Jane Addams Middle School Hosts Seventh Annual Bengal Bowl

Tires, inner tubes, water drills and music were just part of the day's activities at Jane Addams Middle School during the Seventh Annual Bengal Bowl. "When we became a middle school seven years ago, we sat down as a PE department and we decided what would be best with the space that we have and what kind of field day would be best for the kids," Physical Education teacher Laura Schneider said. "We started brainstorming and each year it has been a bit different. Most of it is the same. The core of it is stable and we try to come up with things that kids will enjoy so that they can have that memory that they will have with them the rest of their lives."

The Bengal Bowl is a competition between the different grade levels, sixth through eighth, which are split into teams named after some of the country's most prestigious universities. Sixth graders are represented by Harvard, Yale and Princeton while the seventh grade is represented by USC or UCLA. Eighth grade students are part of Stanford or Cal.

"All of our kids, when they come on our campus during the sixth grade, know about the three colleges that represent the sixth grade," Schneider said. "When we start telling the kids about these colleges, we start putting in their heads that there is a step after high school that we want to prepare them for."

The day's activities begin with relays and races between the teams where the students must work together in order to try and win the competition and bragging rights for the year. The students are then served lunch and given time at the end of the day to play on inflatable jumpers.

"On this day, we have them compete like if it were a picnic contest--you want to be able to study hard and play hard," Jane Addams Principal Frank Noyse said. "These are memorable days for kids and if you think back to your own experience, you remember the field days and the fun days. This is motivation to get the kids to keep coming back and wanting to be here. We want to make this a place where they want to be and days like these make that happen. It is a great day for kids."

The students know what team they are on from the beginning of the school year. They begin their preparation for the event five weeks before the Bengal Bowl, during which time they are required to be on their best behavior. They have to get all homework turned in and avoid receiving strikes in the classroom. Three strikes from anywhere throughout the school will eliminate a student from participating. Of 900 students, only 20-25 were excluded from the activities for not fulfilling the requirements. The Bengal Bowl is a fun-filled annual tradition for the students, but there is a strong academic emphasis in the day's event.

"I think that it [Bengal Bowl] is important from the standpoint that they know college is an option. I personally believe it is an option that is there and if you want it, then you have to work and study hard for it," Math teacher Louie Pastor said. "It is an answer for some, but may not be the answer for others. Some of these kids might want to be mechanics or pipe fitters or pilots or something where you don't necessarily need a [college] degree. It gives them the option and reminds them that if college is what they want to do, then it will take work."

While there is a winner every year, there is no pressure imposed on the students or teams

to go out and win at all costs. Organizers want students to compete and be happy if they win, but without causing disappointment in those who don't.

"We want them to handle losing and winning in the true spirit of sportsmanship and to just enjoy the day and the relays," Schneider said. "The entire two-hour block, there was a lot of cheering and it makes it exciting. It is a fun day for the kids. They leave their backpacks at home and they just come have fun. They are always looking forward to the event and it is the best event of the school year."

For Pastor, the event allows kids to have fun with all the physical education they have been involved with all year while providing a lesson for the future. "The good thing about this is that we push that you must have a work ethic," Pastor said. "Through physical education, we also tell them that it [health] has long-term implications because of how much healthcare costs. I tell my students that if they are in worse shape than the other person, then they will pay more for insurance. The Bengal Bowl at the end of the year takes all that physical stuff that we did all year and we can have fun with it."

While Schneider is credited for spearheading this event, she is quick to mention that it would not be possible to coordinate the Bengal Bowl without Ms. Carter, Pastor and the rest of the staff. "This is not something I do by myself," Schneider said. "Mr. Noyse has been wonderful in helping planning this event. All the teachers and staff members have been great in preparing the kids and getting them together to come out and participate. It is amazing. It is a whole school coming together." •

Improving Women's Financial Literacy, Worldwide

Are the 70 percent of the developing world's adult population with no formal bank account doomed to a life of economic uncertainty and financial illiteracy? If a woman's culture dictates that she should always put her family's financial needs ahead of her own, can she learn to set aside money for her own retirement without feeling guilty?

These are just some of the complex issues raised at the seventh annual Financial Literacy and Education Summit hosted by

On the question of whether financial literacy hinges on access to

traditional bank accounts, Egyptian Journalist Amira Salah-Ahmend said roughly 90 percent of the Egyptian population is unbanked, meaning most of their transactions are unregulated and therefore more Mexican Journalist Adina

Chelminsky added that many third-world people have much easier access to credit through informal lending channels than to bank products. "The idea is not to formalize

the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago and Visa Inc. Renowned U.S. and international financial experts and journalists led a lively discussion - and fielded Twitter questions from roughly 2,000 participants – around the theme, "Improving Women's Financial Literacy & Capabilities Globally."

