South Bay Not Making Much Headway on Electric Vehicle Goal

South Bay drivers and fleet owners are supposed to have 33,000 electric vehicles on the road in six years. California figures that's a fair expectation since the South Bay represents slightly more than 2 percent of the state's registered drivers. The current number of the alternative-fuel vehicles -- known as EVs -- is less than 4,000 across the South Bay.

Sacramento is counting on individual motorists, businesses and local governments to make the switch from gas-powered cars, trucks and buses to electric-powered vehicles before 2025. That's the target date for having 1.5 million EVs on the road in California. The race to reduce carbon emissions and coax more buyers into battery-operated vehicles began in earnest in 2006 and continued with former Gov. Jerry Brown issuing an executive order in January 2018 that state and local governments take the lead to increase EV use.

Currently, there are about 3,800 electric vehicles in the South Bay, according to the South Bay Cities Council of Governments. The organization keeps an updated count of EV ownership in the South Bay and lists each city's number of zero-emission vehicles. For the benefit of EV owners, the organization also shows the location of nearby charging stations.

Hawthorne has 123 electric vehicles in operation and a goal of reaching 3,274 of the zero-emission cars by the 2025 target date, according to the quasi-governmental group. Inglewood motorists own 78 EVs, and must reach 4,588 over the next 60 months. Lawndale residents account for 36 zero-emission vehicles now. Their target is 1,186.

Clearly, South Bay city leaders and state

agencies will need to put the pedal to the metal to reach the state requirements for clean-running transportation. El Segundo residents have put 113 EVs into operation so far. The state is demanding 739 battery-powered cars or trucks be registered in the city. The city of Carson has one of the larger targets -- 3,217 – and has just 106 EVs owned and operated in the city now. These numbers are just a first phase.

The number of electric vehicles in the state must be 5 million by the end of the next decade, according to Brown's directive. It's unclear what, if any penalties, cities would face for not reaching their EV goals. State agencies and officials are tasked with working with local governments and private industry to create 250,000 charging stations for the EVs. What will it take for the South Bay to reach the state's ambitious goals for individual drivers and fleet owners? Higher confidence by the driving public and continued tax and price incentives to attract first-time electric vehicle buyers who worry about running out of juice and getting stranded. Studies done on EVs have shown there is little difference between a gas engine and a battery-powered one for most commuters. The need to drive longer distances is a real concern among consumers when considering an EV purchase.

A summary of findings from the South Bay Cities Council of Governments, which began researching the EVs five years ago and makes comparisons against gas-powered vehicles, noted the average household reduces their emissions by 40 percent when a battery-powered vehicle is introduced in the family. These EVs can be swapped out for a gas-powered engine for normal distances and

destinations, according to the study's findings. "Most participants used their homes or workplaces to charge their vehicles" using a 100-volt outlet, researchers reported. The EVs can keep up with the speed of traffic, too.

Battery electric vehicles are "full-speed vehicles" which have a typical range of 80 to 90 miles before they need to be recharged, said the authors of the December 2017 study.

The federal government offers a tax credit of up to \$7,500 on the purchase of a new electric vehicle or hybrid, according to the U.S. Department of Energy website. The credit amount is based on the capacity of the battery used to power the vehicle. The EV tax credit can be applied to an individual or couple's federal tax return to lower the amount of taxes owed or increase the size of a refund. Used vehicles do not qualify, and the tax credit on a leased EV is given to the leasing company, according to the Energy Department.

State residents also are eligible for a \$7,000 rebate from the state for purchase or lease of an all-electric or hybrid vehicle. As long as funds are available, eligible California residents can follow a simple process to apply for a CVRP rebate after purchasing or leasing a vehicle that qualifies through the program.

The California Air Resources Board also offers incentives for public fleets, with a standard CVRP rebate for all California public entities. Other high-value incentives are given to local governments and agencies in vulnerable and pollution-burdened areas. "Public agencies are eligible for up to 30 vehicle rebates annually. Some fleets may




Check It OutThe Clockmaker's Daughter by Kate Morton

Part ghost story, part mystery, Kate Morton's latest historical fiction book, The Clockmaker's Daughter, weaves multiple storylines through time while touching on music, art, war and the supernatural. At first glance, the various characters and their tales don't appear connected... but by the end of the story, they have converged in interesting and sometimes unexpected ways.

