El Segundo's Very Positive Police Chief

Perhaps the fact that he gave me a “goody bag” when I sat down should have alerted me that I was in for an interesting and informative interview and an uplifting experience. Jaime Bermudez has been El Segundo's Chief of Police since 2021. He is going to retire at the beginning of April. Just what he will do in retirement remains to be seen. He is relatively young and has a contagious energy. I can safely predict that Jaime will continue to contribute as much, if not even more, in the future. It will be interesting to find out the path he follows.

By the way, have you ever met him? I ask because Jaime Bermudez is a gem. At one point during the interview, I mentioned how young he is, but it turns out he is a bit older than I thought. He is in his early fifties, but he sure does not look it.

“My message to the people I work with, and the younger persons coming up in the ranks, is that you are the one. It is *you* who determines when you wake up, if you are going to have a miserable day, or if you are going to choose to be positive. I have told my kids many times that looking back at my 32-year career with the El Segundo Police Department, I can count on one hand the number of negative days I have had.” This is from a person who has spent his career in law enforcement, no easy task, no easy road. Yet, he is full of affirmation. This fellow truly thinks and acts very positively.

Jaime's parents are from Mexico. He started working for his dad at the ripe old age of ten. Dad owned several restaurants and taught him “a very rigorous work ethic, which has helped me in my choices and in my professional life. Let me just say Dad was *tough love*, but to this day, he remains my absolute hero. One of the good things

I learned is to appreciate the importance of small businesses. I have a genuine soft spot in my heart for the small business owner. There are many in El Segundo. As to Mom, well, she was and is so loving. One of the things I am really looking forward to when I retire is spending more time with them.”

Jaime and his wife are happily married, with two sons, ages 19 and 21. They reside here in the South Bay. “The family is super excited about my retirement. Being in law enforcement is a genuine commitment, as you can well imagine, and often twenty-four seven, seven days a week, particularly when you are the Chief. They will finally see a lot more of me...”

This all started with an ad in the Los Angeles Times, which caught Jaime's attention. He

was all of 17 years of age. The ad was about the opportunity to become a Police Cadet. At that time, Jaime was a freshman at California State University, Long Beach. He will switch to become a Criminal Justice major. He applied to the Gardena Police Department and, in time, was offered a position with El Segundo. He is then just 18 years young. While still in college two years later, Jaime attended the Orange County Sheriff's Academy.

In fact, during his senior year, he took off a semester to focus on becoming a police officer. He then worked full-time even as he returned for his final college semester. This meant Jaime may have the proverbial graveyard shift (“When you are just starting out, your schedule is not much fun”). He would get

Glen Scott Rhodes Graham

Scott was born on April 12, 1956 in Lynwood, California. On January 29, 2024, he passed away at home in Torrance, California, surrounded by his loving family. He was a man of great character and personal strength and his passing will be mourned by many.

Scott graduated from El Segundo High School in 1973. He entered the Navy in 1975 and was stationed in Tennessee as an Air Crewman. After his active service, he entered the Naval Air Reserve. He received his Honorable Discharge in 1977.

Scott only held two jobs prior to finding employment in the propane industry where he would remain for the rest of his life. Through hard work and dedication, Scott rose to be Regulatory Affairs Manager for Energy Distribution Partners. Scott was well-liked by his fellow workers and considered so many of them to be his friends. Henceforth, the yearly advocacy award that is presented by the Western Propane Gas Association will be named in Scott's honor.

In 1983, Scott married the love of his life, Vicki. Together, they raised their children: Sarah, Jeff and Wyatt. Scott was a wonderful father who was very involved in the lives of his kids. He was a member of Boy Scout Troop #773 as a boy, and he became a Cub Scout leader of the same troop when his sons became eligible to enter Scouting. Vicki was a Brownie and Girl Scout leader for their daughter's troop, and Scott was of invaluable help there as well. He was extremely proud of his children and was always an active presence in their lives.

