Council Digs in on Building Codes

The El Segundo City Council tackled several intricate agenda items Tuesday night during its regularly scheduled meeting, including the city's new master fee schedule and amendments to "streamline permitted uses and development standards in all zones and implement several cleanups, clarifying, and conforming provisions." These two topics, in particular, involved lengthy discussions by council members and city staff with input from a representative from Continental Development Corporation, which mostly wanted the city's development services director to be able to override developmental standards at their/hers/his discretion in certain categories, including wall and fencing height, temporary fencing removal, and off-street construction parking.

When asked by Mayor Drew Boyles if he had an opinion or recommendation on CDC's opposition/recommendations on the proposed codes and their language, Development Services Director Michael Allen said, "No, I mean, I'm sure I have an opinion. I appreciate the work that Tony and CDC put in. And I think there's some good suggested recommended language in terms of parameters for fence height. What I appreciate as a director is some form of consistency. And so, if we can identify some parameters that give the director discretion to enable some form of consistency and then anything above that goes to planning commission or escalates to the council. I think that's a good recommen-

dation. But, as a director, when you're asked to consider different variables for differing scenarios, it makes it difficult to maintain that consistency. Very frequently, you'll get somebody pointing at one another, saying, 'Well, they got to, why can't I?' Frequently, it's circumstantial. It's difficult to discuss the differences in those circumstances that might apply to one property that doesn't apply to another. It could deal with property crime to visibility issues to privacy issues. So, if there was an appetite to establish, at least with the fencing, some bare minimum to allow that consistency for director interpretation, then anything above that would probably be the best combination."

When asked about current processes, City staff explained, "Well, actually, the way the code is written today, fencing regulations for non-residential properties are entirely up to the director without any other review. So, when somebody comes to the counter to ask us what height fence am I allowed to have on my C2 property, we have to say, 'Let's check with the director.' And the director would kind of look at the situation and decide."

During the discussion about adding back into codes the language allowing for the director's discretion (which, in some instances, was the only language in the code currently), Boyles said, "I mean, I know, I don't know, is there language to propose that's some kind of compromise? I mean, CDC has been an incredibly responsible builder for three decades with us,

if not longer, so these sound like reasonable requests. Do you have an idea of how we could accomplish that tonight, or do we need to come back on this item?"

"I think we should come back," said Allen. "It does require a little bit of wordsmithing, and it would be good to get the council's appetite on excluding restrooms or common areas from the F-A-R, as well. And additionally, it would be helpful to get a little bit of conversation regarding the tandem parking standards."

In other news, the city council unanimously approved putting in a four-way stop sign at the intersection of Whiting Street and West Pine Avenue and heard from some four residents who wanted the intersection changed from a two-way stop to the new four-way stop. One resident spoke in opposition to the four-way stop.

Council also watched a video showcasing the city's second Girls Empowerment Camp - Girls on Fire. It brought girls out for a two-day weekend camp focusing on their abilities to become firefighters and get an actual taste of performing the duties of a firefighter. Thirty-one girls attended the camp, and ten were in council chambers Tuesday night to receive accolades and have their photos taken with council and city staff.

It was also noted that this Saturday is the El Segundo PTA Run for Education fundraiser. The event includes a 10K, 5K, and Kids Fun Run and is the largest PTA fundraiser for El Segundo. **See City Council, page 14**

Eagles Looking for Playoff Push

With the regular season schedules ending in another week or so, the El Segundo Eagles are looking for a playoff push. The boy's volleyball team secured their invite to the CIF playoffs with their win over South Torrance. The softball team's path to the playoffs is arduous, while the baseball team's chances are solid. The girl's lacrosse team is looking to improve their chances, while the boy's team could get if they win two of their final three games.

Volleyball Team Eyes League Title

The Eagles faced their most formidable Pioneer League opponent and withstood the raucous South Torrance crowd. The Eagles were extended to a five-game set for the first time all season but came away with a 17-25, 25-18, 25-17, 19-25, and 16-14 win. Each game was tight, especially the fifth game, but the Eagles prevailed.

With the win, the Eagles improved to 10-0 in the Pioneer League and 16-3 overall. They faced Torrance on Monday and Lawndale yesterday to wrap up their Pioneer League schedule. They have a real opportunity to finish undefeated since they defeated Torrance and Lawndale in straight three-game sets the first time they faced each other.

