Elementary School District Releases 'Safe Route to School' Study Results

Walking or bicycling to school was the norm for many years. However over the course of time, particularly since the introduction of suburbs and as the population expanded after World War II, children had greater distances to reach their school from home. So, school buses were used or parents began driving their children to and from school.

In fact, according to studies conducted nationally by various organizations, there has been a sharp decrease in children walking or biking to school since the 1970s when nearly 60 percent of the school populations walked or biked compared to only about 15 percent today.

Lawndale Elementary School District (LESD) conducted a study for a "Safe Route to School" Program, encouraging its more than 5,800 students to walk or bike to school and citing that there are safe routes and ways to improve and eliminate concerns. With its neighborhood-based schools, Lawndale's seven elementary and two middle schools make it convenient to walk or bike from most homes or apartments to the campuses.

However, there are several intersections in Lawndale that require crossing guards in order to control the flow of students who must use crosswalks at large intersections.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff Department reports that in the LESD from 2006-2011, there were a total of 84 bicycle collisions reported and 65 pedestrian collisions. Auto right-of-way violation was the most common cause of bike collisions. Pedestrian collisions were as a result of violation of the pedestrian right-of-way as vehicles ignore pedestrians who are crossing a thoroughfare.

Children under the age of 13 were involved in 25 pedestrian collisions over the statistical time period, with six bicycle collisions involving the same age group (five to 13 years old).

The study indicates that the development and implementation of a "Safe Route to School" program is necessary to encourage parents to allow walking or biking to school. A program that supervises children as they walk or ride their bikes with volunteer block captains or walking school buses, with a volunteer adult at the front of the line and one at the back of the line as a group of neighborhood children walk to a school from a central location can ensure a safe route to school.

A program such as "Safe Routes to School" can also station volunteer adults at street corners to relay supervision of walking groups and aid in crossing at major arterials more safely, without the cost of hiring official crossing guards.

LESD conducted walk audits in several schools in the district. The study looked at the easy access to the campus, automobile traffic patterns around the school and at drop-off points, on-campus bicycle parking accommodations, and sidewalks, curb ramps, crosswalks, sufficient signage and the overall challenges facing those who walk to schools.

Overall, 38 percent of students in the district walk to school and 55 percent use a family vehicle as the means of transportation. Only two percent of those surveyed travel with bicycles.

The 55 percent vehicle-means-of-getting-to-school results in heavy traffic congestion around schools. Many vehicles double-park and do not enter provided drop-off zones in areas on a campus. To remedy the situation, signage at schools needs to be prevalent, free of graffiti and clear and brightly-colored. Pavement markings must be well-painted and properly taken care of by Public Works.

Bicycle racks are needed at all campuses to encourage the use of bikes for those children whose parents allow biking to school. Also, the use of skateboards over the last 15

years by many students make it necessary for campuses to have new rules governing the use of skateboards and to have storage during school hours. All schools have a "No Skateboarding" on campus regulation.

With the student population of more than 5,000 in LESD, a survey of parents about how their children get to and from school was only completed by approximately 365 parents. School staff and supervisory staff also participated in the survey as teachers queried their classrooms about how each child arrived at school on particular days and made note of reasons why students don't walk.

Walking on many congested traffic thoroughfares also makes parents feel unsafe, due to speeding vehicles in the lanes closest to the sidewalks and poor sidewalk maintenance in many areas of the city. Other concerns around schools include drivers who don't observe signage, don't yield to pedestrians, and don't follow volunteer traffic coordinators at campus entrances.

Currently, there are 10 crossing guards in LESD. However, the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, notes that with only 38 percent of the student population walking and two percent biking, the necessary minimum of 40 pedestrians at an intersection on a daily basis is not met to require more crossing guards in the district.

The reports concludes that finding a "Safe Route to School" within the Lawndale Elementary School District is possible, although not practical.

Most parents (59 percent) who answered the survey agreed that it promotes a healthier lifestyle for children to walk to school. However, many parents also expressed concern not knowing if their child arrived safely or without incident. Many also commented that they would like to see more police officers near campuses to ensure that the children are safer when walking to/from school. •

CSD Urges Torrance to Take Advantage of Earned Tax Credits

The Internal Revenue Service and partners nationwide have launched the Earned Income Tax Credit Awareness Day outreach campaign, aimed at helping millions of Americans who earned \$50,270 or less take advantage of the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

Local officials and community organizations across the country are sponsoring more than 250 news conferences and other outreach events highlighting the benefits of this key work incentive for low-and moderate-income workers and working families. The annual campaign is necessary because one-third of the eligible population changes each year as their financial, marital and parental statuses change. Although an estimated four out of five eligible workers and families get the credit, one in five still miss out on it, either because they don't claim it when filing, or don't file a tax return at all.

"A large part of the nation sees major changes every year with their tax situation," said IRS Acting Commissioner Steven T. Miller. "This year, millions of workers could qualify for EITC for the first time, and the IRS urges them not to overlook this valuable credit."

The EITC varies by income, family size and filing status. The average EITC amount last year was around \$2,200.

As many as one out of five people eligible to claim this credit miss out because they don't apply. If you work, and earned under \$50,000 last year, you could receive up to \$5,891 by claiming the credit on your 2012 Federal tax returns.

In Hawthorne, there are 12,236 tax returns claiming the earned income tax credit for a total of \$30,087,599; in Inglewood, there are 18,036 tax returns claiming the earned income tax credit for a total of \$45,330,976; and in Lawndale, there are 4,006 tax returns claiming the earned tax credit for a total of \$9,686,946.

