Father Joshua Wong's Installation at St. Michael's Episcopal Church

On Saturday, February 1, Father Joshua Wong was installed as the seventh Rector of St. Michael's Church in El Segundo. Located on the corner of Holly Street and Richmond Street, this charming church and Pre-school is a living memorial and reminder that great blessings and dreams can be realized from small beginnings wanting a change. As we learned from Melissa Albers, the founder of the St. Michael's Children's Center's article, St. Michael's came into being in the late 1920's when a group of women and their children from St. Cross Episcopal Church in Hermosa Beach dreamed of starting an Episcopal Church in El Segundo. Since then, there have been six rectors and now in 2025, Father Joshua was selected as the seventh Rector and Chaplain of St. Michael's.

On a beautiful Spring morning service on February 1, Father Joshua was installed by Bishop Ed Little of the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles as their official full-time rector. Father Joshua described this as "a very special day in my life, both sacred and unforgettable."

On that day, St. Michael's saw a packed church with many of Father Joshua's colleagues, friends, and acquaintances from his previous parishes to support, encourage, and congratulate him on this celebratory day. The next day, at his Sunday service, He shared with the congregation the notable events and people that led to this moment. He compared these holy women and men who were instrumental to his journey of faith to

Simeon and Anna, the prophets mentioned on that Sunday's lectionary reading in Luke Chapter 2. He mentioned especially his father and a very special high school teacher who were great mentors in his life. He also spoke about different experiences in his past corporate life that culminated to where he is today—his career as a Creative Art Director in Advertising to his career in New York City as a Footwear Designer for Ralph Lauren. He said he never thought that

he would go from "Soles to Souls." From designing shoes to nurturing and developing the souls of mankind, he is grateful for his interesting spiritual journey.

Father Joshua describes it as "an example of how God can work in our lives if we say "Yes." When he visited St. Michael's before his ordination to the priesthood, he felt that St. Michael's parish had heart and potential. A heart and potential to transform the world

New Theater Comes to Town Replacing Arclight

The Cinemark West Beach Cities a luxury cinema opened on Monday replacing the Arclight off Rosecrans. \$10 million in upgrades were done. It will have 16 screens, reclining seats, serve alcohol and have a Pink's Hot Dog restaurant open the theater-goers and the general public. Construction of a 4DX theater expected to be finished in a month, will incorporate on-screen visuals with motion seat effects, scents, rain, lightening, for and wind. A Sense of Home: Creating Homes for **Aged-Out Foster Youth in South Bay**

A truck sits parked on the street, waiting to fill Symone's first home. While Symone was in foster care, she lived in 32 different residences over the span of fifteen years. It has been a long time since she has laid in a bed that is her own. Because Symone is a former foster youth, she is eligible to receive a home creation from A Sense of Home.


Before the move-in process begins, the volunteers, ASOH staff and alumni gather around Symone and her young family in the empty living room. The volunteers, an intergenerational mish mosh, introduce themselves to Symone and each explains a bit about why they are there. The circle is filled with positivity and excitement. Symone sheds a tear as she expresses gratitude for all the people who have donated items and come to support her, her partner, Michael, and their three-month-old daughter, Nya, today.

Then, Symone is ushered outside to await the reveal. The rest of the group carries home goods one by one from the truck into the narrow two-bedroom townhouse. The furniture and décor have all been donated by community members or companies that partner with ASOH, like Ruggable, Lamps Plus, SimpleHuman, Casper, Parachute, Living Spaces, and more. Back at the warehouse in Hawthorne, this home layout was painstakingly organized for the most efficient move-in possible. There is color coordinated tape on the walls to indicate where everything goes, as the home must be completed in under

It was also the time to honor its seniors and their families. The boys' soccer team lost a close one, while the girls made their last game a memorable one. Both basketball teams lost on the day they honored their seniors. And the playoff brackets were announced.

Girls Soccer Makes Final Game Memorable.

The Eagles had plenty to play for and plenty of incentive when they faced the North Torrance Saxons. A win would certainly guarantee an invite to the CIF playoffs. As if the team needed more incentive it was the Senior Appreciation game where the program's seniors were honored prior to the game. In a special ceremony, the soccer seniors and their families were introduced. Those honored included Victoria Rodriguez, Chloe Thiel, Nyla Cho, Shelby Jackson, Ava Gutierrez, Sam Stahl, Bella Recalde, Kelly Kramer, Lila Cheung, Lauren Nguyen, Sophia Brown, Ava Adlam and Sammi Herrera.

The Eagles have a stalwart defense that has allowed just seven goals in eight Pioneer League games. Goalie Victoria Rodriguez and defenders Nyla Cho, Shelby Jackson, and Ava Adlam are a big reason for the team's challenging defense. The defense demonstrated its skills against a frustrated Saxon squad that was hit with several red cards. The Eagles turned back several Saxon opportunities and held them scoreless in a 2-0 win.

The Eagles controlled the game on both ends and continuously pressured North Torrance's defense. In the first half, Lauren Nguyen had two shots on goal blocked, and Nyla Cho took a pass and had a clear look altered by a Saxon defender. The Eagles had three corner kicks come close but turned away. The Eagles found the goal open in the thirty-first minute when a shot carried off several Saxons. Nguyen was at the right spot and hammered it by Saxon goalie Jordyn Salas for a 1-0 lead El Segundo lead. The Eagles finished second in the Pioneer League and were placed in the CIF Southern Section Division 1 playoffs, which began yesterday. The Eagles traveled to play Sunset League runners-up Newport Harbor, the third-seeded Sailors. The winner advances to Friday's second-round game.

