Ali Rabiei: The El Segundo Unified School District's Swiss Army Knife

The man I am profiling this week, El Segundo Unified School District [ESUSD] administrator Ali Rabiei, can best be described as a “Swiss-army knife,” which is a term currently in vogue, specifically in the National Football League.

One definition of a Swiss army knife: is a multi-faceted, multi-bladed pocketknife assigned to Swiss army members more than one hundred years ago and can be utilized to achieve multiple tasks successfully.

In the NFL, it refers to a player who can do it all and succeed in whatever position he is asked to fulfill. That description fits Ali Rabiei to the proverbial T.

Rabiei, who started working for the ESUSD in 2011, will be circling back in the 2022-23 school year, reprising his role as the High School assistant principal, a role that he first filled eleven years ago.

The Rabiei backstory includes moving to the South Bay with his family from the Dallas-Fort Worth area in 1986, growing up in Torrance and being raised by his grandma and grandpa, and graduating from West Torrance High School. He went on to attend UC Irvine, where he attained his Bachelor of Arts degree, with honors, in political science and sociology. He then attended Cal State University Dominguez Hills [CSUDH], where he notched his teaching credential bona fides, and in 2007, received a Master of Arts in the field of sociology.

Rabiei said he always had a proclivity to want to work with kids and initially started on a path to become a pediatrician. But in a sophomore biology class, one of the class projects involved dissecting worms, and Rabiei said he “did a terrible job” on that project and

started to rethink his career pathway and the medical profession.

He pivoted towards classwork that would lead him to become a classroom instructor, focusing on teaching history. He also garnered a minor degree in mathematics along his educational pathway. While working towards his master’s degree, Rabiei began his teaching career in Manhattan Beach, but that gig lasted only a year. He then joined the ranks of the teachers in the Los Angeles Unified School District in 2004, teaching history classes at Chester W. Nimitz Middle School until 2007.

Next on the Rabiei teaching timeline was a stint at North Torrance High School, where

This is also the case for Ron Leibovici and Jaime Kim, co-founders of Dipped, a new ice cream shop attempting to rethink the way people approach and enjoy the sweet treat. After receiving an ice cream machine as a birthday present, Leibovici and Kim decided to experiment with different flavors at home.

They began thinking outside the box. “After coming up with similar ideas as everyone else, we thought, how can we do something different?” they explained. They began reminiscing on what kinds of desserts they enjoyed in their childhoods. “Chocolate-dipped cones were a favorite growing up,” Leibovici said, “We thought, instead of making ice cream in different flavors, why not add the flavor as a chocolate dip?”

The couple began planning and building their business in the Spring of 2021, eventually opening their doors in October 2021. “Both of us come from corporate

Are You Ready for Some El Segundo High Football

It's been 237 days since the El Segundo Eagles played a football game. But the 2022 high school football season starts tomorrow night, and the Eagles will be in action at home. As third-year head coach Shawn Green oversees practice drills, he likes what he sees. "We're a younger team, but they have all really worked hard and have a thirst for learning what the coaches are teaching," he said.

The Eagles had a successful non-league 2021 campaign going 5-0. In the Pioneer League, it was a different story, where they were winless. Five of the teams from the Pioneer League advanced to the CIF playoffs. It was the second consecutive season the Eagles missed out on the playoffs, not counting the 2020 Covid season. Coach Green believes the playoff drought will end this season but concedes it'll take a monumental effort. "This team will need to be disciplined, and we need to stay healthy because we are not very deep."

The Eagles have been preparing for this season for months. They started holding weight training workouts in January. They

held spring workouts and completed their summer workouts, including their double-days last week. "The players are working hard, and it's showing on their progress daily in practice," said Coach Green.

The outlook for the Eagles this season is encouraging, according to Coach Green. "We aren't a senior-heavy team but one with a lot of sophomores and juniors with some experience. We bring back a three-year senior starting quarterback that is having a great summer. The defense is coming together with a lot of new faces. And the offensive line has the potential to be the best unit on the team this year."

