## All-Stars Win LL World Series Title

The ending for El Segundo's Little League's All-Star run had a Hollywood ending. You couldn't have scripted this final chapter for 12 twelve-year-olds any better. If this were made into a movie, you would sit back and allow the music to engulf the setting of something so magical you'd swear it never happened. So, queue up the music to "The Natural" and settle back because this truly did happen.

What began three seasons ago, for this group of Little League All-Stars, ended in Williamsport, Pennsylvania, the site of the 76th Little League World Series. The pinnacle of any Little Leaguer is to play at Lamade Stadium, where the Little League World Series is played. When you arrive for the first time, it's like walking out of the cornfield, a reference from the movie, 'Field of Dreams'.

The accomplishments this age group conquered over the past three summers include three District 36 titles, three Section 4 banners, two times named Southern California champions, and one West Region champion to qualify for the league's first Little League World Series appearance. Now, you can add two additional banners. They can proudly display the United States Little League World Series Champions banner after defeating Needville Little League, Needville, Texas, 6-1. And to top that off, they won the 2023 Little League World Series banner with a dramatic 6-5 win over Pabao Little League, Willemstad, and Curacao in the bottom of the sixth inning.

After defeating New Albany, Ohio, the Great Lakes Region champion, 4-3 in the opener of the World Series, they bowed to Needville, the Southwest Region winner, 3-1. Falling into the loser's bracket, they defeated the Metro Region winner, Smithfield, Rhode Island, 9-3.

In two more elimination games, El Segundo prevailed over the Southeast Region winner, Nolensville, Tennessee, 5-3. Then, facing another elimination game, they defeated the Northwest champion, Northeast Seattle, Washington, 2-1 to advance to the United States championship game against Needville, Texas.

### El Segundo 5 Nolensville, Tennessee 3

El Segundo put together a solid game, and though they outit and played flawless defense, they came away with a close win. This was Nolensville's third consecutive appearance in the Little League World Series. They are the only Little League program to ever appear in three consecutive Little League World Series. Louis Lappe's two-run home run in the bottom of the fifth inning provided the margin of victory in El Segundo's 5-3 win.

El Segundo had a potential big first inning but came up with just one run. Brody Brooks and Louis Lappe opened the bottom of the first inning with consecutive singles. Lucas Keldorf's fielder's choice scored Brooks, and Max Baker had an infield single to put runners on first and third. Crew O'Connor then hit a ball into the hole that third baseman Ty McKenzie came up with to throw O'Connor out by a step. If the ball gets through El Segundo's inning could have been a massive blow to Nolensville.

In the third inning, with two outs, Brooks beat out an infield single followed by Lappe, who singled up the middle. Jaxon Kalish slammed a two-run triple to right-center, scoring Brooks and Lappe for a 3-0 lead. Nolensville responded with a two-run fourth inning. Nash

Carter opened the inning with a walk, followed by a two-run home run by Lucas McCauley to make it 3-2. Ollie Parks replaced Jaxon Kalish on the mound and struck out the first two batters he faced. With runners on first and second, Parks struck out Stella Weaver to end the inning. El Segundo went scoreless in the fourth after loading the bases with two outs.

In the fifth inning, Nolensville tied the game. Gideon Shepler singled, and Corbin

Cyphers doubled into the right-center alley. Carter Gomillion hit a ground ball that Jaxon Kalish came up with to throw out Shepler at the plate. Cyphers would later score on a wild pitch to tie the game.

## El Segundo 2 Northeast Seattle Little League 1

In the loser's bracket final, to decide who would play Needville, Texas, in the U.S. championship game, El Segundo faced Northeast Seattle Little League, the Northwest Region champion. It was a pitcher's duel between El Segundo's Declan McRoberts and Northeast Seattle's Trey Kirchoff. El Segundo got a couple of key hits from the lower half of the

lineup and came away with a 2-1 victory in front of an announced crowd of 8374 fans.

Northeast Seattle had the potential for a big first inning but was snubbed out on a great defensive play. With one out, Kirchoff singled to right field, but Owen Luke, one of Northeast's power hitters, hit a sharp ground ball up the middle that shortstop Brody Brooks made a miraculous play on. He stepped on

Eng, who forced Lappe out at the plate. Then Declan McRoberts hit an infield chopper he beat out, and Kalish scored to make it 1-0. Crew O'Connor's long fly ball was tracked down by Brooks Shewey for the third out.

