City Gathers for 30th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day Celebration

A picture slide show of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was on a loop on a screen above the stage at the auditorium at Crozier Middle School as the 30th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Celebration took place. "It is truly a pleasure and honor to stand before you today as Chair of the Inglewood 30th annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. celebration," Chairman Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Planning Committee Henry Brown said. "I imagine that when the original Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. planning committee convened during their first meeting 30 years ago, there was some sense of pride, excitement and a sense of great responsibility in having to plan and execute an inaugural event on behalf of the city and in honor of a great man like Dr. King. We have been working on this since June, and part of the city's history with regard to the Dr. King Day celebration is that Inglewood was one of the first cities to declare Dr. Martin Luther King's birthday a holiday."

The day's event began with a two-hour opening ceremony where special guests actress Zoe Hendrix, Los Angeles County District Attorney Jackie Lacey and KTLA Morning Show anchor and Mistress of Ceremony Michaela Pereira helped move the program along by recognizing and acknowledging accomplishments by different individuals in the city, including the winners of the yearly Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Speech Contest. The contest includes students from all schools in the Inglewood Unified School District, as well as participants from local churches. The levels of competition are kindergarten to second grade, third grade to fifth grade, sixth to eighth grade and ninth through 12th grade. This year's winners were second grader Cadence Callahan from Oak Street Elementary School; fourth grader Alonso Rios from Payne Elementary School; sixth grader Zionne Nunez from Highland

Elementary School; and Inglewood High School senior Amani Moultrie.

"We honor Dr. King today by keeping the dream alive past and future," Inglewood Unified School District Interim State Administrator LaTanya Kirk-Carter said. "In 1960, only 29 Negroes lived in the city. Not a single black child attended the city's schools. I am proud to say that my aunt and uncle moved to 8801 10th Avenue in 1968 and my family moved less than a quarter-mile from the city's boundaries in 1967 to the house that we currently live in. My cousin was voted All-American football player linebacker at Morningside High School in 1976. I am here now as a state administrator for the Inglewood Unified School District and I represent the dream of the past."

Also acknowledged during the opening ceremony were the members of the original planning committee for the First Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Celebration, who back in 1984 hosted the first celebration at Darby Park. Committee members, fondly referred to as the Original Dream Team, included Joyce Dorn, Mrs. McDougal, Alemada Thomas, Maurice Wiley, Mr. Hawkins, Reverend Alexander and George Dotson. The first event coincided with the dedication of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Center at Darby Park, which was also developed, planned and organized by a committee comprised of residents selected by the mayor at that time.

"It is pretty amazing that 30 years later we are still celebrating Dr. Martin Luther King's birthday," Inglewood Mayor James T. Butts said. "This is extremely significant because ordinarily when power is yielded it is only yielded in response to physical force or through political force. Through nonviolence and by shaping the consciousness of the country, he [Dr. King] provided equality for minorities of all colors. Without Dr. Martin

Luther King, there would've never been a black police chief in Santa Monica, there would not be black mayors and governors across the country and there certainly would have never been a two-term president named Barack Hussein Obama."

The second part of the day's celebration included music and food for residents and several of the city's businesses and nonprofits to interact. "When we celebrate this event, we are celebrating greatness and it is an honor to do so. Through the dedication of the original planning committee members and those that followed, celebrations have evolved to include medical services, the speech contest, a family festival and on certain occasions a symbolic march," Mayor Butts said. "On the occasion of the 30th anniversary of Dr. King's day, the City of Inglewood extends a heartfelt thank you to members of the original Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day planning committee. We thank them for their vision and dedication and for keeping the dream alive."

Members of the current planning committee include Katherine Thompson, Pinkie Nichols, Crystal Turner-Callahan, Dessie Kelley, Gred Kindred, Elijah Mackey, William Thurmond, James Burt, Alicia Smith, Angel Hernandez, Ashlyn Campos, Erick Holly, Gayle Atley, Dr. Johnny J. Young, Julian Simmons, Kameron Holly, Kyndal Holly, Lorene Shaw, Malik Gordon, Nikki Peters, Rosari Garcia, Sherrod Conyers, Steven Lawton, Taylor Irby and Tomas Arriaga.

"We have certainly come a long way and on Monday, we will mark the beginning of the second term of Barack Obama, our nation's first black president," Brown said. "We have come a long way, but there is still work to be done. So, today as we reflect on our past and as we look forward to our future, we hope something that we say or do here today will inspire you--inspire you to work toward keeping the dream alive." •

Jefferson Elementary Makes Steady Gains

During its meeting last week, the Hawthorne School Board heard a positive report from Jefferson Elementary School Principal Wendy Ostensen on her campus' rising academic performance. She cited the school's steadily increasing Academic Performance Index (API) score and also discussed her plans to shore up some deficiencies in areas such as math.

