Bike Safety, Animal Control Service, City Strategic and Communication Plans Addressed

Bicycle safety, particularly electric bikes, a biting dog, and a thank you were three topics brought to the El Segundo City Council at its regularly scheduled meeting last Tuesday night during the Public Comment portion. Oak Avenue resident Bill Watkins thanked the council for its approval and installation of a four-way stop sign intersection at Oak Avenue and Main Street, which previously had been a two-way stop sign, noting it has kept people from "flying down Main. That seems to have come to a stop," he told the council.

In other action Tuesday night, the council heard an update on the city's Fiscal Year 2022-2026 Strategic Plan from Deputy City Manager Barbara Voss, approved the city's Communications Plan for 2023-2025 as presented by Communications and Legislative Affairs Manager Diane Chaaban, and approved a city staff recommended amendment to city contributions to CAL PERS medical premiums.

Resident Ron Swanson addressed the council about his concerns for bike safety, calling it "a huge problem that's brewing in this town... The electric bikes in this town have been taking over." He told the council he'd watched adults with more than one kid on the back of the bike, with and without helmets, on California Street heading to the back gate of Center Street School. "Nobody in this town stops at stop signs when they're on a bike. I mean nobody, especially kids." He recalled an incident where he stopped in his driveway on California Street to avoid a collision with a young biker. The young male bicyclist went around and behind him,

to which he queried the youngster why he didn't stop, and then a man in a car that had been driving slowly down the street told Swanson not to yell at his son. He said education has to start with parents who inform their children and keep them safe. "What I'm afraid of is a tragedy is going to happen, and then something will be done about it." He offered himself as a volunteer to come up with a plan or be on committees to address the situation, especially near schools. He mentioned the potential of lawsuits and said he's afraid of that, too. "We can avoid this and do the right thing and try to teach these kids how to operate bikes in a safe manner.

And it's just, again, a matter of time that this is gonna happen. We had a tragedy sometime back with a skateboard, and it kind of woke up everybody, and guess what? The skate park came around. We need to do the same thing here and help the community to educate the adults to educate the kids."

City Manager Darrell George, after Public Comment ended, told the council the city has an internal public safety task force that could look into bike safety and that the city has a joint subcommittee with the El Segundo Unified School District that meets monthly on the first Wednesday that the item could

Potential New Legislation for Airbnb

Across the country, among the bustling sounds of car horns and police sirens, a new piece of legislation has been unveiled in New York City. This legislation is designed around curtailing the practices of the popular renting and hosting app Airbnb. Airbnb is a popular app among travelers and those looking to make some passive income from properties. This application allows people to rent their rooms, apartments, and houses and book reservations all in the private sphere, leaving hotels out of the equation entirely. In response to the level of change that Airbnb has had on its economy, the city of New York has recently set out new policies transforming how Airbnb will be allowed to operate within the city limits. These changes include putting "short" back

into short-term rentals and capping them at 30 days, mandating renters to register with the city, and mandating that owners must stay in the home with the guest for the entire duration of the rental. And with all of that Airbnb hosts can no longer rent to more than two guests. This drastic change in what the renting market looks for a hotspot of Airbnb leads many people to turn their eyes to the West, waiting to see what other massive metropolitan areas will do in response to this piece of legislation. New York saw the renting giant as something capable of destroying their real estate market, and politicians have cited this renting app as contributing to higher costs of living by allowing wealthy renters and private renting firms to buy more properties

and creating an artificially inflated real estate market. New York's legislation could be seen as the first domino to fall as other major areas, already looking to crack down on Airbnb, could now be invigorated by New York City's new laws.

Better Neighbors LA, a housing activist group based out of Los Angeles City, is seeking to lead the charge against Airbnb to protect renters and homeowners across Southern California. According to their website, "Our mission is to support enforcement of the City of Los Angeles' Home Sharing Ordinance, conduct research on the short-term rental industry and its impact on affordable housing and gentrification in LA and to develop policy to protect housing, hotel jobs and neighborhoods impacted by the short-term rental industry." With groups like this in place and the city of Los Angeles already taking action against Airbnb by capping their renting options to 120 days, there is a colder wind blowing on this that may hint at a change on the horizon.

With many people in and around Los Angeles, there have been concerns about the safety of the rental properties. According to the Los Angeles Times, "Nearly one out of every five listings advertised by Airbnb hosts in Los Angeles over a 12-month period failed to comply with the city's regulations on short-term rentals..." This is alarming due to the prevalence in which Airbnb occupies the sunswept streets of Los Angeles. There are groups of renters, both individual and private renting companies, doing short-term rentals, such as Airbnb, that are not following the same building codes as other renters due to their only renting in the short term. With any rental property, there are building codes that must be followed in order to make sure that it is safe to be occupied, but that is not the case with Airbnb. Due to the fact that they are privately rented and run, without any sort of government or corporation oversight, they can be held to whatever code the owner sees fit. This creates a dark area in the safety practices of the homes available for rent in the city of Los Angeles and elsewhere.