Fascinating details revealed include:

Richard Cordray, Director of the U.S. Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, noted that "a large majority of K-12 teachers say that personal finance should be taught in school, yet less than a third say they've taught lessons about money, and more than half feel unqualified to teach their state's financial literacy standards."

Linah Mohohlo, Governor, Bank of Botswana, emphasized that it's not only important to teach women about money management, but also to teach them activities to avoid - such as Ponzi schemes or lending money to people without setting repayment and interest terms.

Bernie Ripoll, Parliamentary Secretary to the Treasurer, Australia, added that women should feel empowered to ask questions or say no if they're asked to invest in something they don't understand.

According to South African Financial Journalist Maya Fischer-French, among the biggest financial hurdles an overwhelming number of women in her country face is their status as single mothers – around 56 percent. Of those, only about 21 percent can rely on financial help from their children's fathers.

all this informal lending, but rather for banks and governments to think outside the box and develop new products that cater to women who have minimal savings," she said.

The panelists shared some alternative financing methods that are already in place and thriving:

Microfinance, where organizations like Kiva make small loans to people who can't get credit from traditional banks, is helping women achieve financial stability in many underdeveloped nations. For example, a young woman in Pakistan or Mexico can now take out a microloan to buy a sewing machine, thereby creating her own thriving business.

Also in Pakistan, a large telecommunications company has partnered with a microfinancer to provide "branchless banking" via mobile phone technology to people far removed from banks. "We've got 45,000 agents transacting this kind of business now compared to only 13,000 in the branch network," explained Yaseen Anwar, Governor, State Bank of Pakistan.

Bottom line: Women throughout the world face unique economic and financial literacy challenges. The key is for governments, financial institutions, educators and entrepreneurs to work together to devise financial tools and educational materials that can reach the female half of the world's population – the younger, the better.

City Council Hears Citizen Complaints, **Concerns about Fireworks**

Lawndale citizens have apparently made their opinions known over the years in at least two ballot measures that approved the allowance of safe and sane fireworks to be sold and then used on July 4 each year. Illegal fireworks are banned from the city as they are from Los Angeles County and beyond. Of course, illegal fireworks are able to be obtained by those who know where to buy them and these loud, smoky and dangerous charges still are heard and fired off each year. On Monday evening, the Lawndale City Council heard the concerns of two citizens, one of whom could rattle off every municipal code that is violated, including the one that says no noise after 10 p.m. on any night without fine. Unfortunately, the safe and sane fireworks code says these can be used legally until 1 a.m. on July 5.

Both citizens were concerned with the remnants of not just the safe and sane fireworks being found in yards and on the streets and in gutters for weeks after July 4, but also pointed out how fireworks affect pets and small children and also can cause the elderly to become frightened when the loud noises pierce the evening air. Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department will have extra deputies on duty all day and all night on July 4 and into the middle of the night on July 5 to conduct proactive work on violators of the fireworks use code. Fines will be levied and arrests will be made of anyone found using illegal fireworks.

Citizens are reminded that any block parties or closure of streets can only be done with a City-issued permit, as the municipal code does not allow certain streets, which are through streets for emergency vehicles, to be blocked off--and only acceptable streets can have a permit issued.

The Council recognized the Rotary Club Firefighter/Paramedic of the Year Robert Currier and the Sheriff's Department Deputy of the Year Troy Hilliard for their service to the community of Lawndale.

The consent calendar items included the approval of the dedicated left turn traffic signal at the intersection of Manhattan Beach Boulevard and Firmona Avenue bid process with PTM Engineering Services, Inc., being designated from the submitted bids, with work to begin on August 12, with a projection of completion by December 2013.

Also included was the approval of a letter to Metro filing the comments the Council has on the extension of the Green Line project, opposing use of the Measure R funds for any Metro projects as these funds belong to the individual cities for which the voters approved the measure and uses of the funds in 2011. Lawndale and other cities of the South Bay are filing notice opposing the diversion of these funds as well as the expansion of original boundaries in the Crenshaw/LAX District for the Metro Extension project.

The Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funding for the payments for extra deputies on duty on July 4 and the Youth Day Parade costs, for a total of \$14,616 to be spent over a four-year period beginning in 2013, was initially presented in a public hearing. The JAG funding was then approved for the two presented uses, as the funding has been used in previous grants. More than \$4,600 will be used for extra deputies.