Since 2010, Jefferson's API scores have hovered in the 790s, with its most recent score being 794. However, Ostensen's goal has been (and still is) to achieve an 800 or higher score, which would place Jefferson in the ranks of the district's higher performing elementary schools such as Ramona and Zela-Davis--both of which are just under an 820 API score. While progress to an 800 or higher score has been slow, Ostensen believes her plan will get the school to it. "We would like to see higher test score growth, but we have a long-term plan in place," said Ostensen.

One area Ostensen is taking a close look at improving is math. School-wide, the number of students scoring proficient or advanced on the California Standardized Test (CST) has fallen from 56.6 percent to 54.5 percent, with the majority of those losses happening in third and fifth grade. Ostensen believes that improving math will greatly impact Jefferson's academic record. "School-wide math needs to improve," said Ostensen. "It does have an impact on our test scores."

In order to improve students' math skills, Ostensen has implemented many changes. She has had a math coach working with teachers to model lessons and work with special projects, and intervention teachers to identify and address areas in math that might need more attention. The area with the most room for improvement is number sense. Ostensen said that students are struggling in that area, but her staff is already working to provide additional instruction in the form of "fast facts" that should allow students more time to practice their number knowledge before the test. Teachers have already noticed that student benchmark scores have improved since introducing fast facts. "Number sense is very heavily weighted," said Ostensen. "Teachers know if students can master their fast facts, they will succeed in number sense."

Another avenue Ostensen is attempting to use to teach math more effectively is providing materials and workshops for parents so they can better help their students. However, Ostensen said the number of parents taking advantage of these resources is less than

she'd prefer. "That is an area of need--we need more support from our parents," said Ostensen. "We do as much outreach as possible, but I'm sure there is always more we could be doing."

There are some very encouraging signs from Jefferson that things are improving academically. Ostensen said that the second grade has experienced "dramatic growth." In the 2010-2011 school year, 57 percent and 66 percent of second graders scored proficient or advanced on the language arts and math portions of the CST respectively. This year those numbers are up to 75 percent in language arts and 74 percent in math, which means Jefferson leads the district in those two categories for second grade. Ostensen feels this a major achievement for her and her staff. "We are very excited and proud of our grade level growth," said Ostensen.

Another achievement at Jefferson has been a sharp decline in disciplinary actions compared with last year. Between September 1, 2011 and January 10, 2012, there were 14 suspensions at the school. However, during that same period this year there has been only one. Fewer suspensions should translate into better test scores, as more students are in the classroom and not being distracted by bad behavior. "We all know discipline is a factor in how well students do in the classroom--and if they aren't in the classroom, they aren't learning," said Ostensen. "We are seeing a dramatic decrease in discipline problems, which means more students in the classroom."

Jefferson's staff members aren't the only ones anxious to see the school earn an API score of over 800. The students have made a deal with Ostensen that if they can get a high enough score, they can shower her in slime. "When we get to 800, these students have said they want to pour green slime all over me and I said, 'Okay, once we get to 800,'" said Ostensen. "I think we'll get there this year."

Overall, the Board seemed happy with Jefferson's progress. Board member Alexandre Monteiro complemented Ostensen for her work in addressing both the school's academic issues, with increased coaching and intervention, and the discipline concerns with bullying workshops and new classroom management strategies. "I'm glad to see those benchmarks showing you are on the right track--data doesn't lie," said Monteiro. "I also like to see those discipline results. It shows the bullying workshops are working." •

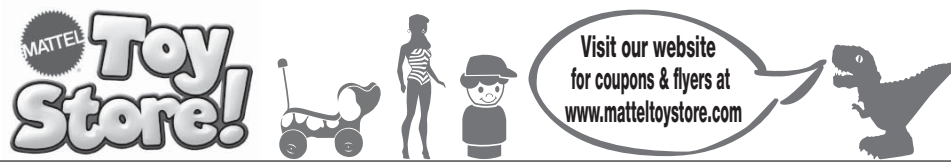

Hawthorne Wins First Ocean Match Over Culver City

Hawthorne High's boys' soccer team has been struggling through most of this season, but the Cougars broke through with their first Ocean League win over host Culver City, 2-0, last Friday. The two teams battled to a scoreless tie until the 75th minute when Martin Murillo tapped in the ball to give Hawthorne the lead. Toward the end of the match, a Culver City player was called for a penalty and junior forward Jason Santana knocked in the ball past Centaur goalkeeper Brian Gutierrez.

