Two El Segundo Residents Tackle the Cause of the El Segundo Blue Butterfly

Two El Segundo residents are on a quest to see the El Segundo Blue Butterfly flourish. And they're off to a good start, with a key donation from the Chevron El Segundo Refinery creating the opportunity for Monica Davis and Barbara Boland (who call themselves the El Segundo Blue Butterfly Conservancy) to be able to finance the purchase of the only plant the El Segundo Blue uses for its entire lifecycle—Seacliff Buckwheat (*Eriogonum parvifolium*). Sustaining and growing the ES Blue population is a passion for the duo, who are keenly aware that the ES Blue has been on the Federal government's endangered species list since 1976.

For Davis and Boland, whose ES Blue vision would position Seacliff Buckwheat growing alongside other key California native plants wherever possible in El Segundo, the donation comes at the beginning of what they hope will be a significant community undertaking to create and plant the native coastal habitat the ES Blue needs. Fortunately for the ES Blue, Davis and Boland are willing to take small steps to educate and bring awareness to its plight.

And they're extremely grateful for the assistance and community support they've received so far, including the connections they've made with Ann Dalkey, a retired marine biologist, and former science director at the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy, which has and is working on creating habitat for both the ES Blue and Palos Verdes Blue Butterfly to thrive in, as well as El Segundo Mayor Drew Boyles and El Segundo Environmental Committee

member Tracey Miller-Zarneke, who accepted the duo's offer to separately tour the Seacliff Buckwheat habitat adjacent the Dockweiler Youth Center and its bluff-top parking lot at Dockweiler State Park/Beach to see the ES Blue flitting about on Seacliff Buckwheat.

More recently and just this month, Davis and Boland have given three tours to locals interested in seeing these tiny miracles during their short-lived adult butterfly stage of about four days in the hopes people will understand how unique the ES Blue is and will want to join the efforts to bring more of its population to El Segundo. (Several

longtime El Segundo residents who took the tour had never seen the ES Blue and were thrilled to see it and learn more about it.)

Notably, just last week at the El Segundo Middle School's ribbon cutting ceremony for its new gym on July 11, Davis was happy to see all of the newly planted small Seacliff Buckwheat plants adjacent a paved pathway near the basketball courts and homes in about a 20-foot by 100-yard-long area and thanks the school district for this contribution toward saving the ES Blue. Davis notes that Seacliff Buckwheat takes some three years to

He was an active member of First Lutheran Church, Manhattan Beach, where he was baptized, confirmed, and attended Circle of Love Preschool.

Luke went to Center Street Elementary School, El Segundo Middle School, and graduated from El Segundo High School on June 9, 2023. He was an exceptional student who excelled academically while taking multiple honors and AP classes in multiple subjects. He completed the engineering pathway at ESHS and had planned to study civil or environmental engineering in college.

He was a gifted athlete who enjoyed a variety of sports and activities. He dabbled in baseball and played many years of soccer. In high school, in addition to playing basketball, he began to focus on what became his favorite sport—volleyball. He played multiple years of club volleyball and greatly missed being able to play club, and again for the Eagles varsity squad, his senior year. He was up for most any other type of athletic competition or challenge.

In addition to being intelligent and athletic, Lubbi was known for his wit and sense of humor. He brought laughter and joy to any room he entered. He was a social being and enjoyed spending time with friends doing things like gaming online, Facetimeing, getting



food, bowling, participating in school activities and hanging out at the beach. He was very close to his brothers, who were two of his best friends. He lived life to its fullest, and did not get short-changed on frivolity in his time with us.

When confronted with the realities of his sickness, Lukas faced it with courage and optimism. He talked about his future with certainty and faced cancer with an incredible amount of strength. Lukas persevered through an amputation and many treatments, all while completing school work so he could graduate with his classmates.

Lukas is loved by many. His passing has left a whole in the hearts of all who knew and loved him. He won't be forgotten.

Lukas is survived by his parents, Chris and Jeff, and his brothers, William and Jake. He is also survived by grandparents, Will and Kathy Lubs; aunts and uncles, Cari and Chris Shaver, Dave and Jessi Lubs, Eric and Jenny Harms, Matt and Cindy Lubs, and Steve and Adrienne Lubs; and cousins, Elise, Peyton, Grady, Brinn, Evan, Mikaila, and Brandon. He was predeceased by his grandparents, Kurt and Sandy Harms.

