Foundation Remembers First Responders

It is December 26, 1993, at approximately 11:05 p.m. A Manhattan Beach police officer assigned to traffic pulls over a vehicle he most likely suspects is a driver under the influence of alcohol. Officer Martin Ganz will pay the ultimate sacrifice when he loses his life to that driver he pulls over after the driver guns Officer Ganz down.

Six weeks later, on February 14, 1994, the Palos Verdes Estates Police Department is conducting a department meeting, and 13 police officers and city employees are gathered in a conference room. A gunman bursts through the door of the 12th-floor conference room at the Holiday Inn (now the Doubletree), opening fire and killing Capt. Mike Tracy and Sgt. Vernon Thomas Vanderpool in a botched robbery attempt.

These three brave heroes' deaths led to the creation of the South Bay Police and Fire Memorial Foundation ("Foundation"), an organization that has assisted the families of numerous police officers and firefighters since its inception in 1994.

The South Bay Police and Fire Memorial Foundation was the vision of South Bay Police Chiefs, Fire Chiefs, and community members. The founding core included El Segundo Police Chief Tim Grimmond, Chief Mel Nichols (Redondo Beach PD), Chief Joe De Ladurantey (Torrance PD), Stefan Wolowicz (CPA), Chip Schulz (Businessman), and Mike Lynn (Daily Breeze Editor). Together they did their due diligence in starting a foundation that would assist first responders and their families with financial support.

The idea was the Foundation's dedication to fallen or disabled police officers and fire personnel would also be extended to their family members. It was sorely needed since, historically, the Police and Fire Departments of the nine South Bay cities the Foundation represents had supported fallen or injured first responders through private fundraisers and the Robert Mutch Fund.

Chief Grimmond essentially said, "Those methods (fundraisers and the Robert Mutch Fund) worked and served our officers in a meaningful way. But, the tragic and untimely on-duty shooting deaths of Officer Ganz,

Captain Mike Tracy, and Sgt. Vernon Thomas Vanderpool was a clear indication that the type of financial support was not sufficient to aid multiple families in need of assistance."

Chip Schulz remembers getting together with the others. "We came together with an idea of supporting our police officers and fire with financial aid when they needed it. In fact, the first contribution, which was to support another organization's failed golf tournament, actually went to supporting the first South Bay Police/Fire Memorial Foundation's golf tournament. And from there, it

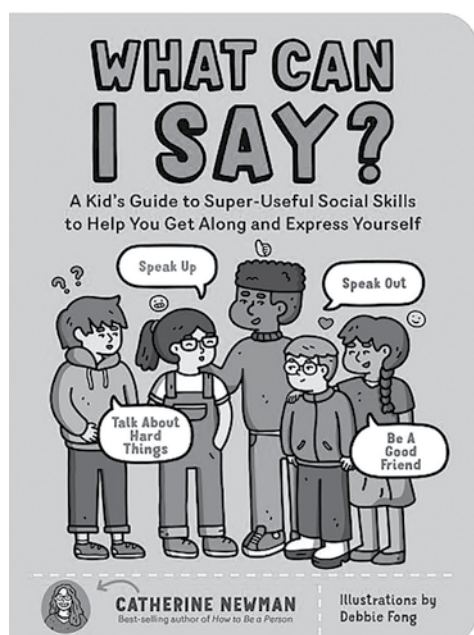

Film Review

Theater Camp Is A Delightfully Entertaining Musical Mockumentary

The world of musical theater is full of such laughably pretentious pomp and over-the-top circumstances that it makes itself quite an easy target to parody. Who would be better to satirize this insular and absurd world than theater kids themselves?

Turning their 2020 short film of the same name into a feature-length film, Ben Platt and Molly Gordon star as insufferably artsy camp counselors overseeing the production of an original musical in the new comedy, *Theater Camp*. Directed by Gordon and Nick Lieberman, *Theater Camp* uses the mockumentary format to satirize the world of theater and its extremely passionate performers.

It's the start of another summer, and eager young campers and budding Broadway hopefuls merrily sing show tunes as they bus it to upstate New York, en route to their beloved haven for thespians: the "AdirondACTS" theater camp. This year, however, will be different: the camp's idolized leader, Joan Rubinsky (Amy Sedaris), has fallen into a coma (which the film sets up as a humorous plot point). Taking over is her "crypto-bro" son, Troy (Jimmy Tatro), who must keep the musical theater paradise of which he knows nothing about running. With his bro vibes, he soon learns that the camp is in a dire financial situation. With no experi-

ence and fewer brain cells, it's up to him to secretly find a way to keep the camp afloat.

Meanwhile, head counselors Amos Klobuchar (Ben Platt) and Rebecca-Diane (Molly Gordon) are tasked with writing and directing an original musical theater production (one that will be a life's tribute to their unconscious icon). What follows is a series of sketches, skits, and bits that poke fun at the entire process of putting on a show. Auditioning, songwriting, acting exercises, stunt training, rehearsal, and finally, the opening night performance is not spared from spoofing.

Written by Gordon, Lieberman, and Noah Galvin (Platt's real-life partner), *Theater Camp*, is a light, silly, altogether enjoyable watch that will surely delight theater kid obsessives (but might not connect with those who aren't as invested in the inner world). The mockumentary nature allows for a loose and (likely) highly improvised nature. Platt, Gordon, and Galvin (who plays a stage manager yearning for the spotlight) create an easy chemistry together. However, after a little while, the tone of the humor does become a little one-note. When every character modulates at the same level of sarcasm, it can start to feel a bit excessive.