Scott was active in The Optimist Club focusing his energy on work with the Optimist Youth Home working to help lift up the lives of children. He proudly served a term as President of the Youth Home. Scott had a deep commitment to helping children and would work wherever his special skills were needed.



The proudest achievement of Scott's life was his family. His 40-year marriage was very happy and the bond he shared with his wife is one we could all envy. He was a good husband, thoughtful friend, and he was always ready to help anyone. He could often anticipate the needs of his friends and neighbors and offer to help before they were able to ask. Well into his illness, he was still that guy in the neighborhood who was willing to help.

In 2016, Scott was diagnosed with Squamous Cell Carcinoma. He began his treatment in 2017. During that time, Scott worked to expand the CANCER SUPPORT COMMUNITY SOUTH BAY organization to support those with cancer of the head and neck. He was always looking for ways to help other people even when his situation was so difficult.

Scott lived his life and faced his cancer with courage and hope. When his prognosis changed, Scott began participating in drug trials. Even though it might not mean his recovery, he wanted to work toward a cure for other people. He continued to participate in those drug trials as long as he could. He suffered so that others might live. He wanted his death to mean something.

Through it all, Scott maintained his sense of humor and fun, and nobody enjoyed his jokes as much as he did. He used his sense of humor to help everyone around him face the challenge of his illness.

Scott was preceded in death by his father, Rhodes "Dusty" Graham, and brothers, Michael Graham and Robi Kahn. He is survived by his wife of 40 years, Vicki and his children: Sarah and her husband Garrett Braun, son Jeffrey and his wife Amanda, son Wyatt and his new bride Rose; his mother Gail Cardwell, sister Lori Sanders and her husband Eldon, sisters Jackie Berliner and Suzi Hastings and brother Jim Chiramonte. 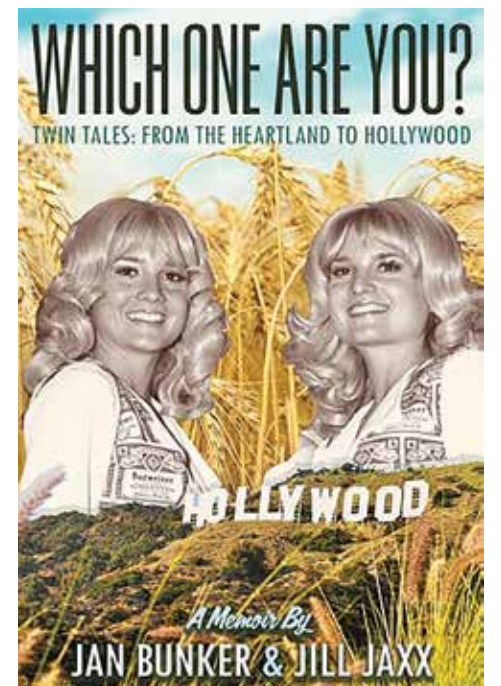

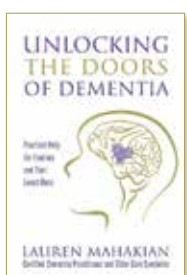

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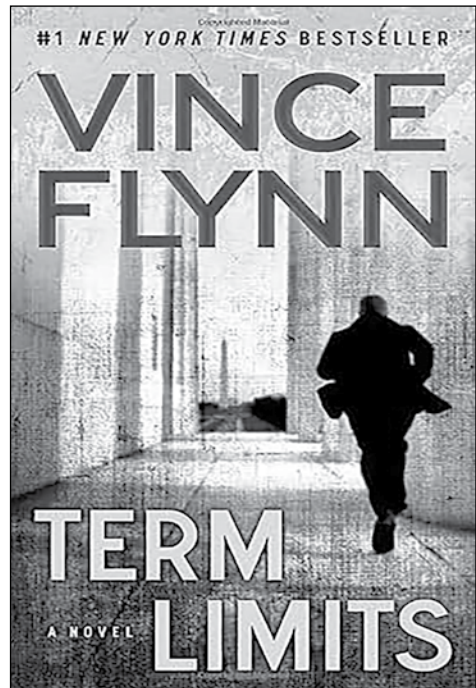
Check It Out