All-Stars Advance to Little League State Tournament

This year's El Segundo Little League 11-12-year-old all-star team has essentially been together intact for three years. As 10s, they won the league's first Southern California state title. As 11s, they reached finished third at the state tournament. After defeating Ladera Little League in the Section 4 championship game, they have advanced to the Southern California State Little League tournament.

To get to the state tournament, El Segundo steamrolled through their District 36 tournament by outscoring their opponents 44-7. They combined to hit eight home runs in four games led by Jaxon Kalish, who clobbered four. It was such a lopsided tournament for El Segundo it gave them an incredible sense of confidence heading into the Section 4 championship tournament. The four-team tournament comprised of three other District tournament champions, including District 25 Ladera Little League, District 27 North Torrance Little League, and District 37 Del Rey Little League.

El Segundo started slowly against Ladera

Ollie Parks led the inning off with a double, Quinn Boehle singled, and Finley Green's sacrifice fly scored Parks. With two outs, Lennon Salazar sent a towering fly ball over the right field fence for a two-run home run and a 7-0 lead. Brooks doubled to left-centerfield and scored on Keldorf's RBI single. A fifth-inning rally was cut short when Parks hit into a double play.

On defense, El Segundo got great pitching from Ollie Parks. The crafty right-hander threw 4.2 innings and held Ladera's offense to one hit while striking out nine. In one stretch, Parks struck out six in a row. Jaxon Kalish came on in relief and struck out three of the five batters he faced.

Brody Brooks led the offense by going 3-for-3, including a single, double and homerun.

El Segundo, which had been so dominating, was humbled by Del Rey for the first five innings. El Segundo was held scoreless for the first time in five games. It's not that they didn't have opportunities; in fact, they had chances in the first inning and the second

but still dominated in an 8-0 win. Next up was Del Rey, which frustrated the locals to the point that El Segundo needed a sixth-inning rally to win 4-2. El Segundo faced Ladera in the championship game and shut them out 10-0.

The Section 4 opener against Ladera took El Segundo once through the lineup to shake off the rust of not playing for a week. The hiatus was the week between the District 36 tournament championship game and the start of the Section 4 tournament. Once through the lineup, El Segundo got things going offensively.

Leading 1-0 in the third inning El Segundo came up with three runs. Brody Brooks hit his second home run of the summer, this time a solo 235 foot. With two outs, Lucas Keldorf drew a walk, followed by Max Baker's two-run homerun for a 4-0 lead. In the fourth inning

inning. In the first inning, Kalish walked, and Keldorf singled, putting runners on first and third. Max Baker then hit a ground ball destined for centerfield, only to be fielded by Del Rey shortstop William Ulrich. He got to the second base bag before Keldorf and threw onto first base to get the double-play. In the second inning, Finley Green led off with a single and was bunted over to second base by Lennon Salazar. With two outs, Brooks drew a seven-pitch walk, but Del Rey got out of the inning with a strikeout.

It was an anomaly for such a high-scoring offense to be getting shut out. To add to their adversity, the lineup was striking out more. In the game against Ladera, they struck out seven times, and against Del Rey, they were

The Lioness of Boston by Emily Franklin

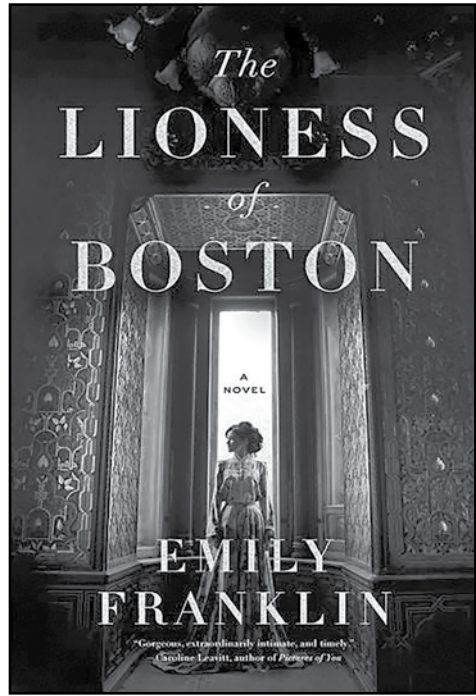
I was reading a book about artist John Singer Sargent and I learned that Isabella Stewart Gardner was his patron as well as his portrait subject. In fact, she had her own art museum in Boston! I remember looking up the museum online and being fascinated ... I really want to visit that place someday!

