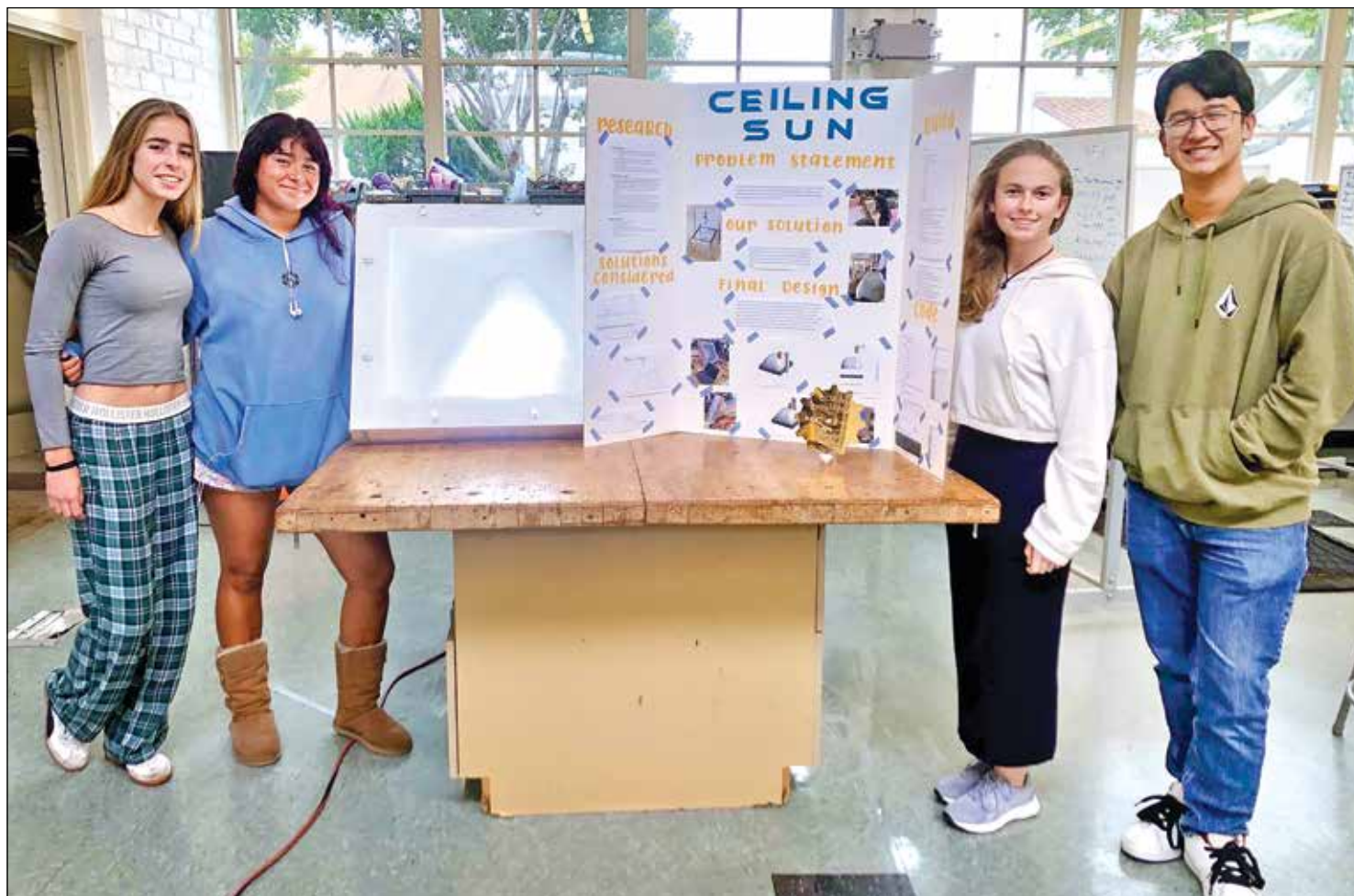

El Segundo's Poet Laureate Continues to Get the Words Out

"My master plan is to create more poets in the world," said Hope Anita Smith, who has served as El Segundo's inaugural poet laureate since the end of 2021. So far, so good. Local poetry is on the rise between her weekly workshops at the public library and various community events. A position initiated through the City of El Segundo Cultural Development Program, the role of the poet laureate, in short, is to serve as "a liaison, advocate and leader for poetry, spoken word and literary works." The ultimate goal is to inspire an appreciation, if not a love, for poetry in the community through workshops, public readings and civic events.