The Eagles will await their CIF Southern Section Division 3 playoff game foe when the brackets are released on Saturday.

The Eagles had a hectic week playing five games. They fell to St Joseph (Santa Maria) 4-0, defeated league opponent Da Vinci 8-1, lost to Palos Verdes 5-2, and easily defeated Fairfax and South Gate in the Village Christian tournament.

The loss to St Joseph wasn't unexpected since the Knights are one of the Central Coast's top-ranked teams. The Eagles sent Hailey Wantz to the circle to slow down the Knight's offense, and the junior did her best behind a solid defense. The Knights were held scoreless until the seventh inning, when they scored four runs on three hits and took advantage of two costly errors.

This game was also a reunion for players on each team. The six players were reunited and reminisced about their Wildcats Orange County based team. The Eagles' Allie Stevenson, Charlie Pages, and Sienna Mayer were travel team teammates with St Joseph's Seleny Chavez, Taylor Mediano, and Kaycie Gavlak.

The relatively easy win over Da Vinci included Sienna Mayer, who was 3-for-4 with four RBIs and a double short of hitting for the cycle. Jacy Lindsay started for the

and three runs scored. Val Miranda went 2-for-2, while Bella Gridley was 2-for-2, including a triple.

The Eagles continued their hot bats with an 8-1 win over South Gate. Maggie Green had a big day going 2-for-2 with three RBIs. Maiya Anderson went the distance giving up one run on two hits and striking out 12.

Baseball Team Splits with West Torrance

If the Eagles are to extend their season with a playoff berth, they'll need to finish strong in the final four games of their Pioneer League schedule. The Eagles split with the West Torrance Warriors leading up to those games. They won a wild one in eight innings, 7-6 but dropped the next 6-0.

In the first game, the Warriors took a 2-0 first-inning lead and extended it to 3-0. In the fifth inning, the Eagles put together a three-run inning to even the score. They benefited from an error, three walks, and an RBI single by Anthony Temesvary to tie the game. In the sixth inning, the Eagles scored two, highlighted by Dylan Immel's RBI single to give El Segundo a 5-3 lead. The Warriors tied the game in the seventh inning while the Eagles went quietly in their half of the seventh.

In the top of the eighth, the Warriors' Reef Sharman's RBI single gave West Torrance a 6-5 lead. In the bottom of the eighth, Mateo Heredia worked an eight-pitch walk, Immel singled, and Temesvary singled, loading the bases. With two outs, Hudson Comer's single to leftfield scored Heredia and Immel, igniting a walk-off celebration by the Eagles with their 7-6 win.

Unfortunately, the Eagles fell to the Warriors 6-0 in their next game. With the loss, the Eagles dropped to 4-4 in the Pioneer League with four games remaining. They played South Torrance yesterday and host the Spartans on Friday at 3:15 p.m. It is a crucial series for the Eagles if they are

What is being proposed? The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) invites you to review and comment on the Draft Hazardous Waste Facility Operating and Post-Closure Permit (Draft Permit) for Chevron Products Company (Chevron), El Segundo Refinery located at 324 West El Segundo Boulevard, El Segundo, California 90245 (Facility). Chevron operates several hazardous waste management units at the Facility under a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) equivalent Hazardous Waste Facility Operating and Post-Closure Permit that DTSC issued in 2007 for treatment and storage of hazardous waste generated by refinery operations, and the post closure care of the Landfarm Area closed in 1996. If approved, the Permit will authorize the Chevron to continue these same activities under the conditions of the new Permit for 10 years.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) DTSC must evaluate whether the Permit may have any significant impacts on human health and the environment. As part of this evaluation, DTSC prepared an Addendum to an adopted Negative Declaration in accordance with the requirements of CEQA Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq. and the Guidelines for Implementation of CEQA California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15164. Upon making a permit decision, DTSC will file a Notice of Determination with the Office of Planning and Research State Clearinghouse. The findings are available for public review in the information repository below.

