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Chris Brown, New Council Members Sworn In for New Term

On Tuesday evening, Danny Juarez handed over the gavel to newly sworn-in Mayor Chris Brown as the latter took his place on the dais to preside over the first meeting of his two-year term. Brown is the first African-American mayor of the City of Hawthorne after his campaign defeated Juarez (and Jose Gutierrez) for the office.

The City Clerk certified that the election results for the General Municipal Election on Nov. 5 are final with the vote counts as follows: For the mayoral race, Danny Juarez 1,324, Chris Brown 1,695 and Jose Gutierrez 1,262. For Council, Alex Vargas 2,000, Angie Reyes-English 1,630, Katrina Manning 1,376, Miguel Talleda 889, John Jefferson 610, Frances Stiglich 565 and Gordon Mege 400. For City Clerk, Norbert Huber 2,599 and Shelby Anderson 1,178. For City Treasurer, L. David Patterson 2,315 and Thierry Lubenec 1,703. The ballot measure to change the term for Mayor from two years to four years was approved, effective with the election on Nov. 6, 2015.

With the certified election accepted unanimously, the next order of business was the official swearing-in ceremony for Brown's two-year mayoral term, the second four-year Council terms for incumbents Reyes-English and Vargas, the second term for Huber as City Clerk; and for new City Treasurer Patterson as the new City Treasurer. Patterson defeated incumbent Thierry Lubenec, who had served for 10 years.

The Council lauded Juarez and Lubenec for their many years of service to the City as volunteers as well as in their elected positions. Lubenec was recently named Citizen of the Year by the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce and is the newly elected President of the Hawthorne Historical Society. Juarez served as an elected official for 20 years--12 years as the City Clerk, two years on the Council and two years as Mayor, as well as an elected Trustee of the Wiseburn School District Board and in numerous volunteer positions with

AYSO and the Boy Scouts.

Congresswoman Maxine Waters recognized each outgoing official with a certificate of recognition. The City declared that Tuesday, Dec. 10 was "Danny Juarez Day" and Wednesday, Dec. 11 "Thierry Lubenec Day."

David Robinson, the HR Department Head for the City Staff, announced that the "Let's Walk" walking program will have the next neighborhood event on Saturday, Jan. 25, 2014 at 10 a.m. in the Holly Park area. Details are on the City website. The program has been successful, as many citizens participate and log walking miles in anticipation of the prizes that will be available at the end of the formal program's first year in July 2014—and also enjoy the camaraderie of walking with neighbors and reaping the health benefits.

Two public hearings were held without public input prior to the introduction of new ordinances and their first readings. Used car dealers will now be subject to regulations that will be in the municipal code, and cottage food industries will be held to standards that comply with State law and Board of Health regulations whether items are being sold for profit or nonprofit. The second readings of each ordinance will be during the first meeting in Jan. 2014 and will become law within 30 days after.

The ordinance introduced at the meeting of Nov. 26 to regulate applications for events not sponsored by the City but using City property was approved. All applications must be filed with the City 90 days before the requested date(s) for the event and all event fees must be paid in full no later than 30 days prior to the event, or risk event cancellation by the City.

Bulletproof wall coverings for the Hawthorne Police Department building's public areas were approved by resolution.

Huber thanked the members of his office for their assistance with all election matters and noted that Deputy City Clerk Monica DiCrisci and Diana Smith were to be commended for their great jobs.

Valentine requested that the economic

vision of the City be a priority in the next year and that local businesses strive to hire Hawthorne residents. Vargas agreed and suggested the Planning Department, with approval of ideas by the City Attorney, have a "brainstorming" session to propose an incentive program to encourage local business owners when they hire residents to continue that trend. Michelin agreed with the vision for building the economic strength of the City and asked for an update on the Hawthorne Downtown Specific Plan and for the date of the next citizen participation event like the kickoff event in late September with MIG (the planning consultants for development of the downtown area).

The Council and Mayor Brown offered each other congratulations on their elections and expressed a positive outlook for working together to move the City forward to prosperity. The occupants of the dais voted unanimously for every motion made and there was little discussion about any of the agenda items.