Smith—an acclaimed poet, author, illustrator and motivational speaker—first heard about the program from an El Segundo resident friend and decided to apply for the position. She noted that one need not be published or live in town to be eligible for consideration. "The main thing you really need is a passion for the craft of poetry," she emphasized. "I love poetry—that was number one. So, I put my dossier together, and the ball started rolling." As it happened, Smith's resume also featured a wealth of poetry publishing experience that probably didn't hurt her cause. Born and raised in Akron, OH, Smith became an avid reader at the tender age of four and discovered poetry at eight. It was love at first sight, and it became an obsession from that point forward. "When you learn how beautiful and powerful poetry is, it's easy to become smitten by it," she said. Her heroes of the genre include Maya Angelou,

Lucille Clifton, Billy Collins (who was Poet Laureate of the United States from 2001-03), Stephen Dunn, Nikki Giovanni and Edna St. Vincent Millay.

Among Smith's career accolades, she garnered the Coretta Scott King Honor, American Library Association Notable Children's Book Award, and School Library Journal Best Books of the Year. She is currently making revisions for her next book and also works in the entertainment industry. Through it all, teaching poetry and making it accessible to the masses provides endless fulfillment.

Smith's passion comes to the forefront during the weekly 6:30-7:30 pm Wednesday workshops, where a dedicated core group of attendees from diverse walks of life gather to share selections they bring in from established poets as well as their own oeuvres. "You aren't required to share, but everyone does anyway," she said. "At the very beginning some people were a little reluctant, but it wasn't long before they realized that we are all in this together and this was a safe space to create and share. They have grown by leaps and bounds. This is evidenced by our self-published chapbook, *Wordmonger*. They're quite proud of it, and I'm proud of them."

The workshops started out small, but continue to grow slowly but surely. Smith noted that "several diehards show up rain or shine" and that their enthusiasm warms her heart. The interaction and creative energy have made a major impact on local resident Brian Hayes, who became a steady contributor last year. "I have

learned a great deal from Hope about poetry and, in turn, about myself," he said. "I look forward to coming to the library every week and especially appreciate the non-judgmental camaraderie amongst the participants who write and recite wonderful poems that might not otherwise be read or heard."

Smith's two-year tenure was to wrap up at the end of last year, but will now extend through August as the City considers applications for a new poet laureate. The submission deadline is May 31, and those interested may access the "call for artists" on the elsegundolibrary.org website. After August, Smith will wait for her successor to settle in to determine if the workshops will continue. Though she did plan to bow out a few months ago, her library group would have nothing of the sort. A final workshop and appreciation night took place

School Spotlight

Students Earn 1st Place in Engineering Design Challenge

Four El Segundo High School students took home first place in the 2024 Cal Poly Engineering Design Challenge. The team—made up of seniors Harper Dame, Sally Gonzalez, Bianca Hammer, and Tyler Kaizen—won the competition with their invention, Ceiling Sun. Designed to help hospitalized patients, Ceiling Sun is a domed ceiling light with an integrated software that replicates the natural progression of daylight. Different types of light shine into the patient's room depending on the time of day, simulating natural light inside their hospital rooms.

Natural lighting in hospital rooms can help alleviate stress and anxiety for patients. Ceiling Sun was designed with patients in mind, especially those with no windows or natural light in their rooms.