DTSC encourages public participation in the permit decision process and invites you to review and comment on the Draft Permit. Before making a final determination on the Draft Permit, DTSC will review and respond in writing to all public comments. A Response to Comments document will be provided to all those who submitted public comments and to those who request a copy. 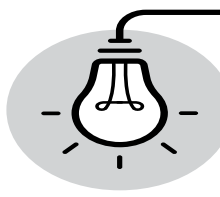

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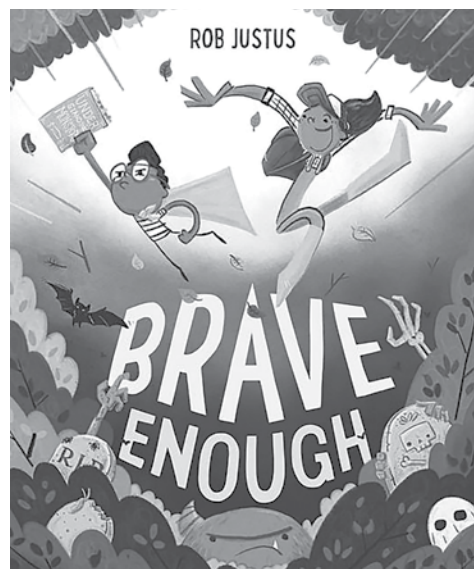

Brave Enough by Rob Justus

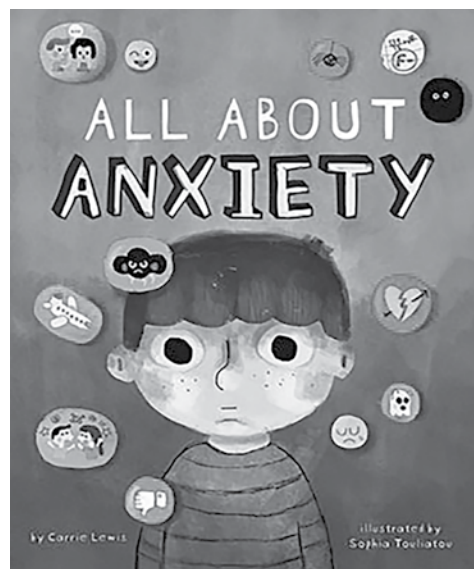

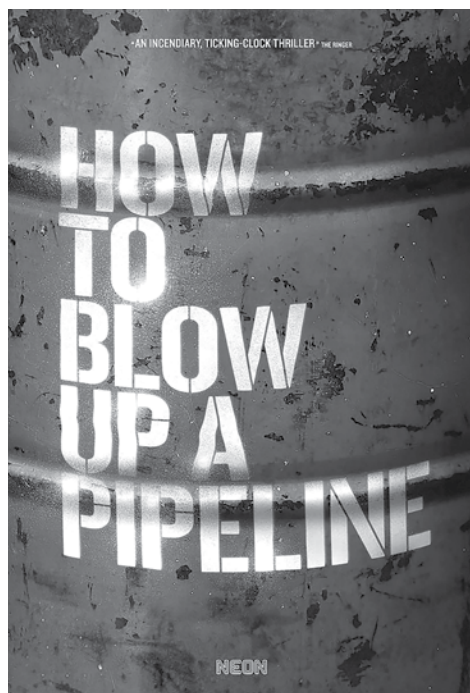

Film Review

In *How To Blow Up a Pipeline*, Eco-Activists Take On the Oil Industry

Director Daniel Goldhaber does not shy away from centering his films around controversial subject matters. His sophomore feature film, the ecological thriller *How To Blow Up a Pipeline*, thrusts a group of activists from across the country into a fight against the oil industry.

Adapted from Andreas Malm's book of the same name, it's an ambitious and worthwhile cinematic and political statement for our times.

We first meet the collective, made up of eight young men and women from various backgrounds. They have convened in West Texas, with plans of destruction already in motion. At first, the lack of context for the first 15 minutes feels insufficient and mildly confusing. However, the characters' backstories and how they all came to meet are eventually revealed.

Once we're given more information on who these people are and why they're risking their freedom and lives to make a statement, their

reasoning seems justified. Passion and anger fuel their actions, and their message, on the whole, is one worth supporting. There are enough twists in the script to make *How To Blow Up a Pipeline* an enjoyably unpredictable watch. Yet, I fear it lacks the staying power to make it a cinematic political statement of the highest degree.