"To receive the credit, eligible Californians must file a tax return and claim what they've earned through EITC," said CSD Acting Director Linné Stout. "The Department and our local partners are working to get the word

out, and to help eligible Californians take advantage of the credit by offering free tax preparation services."

CSD administers the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) through partnering with local non-profits and government agencies to alleviate the causes of poverty in local communities throughout California. Several of CSD's partner agencies around the state are offering free tax preparation and EITC filing services during the 2013 tax season. Many agencies are also collaborating and leveraging with other community based organizations to offer these services, and fill service gaps around the state.

"We are working hard to reach all the members of our community who are eligible for EITC so they don't miss out on this great resource," said Betty McWilliams, executive director for Foothill Unity Center, a CSD partner agency in Los Angeles. "For a very low income family, receiving this credit can make a significant difference in their lives. And, the financial boost EITC provides working people also offers a boost to our local economy."

DUI CHECKPOINT NETS FIVE ARRESTS

The Hawthorne Police Department Traffic Unit conducted a D.U.I./Driver License checkpoint on Jan. 18 at Prairie Avenue and Jack Northrop Avenue between the hours of 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged-driving deterrence and provide the greatest safety for officers and the public. The results of this January 18th checkpoint are as follows:

- 1054 Vehicles Screened
- 3 DUI-Alcohol suspects arrested
- 2 DUI-Drug impaired suspects arrested
- 41 Drivers cited/arrested for operating a vehicle unlicensed or while suspended/revoked
- 52 Citations issued

These DUI/Driver License checkpoints lower DUI deaths and injuries. A major component of these checkpoints is the deterrent effect it has on those who might drive drunk or drugged-impaired, the public's added awareness and encouragement to use sober designated drivers. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies, while also yielding considerable cost savings of \$6 for every \$1 spent. Hawthorne PD will be conducting another D.U.I./Driver License Checkpoint on Friday, Feb. 22. 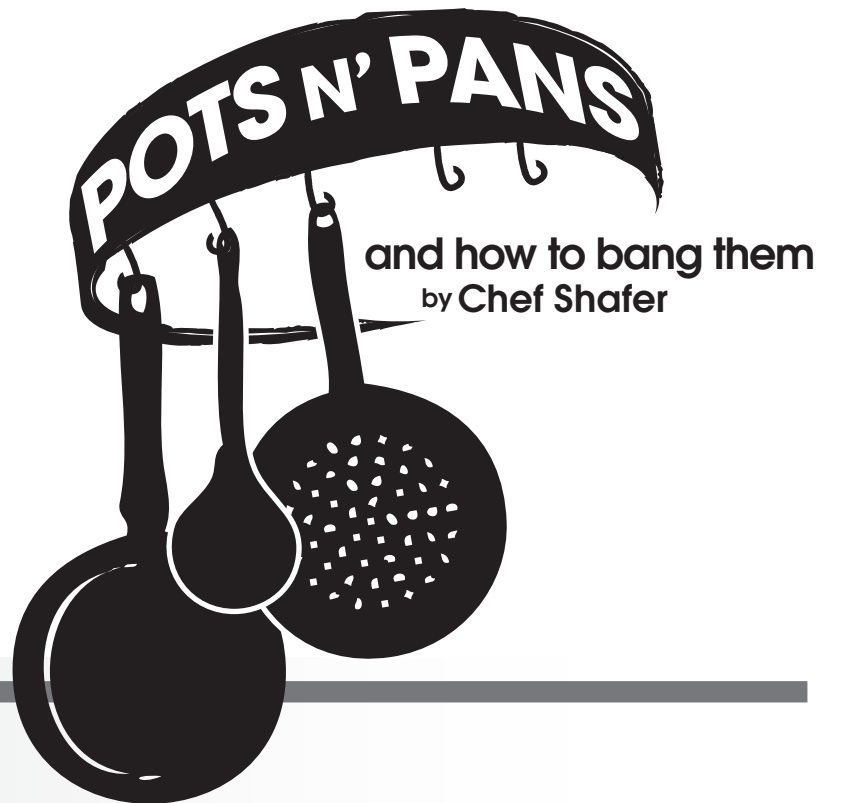

Chef Shafer's Yukon Potato Hash

- 3 lbs Yukon potatoes diced in 1/2 inch cubes
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons kosher salt
- 2 tablespoons paprika
- 2 tablespoons black pepper
- 2 large onions diced
- 1 lb red chard or kale chopped
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1 lb of bacon diced

1. Mix the potatoes, onions, oil, salt, pepper, and paprika and roast in oven at 375° for 20 min. Or until tender.
2. In a hot saute pan cook the bacon until golden brown.
3. Add the chard and mix together with the bacon.

Add the cooked potatoes and the broth mix and serve. •Let sit for 10 minutes, then grill and eat. •

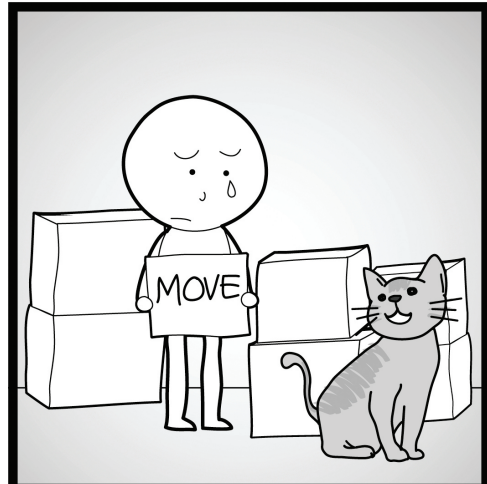