The Eagles faced the Palos Verdes Sea Kings in the last game of the Bay League schedule. With the two teams vying for second place, much was at stake. The game was a defensive battle, and it went to overtime. The Sea Kings broke through with a goal in the ninth minute, a goal by Michael Murillo on an assist by Austin Ambris. It was an epic

defensive battle between two talented teams.

Though the Eagles finished fourth in arguably one of the most challenging leagues in the CIF Southern Section, they were granted an at-large bid for the playoffs. They will host today's first-round CIF Southern Section Division 1 game with Freeway League co-champion Brea Olinda at 5 p.m. The winner advances to the second-round game to face the winner of Redondo/Arroyo Valley on Saturday.

The Eagles honored their three seniors before taking the court for their last Pioneer League game of the season with the South Torrance Spartans. The Eagles fell to South Torrance, but it was still a memorable game for Symai and Alexia, who each scored in a game they'll remember.

The Eagles finished the regular season 17-11 and were awarded the second seed for the CIF Southern Section Division 3AA playoffs. The Eagles host South Hills (Covina) tonight at 7 p.m. The Huskies are the second-place team from the Hacienda League. The winner advances to Saturday's second-round game to face the winner of the Immaculate Heart/ Huntington Beach game.

Eagles Honor Their Seniors Before Last Game

The El Segundo boys' basketball program said goodbye to its four seniors before their final game of the season. In front of a packed gym, seniors Darreson Naruse, Liam Endo, RJ Puffer, and Vitor Dorn were honored along with their families. The four talented seniors were thanked for their commitment, dedication, and willingness to strive to make the program stronger.

The season finale didn't go the Eagles' way. The Eagles fell to the South Torrance Spartans 43-39. After an impressive first half, in which the Eagles limited the Spartans to just two successful field goals, the Spartans made some adjustments. 




Check It Out

Going Viral Review: Would You Sell Your Soul For Fame?

The desire for virality might seem like a modern-day ambition, but Going Viral proves that the search for stardom is timeless. Directed by Vincent Vittorio (American Made Movie) and written & produced by Todd Pringle and Kevin Greene (You're Killing Me), this independent feature blends the best of 80's nostalgia with current technological advances to create a truly original genre film. This 80s sci-fi adventure is full of great music, fun special effects, and a stellar cast. And wow! It is fun to see Corey Feldman back on the big screen again!

Going Viral tells the story of a teenage boy's desperate attempt to achieve fame and the consequences he faces as a result. success by encouraging fame-hungry teens to engage in practical jokes.





two hours.

After the rugs are laid, the furniture settled, the cabinets filled with appliances, the beds made and art hung on the walls, Symone is brought in to see her completed home for the first time. She sits down on her couch with her daughter in her arms, looks around, and says, "I'm going to sleep so well tonight."

A Sense of Home began in 2015 as a random act of kindness by friends Georgie Smith, ASOH's CEO and founder, and Melissa Goddard, who put together one home. The organization was born and has exploded over the past several years, now taking on 3-4 home creations per week, with over 950 total and counting.

The key focus of ASOH's operation is preventing homelessness and building a community of former foster youths who can connect and grow together. Many young adults exiting foster care do not have any external help to fall back on and this makes transitioning into solo adult life especially difficult. A Sense of Home works tirelessly to create healthy, happy and safe living environments for those in need.

Once a foster youth ages out of their assistance programs, they are eligible to apply for a home creation with A Sense of Home. There is no cutoff age for recipientsthe only stipulations are that the person served must be a former foster youth, moving into their first home, and working or in school.

If someone does not yet have a job or schooling, not to worry. ASOH has many other programs that help community members find employment, receive scholarships, and even source leases in new buildings all over Los Angeles through the Foster Youth to Independence (FYI) voucher program. As well, ASOH provides resources to find accessible food, clothing, legal assistance, mental health services, mentoring, LGBTQ+ support, and more. The organization has also begun working with the LA County Department of Children and Family Services to spread awareness to foster youths so that they can apply for home creations before they are aged out.

Many ASOH alums participated in Symone's home creation, including Elvira, who is now a full-time staff member with ASOH and in the middle of her master's degree in social work. Elvira loves what she does, as a

former foster youth herself, she has been in the same shoes as the people that ASOH serves.

Outside the home creation sits Elvira and Candice, who had her home created in 2019. Before receiving her home creation, Candice spent a year living in her car. She remembers the first night she spent in her brand-new home after the volunteers left. She woke up startled, not immediately knowing where she was. "It was surreal," she said, "I'll never forget that feeling."

Despite Candice currently being on dialysis and waiting to receive a kidney, she still showed up to the home creation. She has

been to over 100 home creations in the past four years. "They're my family," Candice says, speaking of ASOH. "All of us who've been in foster care have some type of trauma or something that happened to us." Candice speaks of the bonds she has made with the people she has met through the organization. It is evident the joy she feels while surrounded by found family doing what she loves best.

Elvira and Candice chat about ASOH's most recent gala fundraiser, where the foundation raised over \$1 million. They laugh together, passing Elvira's phone back and forth to see photos of friends in gowns enjoying the event. The women are close; Candice gushes about Elvira's 18-month-old daughter's big brown eyes before Elvira has a chance to show a photo.

Alicia is also present for the home creation, having received one herself only a few months ago. She is excited to give back the kindness that was given to her. She is currently in school for phlebotomy and has a two-year-old daughter. Around 87% of the former foster youth served are women and 54% of those women have children of their own.

The final step of the home creation process is to give Symone all the heart-shaped nametags and notes of well wishes from the volunteers. This 'Love Jar' is meant to uplift Symone and her family on any given day and remind her of the people who came

There are many ways to get involved with A Sense of Home- through furniture and home goods donations, monetary gifts, warehouse volunteering, and joining the fun of home creations. The ASOH is small, consisting of only ten people, and is always looking for volunteers to experience the joy of creating a safe and loving home for others. •




