HMSA Preps Kids For College

During his presentation to the Hawthorne School Board last week, Hawthorne Math and Science Academy (HMSA) Principal Esau Berumen asked, "Is HMSA preparing students for college?" before outlining all the statistics that show the program at his campus gets students on-track for acceptance at some of the nation's most prestigious colleges. He said that in the eyes of everyone at HMSA, getting students ready to do their best in college is their number one concern.

"If you ask anyone on campus, they will say we prepare students for college and college success

"What do we do?" said Berumen. "If you ask anyone on campus, they will say we prepare students for college and college success."

One of HMSA's biggest triumphs is how quickly and decisively its teachers have improved the school's test results in first-year algebra. On the 2010-2011 year California Standards Test (CST), HMSA had only 34 percent of its students earning advanced or proficient marks, placing them one percent above Redondo Union High School. However, in the most recent round of testing, HMSA had 72 percent of its students in the advanced or proficient category, which would rank the school above Mira Costa and Da Vinvi Science. Berumen said that algebra has become an area where HMSA shows its talents. "Last year, algebra was a concern--now it's one of our highlights," said Berumen. "We shot up. If you look across the board, no one is near that."

The school has also recovered from a downturn in ninth grade English scores. On the most recent

CST tests, 82 percent of ninth graders earned marks of proficient or advanced. This puts HMSA right between Mira Costa and Da Vinci Science in the category. "We dipped a little bit last year, but we are back up," said Berumen.

One area HMSA is still struggling with is chemistry. Berumen said his school is somewhat unusual in that all HMSA students are expected to take four years of science. This means that HMSA students can find themselves in advanced science classes earlier than their peers in other schools. However, even in their problem area, the school's scores are growing by leaps and bounds, going from only 35 percent of students being proficient or advanced in chemistry to 46 percent this year. "Chemistry is an area of concern and even though it is a concern, we are showing growth," said Berumen. "We went up 11 percent. That is impressive."

While the school already boasts an impressive academic record, there is one milestone the staff and students are hoping to accomplish this year-reaching a 900-point Academic Performance Index (API) rating. The school's t-shirts even have a motto reinforcing the goal to get to 900. Barumen believes that this year, HMSA has a good shot at achieving this goal. "We have an 894 API score," said Berumen. "We are six points away from 900. We are knocking on the door."

The CSTs aren't the only tests HMSA students are studying for at the moment. Many of them are in Advanced Placement (AP) courses, where finishing the class and passing an exam with a score of three (out of five) or better will count for college credit at most universities. HMSA's AP pass rate is above both California as a whole and the average global pass rates. However, it did take a 7.1 percent drop. Barumen says part of the reason for this drop is that, unlike

other schools, every student in an AP class is required to take the exam.

"It's important to us that everyone who takes an AP class takes the AP exam," said Berumen. "Even students that might be struggling and might not pass, we think it's important for them to take it as it exposes them to college-level testing."

Barumen noted that HMSA tries to get as many interested students into AP classes as possible. Even students who may have been struggling in the subject last year are given an opportunity to work on assignments at home during the summer and earn a spot in an AP class. "If they are willing to do the work, we want them in," said Berumen.

The focus on college has paid off for the Class of 2013. Already, 54 students have been accepted to the various Universities of California (including two heading to UC Berkeley and four going to UCLA) and others are on their way to schools like University of Southern California and Loyola Marymount University.

The Board was happy to see HMSA progressing in its areas of concern and excelling at readying students for college. Board member Alexandre Monteiro complimented everyone at HMSA-students and staff alike--for their dedication to education. "Outstanding, outstanding. We are very proud of HMSA, the staff, the students, everyone involved," said Monteiro. "They are all so passionate about making sure these students are successful."

