## Council Approves Consultant for Richmond Street Design

During its Tuesday night meeting, the El Segundo City Council took the next step in moving forward with the long-awaited Richmond Street rehabilitation project by approving a design services contract of up to \$180,000 with AndersonPenna Partners, Inc. The firm will conduct outreach and develop plans and specifications for the eventual construction work slated for early 2016.

A review panel, including two City staff members as well Mayor Pro Tem Carl Jacobson and Dave Atkinson, unanimously chose AndersonPenna as the “hands down number one selection” after receiving bids from six consultants and interviewing the top three candidates. Jacobson noted that the firm “stood out” in its preparation. “They came out with parking ideas better than what we have now,” he said. AndersonPenna also came in with the lowest bid of the three finalists and will dedicate an estimated 1,500 man hours to the project.

In addition to conducting detailed traffic and civil engineering work, AndersonPenna will also bring in a sub-consultant to conduct comprehensive outreach in order to receive community output on the final design, as well as a parking specialist to consider the proper space angles and widths without sacrificing safety. Senior Project Manager Matt Stepien thought that the existing pavement can be salvaged during the construction and save the City money. Last summer, the Council allocated \$735,000 to the capital improvements budget for Richmond Street. The rehabilitation, covering the 100 through

300 blocks, will include construction of new sidewalks, curbs and gutters as well as the removal of the ficus trees. Atkinson added that AndersonPenna also provided scenarios to put new trees back in without damaging the sidewalks or losing parking.

Also on Tuesday, Mayor Suzanne Fuentes announced five new appointees for the Economic Development Advisory Council (EDAC) as part of the goal to have committee representation covering the various business sectors. The list of selected members includes Gary Horwitz (corporate real estate), Neal Perkey (property management), Lily Craig (Chevron), Jeffrey Lesker (hotel

management), and Alex Abad (real estate). Fuentes described the individuals as “titans of business.”

As part of the consent agenda, the Council approved plans and specifications so staff can request construction bids for a slurry seal project for areas of town west of Sheldon Street and north of Mariposa Avenue. The \$400,000 price tag will be subsidized with gas tax and Measure R monies so as not to come out of the City’s general fund. The slurry seal work occurs on a seven-year cycle covering each of the community’s five quadrants. The northeast residential section

# Obituaries

## William Thomas Mason II

William Thomas Mason II (Bill) closed his twinkling blue eyes for the last time on Wednesday, March 11th, 2015 at his daughter's home in Phippsburg, Maine. He was 89 years young. One of his favorite sayings was "I'm a Tar Heel born, a Tar Heel bred, and when I die, I'll be a Tar Heel dead!" He adored his birthplace and childhood home, Asheville, NC, as he grew up on Sunset Mountain. He attended the University of North Carolina, living in Old East with a direct view of his beloved "Old Well", eventually graduating with a degree in Business Administration. In 1943, Bill joined the US Navy and was in Midshipmen School at Columbia University when he was accepted to be part of a new, elite unit known as the Frogmen (UDT #22), even though he didn't even know how to swim. During his Navy years, he faithfully sent \$100 home from every paycheck to assist his family who were struggling from the downward spiral of the Depression.

Bill married Joyce Rodgers Mason of Charleston, South Carolina. After WWII, they resided in various locations in North Carolina including Raleigh where their son, Dr. William T. Mason III was born. In Wilson, NC, a daughter, Margaret Webb, joined the family. They moved to Jacksonville, FL where Bill worked in Human Resources for St. Regis Paper Company & they raised their children. From gathering sea anemones on the rocks to support his son's science research, to buying a horse for his daughter after 16 years of pleading, Bill supported his children in every way. He believed they should experience

the world and took them to everything from symphonies, opera and the Beatles to PGA tournaments and baseball games. In 1972, he was hired by Allied Chemical Corp. and they moved to Baton Rouge, LA and Newark, NJ (hauling the horse with them), finally transferring to Torrance, CA where Bill fell in love with his working community of El Segundo and vowed never to leave.

Through his position in Human Resources with Allied Signal/Honeywell, Bill became extremely involved with the City of El Segundo and the community of Los Angeles. He joined the El Segundo Rotary Club and found an extended family, dedicated to service as well as eradicating Polio globally. He was also instrumental in starting the El Segundo Education Foundation, raising a tremendous amount of money for the local schools. After the death of Joyce, Bill married Julia O. Abreu in 1996, a fellow Rotarian, and they immersed themselves in service through Rotary Club, attending many National and International conventions.

