City Council Authorizes July 4th Fireworks Stand Permits

The Lawndale City Council met on Tuesday, February 17 in lieu of the third Monday regular Council meeting schedule as the city observed President's Day on Monday and was closed for business. This meeting schedule change created a conflict for Mayor Pro-Tem Jim Osborne who was absent.

Although not the first order of business, the City Council heard from Joe McMahon, Treasurer of the Lawndale Rotary Club, that the application for the July 4th Fireworks Stand for their nonprofit organization was not mentioned as one of the six staff-recommended permits to be issued upon Council approval. He attested to the fact that the club contributed to the betterment of the community and did give back \$18,000 to various causes during the last year. Apparently, he, as the new treasurer, was not given all the information needed in order to fully complete Part B of the application and submit by the required deadline. However, the Part B was submitted on January 12. With eight spots available for stands across Lawndale during the designated days in late June and early July 2015, only the six permits were initially approved with a unanimous Council vote (4-0, with Osborne absent) to issue Fireworks Stand Permits to: Christian Heritage Church, Lawndale Chamber of Commerce, Lawndale Little League, Neighborhood Parent Forum/Girl Scouts, Lawndale Football and Cheerleading Association, and the Wesleyan Church of Lawndale.

Following consideration of the Lawndale Rotary Club request to evaluate the reasons for their delayed complete application submission in order to qualify for a Fireworks Stand Permit, the Council unanimously approved a motion to consider that due diligence by Lawndale Rotary Club's new treasurer to submit the completed application be allowed the nonprofit to be issued a permit for a Fireworks Stand for the 2015 July 4th sale days in Lawndale.

The agenda consent calendar awarded several contracts to vendors for various projects. The city facility improvements will include an upgrade to the HVAC systems in City Hall,

awarded to Pardess Air, Inc., in the amount of \$214,000 and will include a guarantee for a spare switch mechanism and a life expectancy for the unit in order for planning to be more efficient in the future for these systems. The maintenance contract for the HVAC systems in all buildings owned by the city is awarded to South Coast Mechanical in the amount of \$102,104 for a five-year term. The award for the roof repairs to the City Yard building is awarded to Best Contracting Services, Inc., in the amount of \$29,180.

Also awarded is a contract to DB Future International for the Hogan Park Expansion Project in the amount of \$1,611,269.72 after nine bids were received and examined. Construction is slated to begin in mid-March and be completed in August 2015.

The traffic signal upgrade project at 19 intersections is awarded to PTM General Engineering Services, Inc., in the amount of \$636,036 and will start in March with completion scheduled for sometime in July 2015. These improvements will include protected left-turn signal installations, pedestrian pushbuttons and countdown signals, yellow thermoplastic ladder-type crosswalk pavement markings, ADA-compliant improved curb ramps, and timed vehicular signal heads. A list of the intersections is available on the city website.

A request from Providence-Little Company of Mary Hospital Health & Services was received for the city of Lawndale to support a grant application for a cardiovascular program that ultimately will affect and benefit Lawndale residents. The request was approved by a unanimous vote. The city of Lawndale is not being asked to support the program financially, only to assist with any promotional efforts and public awareness, such as through cable television, use of city facilities for events, and postings on the city website.

City Manager Steve Mandoki advised that residents can find several new additions on the city website, such as updates on various road work projects, with maps and dates indicating which streets are scheduled for specific dates. Also available on the city website is a timeline for various projects, such

as the Hogan Park Improvement/Expansion Project, opening of DeOro Lane, and the traffic signals improvement project.

The Lawndale Library has a new Head Librarian following the transfer of Melissa McCollum to a new location. Donald Gould is now assigned to Lawndale and comes to the city from Manhattan Beach Library, which was recently closed for reconstruction of a new building by the Los Angeles County Library system.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Captain Steven Sciacca offered the public safety update reporting that vandalism in 2014 saw a seven percent decrease from the reported 143 vandalism cases in 2013. Also part of the report, Captain Sciacca related the condition of a male transient who was assaulted by several suspects and was hospitalized due to the extent of his injuries from being punched and kicked without provocation. Two suspects were taken into custody following a chase by deputies. In another incident, a suspect was discovered hiding in a house when the homeowner discovered a burglary was in progress and the homeowner, fearing for the safety of his family, fired one shot at the suspect, although the shot missed him, as he attempted to exit the house. Eight hours later a report was received that a suspicious character was loitering in the same neighborhood and deputies apprehended the suspect who matched the description received from the burglary victim. The suspect was arrested and the District Attorney has filed a case against that perpetrator.

During public comments the president of the Centinela Valley Unified High School District Secondary Teachers' Association reported that a recall petition for several members of the school district Board of Trustees has begun to circulate so that the school district may be run more efficiently with the well-being of the students and their education, as well as the treatment of teachers as the priority rather than the private agendas of the elected officials.