While the Board was happy, Berumen emphasized that HMSA still needs to be willing to change what isn't working and keep striving for greatness. "One of the things we have to fight is complacency," said Berumen. "We want to be great." •

Funding Discussed for Wiseburn High School

During its April 25 meeting, the Wiseburn School Board discussed how to proceed with securing funding for Wiseburn High School. Regarding Wiseburn School District's planned new campus, Superintendent Tom Johnstone said that the Board needed to figure out the next step. "We've got some decisions to make," said Johnstone.

To help make those decisions, Johnstone looked to Caldwell Flores Winters to explain how best to pay for the new high school. Johnstone said the District has worked well with the educational financial planning firm. "We're very proud of our relationship with Caldwell Flores Winters," said Johnstone. "They've been very, very important to the success and revitalization of the District."

So far, Wiseburn residents have approved an \$87 million bond to cover the costs of the high school. However, at the time the bond was approved, there were still many unanswered questions about the new school, with one of the biggest being how much the land would cost.

"You never really know how much money you're going to have to pay for land," said Johnstone. "Eight-seven million just to build a high school would been a generous amount--we wouldn't have any problems at all," said Johnstone. "But when you have to buy 13 to 14 acres of land to go along with it [it gets more complicated]."

So instead of possibly saddling residents with additional unnecessary debt, the District played it safe and pursued a bond amount it knew wouldn't cover all the expenses, but would allow it to fill the gap with other funding. "We played it conservatively and went for an \$87 million bond I think knowing that this project was going to cost well over \$100 million and that we were going to be in need of State matching funds and maybe some other funds--as we have on all our projects," said Johnstone. "We got matching funds for Anza, we got matching funds for Dana, we did for Cabrillo... and later on this month, we'll get matching funds for the Peter Burnett project."

By playing it safe with bonds and relying on other funding to make up the difference, the District is currently facing a problem of timing. While there are many specialized facilities (like a black box theater) on the wish list for the new campus, the funding might not be available until long after the District is expected to teach high school students. Johnstone recommended building the

"nucleolus" of the school as soon as possible and delaying the non-essential portions until funding is more readily available.

"What we have isn't a money problemnot in the long run--but a timing problem. We don't have the money right now, but the money is potentially out there," said Johnstone. "As the timing improves...then we'd be in position to add that black box theater."

One source of funding to close the gap is the State's Financial Hardship Program that assists districts in building facilities if they lack the means to fully subsidize their own construction. Ernesto Flores, President of Caldwell Flores Winters, said that receiving this funding would require waiting for the next round of State bond sales and meeting the standards of the Division of the State Architect to make use of an existing building on the school lot. "It's not doing the impossible--we just need to suit up and do this," said Flores.

Unlike the renovations to the District's existing sites, the new high school would be a new construction but incorporate an existing office building. While using an existing building should save money in the long run, Flores warned that it would also mean facing different regulatory challenges. "Here, we have a new ballgame. The State is not in the business of creating mini-schools out of business offices," said Flores. "You are used to drawing plans, getting a stamp of approval and getting your money. Now you'll be doing something a bit differently."

While the rules for converting offices into classrooms are murky, Flores said he believes the District will be successful in finding funding and navigating red tape as long as the Board keeps pushing forward. "What I'm proposing is three things. One, we do believe you will have eligibility [for funding based on new enrollment]. Second thing is, it's no question if you apply the formula today, you do qualify for a hardship grant. Thirdly, the concept that, 'Okay, the rules will change,'" said Flores. "We don't know how the rules will change, but you have to move forward."

While navigating a new network of regulations and funding requirements may be a daunting task, Flores reminded the Board that even before getting as far as purchasing a site, the idea of a Wiseburn High School had supporters. "There are 87 million reasons that support you going to build a high school," said Flores. "Before you ever unified, before you ever picked a site, before you had plans, people said, 'I'm here."" •

Former Hawthorne Grid Standout Moala Dies

Former Hawthorne High football standout Tevita Moala, a premiere defensive tackle who keyed the Cougars to their last CIF-Southern Section championship in 1992, died of cancer two weeks ago. He was 37 years old.