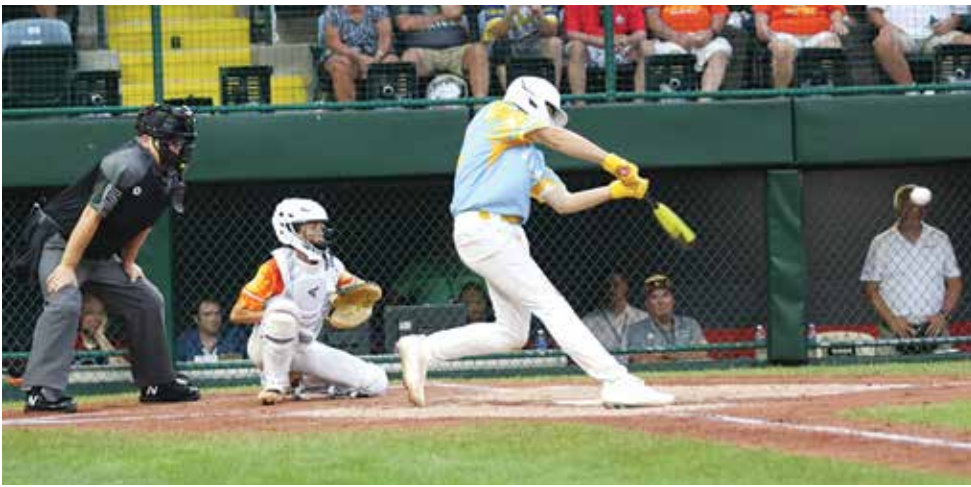

bracket. The U.S. championship game, which was seen nationwide by millions on ABC and nearly 30,000 in person, was the perfect setting to exact revenge for an earlier loss. They were in four must-win games in five days and were pushed to the brink of elimination after losing to Texas, 3-1, in their second game of the World Series. "We're battle-tested," Boehle said. "We are a very hard team to play against on both sides of the ball."

El Segundo scored a first-inning run when Brody Brooks jumped on Needville's pitcher DJ Jablonski's fastball for a leadoff homerun. It was the third consecutive game Brooks had led off the game with a base hit. "I've always loved being the leadoff (hitter) because I can set the tone," said Brooks, who is 11 for 14 in six games.

El Segundo received help from the bottom of the order. Quinn Boehle recorded his second hit in two days, and Colby Lee walked and scored twice. In the third inning, Lee walked Brooks doubled, and both scored on Luis Lappe's double to make it 3-0. Lee said, "At the bottom of the order, the job for us is to get to the top of the lineup where the big guys Brody (Brooks), Luis (Lappe), and Jaxon (Kalish) are."

In the fourth inning, El Segundo threatened to blow the game open. Lucas Keldorf and Max Baker opened with consecutive singles. Declan McRoberts walked to load the bases, but Needville's pitcher, Jablonski, ended the inning with three consecutive strikeouts.

Needville's only offense came in the fifth inning when Jablonski doubled and advanced to third base on a throwing error on the play. He then scored on a wild pitch to make it 3-1. After walking Easton Ondruch, El Segundo starting pitcher, Luis Lappe struck out the next two batters and got Jakolby White to fly out to Declan McRoberts.

In the bottom of the fifth inning, Colby Lee drew a walk that was followed by a single by Brooks. Then Lappe connected on a fastball outside and drove it over the hedges in right

field for a three-run home run and a 6-1 lead.

In the sixth inning, Lappe struck out Michael Raven to open the inning and reached his pitch count limit. Brooks came in and got a strikeout. With the World Series victory in reach, Brooks got a fly ball out to Max Baker to end the game and give El Segundo the United States World Series title. They became the first California team to do it since 2013 when Chula Vista Little League won it. El Segundo is the 24th team to represent California in the championship since the Little League World Series began in 1947. California leads all U.S. states with seven LLWS titles.

Boehle celebrated the accomplishment, but he quickly shrugged away the satisfaction as he refocused his eyes on the main goal. "This was our mission three years ago when we had

With both teams coming into the game with momentum after winning the United States and International championships respectfully, they were unfazed by the 30,000 people gathered at Lamade Stadium or the nearly 3 million watching it on television on ABC. El Segundo's contingent included Mayor Drew Boyles and former Councilman Scott Nicol, who flew in just for the World Series finale weekend.