The next meeting of the Lawndale City Council will be held on Monday, March 2 at 6:30 p.m. •

What is The Best Way to Protect Against Viruses?

Viruses are computer programs written by malicious programmers to infect your computers. Most people aren't aware their computer has contracted a virus because a virus can come from an email (usually at attachment), website, social media site like Facebook, or even your phone.

The best way to protect your computer against viruses is by using anti-virus software. There are several software companies providing good solutions. I did a search for the "Best antivirus software" and the top three on the website www.top10antivirussoftware.com are: 1) McAfee, 2) Kaspersky and 3) Bullguard. I currently use the free version of AVG on my computer but there are higher rated software companies available. I did another search on "Best free antivirus software" and the top three on the website www.pcmag.com are: 1) Malwarebytes 2) Panda free antivirus and 3) Bitdefender antivirus free version.

Anti-virus software works by scanning your computer for viruses and can run in either an active or passive mode, based on settings you control. When the setting is passive,

you need to schedule the scan or manually click the scan. The scan could take several minutes to complete. Using the active setting means your computer is constantly scanning for viruses. I recommend the active setting, which will slow down your computer, but provides the best defense against viruses.

Good antivirus software will detect the virus and then ask you to delete or quarantine the virus. Sometimes, the virus can't be deleted without impacting the operations of your computer. For these types of viruses, the anti-virus software will isolate the virus into a separate "quarantine area" of your computer where it cannot cause harm.

Antivirus software is critical to maintaining the health of your computer, so make sure to do your part to defend your computer from attack. I wish you the best of luck and remember to always use protection!



Lawndale Kickers Outlast El Segundo to Tie for Pioneer Crown

Lawndale High's boys' soccer team pulled off a tie for the Ocean League championship after outlasting El Segundo 2-1 in overtime on February 10 at Lawndale. The Cardinals, then, shut out host and rival Hawthorne 3-0 last Thursday in their league finale.

Lawndale, which improved to 16-7-3 overall and ended Ocean play at 8-1-1, had the winning goal from senior forward-left midfielder Francisco Sanchez toward the end of the second overtime period.

Sanchez kicked the ball that bounced over El Segundo goalkeeper Zach Keller's head and into the goal as he and his teammates celebrated the big victory. "I was at the right place at the right time," Sanchez said. "I just thought about it and it went in."

The play began on a throw in by senior midfielder and Captain Erick Ponce and it was headed around several times before Sanchez's big play. Ponce gave the Cardinals a 1-0 lead in the 27th minute when he scored on a penalty kick.

With about seven minutes left in regulation, the Eagles, who entered the game ranked third in the CIF-Southern Section Division IV, tied it at one when David Freiburger booted the ball past a group of players and it ricocheted and bounced over the head of Lawndale goalkeeper Daniel Aguilar. The win also avenged the Cardinals' 1-0 loss to El Segundo earlier in league.

"I told the guys why we lost the previous game (to the Eagles)," Lawndale head coach Angel Mendez said. "They were not efficient. This time we used five midfielders and two forwards. Everything went up front. We didn't want to relax. El Segundo is known for taking advantage of it. You hang around around they'll come back and bite you. It was important that we wanted to win."

The Eagles ended their regular season at 16-2-3 overall and 8-1-1 in league with a 2-1 home win against Santa Monica last Thursday. Among one of El Segundo's most outstanding seasons was winning the highly

regarded South Torrance Christmas Classic that included victories over outstanding teams in Pioneer League champion West Torrance (rated fifth in the Southern Section Division IV), Santa Barbara and Long Beach Millikan.

Felipe Rubio, Sanchez and German Ramirez each scored in Lawndale's win over the Cougars, who finished league in fifth place at 2-7-1. Both teams begin the Division IV playoffs this week with the playoff pairings announced last Monday. The Eagles, however, won the coin flip and go in as the champion while the Cardinals enter as the second place team. Santa Monica placed third.

Leuzinger High's boys' basketball team captured the Pioneer League championship outright with wins over host North Torrance and visiting Compton Centennial last week.

New Specializations Are Changing Long-Held Industry Perceptions

(BPT) - Optimistic job forecasts for trending specializations in accounting are making the field more appealing than ever for recent graduates. Accounting jobs are projected to grow 13 percent between 2012 and 2022, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, with select specializations projected to grow even faster.

Emerging opportunities in the field call for new and diverse skill sets that have not been required in the past. Today's accountants are being asked to go beyond number crunching to help companies make important business decisions that impact their bottom line, impart technologically-driven insight and even solve white-collar crimes. In fact, each of these assignments represents a hot, new professional specialization in the accounting field.

Financial analysis, business systems analysis and forensic accounting have emerged as exciting opportunities for job-seekers to fill in-demand business roles in almost every industry.