"We are incredibly proud of these four students for their recent first place win in the Engineering Design Challenge," said Dr. Melissa Moore, Superintendent of the

El Segundo Unified School District. "This invention not only showcases students' technical and engineering skills, but also demonstrates their compassion and empathy for those in need. We are extremely impressed with their abilities and with their invention's potential to positively impact lives."

The team initially created Ceiling Sun as its capstone project for the school's Engineering Design and Development (EDD) course, the culmination of a four-year engineering pathway. During their senior year, engineering students dedicate themselves to completing a capstone project that involves identifying an issue and then researching, designing and testing a solution, ultimately presenting their solution to a panel of engineers.

Teen Book Review of *Darth Plagueis* by James Luceno

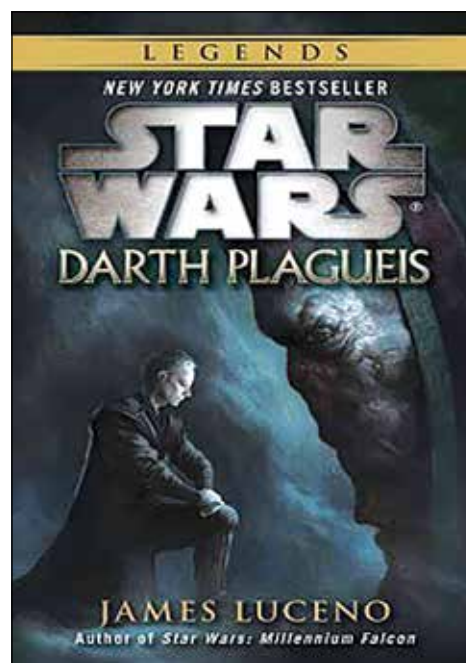

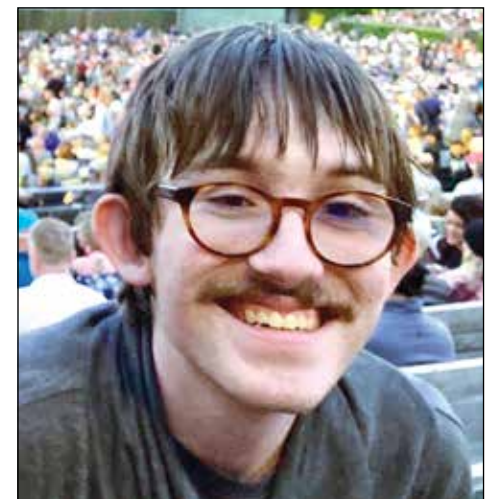
If you answered yes to any of these questions, then I recommend you delve into the shadowy world of the Sith in James Luceno's 379-page book titled, "Darth Plagueis." This captivating novel explores the rise to power of Darth Plagueis, the cunning Sith Lord who trained Emperor Palpatine. Who is

Palpatine you ask? Well, Emperor Palpatine cloned himself and ruled the galaxy during George Lucas's three films *A New Hope*, *Empire Strikes Back* and *Return of the Jedi*.

Everything We Saw At This Year's TCM Classic Film Festival

The 15th Annual TCM Classic Film Festival took place this month and my sister Morgan and I were there to savor every minute of it. Running April 18-21 in the heart of Hollywood mainly at the TCL Chinese Theater and newly remodeled Egyptian Theater, the festival once again brought thousands of cinephiles and Turner Classic Movie fans from all over the world to enjoy films of all kinds: from black-and-white to modern classics and everything in-between. Beyond watching classic films on the big screen, TCM Classic Film Fest is a premiere event for bringing out stars to celebrate their films, including this year's reunion of the cast of *Pulp Fiction* for the opening night film. Over three days, Morgan and I saw seven

Steven Spielberg Recounted *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*

The first film I saw that Friday afternoon, 1977's *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*, was among the weekend's top highlights. While I was excited to see it on the big screen (I'd seen it before), the real draw was the conversation that preceded it, held by TCM's Ben Mankiewicz and the film's writer and director, the legendary Steven Spielberg. After a rousing standing ovation, Spielberg recounted memories of his third feature film (which famously followed the seminal blockbuster that changed Hollywood

Seniors Have Their Day

There comes a day when some high school athletes complete their athletic journey. Throughout their four years in high school, these young athletes have dedicated their time and made sacrifices to play their favorite sport or, in some cases, multiple sports.