The strengths of the team look to be the leadership of senior quarterback Leo Menendez. This will be Leo's third year directing the offense. According to Coach Green, his quarterback has grown not only as a player but as a team leader that his teammates have embraced. Menendez, who has a 4.3 GPA entering his senior year, says the team is working to improve in each practice. Menendez has worked hard in the

Your Neighborhood Therapist

Dear Neighborhood Therapist,

I am now in my thirties and I feel like I have the potential to be at the top of my profession. I'm full of ideas, but I feel constrained, like I'm bound by a set of unwritten expectations that only I have to follow - not about little things, but about big ones like my career and my love life. It's keeping me on the "safe" path, when what I think I need to do is be taking risks and even taking on more responsibilities. Part of me knows that this is all "in my head," but... there it is, in my head. I feel like I'll never live up to my potential if I don't stop thinking this way. Can you help?

– Stuck in Limbo, El Segundo

Dear Stuck,

We spoke and you told me a bit more about your situation. You have wonderful, loving parents and an extensive support system of friends who have professed they want nothing but the best for you no matter what you choose. Even such fortunate circumstances sometimes come with a cost: often we fail to take risks and pursue responsibilities not because we're afraid of the risk or the responsibility itself, but because we realize how fortunate we are and we desperately want to show that we are worthy of these gifts we have been given. We are terrified of disappointing others and thus we feel like we have to ask permission at every major crossroads of our lives.

The thinking goes: they love me so much, they hold me in such high regard, they taught me everything and they seem more hurt than I do when I stumble. How can I risk what they've given me? How could I face them if I made a decision that didn't work out?

Taking the safe route is always going to be the easier immediate choice, but you are feeling its long-term danger.

Consider replacing the phantom expectations that your mind knows others have not actually set for you with your own set of expectations. How do you do this? First,

decide if you are eligible to have your own expectations. What kind of person is eligible to have their own expectations? Do you have to have values? If so, do you have values? Do you have to have reached a certain age - perhaps an age when others have made their own decisions? Have you reached that age?

When you think about others' expectations for you, where does their authority to set expectations come from and what, if anything, continues to support that authority? At what point in life is a person old enough and independent enough and responsible enough to do things according to their own best judgment? Have you reached those points?

I suspect you will find that you are indeed eligible to set your own expectations for your own life. If this turns out to be the case, take the time to write down the answers to these questions: how would I live my life, or what actions would I take, if the people whose expectations I have tried to live up to suddenly disappeared forever? How does this line up with how I am living my life now? What would be the cost of switching my life orientation from their expectations to my own expectations? How do I know that's the cost? How sure am I about that? Have I actually checked? Am I in a position to advocate for myself enough to lower those costs? If so, have I done that?

Write it all down and lay it out in front of you. You may realize you have begun to create the map you've been looking for.

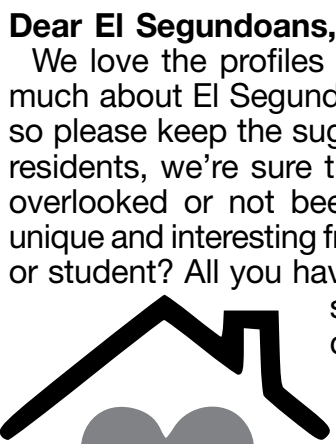

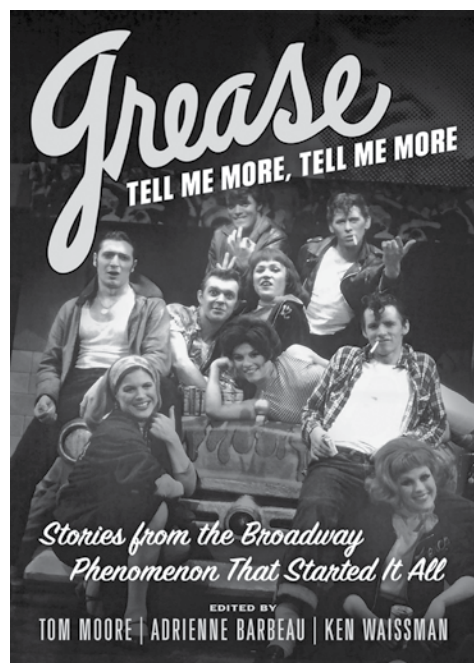

Grease - Tell Me More, Tell Me More : Stories from the Broadway phenomenon that started it all, edited by Tom Moore, Adrienne Barbeau and Ken Weissman