Teen Book Review of *Term Limits* by Vince Flynn

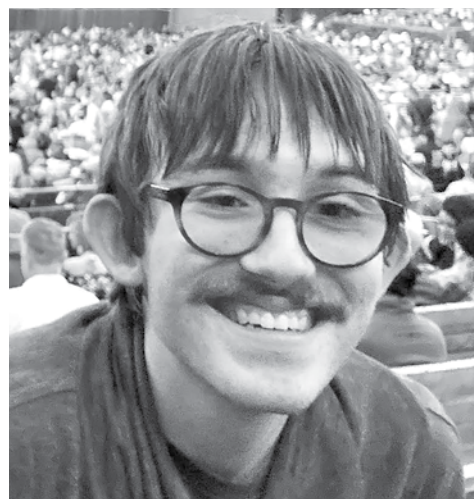

Do you like spy novels? Do you like novels with intrigue and mystery? How about plots with twists and turns? If your answer was yes to any of these, the book called "Term Limits" by Vince Flynn is what you NEED to read. It is a stand-alone 612-page book published in 1997 as Vince Flynn's first book published. If his name does not ring a bell, the fact that he was a story consultant on the well-known TV series "24" should substantiate his expertise in how to construct drama and suspense. I know that 612 pages is a lot, but Vince's writing style entices the reader to not put the book down (chapter after

chapter) and continues to keep the reader interested. The novel kicks off with a shocking event – a group of assassins kidnap and executes three high-profile U.S. politicians. The motive behind these killings is to send a powerful message to the political elite... corruption will no longer be tolerated. No one, they warn, is out of their reach, not even the U.S. president. As the authorities scramble to uncover the identities of these perpetrators, the tension escalates, and politicians start dropping like flies. In an attempt to discover who is behind these murders, the President authorizes the Central Intelligence Agency (known as the CIA) to operate on US soil and use whatever means necessary to obtain information. Only Congressman Michael O'Rourke, a former U.S. Marine, holds the clue that could stop the violence, but it has explosive implications for his country and the future of the United States. •

The Space Race: A Revelatory Exploration of NASA's Black Astronauts

From National Geographic Documentary Films comes *The Space Race*, a revelatory exploration into the historical accomplishments of Black NASA astronauts. Directed by Lisa Cortés (*The Apollo*, *Little Richard*) and Emmy-Award winner Diego Hurtado de Mendoza, *The Space Race* is a compelling portrait of the National heroes whose service, up until now, has been absent from mainstream history. Now streaming on Hulu and Disney+.

Space exploration wasn't encouraged in ethnic communities back in the 1960s. The mindset that was birthed from racial

segregation and discrimination was especially not welcoming to Black Americans looking to get into the scientific fields but that didn't stop Ed Dwight, Guion Bluford, Charles Bolden, and Victor Glover from pursuing their dreams of becoming astronauts. In an attempt to combat the social injustice at the time, President John F. Kennedy announced that Captain Edward Dwight would carry the title of the country's "First Negro Astronaut." This news was met with both applause and criticism and, unfortunately, those who were skeptical that the optics were just