Bill was appointed to the "Governor's Council on Aging" in 1990's, he made sure to explain he was the "youngest member" of the committee! In 1992, 1997 and 1998, he served as President of the El Segundo



Chamber of Commerce. Bill was instrumental in helping keep the Los Angeles Air Force Base in El Segundo during the BRAC process. Bill was the Chairman of the Chamber's Military Affairs Committee for many years helping to foster relationships with the LAAFB and the community. In 1992, Bill served as Rotary Club President and chose the theme "Integrity Above All". This was not only Bill's theme for the year, but an adage he lived by.

Bill is remembered by his friends and family as a man who never knew a stranger. He believed in treating everyone with the utmost respect, regardless of their age or position. He was a parent who would "consult" with his children about adult situations he would encounter at work and ask for their opinion. He was the master of creating win-win outcomes and, for that reason, was invaluable as a mediator for his company and in community disputes. His children could count on him to explore all sides of any conflict before coming to a conclusion! Bill's inherent trust and belief in people created many lasting friendships. He would inspire by his positive attitude and he was known for never hesitating to compliment good traits and qualities in people. By that, he drew out the best

in others and helped them to rise above any limit they put on themselves. He put a strong emphasis on education, work ethic, manners and social skills but, above all, - character. He admired ambition - but not at all costs. He loved having his back scratched and used to pay a nickel to his kids for every back rub. He had a keen sense of humor and loved to tease, although the straight face gave way to a grin as the years went by. His ice blue eyes and deep dimples combined with impeccable manners made him quite the charmer. Never turning down a social invitation, he was most happy when his calendar was full. He loved poetry, dancing (especially the jitterbug!) music of all genres and appreciated fine art and good wine. Some of his favorite times were visiting his son in England and traveling throughout Europe.

Bill was preceded in death by his parents, James Irving and Alema Manley, his brother - James, sister - Jean Vanderford and both of his wives, Joyce Rodgers and Julia Abreu. He is survived by both of his children, William III and Margaret and many grand and great-grandchildren who adored him. There will be a service at St. Francis Episcopal Church in Palos Verdes, CA, followed by a memorial service at the El Segundo Rotary Club (date to be announced). He will be buried along-side his family in Riverside Cemetery in Asheville, NC. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to the Rotary Club of El Segundo in Bill Mason's name. These funds will be used to create a project in El Segundo in honor of Bill. •

## Five ESHS Football Scholar-Athletes Honored

All of the honorees had achieved a minimum 3.2 GPA, are involved in their communities as volunteers and leaders, while still excelling at the highest level of football and academics. I am proud to report that five of the 56 scholar-athletes were El Segundo High School football players from this year's League Championship team!

The tuxedo-clad scholar-athletes and their families and coaches proudly gathered for a cocktail hour and a sit-down dinner banquet as the scholar-athletes were feted for their achievements, and learned that their names are provided to the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Indiana where their names can be viewed upon visiting the museum. Joey Garza (5' 10" 180 lbs) played outside linebacker for the Eagles. He was All-Ocean League and is a 4-year member of the Honor Roll and the California Scholastic Federation. He serves in the Freshmen Mentor Program, and the Wounded Warriors Hockey Association. Garza has a 4.1 overall GPA and plans to attend Occidental College majoring in Economics.

Mike Villa (5' 11" 185 lbs) played defensive end, and was All Ocean League. He serves as a volunteer at the Long Beach Aquarium and is also a Link Crew Leader; he also serves as a tutor for elementary school

students and as a volunteer for local beach clean-ups. Villa carries a 3.45 overall GPA and plans to major in Pre-Med and Biology.

Elijah (Midgee) Hale (5'8" 160 lbs) played cornerback and earned All- Ocean League, All-CIF, and played in the Lions Club All-Star Game. He serves as a volunteer at the Los Angeles Mission, and he also volunteers at the St. Robert's Homeless Shelter. Hale has a 3.3 GPA, and will be playing football next year for Ave Maria University, majoring in Global Affairs & International Business.