Similar to other Morton works, Clockmaker features a house, Birchwood Manor, located in a small English village. Throughout the 150-plus years, the house is the setting for joy, grief, love

Film Review Us Review: A New, Essential **American Nightmare**

Last year's Get Out ended up being more than just one of the scariest and most wildly original movies of recent times. Jordan Peele's horror flick, about a group of African Americans who become enslaved through mind control after getting hypnotized by a family of wealthy Whites, became a pop cultural lightning rod for people to discuss the Black experience of living in America – speaking to both its earliest historical roots of enslavement through the modern anxiety of Trump-era politics.

For such a stunning achievement of a debut, it's no wonder that audiences have been looking forward to whatever Peele's follow-up film would be with feverish excitement. And now, Peele is back with another

suspense thriller -Us - which is equally ambitious in its masterfully layered allegory (this review is spoiler-free).

It/s this duality that makes *Us* work on two operatic levels: a familiar yet pulse-pounding set-up of a family trying to survive a home invasion, as well as a wildly conceptual existential dread-fest that ties in such gigantic conversations as race in America. When an African American family (a detail that isn't relevant to the story until you think about it symbolically afterwards) vacations at their beach house, haunting memories can't help but pop up for Adelaide (Lupita Nyong'o), who remembers an experience she had when she, as a little girl back in 1986, wandered away from her family one night at the boardwalk only to find herself face to face with another girl - her exact self. It's enough to make for a traumatic childhood that makes her feel not quite herself and sets the stage for years later when her family becomes the targets of home invaders - frighteningly and inconceivably enough, being each of their actual selves.

A family of four staring back at their exact opposites, they see these attackers all clad in red jumpsuits, brandishing scissors as weapons and noticeably all mute - except for Adelaide's doppelgänger, Red (also played by Nyong'o). From there, it's a story of the family trying to outlive their attackers, who aim to do away with them and take their place in this world.

Peele, a previous funnyman whose background on the two iconic sketch shows Mad TV and Key and Peele helped shape him into the brilliant premise inventor that he is, proves more amazingly here that it's his deep understanding of film history that makes him such a gifted talent (the Hitchcock comparisons have been flying his way as of late). While this review could spend even more time unpacking the visual references that are everywhere in the film and their significance (while still not touching on everything), quite simply put, Us is everything any audience could want in a movie. And one of the best parts is Peele marries his uncompromising vision with the mindset of being big-screen popcorn entertainment, giving Us the opportunity to be seen and discussed by people of all types. And this is what films - the best, paradigm-shifting films - are supposed to do. We should not only escape into something for 100 minutes and return to modern life unchanged, but come back from the experience more learned, or at the very least willing to confront realworld discomforts. So beyond being one of the most unsettling films of this or any other recent year, Us achieves an importance that will be recognized, re-watched and discussed for years to come.



Pursuant to California Government Code Sections 53316 and 53340, and in accordance with the Rate and Method of Apportionment (the "RMA"), as set forth in Exhibit E of Resolution No. 19SCIP-1 (the "Resolution of Intention") adopted January 24, 2019, as incorporated into Resolution No. 19SCIP-35 (the "Resolution of Formation") adopted March 7, 2019, with respect to the California Statewide Communities Develop-mentAuthority Community Facilities District No. 2019-01 (333 North Prairie), City of Inglewood, County of Los Angeles, State of California (the "Community Facilities District"), a special tax is hereby levied on all taxable parcels within the Community Facilities District for the 2019-2020 fiscal year and for all subsequent fiscal years in the amount determined by the Community Facilities District in accordance with the RMA until collection of the Special Tax by the Commission ceases and a Notice of Cessation of Special Tax is recorded in accordance with Section 53330.5 of the Act, provided that this amount may in any fiscal year be levied at a lesser amount by resolution of the Commission.

SECTION 2. qualify for increased incentives if located within a California disadvantaged community census tract," says the Air Resources Board website.

Under the law pushing motorists to switch to all-electric cars and SUVs, California will require that about 8 percent of the new cars sold by automakers be battery-powered. In a blog posted on the Union of Concerned Scientists website, a clean vehicle engineer wrote two years ago that automakers have proven they can meet the state's EV goals.

David Reichmuth in his blog, "What Will It Take for Automakers to Meet California's EV Requirements?" said sales were already trending toward more zero-emissions cars -- even four years ago. While Gov. Brown's goal of 1.5 million electric vehicles by 2025 was a stretch back then, the engineer wrote all-electric vehicles was they had grown in back-to-back years. "EV sales in California increased 18 percent from 2015 and 3.5 percent of all new cars in the state were plug-in electric, up from 3.1 percent last year," he wrote. "But the story is more impressive when you consider several major automakers were absent from the market in 2016. If we exclude the two major automakers without a plug-in EV in 2016 [Honda and Toyota], EV sales would have exceeded 5 percent of new car sales in California."