However, Airbnb has shown an ability to work with Los Angeles in particular. Among the several renting apps on the market today, Airbnb is the only one ever to reach an agreement with the city and county of Los Angeles. In the infancy of the renting app, there were massive issues with filtering out illegal rent listings, which, since then, in a combined effort, Airbnb and Los Angeles have worked

to squash in order to promote a safer renting environment. These changes came about in the year 2020.

Since then, however, there has been a growth in commercial operators buying real estate and turning them into rental properties designed for tourists. This, of course, breaks the City of Los Angeles Home Sharing Ordinance (CF 14-1635-S2), which states that only the owner's primary residence can be available for rent. This is the same problem that New York had faced that brought about this massive curtailing swing of change with their most recent law, which went into effect September 5th.

A stranglehold currently latched onto the affordable housing market in Los Angeles County is being exacerbated by renting apps such as Airbnb. While Airbnb has shown promise in its ability to work with local governments, there is some concern that the issues that it has created are well beyond the control of the current standings of city and county legislation. Many activist groups across Southern California, based out of Los Angeles City and County, have been working diligently to defend the renters that are practicing appropriately and legally and even working to claw back the ghost of the affordable housing market. There is an uphill battle ahead, but surely there is some invigoration in the fight against Airbnb and other massive renting companies due to the boldness of New York's renting law, now the strictest in the country. Whether or not New York City will find success in its choice to change how its short-term renting market looks remains to be seen, and only time will tell. But it cannot be understated the effect such a massive piece of legislation can have on other cities nationwide. When changes like this are rolled out, it is almost certain there will be other pieces of legislation meant to organize in the same vein, as the same frustrations have been felt elsewhere.

While there is no overnight fix to the housing crisis that is felt here in Los Angeles County and other places across the nation, many people look at restrictions like this as something that could alleviate the weight from the young struggling family, the older woman on social security or the struggling single mother trying to make ends meet. There is a lot of time before the entire ramifications of New York City's new law are felt, and only time will tell what they are. And with that, the nation, Los Angeles County, and other hotbeds of the housing crisis watch and see if this is the change that needs to be made to help everyone. •

Eagles Win Prestigious Tournament

The El Segundo High School's boy's water polo team enjoyed a great week. They swept their Pioneer League schedule and then rolled through four victories to win the prestigious Henry Stuart South Bay Water Polo Tournament.

The Eagles have started their 2023 schedule by rattling off 16 consecutive victories. According to legendary El Segundo water polo coach Henry Stuart, it is the best start in the program's history. Coach Stuart should know he's been close to the program for over fifty years. Consider this: the program has won 38 league titles, numerous CIF titles and even sent teams to the Olympics. But none of those teams started 16-0.

The Eagles have a wealth of senior talent and a deep roster with plenty of underclassmen. With such a roster, head coach Nila Ward has no second thoughts about getting most of her players playing time. She says practices make the entire team better when those who are starters are pushed by those wanting more playing time. "It's a win-win situation."

The Eagles had their way with North Torrance in their 22-2 victory over the Saxons. The Eagles were so strong on both ends of the pool that they scored 14 first-half goals, limiting the Saxons to just three shots at the net. Fourteen players scored for El Segundo, led by Tristan Foster and Vincent Davis, scoring three goals apiece. Sutton Fisk, Andre Lavalle, Nolan Barnett, and Max Hale each scored two goals. The others chipping in one

The offense worked the ball instead of forcing their attempts. Williamson assisted Austin Miller's goal to give the Eagles a 10-8 lead. Giroux

The game, which was low-scoring in the first half, picked up momentum in the second half. Max Hale assisted on Tristan Foster's goal with 40 seconds remaining in the second period to give the Eagles a 4-3 lead.

El Segundo's offense got rolling in the second half. Logan Fastman's assist to Max Hale on a fast break gave the Eagles a 7-4 advantage. In the fourth period, Foster scored twice off passes from Williamson to make it 10-4 and one from Hale for the final 11-5 score.

It was a long time since winning the tournament they've hosted for over forty years, but that drought is over. Tristan Foster, who led the team in scoring during the tournament, was named Most Valuable Player.