The film's aesthetic is comforting in its warm and grainy look, similar to Power Ranger films of the mid-90s. The editing is also reminiscent of old-school superhero shows you'd find on TV after school. It gives the film an organic texture that feels rooted in the Earth, almost like we can feel the effects of global warming through the screen.

Composer Gavin Brivik incorporates the sounds of the enemy – oil drums and pipes – into his score by recording samples with distorted and pulsing synth sounds.

There's no doubt that this story is one worth telling. *How To Blow Up a Pipeline* is a commendable effort to bring attention to this crisis. While it may not rank among my favorite ecological thrillers (*Woman at War* and *Night Moves* to name a couple), *How To Blow Up a Pipeline's* message alone is worth the watch.

Kidney Stones: Recurring Symptoms Could Signal an Inherited Disease

(BPT) - Throughout her life, Kim had no explanation for the recurrent, painful kidney stones she experienced. Growing up she and her doctors dismissed these stones and associated pain for other conditions like menstrual cramps and irritable bowel syndrome (IBS). It wasn't until her sister Joy passed away from the same disease that Kim received answers in the form of an official diagnosis - Kim's kidney stones were the result of an inherited disease called primary hyperoxaluria type 1 (PH1).

Kidney stones are a hallmark symptom of PH1. However, many people who experience recurrent stones in adulthood or even one kidney stone as a child do not consider or investigate a root cause, which can lead to delayed diagnoses and further complications. After watching her sister's progressive PH1 symptoms, Kim is determined to ensure her sister's memory lives on by sharing PH1 education and her own disease journey. Here's some information to know about PH1, including signs and symptoms, to better understand what to look for and when to potentially suspect this rare disease.

PH1 causes an overproduction of oxalate - an unneeded waste product that cannot be broken down further - in the liver. Normally, oxalate is present only in small amounts, is not used by the body for anything and needs to be eliminated by the kidneys. The overproduction of oxalate can lead to the formation of painful and recurrent kidney stones as well as progressive damage - meaning it can get worse over time and cause permanent damage.

As a rare disease, PH1 affects approximately 1 to 3 individuals per million in the United States and Europe, with an estimated 1,300 to 2,100 diagnosed cases across geographies. In some regions, such as the Middle East and North Africa, the genetic prevalence of PH1 is estimated to be higher.

After getting diagnosed with PH1, Kim took a genealogy test that showed she is, in part, of Middle Eastern descent, giving her a higher likelihood of having PH1. Knowing this helped fuel her vigorous research to learn about disease management options, especially since she and her siblings are more likely to have PH1 due to their ancestry.

Most people with PH1 have their first symptoms as children or teens, but some

people don't have signs until they're adults. Kidney stones are the most common symptom of PH1, which may include pain in the side of the body, painful and/or bloody urination and urinary tract infections. However, not everyone with PH1 may have kidney stones. Other symptoms of PH1 include, but are not limited to, nephrocalcinosis (crystal deposits in kidney tissue), failure to thrive in babies and end-stage kidney disease (kidney failure).

Kim was not the first person in her family to experience kidney stones. In fact, this seemingly common symptom ran in her family. Her brother passed away at birth due to crystallization in his kidneys, and her sister also experienced kidney stones, among other PH1 symptoms, throughout her life. Their symptoms were undiagnosed by doctors for years until they received a formal diagnosis later in life - which unfortunately, was too late in her sister's battle with PH1.

PH1 can be diagnosed by a doctor measuring oxalate levels in the urine or blood, and/or with a genetic test. While managing PH1 is life long, there are various ways to address the symptoms. A person diagnosed with PH1 should work with their doctor or care team to create a personalized care plan, which likely would include monitoring oxalate levels and kidney function. Management options include hyperhydration (drinking a lot of water to dilute urinary calcium oxalate), dialysis (removing oxalate and other waste products from the blood) and certain supplements or oxalate-lowering medications.

For many patients, like Kim, PH1 is not diagnosed immediately. Half of people living with PH1 may be undiagnosed. Unfortunately, Kim's sister was also diagnosed later in life and, due to the delayed diagnosis, developed severe oxalosis throughout her body, including in her legs and heart before passing away.