El Segundo sent Ollie Parks to the mound, and the hard-throwing right-hander walked two and struck out the side in the first inning. Brody Brooks singled for the fourth consecutive game, followed by Luis Lappe's single. Lucas Keldorf unloaded on Caribbean pitcher Sean Serverie's fastball for a two-run double. As the partisan crowd chanted "USA USA," Keldorf stood on second base with a smile

this team as 10-year-olds. I saw the talent they had. It's a great accomplishment for the boys, but our goal is to win the series," he said.

Curacao was set to play in its second consecutive Little League World Series championship game after defeating Taiwan 2-0 in the Little League International championship game. The shocking victory came just three days after Taiwan had defeated the Caribbean club 9-1. Taiwan had dominated the International bracket with a 25-1 scoring margin in three games before coming up short in the International title game.

**World Series Championship United States (El Segundo) 6-Caribbean (Willemstad, Curacao) 5**

The finishing touches to this Hollywood ending was an epic closure that has never been done in the 76 years of the Little League World Series. El Segundo would see a 5-1 lead evaporate and allow the heroic swing to win the World Series. It would be seen around the World and be the subject of water cooler conversation for years to come. It will be talked about much like when Bill Mazeroski of the Pittsburgh Pirates hit his World Series-winning homerun in 1960.

from ear to ear.

In the third inning, Curacao scored to tighten the deficit. Jay Dlynn Wiel singled and scored on Shermar Jacobus' RBI single. El Segundo answered with two runs when Colby Lee drew a base on balls, and Brooks earned a seven-pitch walk. With two outs, Jaxon Kalish smacked a two-run single, scoring Lee and Brooks for a 4-1 lead. El Segundo extended their lead in the fourth inning when Max Baker, who had not struck out in over fifty at bats during the all-star run this summer, tripled to right field and scored on Crew O'Connor's single up the middle for a 5-1 lead.

In the top half of the fifth inning, Curacao loaded the bases, and Parks was lifted. Max Baker came in to silence Curacao and struck out the leadoff hitter. Nasir El-Ossais then hit Baker's fastball offering over the hedges for a game-tying grand slam homerun. Jacobus followed with a deep fly ball to left field that Declan McRoberts tracked down for the final out while El Segundo went in order in the fifth.

In the sixth inning, Brooks replaced Baker on the mound, and he retired Curacao in a scoreless inning. That setup is what every boy fantasizes about in the backyard: smacking a World Series walk-off homerun to win it.

Louis Lappe stepped to the plate to face Jay-Dlynn Wiel. He said afterward that the two had become friends and battling each other in ping-pong matches. During their interactions over the week, Wiel and Lappe would immerse in banter on what each would do if they faced each other.

On the second pitch, Lappe drilled a letter-high fastball over the fence for a towering 240-foot homerun. As he was celebrating his homerun-winning moment, rounding the bases, the crescendo of the massive crowd chanting "USA USA" grew stronger and stronger. As Lappe leaped towards home plate, he was mobbed by his teammates. Lappe's homerun gave him six for the World Series, one off the record of seven set by Chin-Hsiung Hsieh of Chinese Taipei in 1996.

They have made our community, the State of California, and our nation proud by winning the 2023 Little League World Series.

As the background music keeps playing, let's credit and thank the countless volunteers for El Segundo Little League, including the Little League Board, the managers, coaches, those working the snack bar, and the parents for their support. Finally, thank you to the community of El Segundo and the businesses for supporting Little League baseball and welcoming the team home with a massive turnout.

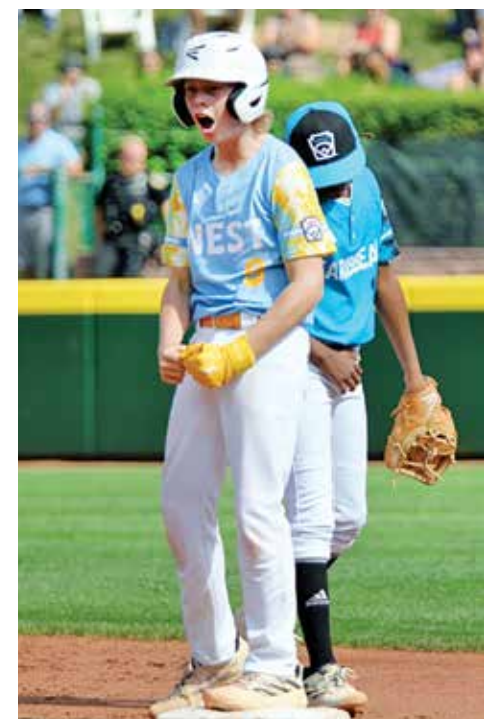