Lars Nootbaar (6' 2" 190 lbs) led the Eagles to the league championship as quarterback for the Eagles. He made All-Ocean League, All-CIF, All-Area and All-State; he was also the Ocean League MVP. He participates in the Support Our Troops Organization, as well as in Friendship Circle. Nootbaar has 3.2 overall GPA. He is a double-threat athlete, and will be playing baseball for the University of Southern California next year where he will major in Sociology.

The big man of the night was Miguel Wagner-Bagues (5' 8" 165 lbs). Warner-Bagues was selected at the National Football Foundation ceremony as second place among all 56 athletes for Scholar-Athlete of the Year, which earned him a \$2000 scholarship! Wagner-Bagues played running back and wide receiver for the Eagles. He was All-Area and All- Ocean League, along with being the team's Co-Offensive Player of The Year. He was also a National Merit Scholar Hispanic Recognition Scholar. He volunteers as President of the Math Club, and is also President of the school's Eagles Fight Hunger Club. celebration of the music as it is praise and acknowledgement for the musicians themselves, and how dedication and passion for their job changed the music industry forever.

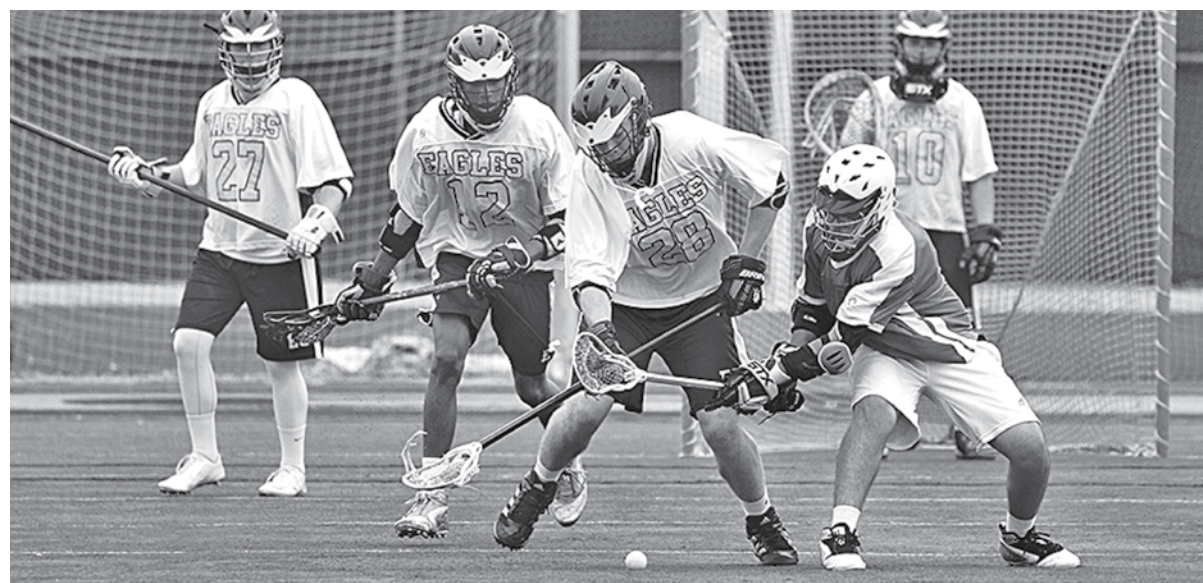

### The NBA and the ITO

It's clear that Kelly either hates former Eagles coach Andy Reid and all of his players, or simply wants to build a roster with all of his own players on it to show the world, "Look, I did it."

While it seems unfathomable that Kelly would let two more of the league's best players simply walk away from the team, it seems as though he has a plan in place that revolves around defense. The trade for McCoy got the team a young Pro Bowl asset in Kiko Alonso at linebacker. Byron Maxwell and Walter Thurmond were also brought in to beef up the leaky secondary of a year ago. Trading Nick Foles for Sam Bradford, however, is a head-scratcher any way you look at it. Bradford is lucky if he gets through two games without getting injured. To give up an efficient Foles and a second round pick for a guy who is lucky to even see the field is certainly a loss for the Eagles unless it's part of some big plan that we are all still blind to.