Football Team Shows Positive Signs in Loss

The Eagles have had a challenging last couple of seasons playing in the Pioneer League. But they have shown promising glimpses of a winning formula. They hosted the North Torrance Saxons in the 2023 Pioneer League opener and played well through the first half. The second half was a different story when the Saxons scored 28 unanswered points to defeat the Eagles 35-7.

Over the course of the first five games, the El Segundo defense has been stellar against the run. Against North Torrance, the Saxons managed a paltry eleven yards rushing in the

The matchup with Torrance was another lopsided 22-2 win for the Eagles. El Segundo jumped out to a 10-1 first-half lead. It was much of the same in the second half when Coach Ward emptied her bench early on. Carter Williamson has returned from a nonwater

In the opener, against Brentwood Academy, the Eagles jumped out in front 10-0 in the first half on the strength of Tristan Foster's five goals. El Segundo extended their lead to 14-1 in the third quarter. Foster would score twice more before taking the fourth period off. Hayden Abbot assisted on Sutton Fisks's early fourth-period score. Logan Fastman set up Austin Miller on another goal, and the Eagles won easily 16-4.

The Eagles were tested in the second game against the La Costa Canyon Mavericks. The Eagles let their defense and the offensive transition dictate El Segundo's 15-10 victory over one of the top-ranked San Diego Section's top teams.

In the championship semi-final against Santa Monica, the Eagle's defense stopped the Vikings' attack and won a close one, 11-8. These two programs are no strangers to playing each other. In the past 14 years, the Eagles have won 17 games while losing 10, and in most cases, it has been a close contest.

El Segundo took a 3-0 first-quarter lead with goals by Tristan Foster's inside goal, Max Hale's shot from the right side, and Carter Williamson's open attempt that whistled into the net. Santa Monica tied the game in the second quarter with three consecutive goals to

shut out the Vikings in the fourth period with five saves. Williamson's goal with over five minutes remaining was the only goal scored in the final period, and the Eagle moved to the championship game against Downey.

It's been over two decades since El Segundo won the South Bay Tournament. But that drought is over with a hard-fought 11-5 win over the

first half and just 43 total yards for the game. It has been their passing defense that has been their Achilles heel that has been so woeful. But the secondary is showing signs of improving by giving up just 236 yards through the air. Unfortunately, some of those passes went for big chunks of yardage or touchdowns.





Fair Play Is a Timely and Exciting Romantic Thriller

Available to stream on Netflix starting Friday, Fair Play is an exciting romantic thriller set in the world of high-stakes finance. Phoebe Dynevor and Alden Ehrenreich star as a young couple who must navigate their romantic relationship after a work promotion elevates one above the

other. Writer-director Chloe Domont's (Suits, Ballers) directorial debut aspires to leave audiences gripped with suspense.

On the surface, Emily (Phoebe Dynevor) and Luke (Alden Ehrenreich) are attractive, successful, lustful, and in love. It's a seemingly perfect relationship, but one that they must hide. That, along with the news of their recent engagement since they work together at an affluent New York investment firm.

Their secret news, however, soon benefits from some good fortune. An opening at the company provides the opportunity for Luke's promotion. The couple grows excited at the possibility, but a twist disrupts their plans. Their boss (Eddie Marsan) tells Emily that it's she who the firm is promoting.

Emily breaks the news to a surprised Luke and even offers to help promote him from her new rank. Luke is initially supportive, but Emily's new position creates a subtle distance between them. This all slowly weighs on Luke's psyche, and the tension between them grows and makes for unstable, dangerous circumstances.

Writer-director Chloe Domont's brisk and moderately suspenseful feature debut has a lot of winning elements. Its high-stakes finance world setting is feverishly exciting, making for a fast-paced energy and tension that grows as the story gets more dangerous.


The secret romance between Emily and Luke drives the film's propulsive energy. The gender dynamics on display are also powerful and very perceptively shown. In this male-dominated world, Domont writes Emily into a situation that feels exactly like what a bitter man might internalize if they felt overlooked next to a female partner. It's also another fascinating read on gender and power and fragile male egos that is a fascinating part of the film.