"It's great to get our first win," Hawthorne head coach Yury Najarro said. "We lost our captain, Candalario Paz, for the season. He has a torn ACL. It's a great loss for us."

The Cougars had earlier Ocean losses to Beverly Hills, Inglewood and Morningside. On January 16 at Hawthorne, the Cougars fell to Morningside, 4-1. Santana scored Hawthorne's only goal. Morningside, which is 3-1 in league and is second behind Beverly Hills in league, had a hat trick goal by Aurelio Partida and another goal from Jose Rodriguez.

Hawthorne hosted Santa Monica last night. The Vikings have been a league power, but are faced with rebuilding with just a 2-2 Ocean record. Najarro feels that the Cougars have a shot at their first win over Santa Monica in several years. Hawthorne then will host the league-leading Normans Friday at 6 p.m. and visits Inglewood next Wednesday at the same time.

MORNINGSIDE WIN OVER HAWTHORNE ENDS WITH BRAWL

On January 16 at Hawthorne High, Morningside High's boys' basketball team from Inglewood downed the Cougars 63-52 in a contest that ended in a bizarre brawl between players and fans. The event caused seven Cougar players to be suspended for last Friday's game at Culver City and as a result,

Hawthorne Principal Mark Newell asked that his school, which had just three players left and did not want to move up junior varsity players to the varsity squad, forfeit and have the game canceled against the Centaurs.

Hawthorne, which had a fine showing in preseason play at 10-4, is 0-4 in the Ocean League, also losing the previous league games to host Beverly Hills (64-56 on January 9) and a 72-71 nail-biter to Inglewood on January 11.

The brawl stemmed from a hard foul by the Cougars' Akeem Allen. At the end of the contest as both teams started shaking their hands, Monarch players and fans were dashing and beginning to attack Allen, according to sources. Hawthorne players went and tried to defend Allen, but from the other side, Cougar fans dashed onto the court and got involved. According to a source, virtually everyone got involved and it got out of control.

Four Hawthorne players had a one-game suspension, but Newell asked that three other players sit out and that left just three Cougars out of their 10-player roster. Also, two Morningside players were reportedly suspended for last Friday's league home game against first place Santa Monica (18-4 overall and 4-0 in league). The Vikings downed the Monarchs 67-50.

Morningside hosted cross-town rival Inglewood last night and will be at home against Culver City for a 7:30 p.m. league game on Friday. The Monarchs are at home at Beverly Hills next Wednesday at the same time.

Hawthorne (10-8 overall) hosted Santa Monica last night and are at home against Beverly Hills Friday at 7:30 p.m. The Cougars visit Inglewood next Wednesday at the same time.

LEUZINGER ROUTS WEST

Leuzinger High's boys' basketball team recorded a surprising rout of host West Torrance 64-42, setting the stage for its first Bay League home showdown against Redondo in the battle of 4-0 league teams last Tuesday.

The Sea Hawks (11-8, 4-0) easily won their home game over Palos Verdes (7-13, 0-4) 71-38 last Friday. Against the Warriors (12-7, 2-2), the Olympians (15-4 overall and ranked second in the CIF-Southern Section Division IIIA) led 35-27 at halftime, then pulled away by outscoring West 29-15 in the second half.

Against South, Will Newman and Nathan McAnally shared the Cardinals' high-scoring honors with 15 points each. Newman led Lawndale (11-6 overall) with a game-high 26 points, six rebounds, six assists, five blocks and three steals in its win over the Saxons. McAnally contributed 11 points and R'Lando Beckles had nine. North was led by Alex Thompson with 11 points.

The Cardinals visited Centennial High in Compton last night and will host El Segundo Friday at 7:30 p.m. Lawndale is at Torrance next Wednesday at the same time. •

Police Department Hosts Blood Drive, Battle of the Badges

The Hawthorne Police Department, in collaboration with the Red Cross, hosted the Battle of the Badges in the most recent blood drive to be hosted in the city. Battle of the Badges, which took place January 15, is a friendly competition that gives all badge-carrying personnel an opportunity to donate blood on behalf of their department to see which entity can donate the most. The blood drive also welcomes community members and anyone willing to donate.

"We have done this for four years at the Hawthorne Police Department and last year we had a 90 percent increase in our donations, so we were very happy with that," Community Affairs Sgt. Chris Cognac said. "This year we have a very good turnout even though we had a little bit of a glitch because the blood mobile broke down on the way here, so we only have half the time to collect the blood donations--but we have a full room of people willing to donate. A lot of people came in from the community."