The addition of DeMarco Murray and Ryan Mathews last Thursday, however, gives the Eagles a three-headed monster in the backfield that together with Darren Sproles and a spread offense that the running backs love will give the Eagles one of the best backfields in all of the league. The entire Eagles team has now been made over and officially renovated. A lot of the moves are questionable, but the roster is still filled with an influx of talented players. It's hard to say if Kelly and his team are winners or losers, but they're definitely something. We'll just have to wait and find out to see if that something is good or bad come this year's regular season.

Two teams that are amongst this year's biggest offseason winners are the Indianapolis Colts and the Miami Dolphins. The Colts, who made it to last year's AFC championship game, now find themselves as early favorites to win next year's Super Bowl as the front office did everything they could to get Andrew Luck some help. The team lost its legendary wide receiver Reggie Wayne, but to be honest, he wasn't producing much at his age anyways. Additions of Frank Gore and Andre Johnson, however, will beef

up an offense that simply couldn't hang with the Patriots last year. Luck finally has his running back to spearhead an offense that will be much improved and much more powerful than it was a year ago. The Dolphins made the biggest signing of the year by snagging former Lions defensive tackle, Ndamukong Suh. Suh was the biggest name on the market this year. Revis's contract is exorbitant and like the Bills, the Jets still don't have a quarterback, but the Jets have used this year's free agency period wisely in order to improve their team all around.

The last couple of weeks in the NFL were so crazy that Jimmy Graham being traded to the Seattle Seahawks from the New Orleans Saints couldn't even make the list. Russell Wilson finally has the receiver that he has been needing and one that most likely would have won the team a Super Bowl last season. The landscape of the NFL will certainly look much different next year and the NFL draft is still to come. The regular season is far from being on the horizon, but as the biggest sport in America, football is naturally still making headlines at all times of the year. There will still be much more activity to come in the near future, but stay tuned because next season is already shaping up into what will certainly be one exciting ride. •

### The Link Between Snoring And Heart Disease



(BPT) - Snoring isn't pleasant for anyone - not the partner who has to sleep beside the snorer, nor the snorer whose breathing may pause repeatedly throughout the night. But did you know that loud, excessive snoring is often a sign of obstructive sleep apnea, a condition that - if left untreated - can cause you to be five times more likely to die from heart disease?

Along with good nutrition and regular exercise, healthy sleep is essential for a healthy heart. Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the U.S., so treating sleep apnea is good for your sleep and your heart.

According to the National Healthy Sleep Awareness Project, obstructive sleep apnea is a chronic disease that afflicts at least 25 million U.S. adults.

"Obstructive sleep apnea is destroying the health of millions of Americans, and the problem has only gotten worse over the last two decades," says Dr. Timothy Morgenthaler, president of the American Academy of Sleep Medicine and a national spokesperson for the Healthy Sleep Project. The project is a collaboration between the AASM, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Sleep Research Society and other partners.

Sleep apnea involves repetitive pauses in breathing during sleep, which can put an enormous strain on the heart. Severe sleep apnea can reduce the amount of oxygen in your blood and cause dangerous surges in your blood pressure. This stress triggers your body to respond in ways that may promote heart disease.

Sleep apnea may be far more common than you think. Between 30 percent and 40 percent of adults with high blood pressure also have sleep apnea. The rate of sleep apnea soars to 80 percent among people with high blood pressure that do not respond to treatment with medications. Research even shows that sleep apnea can affect the shape, size and performance of your heart.

"The good news is that detecting and treating sleep apnea can improve your heart health and other clinical outcomes," Morgenthaler says.

The primary treatment for obstructive sleep apnea is continuous positive airway pressure therapy. CPAP therapy keeps your airway open by providing a stream of air through a mask that you wear during sleep. Treating sleep apnea with CPAP therapy improves blood pressure control and reduces the risk of heart disease. It can even reverse the changes to the shape and size of the heart that can be caused by sleep apnea.

Excess body weight is the leading risk factor for sleep apnea, and loud snoring is a common symptom. Other warning signs for sleep apnea include choking or gasping during sleep, and daytime fatigue or sleepiness. Visit [stopsnoringpledge.org](http://stopsnoringpledge.org) to pledge to "Stop the Snore" by talking to a doctor about your risk for sleep apnea.

"Treatment of sleep apnea can be life-changing and potentially life-saving," Morgenthaler says. "For the best possible clinical outcomes, people with heart disease should discuss their risk for sleep apnea with their doctor." •

and everything east of Sepulveda will be next on the list.