The appeal of Fair Play boils down to the chemistry between Phoebe Dynevor and Alden Ehrenreich. Theirs is one that feels exciting and dangerous. Dynevor is commanding and owns the screen in some very demanding scenes. Ehrenreich delivers an excellent performance, turning from charismatic to embittered and unraveling. Both are captivating at every turn, even when the writing fails to meet them at their level.



be agendized for. Mayor Pro Tem Chris Pimentel noted that the state is looking into several bills that address ebike safety with minimum age and licensing requirements and that Los Angeles County may soon have an ordinance. He asked city staff to align with and look at those potential laws for guidance. He noted that different electric bikes have different maximum speed capabilities. Mayor Drew Boyles said, "It's also incumbent upon us to publicize to the drivers that this is a slow-speed town of 35 miles an hour or less, pretty much everywhere except PCH (Pacific Coast Highway)... Bikes aren't going away. Multi-mobility is not going away. Ebikes. Scooters. Golf carts. We just have to get everyone used to it. So I think it's the ebike riders, the kids, the adults, and their parents. It's our police department holding them accountable and ticketing them. It's also getting the word out to everybody that we need to pay attention because we have a lot of cyclists in town who also want to share the road, and they want drivers to obviously not hit them." Voss noted that the police department had made a video on bike safety, and they could resurface it. Said Swanson, who returned to the podium, "You can do print, you can video. If the parents don't do it, the kids aren't going to do it. What we need to do first is patrol around the schools." He named the high school and middle school as the first areas that should be targeted, calling the middle school "the problem child right now. You can lead the horse to water but can't make it drink. But enforcement and some summons. They see these kids doing this stuff; they gotta be stopped. And they gotta give them a summons. See how long that child has that bike if the parent has to bring them down to PD (police department) to get a little lecture on it." Pimentel noted that in Manhattan Beach, the first offense is a \$500 fine. "Grand and Center is huge. And nobody stops. Nobody. The adults, even on the road, race bikes. They don't stop because they don't want to lose their momentum

over the weekend to help him deal with the situation, which occurred on Friday, Aug. 25 at 4 p.m., he said. He said a Rhodesian Ridgeback weighing between 90 and 100 pounds walked by three boys and a woman, jumped and bit his hand. He noted that his hand is still healing and that he is having some trouble manipulating his ring finger on his left hand, calling it "painful" and noting that it "continues to be a problem." He said police responded to the incident and took photos, videos, and a report. The fire department rendered first aid. Guidone noted that since the bite, he has found out that the dog Logan has reportedly bitten two other people. "This dog is a menace to the city, and I have no idea what has been done with it, but it needs to be removed from the public streets. I don't like to complain, but I feel like I've been a victim here." He suggested putting the dog "on a farm out in Utah where they have room for malicious dogs." He said El Segundo's animal control works Monday through Friday and that he didn't receive help from the department until mid-Monday morning after Friday the incident. He suggested that the city have animal control available on weekends like other cities.

City Manager George told the council that the El Segundo police department handles animal control, and service officers function as animal control on the weekend. Council member Carol Pirsztuk said she recently had to be persistent to reach animal control on the weekend, but an officer did come out and handle her issue. Said Guidone, "My concern was that after this dog bit me, there was really no one to really see that the dog was quarantined, that it had its shots. You know, I'm thinking, 'I wonder if the dog's had his rabies shots?' You know—pertinent information, like that. You know, so I'm sweating bullets for 72 hours to find out. OK."

Pirsztuk mentioned cross-training as Mayor Boyles suggested mutual aid. Mayor Pro Tem Pimentel then chimed in and said that dogs picked up in El Segundo go to Hawthorne (shelter), "so this would be something the (police) chief might comment on about our ability to address that. There must be a decision tree that officers would go through on the weekend. But that would be worth revisiting, city manager."•

(BPT) - A house with ample windows can win your heart with silent promises of sun-drenched rooms and warm breezes wafting through open windows. The truth, however, is that even a home with windows galore can have rooms that feel dark and cave like. Some of the most-loved aspects of modern design open, expansive floor plans, wood flooring in darker tones, walls of windows - may leave portions of a room dazzled with sun and other parts dim and poorly lit. What's more, interior spaces like powder rooms, laundry rooms, mudrooms and closets often have no windows at all, making them feel small and dark. Maximizing the amount of light that comes in through the windows you do have is easy. Keep curtains light and airy, and use blinds or shades to control the amount of light coming from the window. You can also "dress" walls to mimic the look of windows. For example, if you have a windowless powder room, adding a transom above the door can help the room feel bigger while borrowing light from adjacent rooms. The tactic of borrowing light can also work if you're able to put a pass through between a closed off room and an adjacent one that has windows.

Finally, don't overlook the power of decor in making a room feel bright and welcoming. Light-hued walls of white, cream or pale yellow or blue not only make a room feel bigger, they evoke the visual qualities of natural light.

Filtered overhead light can also create the effect of a natural light source. For example, drape light-colored, opaque fabric above a bed, so that the cloth conceals the overhead light fixture. As the artificial light shines through the fabric, it will imitate the diffused look of natural light. *