In *The Lioness of Boston*, author Emily Franklin uses the historical fiction genre to inhabit Isabella's mind and heart and give readers an understanding of what the mid-1800s must have been like for an intelligent

console her from the slights she suffered: she was always trying to fit in, especially with the ladies of the sewing circle (she was never invited to join.) "Mrs. Jack," as she came to be known, had friendships with many people from all walks of life. In this accounting, she had friendships with a gardener and a fountain caster at the Public Gardens (in Boston), and even a zookeeper. There's a lively scene that describes Mrs. Gardener leading a pair of leashed lions down a busy city street! Did that really happen? Isabella herself is quoted as saying, "Don't spoil a good story by telling the truth."

Isabella Stewart Gardner knew sorrow (her only son died while a toddler and her brother and sister-in-law left three young boys, which she and her husband raised) and the frustration of not being taken seriously as a person. Her relationships with artistic and literary celebrities of the time formed a foundation of self-education which extended to a passion to support artists and collect their works. Always searching for her true self she declares, "I know I've a greater use in this life. And I'll be damned if I let go until I find it." Even if this isn't a true biography, it seems like Ms. Franklin has captured the spirit of a fascinating and indomitable woman - one who succeeds wildly beyond her own hopes.

Jack was a partner in his father's East Indies trading business and his family was quite wealthy. Isabella had been raised in a distinctive household in New York City, attending private schools for girls, eventually sent to an exclusive academy in Paris.

After the wedding, Mr. and Mrs. Gardner moved to 152 Beacon Street in Boston. "Belle" chafed against society's guidelines for women. It seems that being ornaments to husbands, bearing and rearing children, running households, giving parties and always being mindful of one's "place" ... were not things to which she ascribed. Belle had a sharp intellect, a quick wit and delighted in nature, literature and art. Her husband indulged her and would

20 Days in Mariupol Offers a Look at the War in Ukraine From the Front Lines

A good documentary brings the viewer into a previously unknown world, introducing them to the subjects and situations from an unbiased point of view. At times, this intimate experience can prove to be a challenging watch, especially when human lives, including the filmmaker's, are at stake. *20 Days in Mariupol* is a brutal and sobering time capsule of the early days of Russia's invasion of Mariupol, Ukraine's Eastern port city.

Bringing this story to the world is Pulitzer Prize-winning AP journalist and Ukrainian

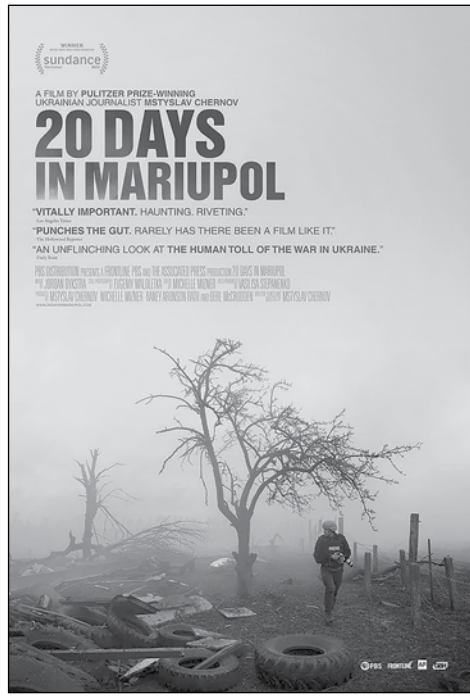
was captured by Chernov.

Throughout all of the chaos, Ukrainians are glad to have Chernov on site to show international news outlets the horrific nature of the war and Russia's consistent killing of civilians. Chernov's presence is invaluable, as he captures doctors frantically performing CPR on a four-year-old child who's clearly dying, a father weeping over his sixteen-year-old son's bloody body, his face so close that there's a transfer of blood on his forehead, and devastated doctors crying underneath their N95 masks. "This is painful to watch, but it must be painful to watch," says one Ukrainian police officer. This is the reality of life in Mariupol.