Several residents expressed concern about the recent spate of crimes in El Segundo and lamented the reduction in police on the streets compared to past years (down to 58 sworn personnel from as high as 72). A major culprit mentioned was the recently passed Proposition 47, which turned former felonies for acts such as drug and firearm possession into misdemeanors and ultimately allows more criminals back on the streets. Police Chief Mitch Tavera confirmed that his department is running about 10 percent below its allotted number, mainly due to injuries on duty. He mentioned that the State Legislature is looking at possible reform to some elements of Prop 47 that would revert offenses such as firearm and date rape drug possession back to felonies. Councilmember Marie Fellhauer added that AB109 (the prison realignment bill) has also had a major impact on crime and emphasized the importance of cops on the street as a deterrent. "Government's primary responsibility is to protect the people," she said.

A resident of the 1100 block of Acacia Street reported that she and her immediate neighbors have gotten parking tickets because they have nowhere to put their cars on street cleaning days since the adjacent blocks of California and Walnut have permit parking

between 10 and 11 (instituted to deter Sepulveda employees from leaving their vehicles in residential neighborhoods). The resident pointed out that her block lacks driveways. She asked if the City could consider issuing a permit to allow those on her block to park on California or Walnut on street cleaning days. Mayor Fuentes asked staff to look into the possibility.

The Mayor agreed with the assessment of another resident who pointed out that the Wiseburn Unified School District receives significant tax revenues from east El Segundo businesses (with the new elevon development at Campus El Segundo used as an example) and should therefore contribute more to the new aquatics facility. Fuentes confirmed that Wiseburn's superintendent recently indicated that his district would indeed commit more funds to the pool project—though that school board had not gotten together on the dollar amount as yet. She also hoped to see contributions to the cause from El Segundo Unified School District and was pleased to report that corporate businesses are stepping up to the plate as well—with the ultimate goal to not use any City funds towards the new pool's construction.

The next El Segundo City Council meeting will take place on April 7 (with March 31 a dark week since it is the fifth Tuesday of the month). •

with terminal cancer. He was determined to show the world who his father was and how his group of friends influenced the music industry. Tommy Tedesco was popular among his peers, and his guitar skills were unmatched (If you've ever heard the Adam West-starring *Batman* theme song, or listened to the *M\*A\*S\*H\** or *Green Acres* themes, you've heard him play). He is probably the most famous artist you've never heard of. Tedesco, along with the rest of the musicians, were always just outside of the spotlight, but attention wasn't what they were after. Being able to play music for a living—paying the bills by playing the guitar—was all they aspired to.

These musicians were the new wave of players, and because of their anti-suit wearing attitudes and disregard for the "No smoking in the studio" rule, they were dubbed "The Wrecking Crew" by the older generation of musicians. These guys (and singular girl, Carole Kaye, who absolutely kills it on the bass) were rock n' roll professionals. A group of 20-30 players (no one is quite sure just how many members there were) made up the crew, and their fresh take on music, combined with complete professionalism and talent, made them sought after by nearly everyone in the industry.


Surf rock was extremely popular in the mid 60s with The Beach Boys at the peak of their fame. Brian Wilson, founder of the

band, was regarded by the crew as a pure genius. He brought the ideas, and the crew brought the sounds. Ironically enough, they played on a majority of the Beach Boys records, which was unknown to most everyone. That "Pet Sounds" record you have? Yep, all of those instruments were performed by The Wrecking Crew; only the vocals were by the Beach Boys. Glen Campbell, who became a solo artist years later, actually took over the main guitar spot on the record. Campbell, known today for his hits like "Gentle on My Mind" and "Wichita Lineman," originally got his start as a musician with The Wrecking Crew. And who did he call upon when it was time for him to record his first album? His friends, his "Crew."

Nearly 60 years later, after the passing of many of its members (for whom the film is dedicated to during the end credits), The Wrecking Crew is finally getting some of the recognition they undoubtedly deserve. After watching this documentary, there is no way you'll be able to listen to another Beach Boys' song, Simon & Garfunkel record, or virtually any album from the 60s and 70s without thinking of the real men (and woman) who made it possible. Denny Tedesco not only creates a vivid look at this special moment in history with The Wrecking Crew, but finally gives these hardworking, extremely talented musicians, their turn in the spotlight. •