While their commitment is obviously valued by the programs they participate in it takes more than that. It also takes a strong support system at home where mothers and fathers as well as brothers and sisters become their biggest fans.

Towards the end of each sports season, it has become a tradition to honor their seniors and family members on a Senior Appreciation Day. The softball and baseball teams held their celebration to recognize their seniors before their last regular season games.

Baseball Team Sweeps Lawndale

The Eagles finished out their regular season with a pair of lopsided 15-0 and 16-1 wins to finish (9-3) finishing third in the Pioneer League. In the first game, the Eagles were held scoreless for the first three innings, but the bats erupted in the fourth inning.

The Eagles scored five runs on three hits and benefitted with two hit batters and a walk. Sophomore third baseman Logan Brooks drilled a two-run double to center field. Reed Abrams came up with a two-run single to make it 4-0, and Ethan Ayler's sacrifice fly made it 5-0. In the fifth inning, the Eagles sent nine batters to the plate and scored four more. With the score 10-0 in the sixth inning, El Segundo put up five more runs to finish off a 15-0 win.

Seniors Have Their Moment Before Last Game

Prior to finishing their final regular season game against Lawndale the El Segundo High School baseball program honored its ten seniors and their families. Will DeBlanc, Carson Brooks, Louis Church, Mateo Heredia, Anthony Temesvary, Hudson Comer, Dylan Alcala, Mays Borgmeyer, James Baldino and Dylan Garcia were recognized along with their number one fans - their parents and brothers and sisters.

Senior starter Dylan Alcala made the most of his final start before the playoffs. He tossed five innings, giving up just two hits while

striking out six. Alcala picked up his seventh win of the season and lowered his ERA to 2.40. He gave way to another senior, Dylan Garcia. The hard-throwing Garcia made the Lawndale hitters look weak by not allowing a ball to hit out of the infield. In the two innings, he faced seven batters, striking out four of them.

The Eagles continued their offensive outburst by pounding out 15 hits and scoring a season-high 16 runs. After a scoreless first inning, El Segundo scored two runs each in the second, third, and fourth innings. The third-inning scoring was highlighted by UC Irvine baseball commit Hudson Comer's team-leading sixth homerun of the season.

In the fifth inning, the Eagles had six more runs, highlighted by a sacrifice fly by Chase Mattoon, an RBI single by Lincoln Quaintance, an RBI single by Mateo Heredia, and a ground ball fielder's choice by James Baldino. In the sixth inning, four consecutive pinch hitters singled, including Austin Hohman, Ben Lee, Kyle Whalen, and Ethan Ayler. Then, for good measure, senior pinch hitter Sam Forthuber had a sacrifice fly to deep left field. Later in the inning, Heredia's RBI single made it 16-1.

It was a great way for the seniors to end their final regular-season game. Each of them either had at least one hit or scored a run and a memory that will last for years.

The Eagles travel to play Long Beach Wilson, the number two team from the Moore League, on Friday at 3:15 p.m. The winner advances to the second round next Tuesday.

Softball Team Finishes Strong

The Eagles needed a sweep of the Torrance Tartars and Lawndale Cardinals to guarantee a spot in the CIF Southern Section Division 3 playoffs. With El Segundo and Torrance tied for third place in the Pioneer League, the winner of this game would have an inside track for a playoff spot.

The first time these two teams met, it took nine innings to settle the game. After Allie Stevenson hit her second home run of the season to give her team a 1-0 lead, the Tartars countered with two unearned runs with two outs to win the game.

The Eagles weren't seeking revenge but rather playing with a mission. Head coach

Rob Croxall says revenge never entered the team's mind. "We didn't get the timely hit the first time we played Torrance. The team knows what's at stake, so we'll be focused." The Eagles played brilliantly and got the timely hitting in their 5-1 win.