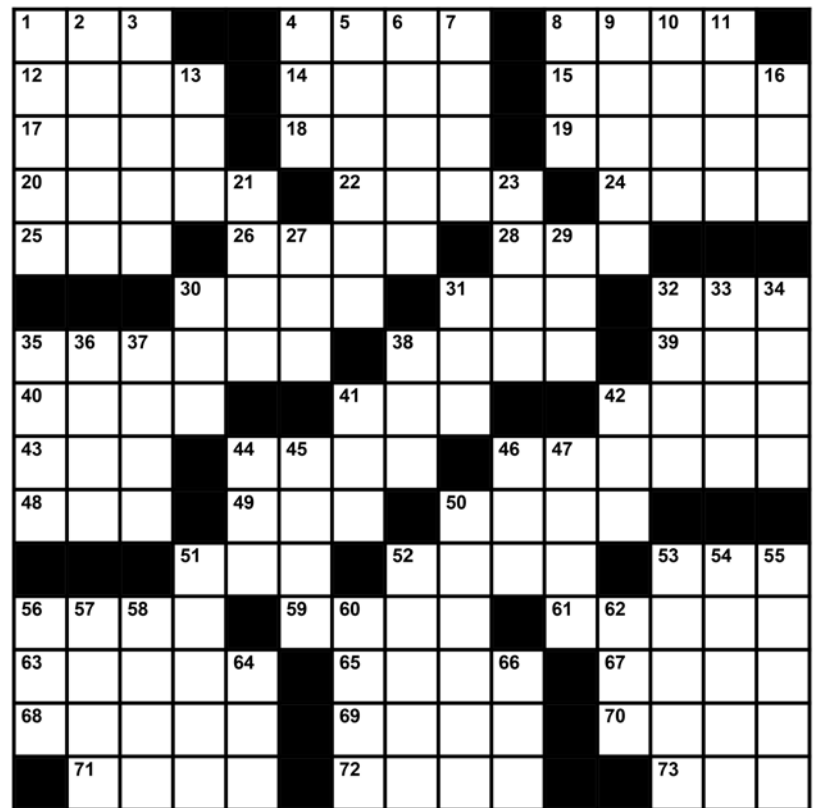

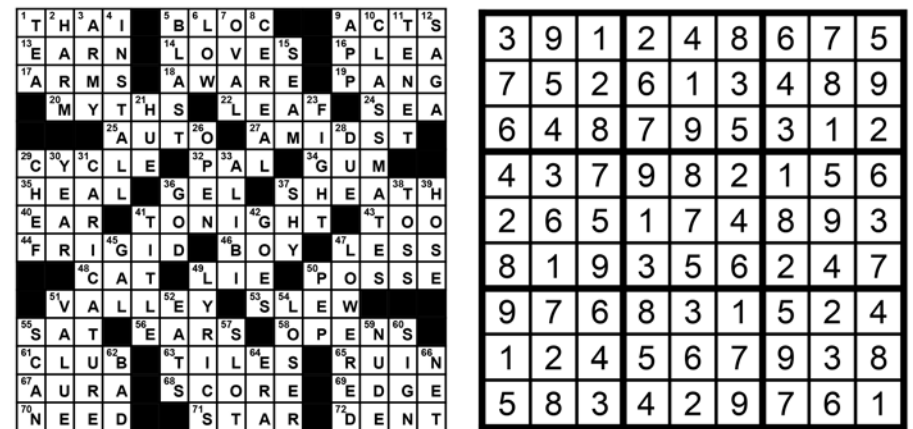

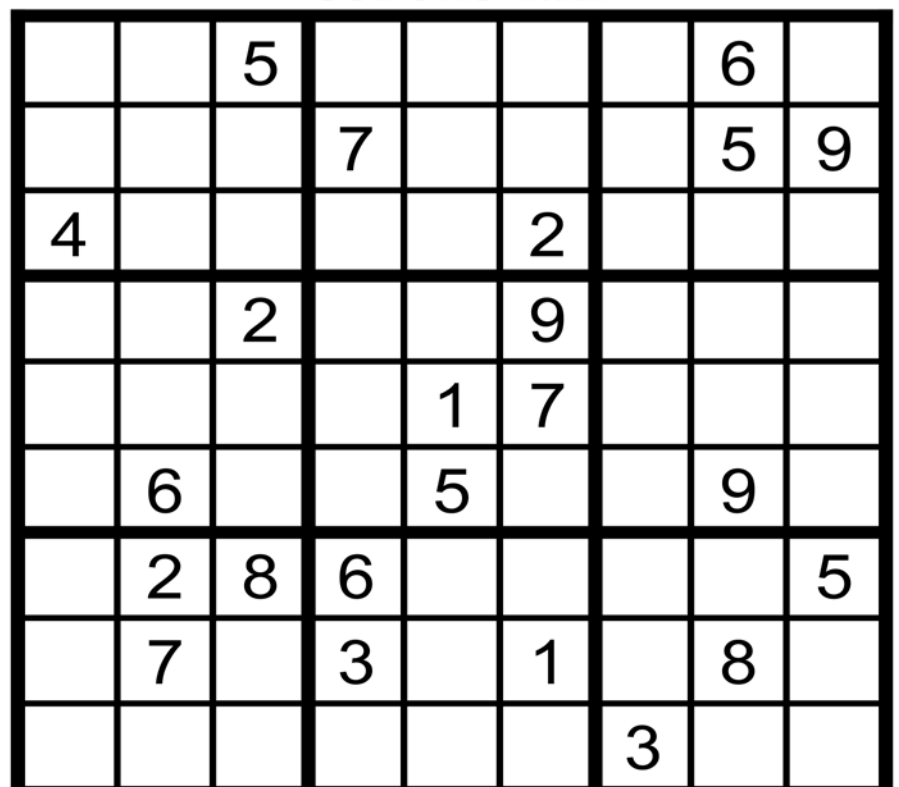

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TRENDS IN TODAY'S HOMEBUYING MARKET



(BPT) - Trends in real estate and home buying go far beyond mortgage rates and home prices. There are several more trends that provide insight into today's homebuyer and what they are looking for in a home.

There is a big difference between a first-time buyer and someone who already owns a home. In fact, the 2023 Profile of Home Buyers & Sellers by the National Association of REALTORS® (NAR) reports a 23-year age gap between a typical first-time buyer (35 years old) and an older buyer (58 years old).

More unmarried people are buying homes today. While 59% of all buyers were married couples, single females purchased 19% of homes, followed by single men (10%) and unmarried couples (9%). Interestingly, 70% of recent home buyers did not have a child under 18 living in the home.

First-time buyers remain active and continue to account for about 30% of all home purchases. A down payment remains a challenge for the majority of first-time homebuyers. Many are getting

financial help from parents, families and friends.

NAR reported that 39% of older buyers traded up, while 33% purchased a smaller home. But home size is not the only consideration. Nearly 60% of all buyers said the quality of the neighborhood was the most important factor in determining where to live. Being close to family and friends is the biggest driver of where people want to be, even more than affordability. There is also a trend towards longevity in a home. While most live in their home for 10 years, today's buyer believes they will stay in their home for at least 15 years.

The home buying and selling patterns of baby boomers, those now 59-77, have redefined societal norms in housing as they age. The U.S. Census reports the homeownership rate is more than 75% for baby boomers and AARP reports an overwhelming majority of this group wants to age in place.

One of the big questions hanging over the housing market is how long baby boomers will stay in their

existing homes. As those in this demographic move on to the next phase in their lives, they will be looking for more manageable homes, nearby medical facilities, accessible community amenities and proximity to friends and loved ones.

NAR shared that those over 60 almost tripled the number of home purchases in senior-related housing compared to the previous year (19% vs. 7%, respectively). Retirement, health of a loved one and the desire to downsize are the driving factors for a move for those 65 and older. Only 3% in this age group say they want a larger home.

It's important that buyers select an agent with whom they are comfortable, with a like-minded communication style and experience working in the price points and communities the buyer is interested in.