Do you know the origin of the musical *Grease*? In 1969 author composer Jim Jacobs was hosting a party. He wandered over to Warren Casey, his collaborator from the Chicago Stage Guild, and posed a question to him: "How come there's never been a

Broadway show with rock & roll music?" He begins to ramble about his high school days in the '50s where everything (hair, food, guys under the hoods of their cars) was greasy ... "It could be called GREASE!" Warren points out that it's three o' clock in the morning and accuses him of being drunk. A week later, Warren calls Jim to tell him that he's written a scene for "the show you were talking about the other night." Some time later, Jim is asked to substitute teach a drama class for a friend. What does he do? He decides to teach "Auditioning for a play" and uses the pajama party scene Warren had written for the students to read. The class loves it, Jim calls Warren and exclaims "We have a play!"

A primitive version of *Grease* was performed on weekends in an old trolley barn converted to a community theatre in Chicago in 1971. Young Broadway producer Ken Weissman was invited to see the show by a friend and ... well, you can read the rest in *Grease - Tell Me More, Tell Me More*, a very entertaining account of the evolution of one of the greatest Broadway musicals of all time, commemorating its fiftieth anniversary. Tom Moore, the original Broadway director

of *Grease*, Adrienne Barbeau, the actress remembered from TV's "Maude" played the character of Rizzo and the afore-mentioned Ken Weissman compiled and edited memories of many cast and crew members from all the performing companies during the years from 1971 through April of 1980.

This is a book that will appeal on many levels: It's a great introduction to what it's like to be involved in theatre, it transports you to the pop culture worlds of the 1950s AND the 1970s, there's a lot of celebrity gossip and you may get teary-eyed by the heartfelt testimonials of all involved.

There are mentions of the 1978 film, and you'll learn of some of the differences from the play versus the movie version. For instance, the T-Birds of the film are actually the Burger Palace Boys. Many songs from the musical became instrumentals or were heard on the film soundtrack --- new songs were added for the film. On stage, the show was raunchy, so the film was "cleaned up" for a PG rating and expanded from the limited scene changes in the play. Characters were subtracted as well as added for the film. Apparently, Cha Cha was not the femme fatale portrayed in the movie. Jeff Conaway was Danny Zuko on Broadway, but John Travolta (who played the character of Doody onstage) made his dream come true when he was cast as Danny while Jeff would play Kenickie in the film.

Former cast members reminisce about nerve-racking auditions, backstage romances, dance-related injuries and more. You'll learn about the star-studded parade of former Danny Zukos --- originator Barry Bostwick, Treat Williams, Richard Gere, Patrick Swayze, Peter Gallagher, to name a few.

Film Review

Three Minutes: A Lengthening Gives Life Back to the Ghosts of the Past

Where to Watch: Three Minutes: A Lengthening opens this Friday at Laemmle Royal with additional theatrical engagements to follow.

It's the genuine spark that lights up the faces of nearly 150 men, women, and children as they look directly into David Kurtz's camera lens, that hurts the most in hindsight. It was a fleeting moment during David's sightseeing trip to Poland in 1938 and, if anything, he was inconvenienced by the crowd's presence

Glenn narrows down key details in the grainy footage that ultimately end up leading him to a precise location: Nasielsk, Poland. His search yielded tangible results too, as he was able to locate seven living survivors, one of whom contributed to the film.

Distributed by Super LTD, *Three Minutes: A Lengthening* is a powerful portrait of the lives lost and a poignant celebration of the power of film. With only three minutes of archival footage in total, Bianca Stigter cre-

in his shot. He wanted to capture the beautiful architecture of the city but was instead met with curious faces and locals from the community infiltrating his framing. David captured roughly three minutes of footage here before continuing on his trip. Little did anyone know that a short time later, most of the people that David got on film that day would be dead.

Writer/director Bianca Stigter gives life and dignity back to those in David's footage in the gripping documentary, *Three Minutes: A Lengthening*. Narrated by Helena Bonham Carter and co-produced by Steve McQueen, the film contains the only moving images that exist of the Jewish inhabitants of Nasielsk, Poland before the Holocaust.

Glenn Kurtz, David's grandson, spent four arduous years attempting to identify the people in his grandfather's images. His search spanned various countries, film preservation laboratories, and even an abandoned Luftwaffe airfield, which he details throughout the film. Acting as part film historian and part detective,

actively stretches and humbly manipulates the images to create a 70-minute feature that is ripe with emotional depth.