Trailing 1-0 in the fourth inning, Allie Stevenson singled and scored on Hailey Wantz's RBI single. Then, with the bases loaded, freshman catcher Sullivan McLaughlin laced a bases-clearing double to centerfield to make it 4-1. In the sixth inning, McLaughlin drew a walk and scored on Taryn Walker's RBI double to give the Eagles a 5-1 advantage.

El Segundo starter Maiya Anderson tossed a complete game and held the Tartars

to one run on three hits while striking out six. The Eagles got their much-needed win thanks to timely hitting and a stellar pitching performance.

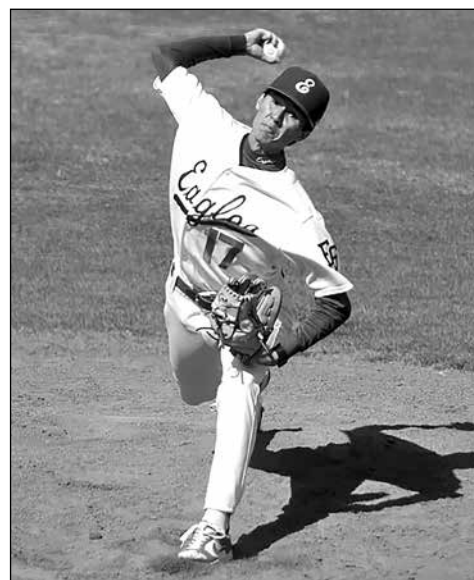
Before defeating Lawndale the softball program honored and celebrated its five seniors along with their families. Maiya Anderson, Lauren Ray, Audrey Garcia, Hailey Wantz and Chloe Crabtree and their families were saluted and feted during a pre-game ceremony.

Each of the seniors had a big day in the lopsided win over the Cardinals. Maiya Anderson was 2-for-4 and scored twice, and Lauren Ray had two doubles and a single. Audrey Garcia was 3-for-3 with an RBI

earlier in the year, but the regulars implored her to stay on, and so she did.

Since arriving in town, Smith has overseen several noteworthy events, including a father/kids open mic program with the El Segundo Fire Department. "It was a huge success," she reported. The kids read a poem about their dad and vice versa. They served donuts and milk, and the poets got to take a picture with the firetruck.

Last year, in celebration of Mother's Day, a mom/daughter tea also featured a poetry exchange that resulted in a dry eye in the house. "There were tears everywhere," Smith said. "People don't realize how powerful and moving their words are to others."

Smith also held events at El Segundo High School and Old Town Music Hall. For the latter, attendees submitted their original works for selection to participate in the poetry reading. Smith wrote a poem for the United Against Hate Rally and a piece for the Winter Festival. She additionally received a commission to compose a poem for a private business in El Segundo.

Smith is quick to promote the concept of poetry for its visual potential. Recently, local artist Natalie Strong taught the workshop attendees how to make a stitched book that can house a

single poem they wrote. "The evening was a success and hopefully we will be able to pair poetry with other disciplines," Smith said. "The possibilities really are endless."

Smith praised the City and library staff, as well as the community itself, for being accommodating from day one. "Even though I live about 35 minutes away, depending on traffic, they have made me feel welcome here as though I live here," she said. "Their kindness and support have been heartwarming."

As for her future goals, Smith has quite a lofty one in mind. "I'd like to be the Young People's Poet Laureate," she said. "I'd like to instill that love for poetry and words while they're little."

She also encouraged her workshop crew members who may be interested in applying for the El Segundo position to do so. "I also urged them to submit their poems to various publications, and they're doing it."

In a world bombarded by arguably too much wordiness, a big part of poetry's appeal is its succinctness, Smith reflected. "You can say so much in a small space. You can share a complete idea in a poem and know that you've shared a story or captured a moment. There's so much power in that..."

The film's climactic ending between humans and aliens set to a sweeping score by John Williams is a must-watch for cinephiles everywhere.