Brown thanked all who came out to the meeting and to his special event Thursday, Dec. 5. He reiterated his message from that previous evening to bring new businesses to the Hawthorne Boulevard Downtown area, with new restaurants and other vendors.

The Mayor asked the City Manager to prepare a report with accurate numbers in order for the budget "to be tackled head-on" with all expenses and planned revenue streams defined as soon as possible so that the first meeting of the new year will allow for the 2013-2014 budget to be approved with the true overall bottom lines.

The Council agreed by unanimous vote to cancel the scheduled meeting of Tuesday, Dec. 24, 2013 to allow for all to spend Christmas Eve with their families.

The next meeting of the Hawthorne City Council will be held on Tuesday, Jan. 14, 2014 at 6 p.m.

The meeting was adjourned in memory of the young son of Hawthorne Police Department Sergeant Robbie Williams. •

Irony is a delicious thing, isn't it? Let's consider these bits of irony:

Obamacare was intended to reduce the number of uninsured. Instead, the cancellation of existing policies could cause the number of uninsured to more than double.

Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV), a vociferous advocate of Obamacare, has exempted himself and his senior staff from this onerous law.

Want another one? The man who gave Obamacare his name has not signed up for that abomination.

Here's still another one: To function, Obamacare needs seven million signups by next April, 40 percent of whom must be young, requiring little medical care. Unfortunately only 28 percent of today's enrollees are in that demographic. *Fox News* reports that since youngsters from 19-34 on average require medical care only six times over that 15-year span, they aren't buying what they don't need. Ironically, Obama undermined sales to youngsters even further by allowing those up to the age of 26 to stay with their parent's health plans rather than buying their own coverage. Regardless of whether too few people enroll or whether too many with the wrong demographic enroll, Obamacare could crash with horrendous health and financial implications.

Then there's this: The public has until December 23 to sign up for insurance that will be effective on Jan. 1, 2014. But by that date, Obamacare will not be functional! You see, there are two parts to Obamacare, both of which need to be operational. First,

there is the sign-up process that has been the subject of such ridicule and still fails 20 percent of the time. Second, however, is the administrative process among the various governmental departments and the way they interface with applicants for government subsidies and the insurance companies that pay caregivers. The computer programs that encompass this "back end" have not been written yet and are not scheduled to be completed until sometime next year.

Applicants for government subsidies need only to make unsubstantiated income claims to receive subsidies. As for insurance companies, they need only "estimate" the amount the government should compensate them on a monthly basis, with accounts to be reconciled later. To prepare for any eventuality, President Obama is preparing a federal bailout of insurance companies that may suffer as a result of Obamacare.

In the absence of any financial controls, this most dishonorable President is calling for an honor system requiring truth from applicants for subsidies and insurance companies alike. The point of fact is that financially the President doesn't know where we are and doesn't know where we're going. Importantly, the financial chaos of Obamacare is the backdrop for budget negotiations scheduled for this coming January, and threatens to spread financial uncertainty far and wide.

Finally, the most delicious irony of all is that the political party that advocates a godless, secular society will need an act of God to save their plan, rescue the ailing among us and preserve our economy. •

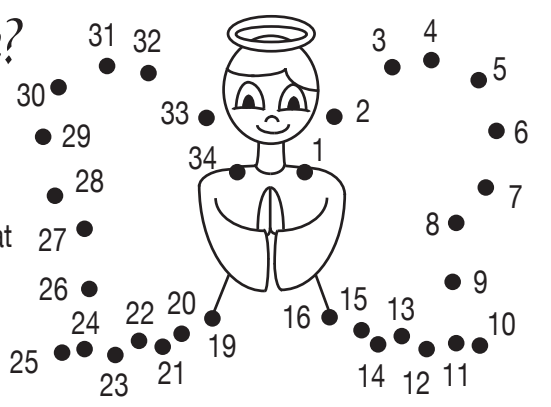


World Famous Christmas Tree