Emergency roof repair for City Hall and the City Yard buildings was continued until the Council meeting on July 15. In addition, an item for repair of Hawthorne Boulevard Street Lights and invoices from Southern California Edison Company was continued until the July 15 meeting.

The Health, Safety and Pet Fair will be held this Saturday, June 22, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on the Civic Plaza at 147th Street and Burin Avenue. Pet vaccinations; pet licensing; vendors for free screenings of eyes, blood pressure and hearing for humans; and information on safety from various agencies will be available for the public. Food vendors will also be available.

During the Public Safety Report from Sheriff's Department Captain Eli Vera, it was reported that despite several shootings that have occurred within the city limits in the month of June, statistics indicate that violent crime is trending downward in Lawndale. The shootings appear to all be unrelated. A report of drug sales in Hooper Park is under investigation and deputies have been conducting random checks of people loitering in the park. There were no drug sales observed, although an arrest was made of an individual who had seven outstanding warrants. The report of a known gang member moving into Lawndale resulted in the finding of an AK-47 machine gun and ammunition.

City Manager Steve Mandoki announced that all painting of the exteriors of the Lawndale Community Center is complete and the metal lettering signage has been installed on the front of the building.

The American Cancer Society Relay For Life of Lawndale is scheduled at Leuzinger High School on June 29 and 30. Participants are encouraged to sign up for the 24-hour walk to raise funds for cancer research. During opening ceremonies at 9 a.m. on Saturday, June 29, all cancer survivors will be honored. At 9 p.m. the Luminaria Ceremony will honor all those who have lost their battle to the disease with lighted decorated bags lining the walkways. The closing ceremonies on Sunday, June 30 at 8 a.m. will honor those currently fighting the disease and encouraging them for the future.

The Lawndale City Council has cancelled the regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, July 1 and will not meet again until Monday, July 15 at 6:30 p.m. •

Fraud Alert: Grandparent Scam **Continues to Trick People Out of Money**

(BPT) - Imagine being woken by a phone call in the middle of the night. It's your crying grandchild, who is asking for money because of an accident. Of course you want to help your loved one, so you do whatever you can in this emergency situation. You open your

the person by phone or other means.

"Awareness is the best defense against emergency scams," says Hopkins. "These scams can be convincing, but it's important to keep a few things in mind before you rush to help."

Unfortunately you've just become a victim of a scam that is happening across the country. Known as the "grandparent scam," this type of fraud involves bogus calls from people claiming to be relatives in trouble. The personal nature and urgency of these calls causes people to let their guard down, and act quickly without verifying the validity of the call.

"Criminals often target older people, but in reality anyone of any age can be a target of a scam," says Phil Hopkins, vice president of global security with Western Union. "With more people sharing personal information online, such as through social media websites, it's easier for criminals to learn details of personal relationships so they can imitate loved ones by name. Newspapers and obituaries are also good sources of personal information, providing detailed relationship information."

Con artists may also impersonate attorneys, police officers or bail bondsmen to create a sense of urgency and legitimacy. Add in loud background noises, muffled voices or fuzzy phone lines, and it's easy to believe someone is calling from jail or a remote location, where he or she may be in trouble.

In addition to calling victims, hackers use similar strategies to target victims through email. Tapping into a person's address book, scammers send emails or instant messages directly from the person's email account alerting friends and others of the "emergency" and requesting funds. Do not respond to the email and confirm the situation by contacting

Hopkins recommends you follow these tips to avoid becoming a victim of the emergency scam or other types of fraud:

- 1. If you receive a phone call or email claiming a friend or family member needs cash, take a moment to review the situation. Does it make sense? Can you verify the emergency?
- 2. Call the person at a known telephone number, not a number given to you by the caller. Or, call a mutual friend or another relative and find out if he or she is aware of the situation.
- 3. Let your friend or family member know that you have received a call or email from the person requesting help. If the request turns out to be fake, contact the police immediately.
- 4. Regardless of whether you are contacted by phone, email or some other means, be suspicious of requests to send money to "help a friend or family member out" unless you can verify the information you've been given with 100 percent confidence.
- 5. If you did send a money transfer through Western Union, and then realize that it was for a scam, contact the Western Union Fraud Hotline at 1-800-448-1492. If the transaction has not been picked up, it will be refunded
- 6. Never send money to someone you have not met in person.


Riccotta Cheese and **Brown Sugar Rice Pudding**