The filmmaking team could only withstand 20 days in the war-torn city before making a desperate decision to escape. It's horrifying to discover that the war continued for another 60+ days after the AP reporters' departure. What more destruction could Russian troops have possibly inflicted on this already depleted working-class town? One statistic displayed at the end of the film paints a stark picture of the community's fate - a confirmed 25,000 people perished, with the actual number believed to be much higher.

20 Days in Mariupol also signifies the resilience of the community. The doctors, first responders, military, reporters, and citizens who open up their homes to strangers, all work together to keep any semblance of optimism alive. Mstyslav Chernov and all involved in helping tell this story should be lauded for their heroism and dedication to revealing one of the most important events in history.

filmmaker Mstyslav Chernov, who is credited as the documentary's director, writer, and cinematographer. Immediately, we are transported to a ramshackle apartment building, with Russian tanks etched with the letter "Z" (signaling war) slowly encroaching into this previously quiet neighborhood. What follows is devastation of the highest degree: civilians are shot, the local hospital is under siege, and the harrowing realization that safety is fleeting.

Wearing a press badge as if it was a bulletproof vest, AP reporter Mstyslav Chernov uses a handheld camera to capture all of the events that unfold in Mariupol over the three weeks he is there. The footage he gets from being on the ground is directly sent to news outlets around the world, that is, when Russia doesn't revoke internet access and make communication with the outside world impossible. This beacon of our community’s resilience and unity could only have been realized thanks to the community’s overwhelming support. The \$92 million Measure ES Bond, passed with a resounding 63.3 percent vote in November 2018, provided the necessary funding. Construction work began in January 2022 under the direction of Telacu, the project manager, and Miller Construction, the general contractor. The project took over 60 percent of the entire campus. The gym was just one part of the grand plan, as upgrades also revitalized the field space, underground plumbing systems, electrical substation, and outdoor basketball and volleyball courts.

the environment, sustainability was woven into the very fabric of the project. The implementation of a 5,000 square-foot bioswale will minimize runoff, recharging the groundwater table. Deeply rooted in collaboration, the project was fueled by the tireless efforts and dedication of the ESUSD Facility Advisory Committee, made up of community members whose expert insights and recommendations proved invaluable. The Citizen Bond Oversight Committee provided the fiscal compass, steering bond dollars with prudence and accountability.

Baseball Legend on Fighting Non-melanoma Skin Cancer

(BPT) - Johnny Bench earned nearly every conceivable Major League Baseball accolade and accomplishment during his 17-year career with the Cincinnati Reds. His natural talent paired with his dedication to practice and play for hours every day - often in the hot sun - is why many consider him to be the greatest catcher to ever play the game.

Long days outdoors may have contributed to his legendary baseball status, but they were also silently having harmful consequences on his health. Later, in his retirement, Bench would be diagnosed with skin cancer.

As the leader of the “Big Red Machine” of the 1970s, Bench led Cincinnati to two World Series titles and four National League championships. On an individual level, he won two Most Valuable Player (MVP) awards, one World Series MVP award, Rookie of the Year honors and 10 Golden Gloves. In 1989, he was inducted to the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York. Bench hit 389 home runs, but he was perhaps best known for his rocket arm and his endurance, catching 100 games or more for 13 consecutive seasons in the often-blazing sun, before ending his career at third base - a less physically grueling position.

Eventually, Bench’s many years of prolonged sun exposure took a toll. In 2012, he was diagnosed with a non-melanoma skin cancer called basal cell carcinoma (BCC) - the most common type of skin cancer in the United States 1 - and again recently during a routine doctor visit. Of the roughly 2 million U.S. cases of BCC diagnosed each year, 95% are caught at an early stage² and can be removed like Bench’s case, before becoming advanced. However, in rare cases, BCC can grow deep into surrounding tissue or spread to other organs or other parts of the body.¹ While early-stage BCC may be cured by surgery or radiation, progression to advanced disease is often difficult to treat and associated with a relatively higher risk

of returning and poorer outcomes. Treatment options for advanced BCC and CSCC are available and include surgery, radiation and systemic therapy. Patients should speak with their physician to find a treatment option that’s most appropriate for them.³ In retirement, Bench has become a vocal champion for efforts to get real about skin cancer and continues to be proactive about sun protection throughout the year - especially in the summertime.