I didn't have overwhelmingly high expectations going in, and *Theater Camp* exceeded those, being much funnier than I thought it would be. The film is produced by Gloria Sanchez Productions, the sister label production company of Will Ferrell and Adam McKay's Gary Sanchez Productions, with a focus on female voices in comedy.

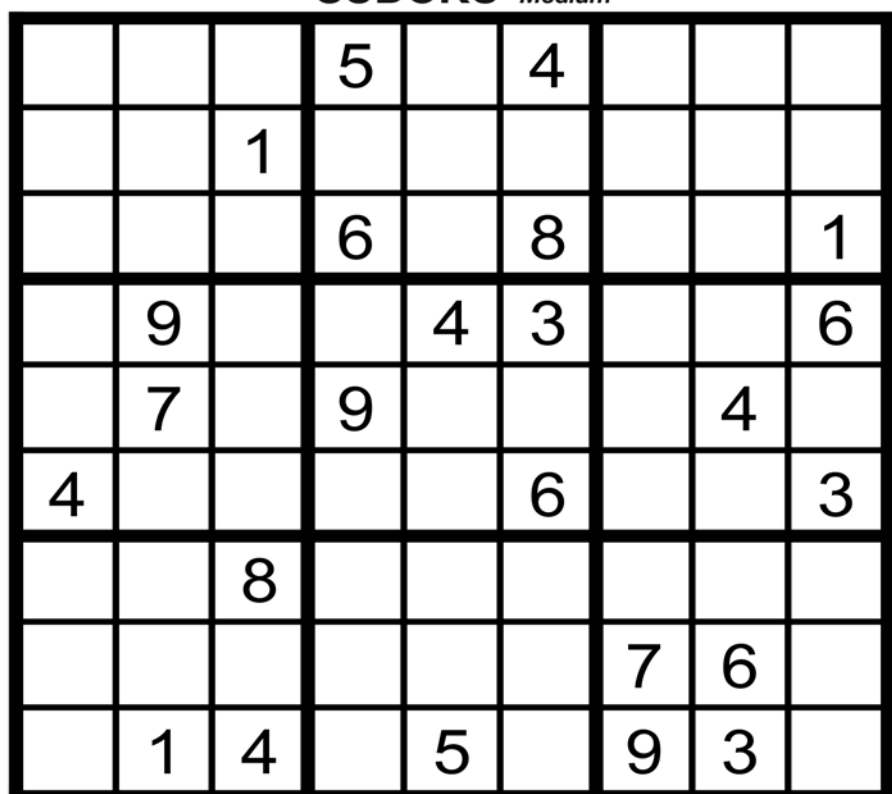

helped set the wheels in motion.”

So the five founding members created the South Bay Police/Fire Memorial Foundation in 1994 after a laborious and lengthy deliberation. The Foundation would form a committee consisting of an Executive Board that included a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Director of Operations, Director of Fund Development, Director of Benefits, Director of Investments, Director of Financial Oversight, and Directors at Large. The Executive Board, which is comprised of police officers, fire personnel, and community leaders, all volunteer their time to run the Foundation.

The Foundation provides financial support for many unexpected needs that arise, including medical expenses, funeral expenses, counseling, scholarships, and career guidance. A committee selected from the Executive Board determines the distribution of funds within the guidelines and bylaws of the Foundation.

Early on, it was clear the Foundation's vision to fund it was to host community fundraisers. Funds raised would create a solid financial base for first responders and their families who are part of the South Bay Police/Fire Memorial Foundation. The Foundation is supported and funded by private and corporate donations, and no public funds are used. Over the past 29 years, fundraising events have included a Motorcycle Poker Ride, the popular Bachelor Auction, the Comedy Club's 9-11 Tribute, and a Golf Tournament.

The Motorcycle Poker Ride was a ride through the South Bay where riders would collect poker playing cards at different stops.

Once the riders collected their poker hands, they would collectively gather at a site for fun and additional ways to donate to the Foundation.

The Bachelor Auction was a sold-out event held at the former Radisson Hotel on Rosecrans Avenue in Manhattan Beach. The Foundation

was able to get James Blackman, the CEO of the South Bay Civic Light Opera, to be the auctioneer. The auction featured single police officers and fire personnel dancing on a runway stage, getting bid on by a room full of party-going women. The winners would be paired up with their winning bid and sent

out on a date; there were two that ended up in successful marriages.

The Comedy and Magic Club in Hermosa Beach has been the site of the 9-11 Comedy Night. The event has featured some of the funniest acts around.

The golf tournament has been around as

The South Bay Police/Fire Memorial Foundation is now responsible for hosting the South Bay Medal of Valor Awards luncheon. The luncheon honors police officers and fire personnel for their heroic acts. It isn't an event the Foundation sees as a fundraising event but rather as continuing its 47-year history in honoring and recognizing first responders.

Over the past 29 years, the Foundation has supported over fifty families of first responders who have benefitted from the Foundation. El Segundo Police Department's Lt. Aaron Corkins lost his wife to cancer and was supported by the South Bay Police/Fire Memorial Foundation. He immediately became a single father to two young boys. The South Bay Police/Fire Memorial Foundation provided financial assistance, which helped the young officer tremendously. Lt. Corkins eventually joined the Foundation and is now the Director of Benefits. When asked why he chose to volunteer for this organization, Corkins said, "It was because of the generosity the foundation showed him during his time of need, and he wanted to pay it forward by helping other police officers and firefighters who face these same challenges."