Today, Kim is passionate about telling her story, so she was happy to be sponsored to share her story with Alyniam. She also advocates for herself and others with PH1. 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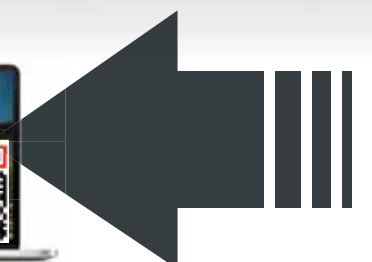
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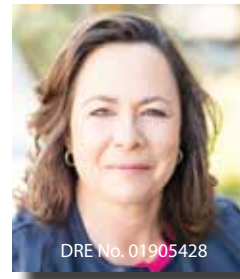


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Honey Garlic Chicken

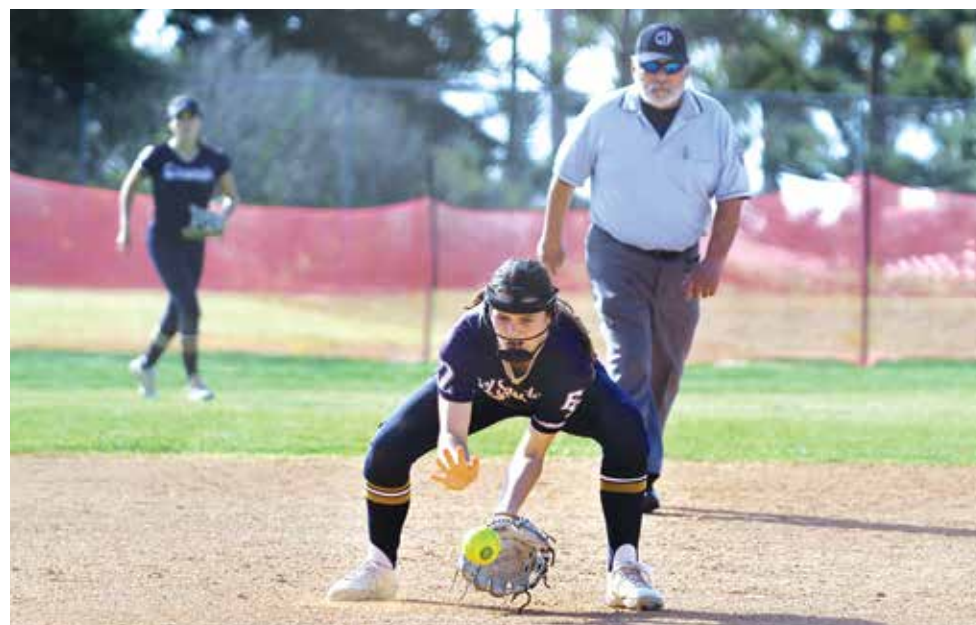

The City of El Segundo is accepting sealed bids in the City Clerk's office, 350 Main Street, El Segundo, California 90245, until 11:00 a.m. on: **TUESDAY, MAY 9, 2023** at which time they will be publicly opened. Bids will not be accepted after that time.
As described in the Bidding Documents, the bids are for a public works project ("Project") which consists of traffic control, centerline-tie surveying and tie replacement if removed, tree root dig-outs, asphalt repairs, asphalt cold milling, hot mix asphalt paving, sewer and storm drain manhole-cover adjusting, water system valve-cover adjusting, clearing and grubbing for slurry seal, crack sealing, mechanically removing striping in slurry seal areas, protecting manhole, valve covers, or concrete areas from slurry seal, slurry seal Type II resurfacing, dust control, street sweeping, thermoplastic re-striping, reinstalling pavement markings, and related work.
Work on the Project must be performed in strict conformity with Specifications No. PW 23-01 as adopted by the El Segundo City Council on April 18, 2023, which is filed with the Public Works Department. Contractors bidding the project shall provide a minimum of five government agency references, preferably municipal, for building similar projects (in terms of scope, size, type, magnitude and complexity), as the prime contractor in the past five (5) years. Bidders shall include references, etc. to demonstrate qualifications. Copies of the Plans, Specifications, Contract Documents and Engineer's estimate are available from the Engineering Division of the Public Works Department, City of El Segundo, 350 Main Street, El Segundo, California, 90245. A pre-bid meeting is scheduled for **Tuesday, May 2, 2023, at 10:00 AM**, at the Civic Center Plaza, 350 Main Street, El Segundo, CA 90245. Bidders' attendance at this meeting is **mandatory**.
Questions regarding the bid shall be submitted by **4:00 pm on Wednesday, May 3, 2023** to <https://www.elsegundo.org/government/departments/public-works/request-public-works-bid>.
The terms and conditions for bidding on the Project are described in the attached Bidding Instructions.
This project requires payment of State prevailing rates of wages for Los Angeles County. The contractor must post copies of the prevailing schedule at each job site. Copies of these rates of wages are available from the State of California Department of Industrial Relations Prevailing Wage Unit, Telephone No. (415) 703-4774. The website for this agency is currently located at www.dir.ca.gov.
Note that the Project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by California Department of Industrial Relations. Pursuant to California law, the City must find bids failing to comply with all applicable Labor Code requirements including, without limitation, Labor Code §§ 1725.5 and 1771.4 to be nonresponsive.
The contractor to whom the contract is awarded must assist in locating, qualifying, hiring and increasing the skills of minority group employees and applicants for employment, as set forth in Executive Order 11246 and 11375.
Any contract entered into pursuant to this notice will incorporate the provisions of the State Labor Code. Compliance with the prevailing rates of wages and apprenticeship employment standards established by the State Director of Industrial Relations will be required. Affirmative action to ensure against discrimination in employment practices on the basis of race, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, or religion will also be required.