It is also important to choose an agent who can help identify reputable loan officers with various financing options. More than half of all buyers use an agent who was referred to them or someone they worked with previously. *

smoke and mirrors were proved right. In the film, Captain Dwight frustratingly admits that he believes his hiring was for political and propaganda purposes, not moral progress. America needed a positive PR spin, and he was their chosen target.

Fast forward through decades and cultural strides, *The Space Race* uses archival footage and current-day interviews to show the side of history that wasn't written in textbooks. Special attention is dedicated to Ron McNair, the only Black astronaut aboard the Challenger Mission, who died along with six others when the spacecraft infamously exploded just seconds after takeoff. Regrettably, we will never know the full potential of his impact on future generations but despite his untimely passing, Ron is cited as an inspiration among his peers. Ron represented hope and ability for many people, specifically within the Black community.

The Space Race thrives when we hear the men reminisce in detail about their time spent in outer space. One describes Earth as being so small that his crew circled it every 90 minutes. Another speaks of his amazement to see the countries from that high, noting there were no lines or divides that we are accustomed to seeing on maps. If only everyone could co-exist with that mentality, that we are all equal and not bound to imaginary borders or tier systems. It's a message that extends far beyond space, and one that will hopefully resonate with audiences to infinity and beyond. •

to get excited about with their up-tempo transition offense and stifling defense. The Eagles forced the Flashes into turnover after turnover, which El Segundo capitalized on and scored 28 points.

Shane Biscaya scored 17 first-half points to lead the Eagles to a 53-17 lead. Eli Coles scored three consecutive baskets within a thirty-second margin thanks to the turnovers he caused; he ended the game with 15 points.

The Eagles played like a number-one seed and played with passion. Head coach Scott Martin said his team has continued to surprise him with how they have progressively gotten better with each game. Advancing to the second round against the Tarbut V' Torah Lions would be another lopsided affair with the Eagles winning 60-36.

Playing their first road game of the post-season, the Eagles had a large contingent of fans and students make the trip to Irvine. Their support was appreciated by the Eagles, who took a 17-point halftime lead. With a balanced scoring attack, the Eagles went up by 32 points in the second half. Eli Coles led the offense with 13 points and had 11 rebounds. Darreson Naruse had ten points and eight assists, while Jack Pintens contributed eight points and six rebounds.

The Eagles traveled to Valencia on Tuesday to take on the Trinity Classical Academy Knights from the Heritage League. A win would send the Eagles into the semi-finals most likely at home on Friday night; the CIF finals are slated for next Friday, February 23.

Boys' Soccer Team Falls

The Eagles had a winning season by going 14-6-2 overall. In the first round of the CIF-SS Division 3 playoffs, they faced the El Rancho Dons in the second place team from the Del Rio League. The Eagles had numerous scoring opportunities but came up

The same official would make the penalty call on El Segundo in the extra period. The penalty call was less egregious than the one in regulation not called on Salesian.

El Segundo's tight defense was tough to challenge, and James Baldino was solid in goal. The movement on offense suggested that the Eagles would tag on more scores, but Don's goalie, Joshua Navarro, made some spectacular saves.

The 1-0 win over El Rancho sent the Eagles on the road to face the Salesian Mustangs, the Del Rey League champions in the second round. These two teams were about as evenly matched as you'll find. The Eagles put pressure on the Mustangs, as much as the Mustangs did on the Eagles. After two 40-minute halves without a score, the game went into golden goal time. Three minutes into the extra period, the Mustang's Andy Garzon lofted a free kick past Baldino for a Salesian 1-0 win.

But that final scoring moment, which came on a penalty, won't be the one remembered.

Water Polo Team Bows in First Round

With success comes the promotion to play in higher divisions. The Eagles won a CIF championship in 2022 and were promoted to Division 1 the following year and this season. For the third consecutive season, they won at least 22 games, so their success is legitimately there. Playing in the Pioneer

League against lesser-talented teams didn't challenge the Eagles. They just completed their third consecutive undefeated league season and finished (22-7) overall. That lack of competition may have played a part in the Eagle's early first-round exit in the CIF-SS Division 1.