Today, the Hall of Famer has been working with Regeneron since 2022 to share his experience with BCC, raise awareness of non-melanoma skin cancers and help people catch skin cancer before it advances so they can receive appropriate, effective treatment. Bench encourages everyone, especially outdoor enthusiasts, to conduct regular skin exams, including areas commonly exposed to the sun like the ears, face and hands.¹ If a spot or mark is new, changing or unusual, he encourages people to see a dermatologist.⁴ Those who have previously been diagnosed with a non-melanoma skin cancer are at a higher risk of developing it again.^{1,4} A BCC or CSCC that keeps coming back could be a sign the cancer has advanced.⁵

Bench, now 74, continues to enjoy time outdoors but takes extra precautions to protect himself and encourages others to do the same. “Now I wear my sunglasses and my big hat every time I’m on the golf course or go out fishing,” he said.

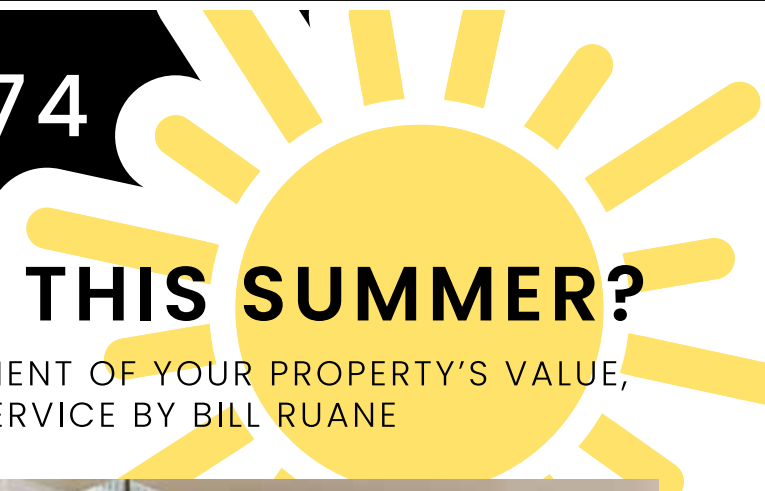

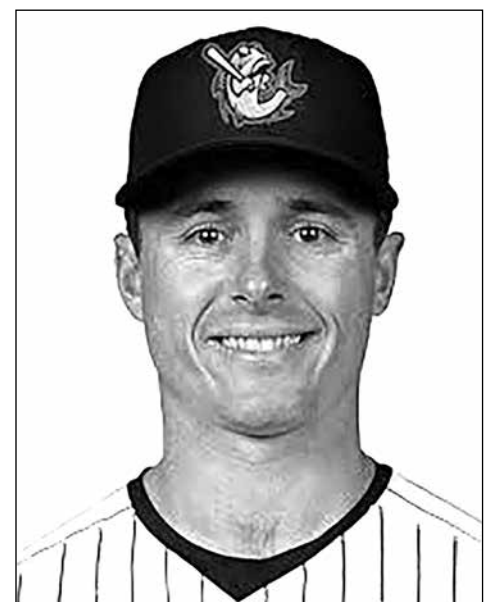

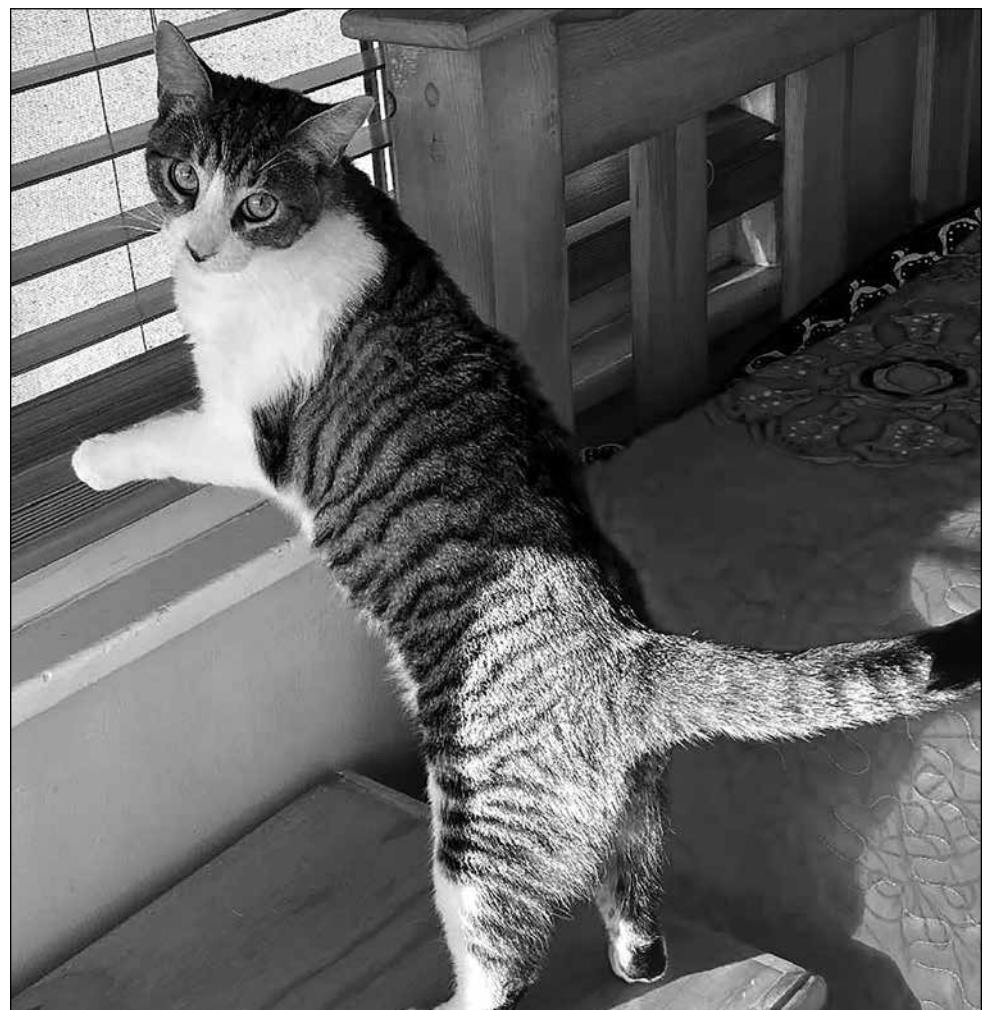

get established—she says it’s dubbed “sleep, creep, leap” because it “sleeps” in year one, “creeps” in year two, and “leaps” in year three and that year four is when observers can begin to expect to see the ES Blue using

discounted plants from the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy, which grows its own native plants. Throw in the six months it takes to grow the plants, and you get a good idea of the factors involved in the ES

Native plants, though drought tolerant, will require watering in their formative years, but once established, require less water and will attract a diversity of native insects, birds, and lizards. Seacliff Buckwheat is a nectar