Financial Analysis

Accountants who can analyze financial information and identify key trends are in high demand. These financial analysts weigh company risks and rewards by assessing the current state of the business, how the market is expected to perform and how the business will be impacted by a potential deal. Companies rely on this type of accountant to interpret financial data and turn it into insights that



can be used to make investments and offer background information around mergers and acquisitions. Employment of financial analysts is expected to grow 16 percent between 2012 and 2022, faster than the national average, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Business Systems Analysis

Many companies are looking for accountants who understand information technology (IT). Called business systems analysts (or sometimes computer systems analysts), these professionals use their knowledge of IT to determine the best way to implement and upgrade the use of technology to maximize business performance and profit. As cloud computing, cybersecurity and mobile networks are further integrated into everyday business, demand for business systems analysts will continue to increase. The

field is expected to grow 25 percent between 2012 and 2022, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Forensic Accounting

Forensic accountants combine traditional accounting with investigative skills to help companies sniff out fraud and white-collar crime. Past high-profile fraud cases involving Bernie Madoff and Enron prompted stricter regulations and public calls for greater transparency. Large companies now routinely employ forensic accountants to protect them from similar activities. Nearly 40 percent of the top 100 accounting firms in the United States now have a forensic accounting department and the field is expected to be one of the top 20 job markets in the next few years.

Students interested in pursuing these career opportunities in accounting will first need a bachelor's degree in the field. Graduates can enhance their career potential by earning a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) designation to demonstrate their high level technical skills, advanced knowledge and high ethical standards. A student can earn a CPA designation through 150 semester hours (typically 30 more than a bachelor's degree), passing the CPA exam and then applying for licensure. Eligibility requirements for the exam vary by state.

Many schools now offer degree programs that address the growing demand for these "new" accountants. DeVry University, for example,

offers a bachelor's degree in accounting, and accounting specializations within its bachelor's degree programs in business administration, management and technical management.

Upon completing their degree, students can begin training in the field for a specialized accounting career. Some companies offer applicants a self-selection test to help them determine the right specialization for their qualifications and interests. In general, finding the right specialization comes down to personal preference. Financial analysts require a more in-depth understanding of business markets, business systems analysts need a solid IT background, and forensic accountants require knowledge in law enforcement and criminal justice.

"The days are long gone when all accountants did was manage financial statements and taxes," said Beth Rolison, accounting professor at DeVry University. "Today's complex business environment requires accountants to be the eyes and ears of a company and demands that they possess a variety of soft and hard skills to live up to the role of trusted advisor."

Trending specializations open the door for students with diverse backgrounds and interests to enter the field. Demand for accountants will continue to rise as they play an increasingly important role in helping businesses navigate the financial landscape in our dynamic marketplace. •

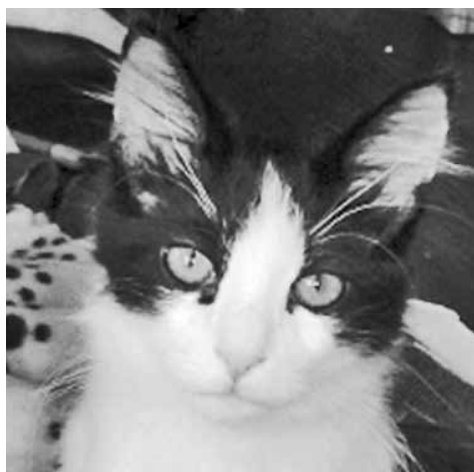

Tuscan Brined Pork Chops with Salsa Verde



Ingredients

• Pork Chops:

- 4 thick-cut pork rib chops (1 1/2 inches) 9 - 10 ounces each
- 1/2 cup kosher salt
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 3 crushed garlic cloves
- 4 crumbled bay leaves
- 2 sprigs rosemary, roughly chopped, plus 1 tablespoon chopped
- 2 dried red chili peppers, crumbled
- Zest of one lemon, peeled with a vegetable peeler
- Freshly ground black pepper

Salsa Verde:

- 1 cup Italian parsley leaves
- 1 cup arugula
- 1 cup cilantro leaves
- 1 clove garlic
- 2 teaspoons salt-preserved capers, rinsed
- 3/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- Salt

Preparation

Pork Chops:

1. Put the pork chops in a gallon size freezer bag and place the bag in a large bowl. In another large bowl whisk the salt and sugar with 6 cups water until dissolved. Add the garlic, bay leaves, rosemary sprigs, chili and lemon zest. Pour the brine over the pork. Seal bag and refrigerate for at least 1 hour and up to 4 hours.
2. Prepare a medium-hot fire in a grill. Remove chops from brine and pat dry. Place chops on the grill and cook 4 minutes per side. They should be nicely browned and register between 135 - 140 degrees on a meat thermometer.
3. Loosely cover the chops with foil and let rest 5 minutes. Season with black pepper to taste and sprinkle with chopped rosemary; serve with

Salsa Verde:

To make Salsa Verde, pulse parsley, arugula and cilantro in a food processor until chopped. Add garlic, capers, olive oil and 1/2 teaspoon salt and pulse until combined. Taste and season with additional salt if desired. •
