Interim School Superintendent Continues to Face Challenges, Critics

A little more than half a year after the \$55 million takeover by the State, Inglewood schools interim replacement administrator La Tanya Kirk-Carter continues to face difficult challenges while raising concerns among some of the city's residents. With the already deep cuts to the budget that have claimed adult and early childhood education services this past March, discontent was voiced once again by Christopher Graeber and the California Professional Employee Local Union #2345, as well as Equity in Education Committee after the hiring of Brenda Young, the wife of Advisory Board member Johnny J. Young, as a nursing consultant. In addition, Graeber voiced concerns about Inglewood School Police Chief William Carter being put on paid administrative leave.

"I brought in somebody who just left the [School] District and since she recently retired, she is background-cleared and TB-clear--she literally just retired in December, so she knows the school, she [Young] knows the principal," Kirk-Carter said. "We picked her because we have a really bad infestation of lice among children. There were about five or six schools that were infected. The students were coming back and nobody was here to check them--so we are not only losing attendance from the students, but the teachers were calling out and she was a good solution. She recently retired and she knows the kids. She [Young] had a good reputation with the District as an employee. People say she was a good nurse and she left under good circumstances."

Young's hiring as a consultant to assist with the oversight of the Health Services Department is just one of the many concerns raised by people like Graeber and Tawana Cherry--the Communications Director for Equity in Education Committee, who recently sent a letter State Superintendent Tom Torlakson to express discontent with the manner in which the District has been managed since it was taken over by the State.

"You address certain concerns to the district,-i.e., La-Tanya Kirk-Carter because she is now in charge of the District, and you do not get a response, then you get no transparency and you get no accountability," Cherry said. "When certain things are being requested of you to

have some validity as to why you are taking the steps you are taking without following proper protocol, that raises a red flag and tells you that something else has to be done. We go to the State and now we don't want to have any more communication with Kirk-Carter or any State-designated interim officer that has been placed in the School District because we aren't getting answers."

Kirk-Carter, who became the interim superintendent when predecessor Kent Taylor resigned in December, acknowledges that the District's situation is dire and that citizens want results--but she stands by her decisions and actions as the best steps to help the District recover. "The District has big problems and we will do whatever it takes to fix those problems. Some of the issues are ADA, which has gone from 19,000 students to 11,000," Kirk-Carter said. "We are in a \$17 million structural deficit. We are upside down and we are spending way more money than we have coming in. I'm not the old board. They hired me to fix the District and they would not have hired me if I couldn't do what I do. It is not going to be pretty and it is not fun when you are in this position."

Still, Cherry and Graeber both agree that additional cuts and layoffs can only do so much to help fix the situation that afflicts the District. In addition, the classified employees union and the Equity in Education Committee are not happy with what they consider a lack of transparency and ethical protocol by the District when hosting meetings because they believe that the residents are not given nearly enough notice about such meetings. Furthermore, Cherry expressed concern that there is no fiscal recovery plan that has been seen, yet the cuts to the budget continue to happen.

"The whole purpose of the State taking over was to put you in a better position than the way you were found. So when you have a State interim appointee that is not following the rules of the SB 533, which states that you have to have a fiscal recovery plan in place before you decide to make cuts, that's a problem," Cherry said. "Now is the time for things to change and we want that change now. Enough is enough. We have been dealing with the garbage for a year and a half now. It is not so much a La-Tanya Kirk-Carter issue as much as it's a public instructional State superintendent issue.

We elected you and your duty is to make sure that every school district is functioning within financial solvency and functioning to provide a higher-quality education for every child in the district."

Kirk-Carter understands the need to keep the District's employees working, but made it clear that her priority will continue to be the students. However, with the budget constraints getting worse, there is no guarantee that more cuts won't be necessary.

"In this case, it is so upside down that you can't just fix everything right away. We had to lay off employees and we are going to restructure, but you can only cut so much before it becomes not manageable," Kirk-Carter said. "You have to say at some point that we either die as a district or we have to grow--and right now, we have to grow because you can't shrink when you are this big. You are going to end up having to close schools and more people will lose their jobs. People must realize that we have to give kids a quality education and let the parents know that you respect them and that you are treating them the same way that any other school district would treat them, which is with respect and by taking care of their kids. That is the only way the parents will trust you with their kids." •

In a consolation game of the El Segundo Tournament on Saturday, the Cougars were edged by Mary Star of the Sea High from San Pedro 4-3. The Stars went on to win the consolation title with a 3-0 shutout of Torrance Bishop Montgomery.

Hawthorne closes league this week. After hosting Inglewood on Tuesday, the Cougars finish Ocean play at Beverly Hills today at 3:15 p.m. Hawthorne begins the CIF-Southern Section Division IV playoffs next week.

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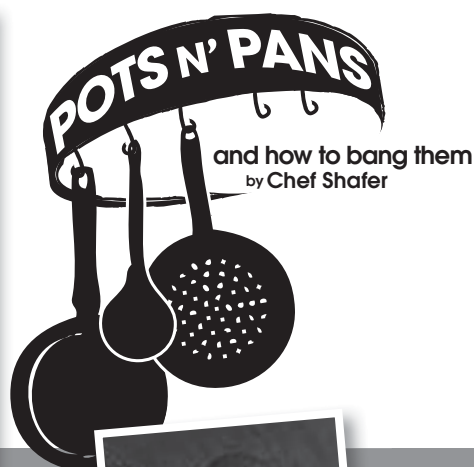

 ¼ cup finely chopped red onions
 ¼ cup olive oil
 ½ cup raw pine nuts
 ½ cup dried berries
 ¼ cup rice vinegar
 2 pound bag washed spinach
 4 eggs for poaching
 4 cups water for poaching
 2 tablespoons white vinegar for poaching water

Place water in a pot with the vinegar and bring to a slow boil. When ready, add the eggs and cook for 1 to 2 min. Or till cooked to your liking.

Sauté the onions in the olive oil in a hot sauté pan. Add the pine nuts and the cherries.

Remove from the fire. Add the vinegar.

In a large bowl pour the mixture over the spinach and toss together.

Separate into portions and top with the warm poached eggs.