this host plant for its multi-stage life cycle of egg, larva (caterpillar), pupa (chrysalis) to butterfly. In fact, just this year, in the native habitat she planted in her front yard four years ago, Boland has seen her first ES Blues.

Blue’s survival. Planning, availability of Seacliff Buckwheat (not all garden centers will have the plant and/or be able to get it), purchasing the other recommended California native plants (Boland and Davis

source for many beneficial insects which then serve as a food source for birds and lizards. And, Seacliff Buckwheat is a pollinator for other plants as bees and other nectar-seeking insects and birds will spread the pollen to other plants.

Chevron property that isn’t accessible to the public, and small patches of land along The Esplanade in Redondo Beach and Vista Mar Park above Torrance Beach that PVPLC has been at work on, seems too little space for the tiny butterfly that once thrived all along the sand dunes from Vista del Mar to PCH until development destroyed their habitat.

The life of an ES Blue consists of a short several days’ adult butterfly life in which the blue males search for the brown-colored females to mate. Once they mate, the female lays her eggs on the flower heads of the Seacliff Buckwheat, which booms roughly from June-August, depending on the amount of rain and sun the plants have received. A few days after the eggs have been laid, caterpillars emerge from the eggs as “little flower-eating machines,” according to Blue Butterfly Conservancy literature. From there, it takes five molts before the caterpillars crawl to the bottom of the plant and molt into the chrysalis stage, where they remain through the fall, winter, and spring before their emergence as an adult during the proper summer conditions. The ES Blue produces just one brood per year.