In a similar style to *Dawson City: Frozen Time*, *Three Minutes: A Lengthening* keeps the memory of the dead alive by preserving the last known artifact of their existence. •

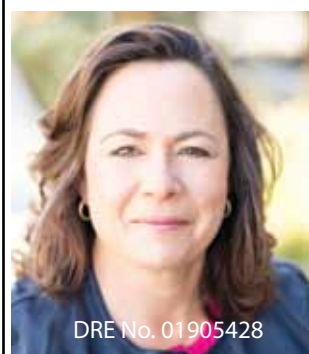

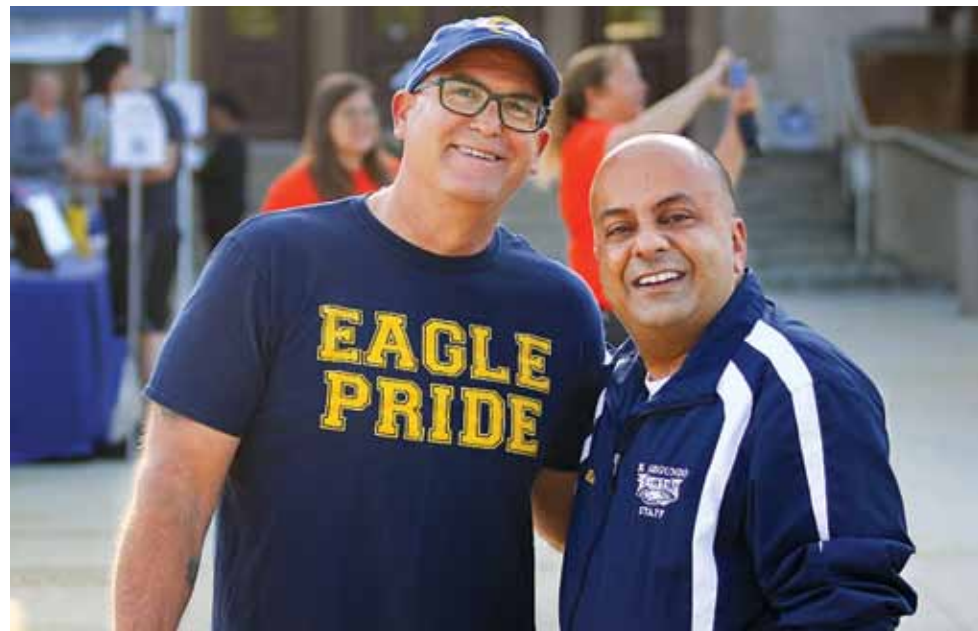

he toiled as a mathematics and social science teacher for a few school years, before entering the administrative side of education in 2009 and accepting the job of assistant principal at Torrance's Casimir Middle School, after reneging on a job offer, he had accepted from the El Segundo Unified School District.

It was in 2011 that Rabiei started to draw his paycheck from the ESUSD, beginning as an assistant principal at the High School. As the school years continued to churn, Rabiei

backgrounds, but had a desire to have our own business," they explained, "We thought Los Angeles didn't have this type of ice cream experience, and we could bring it to the market."

After toying around with the idea, Leibovici and Kim began experimenting with other dipped flavors. Today, Dipped has only three ice cream flavors—vanilla, vegan vanilla, strawberry, and chocolate—and eight different dip flavors, including, but not limited to, milk chocolate, dark chocolate, hazelnut, salted caramel, and cookies & cream. They also offer specialty cones, which include a dipped cone with additional toppings specific to the dip flavor.

"Traveling around the world, we have eaten a lot of ice cream," they reflected. As outlined on their website, their ultimate goal is to prepare ice cream with the finest ingredients to deliver customers a quality, worthwhile experience. "We know that people can taste the quality, and we want to ensure that when they come to Dipped, that is what they taste. We are always working on the menu and trying to continue to deliver a quality product," they said.

However, this process hasn't always been easy. The couple explained that one of the things that have proved to be most difficult is finding certain ingredients and making sure they're available. "Because of the pandemic, it's been hard to coordinate and ensure our vendors have everything we need all the time," they said.

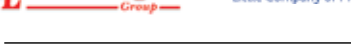