Battle of the Badges, which was constantly announced on the Police Department's Facebook and Twitter accounts, is in its seventh year of existence and has been experiencing a growth in participants since the beginning of the campaign. Last year, there were a registered 5,178 donors for the drive by the United States Probation Office and other participating agencies. This year, the Red Cross set its goal of units collected at 5,500.

"We greatly appreciate the Hawthorne Police Department and their support, especially at this time because we are coming out of the New Year and our supplies are a little lower because we are still recovering from the holidays," Red Cross Account Manager Alice Lan said. "People do not think of donating blood during the holidays. People are out of town, with family or on vacation, so it's harder. Each day, we require 1,500 units of blood to ensure that we meet hospital patients' needs. This can be people who are suffering from blood disorders, people who require surgery, people who have been in some sort of trauma, burn victims or premature babies."

The blood drive attracted donors from within the department, the City staff and employees from local entities. "I heard about it [blood drive] at work," Medical Records Director with the Hawthorne Healthcare and Wellness Center Valerie Cardona said. "They brought it up in our meeting and they said it would be great if we went as a team and showed our support. I just went for it."

For Leah Seharf, also from the Hawthorne Healthcare and Wellness Center, donating blood is something she plans to continue doing. "We are here supporting the City of Hawthorne," Seharf said. "This is our first time and the first time that I know that they have had something like this since I have been working in the City of Hawthorne. I am actually pretty excited and if I ever need blood one day, I will probably need somebody else's blood, so it is good to give some of my own."

Aside from the friendly competition behind Battle of the Badges, Sgt. Cognac believes that hosting such events not only contributes to the Red Cross' goal of maintaining a blood supply, but also provides an opportunity for the department and residents to interact and build a stronger relationship. "Blood is truly the gift of life and blood is in constant need--we are always in a shortage of blood," Sgt. Cognac said. "Our blood supply is not forever. Blood expires and so there is a constant need for it and you really can save a life, or two, or three with your donation. That is why we always need to do things like this. This brings the community together and it lets everyone become a part of something. It is nice because we get to come here and talk to people as well. I am waiting to donate my blood and I am sitting next to a regular citizen that saw us on Facebook and decided to donate blood. It is good, it helps us build a nice little bond and we get a sense of community."

Lan added, "I hope that they walk away knowing that they saved three lives with their donation and that they really made an impact in somebody's life. They have helped a brother, sister or a mom and we are really grateful that they are able to donate their time and their blood." •

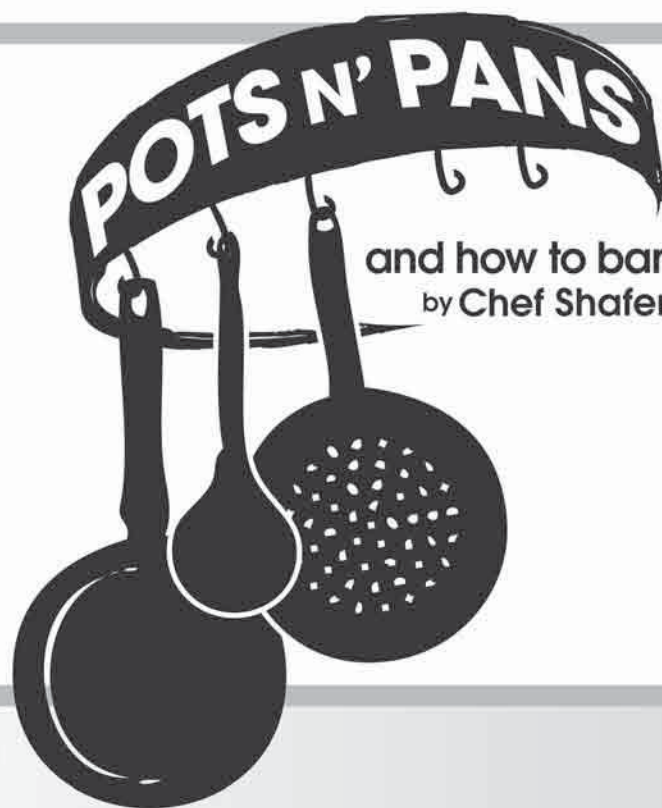

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Chef Shafer's Curry Rub

- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 6 cloves of garlic chopped
- 1 tablespoon chopped pickled ginger (sushi style)
- ¼ cup chopped cilantro
- 2 tablespoons curry powder
- 1 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon course black pepper
- ¼ cup light sodium soy sauce

Mix together all ingredients then rub onto whatever you are going to grill. Let sit for 10 minutes, then grill and eat. •

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