Indeed, one might think that the ES Blue requires very little for its life. Just Seacliff Buckwheat, right? But that’s not all it needs. And growing, buying, and planting the ES Blue’s required host plant Seacliff Buckwheat takes a grower who grows the plant, money for its purchase, and proper soil and space for planting the Seacliff Buckwheat, which is not to be confused with Coast or Coastal Buckwheat, which is not the same plant. As a rule, it’s best to use the botanical name for plants since common names can apply to more than one plant, while the botanical name does not.

say to play California Poppy—*Eschscholzia californica*; California Fuchsia—*Epilobium canum*; California Bush Flower—*Encelia californica*; Blue Elderberry—*Sambucus nigra*; Bladderpod—*Peritoma arborea*, and Purple Sage—*Salvia leucophylla*) to create a native habitat for the Seacliff Buckwheat are all key.

For Davis, who has lived in El Segundo with her husband since 2004 (the couple is raising their twins here), the fact that the ES Blue has little Seacliff Buckwheat for it other than the small patch of shrubs at Dockweiler, the fenced-in preserve that sits on dunes (once a residential community

Davis has long-term and short-term goals for the ES Blue and a vision that includes native habitat lining Imperial Highway on both sides and the median where possible, along with implementing habitat into the city’s Downtown Specific Plan, park areas, and any little space where even a small amount of native habitat can be planted. She’s creatively surveyed spots in the city where she thinks habitat could be planted and has been met with a receptive ear from the city’s Parks and Recreation Department. She also would love for residents to plant native habitat gardens.

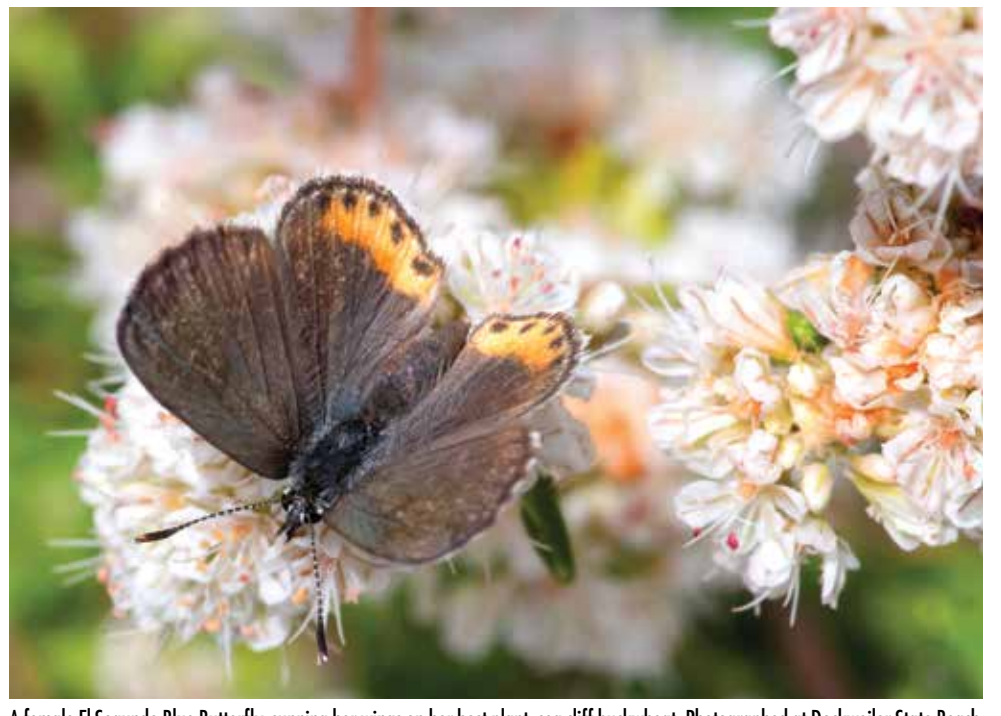

Mostly, though, she and Boland, who joined Davis’ 2018 cause in September of 2020s, aim to instill excitement at the miracle these diminutive creatures are. Not only has the ES Blue survived the days when sand dunes were upended by houses and buildings as the city of El Segundo grew, but they’ve also survived years of neglect and a lack of understanding and awareness that could have supplied their needs and probably their population.

Now, Davis and Boland hope to turn another corner for the ES Blue and bring it back to El Segundo city limits in a manner where it thrives and where it can sustain itself by virtue of countless patches and areas filled with Seacliff Buckwheat and the other California native plants that will offer it an opportunity to thrive, just as it once did on the coastal dunes of El Segundo. •