It was just over 20 years ago that Moala sparked Hawthorne with a school record 175 tackles in leading the Cougars to the Southern Section Division III title with a 27-14 win over host Bell Gardens. Moala went on to star at El Camino College, Brigham Young University in Salt Lake City and Oregon State.

At Hawthorne, Moala was the Bay League's Most Valuable Player and the CIF-Southern Section Division III Player of the Year. Hawthorne, under head coach Dan Robbins, also won the Bay League crown in that season.

That period was the opposite of what the Cougars have gone through during recent years when they suffered a 1-9 overall record, including 0-5 in the Ocean League this past season. A few years ago, Hawthorne had a 45-game losing streak that stretched from 2005-10.

Moapa's number 1 jersey is planning to be retired, hopefully during next season. Next season, the Cougars will be head-coached by Donald Paysinger, who was head coach at Beverly Hills, one of Hawthorne's Ocean League foes, over the past several years. Paysinger replaces James Swain, who was dismissed by Hawthorne administrators.

Current players in attendance at his memorial service at the Hawthorne gym on April 22 will seek to make Moala a role model and turn things around next season. Moala is survived by his wife Maata and six children.

Safety Tips for Seniors: Reducing Risk, **Increasing Peace of Mind**



(BPT) - If you're just entering retirement, chances are you have many years of good health and independence ahead. But the normal aging process still brings limitations that we all need to prepare for - such as slower reaction times and declining vision - which can lead to accidents and injuries.

Many accidents are preventable though, and you can take simple measures to enhance your safety as you age.

In Your Home

Falls are one of the greatest age-related risks inside the home. One in three adults older than 65 falls each year, and the risk of injury rises with age, according to the National Safety Council. Many falls are caused by hazards that are easy to avoid if you know what to look for.

To prevent tripping, eliminate clutter on floors, remove throw rugs or tack them down with double-sided tape, and make sure electrical and phone cords are kept out of the way. You might need to rearrange some of your furniture as well, to ensure that there are unobstructed pathways into and out of every room.

In the bathroom, use a nonslip rubber mat or stick nonslip adhesive strips to the bottom of the bathtub or shower. You may also want to consider installing grab bars. Keep a night light on in the bathroom at night, and remove any obstacles in the path from the bedroom to the bathroom.

If your house has stairs, make sure they have good lighting (with light switches at both the top and bottom of the staircase) and sturdy handrails (preferably on both sides). Attaching nonslip rubber treads is a good idea if the steps are potentially slippery.

The kitchen presents a slightly different set of potential hazards. To reduce the risk that you'll cut or burn yourself, make sure there is bright, nonglare lighting over all food preparation areas. Also, it's better to store sharp knives in a knife block or rack rather than loose in a drawer. And make sure any hazardous substances (such as cleaning

supplies) are well marked and stored in a place where they're unlikely to be misidentified or come in contact with food.

Outdoors

To make your yard safer, replace or repair any broken or loose paving stones and clear the walkways of overgrown branches or any other potential tripping hazards. Make sure all handrails are firm and secure. Mark the edges of steps with reflective tape and check that there is enough light to see obstacles

You might want to consider a timer or motion-detector light near the front door so you don't have to fumble with your keys in the dark. And, just in case, make sure your house number is visible and lighted so emergency personnel can find it quickly.

In the Car

To increase your safety on the road, have your vision and hearing checked every year, and, if you need them, wear your glasses or hearing aid when driving. Know your limitations and avoid situations that make you uncomfortable - for example, you may decide to avoid driving at night or on extremely busy roads.

Have your car checked regularly by a trusted mechanic to make sure it stays in

good working order, and keep a cellphone with you so you're prepared in case of an emergency, which can't be emphasized enough. It's good to have a cellphone on hand for any type of emergency - not just in the car. In a 2011 survey by the Pew Research Center, 40 percent of respondents who owned cellphones said that in the past 30 days they had found themselves in an emergency situation in which having their phone with them helped.

Knowing that you can call for help at any time provides great peace of mind, and a cellphone doesn't need to be complicated or expensive. 