The Eagles hosted the Dos Pueblos Chargers in the first round and took a 2-0 first-quarter lead, but that lead would wither away in their 13-5 loss. The Chargers figured out how to keep El Segundo's top-scoring threat, Emmie Ramirez, in check. Once they did that, El Segundo's game was thrown off. The Eagles' usual crisp passing and transition game came apart.

Ramirez, who ended her high school career as one of the program's top scorers, finished with four goals, an assist, and two steals. She was hampered by an early season injury that kept her sidelined for the first seven games, but she still scored 121 goals this season.

Standout goalie Kendall Donahue had a stellar season, including the game against Dos Pueblos. The junior turned back nine shot attempts, including two penalty shots; for the year, Donahue had 207 blocks.

Girls' Soccer Downed in Playoffs

The Eagle's season ended in the first round of the CIF-SS Division 2 playoffs with a hard-fought 1-0 loss to fourth-seeded Woodbridge (Irvine). The Eagles displayed a tremendous defensive effort, allowing the Warriors just three shots on goal. Offensively, El Segundo could not penetrate too often and was shut down by an aggressive Warriors team.

First-year head coach Rob Duffy was proud of how his team played all season long with the transition of a new coach and the adversity of injuries hampering the team. They'll return plenty of talented players next season to take the program to another level.

off work early in the morning, maybe catch a few winks of sleep, and then get himself to school.

Did I mention his work ethic? Jaime's diligence is all the more admirable because it is expressed without any frustration, and without any complaint. A Police Chief should set a good example so he clearly foots the bill.

Jaime felt very fortunate to have some special assignments early on, which included being part of a travel task force working with US Customs to track money launderers. He traveled to many parts of the country. Then, over time, over the years, he will become a Detective, be promoted to Sergeant, and eventually to Lieutenant. Not surprisingly, he became El Segundo's Chief of Police.

The El Segundo Police Department is authorized to have 72 employees, but presently is at 64. Thus, the Department is a little short-staffed. Thankfully, recruitment is picking up, but we went through a tough time during which contentiousness about the role of law enforcement impacted the number of people willing to apply for available openings.

Still, Jaime Bermudez says: "I look back over the 30-plus years... It feels more like five years. I think about walking these hallways as a police cadet. I vividly remember that time. Then, years later, when I was appointed Chief, what a sense of pride and humility. I get to work with these incredible men and women who are doing the same thing I was doing as I grew up. Some of the kids coming in look like my sons. We more seasoned officers remain mentors and guidance counselors in

some instances, and at times, we are brothers and sisters to each other. What has been very helpful to me is something that I so often try to do for others – mentoring – those who help others, who helped me to learn, to grow, and to get to where I am today. I would not be here without the hand and support they provided."

I finally asked Jaime what he has focused on as El Segundo's Police Chief. "Whether you are a cadet, a janitor, a captain, or myself, the Chief, there are four focuses: service, professionalism, mission, and ownership. I have sought to ensure that the El Segundo Police Department maintains its very high level of service and insist that all personnel (which includes me) show the highest level of professionalism, both internally and in the community. Our mission remains to provide a safe environment and treat everyone with dignity and respect.

Finally, then, is ownership of the job. The days when something happened, and you might say, 'But that is not part of my job,' are unacceptable now. You own your job, and you have to handle it!

Jaime Bermudez retires in April and is going to be sorely missed. But there is no doubt he is just gearing up for the next phase. Blame it on his hero, perhaps; blame it on his dad. Jaime's DNA leaves him with no real choice. Retired? Well, I would say, "Not really." Instead, I would say Jaime will be working to set an example and to make things better, whatever he next chooses to do.

Positivity is contagious. Having sat with Jaime Bermudez, I hope to catch it every day! •