The City of El Segundo hereby affirmatively ensures that minority business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this notice and will not be discriminated against on the basis of race, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, or religion in any consideration leading to the award of contract.
Prevailing Wage: Federal Labor Standards Provisions, including prevailing wage requirements of the Davis-Bacon and Related Acts will be enforced. In the event of a conflict between Federal and State wage rates, the higher of the two will prevail.
The Contractor's duty to pay State prevailing wages can be found under Labor Code Section 1770 et. Seq. and Labor Code Sections 1775 and 1777.7 outline the penalties for failure to pay prevailing wages and employ apprentices including forfeitures and debarment.
Five percent (5%) will be deducted from each progress payment and retained by the City. The remainder less the amount of all previous payments will be paid to the Contractor. Pursuant to Public Contracts Code ("PCC") § 22300, the Contractor may substitute securities for retention monies held by the City or request that the City place such monies into an escrow account. The Contractor is notified, pursuant to PCC § 22300, any such election will be at Contractor's own expense and will include costs incurred by the City to accommodate the Contractor's request.
In entering into a Public Works contract, or a subcontract, to supply goods, services, or materials pursuant to a public works contract, the **Contractor, or Sub-Contractor**, offers and agrees to assign to the awarding body all rights, title and interest in, and to, all causes of action it may have under Section 4 of the Clayton Act (15 U.S.C. Section 15) or under the Cartwright Act (Chapter 2 [commencing with Section 16700] of Part 2 of Division 7 of the Business and Professions Code), arising from purchases of goods, services, or

materials pursuant to the public works contract or the subcontract. This assignment shall be made and become effective at the time the awarding body tenders final payment to the **Contractor**, without further acknowledgment by the parties.
Bids must be prepared on the approved Proposal forms in conformance with the Instructions to Bidders and submitted to the City Clerk, 350 Main Street, City of El Segundo, in a sealed envelope plainly marked on the outside: **"SEALED BIDS FOR PROJECT NO.: PW 23-01 FY 22/23 PAVEMENT REHABILITATION PROJECT IN THE CITY OF EL SEGUNDO DO NOT OPEN WITH REGULAR MAIL"**
The bid must be accompanied by a bid bond, made payable to the City of El Segundo for an amount no less than **ten percent (10%)** of the amount bid for the base contract.
No bid will be accepted from a **Contractor** who has not been licensed in accordance with the provisions of the State Business and Professions Code. For these projects, those acceptable classes of license shall be **"A"** or **"C-12"**. The successful **Contractor** and his **Sub-Contractors** will be required to possess the correct license for their project classifications, and valid City Business Licenses from the City of El Segundo.
The City of El Segundo reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any irregularity, and to take all bids under advisement for a period of **ninety (90) calendar days**.
Any contract entered into pursuant to this notice shall become effective or enforceable against the City of El Segundo only when the formal written contract has been duly executed by the appropriate officer(s) of the City of El Segundo.
