## City Manager Steve Mandoki: Renaissance Man in Public Service

When one attends a first City Council meeting at the age of 17 because it is a requirement of a high school government class, it is not even a fleeting thought that nearly 40 years later you will be sitting on that very dais managing that same city and thereby returning full circle. Steve Mandoki, Lawndale's City Manager since April 2011, did take a few detours along his life's journey searching for a career.

Born in Los Angeles, his family moved to Hawthorne when he was eight years old, so his first few years of education was not in the South Bay. He graduated from Leuzinger High School before attending El Camino Community College and then Long Beach State where he focused on radio, television, and production classes at first, but switched to psychology and Dominguez Hills for his Bachelor's and Master's of Arts degrees.

"At first, I thought I would teach and actually was a Teaching Assistant for a Psychology professor, helping students in counseling tracks, statistics, and just general work in the classes that professor taught. I even did some of the lectures," recalled Steve. "But that wasn't exactly what I wanted, so I went back and took business classes and was trying to figure out how to apply the knowledge base I had created for myself.

"I really enjoyed the analysis and statistical portions of the psychology work and heard about a program back at Long Beach State that was a Master's in Public Administration and it involved business, analysis, statistics, and there was an internship attached to the program, whereby cities would hire an intern to allow for on-the-job training, in a way.

"I had several opportunities to work in Long Beach, or South Gate, or Carson and it just felt 'right' to choose Carson. My first

position was working for the Superintendent of Recreation and Parks as an Administrative Assistant. I was heavily involved for a 'part-time' worker," he chuckled. "After a couple of years, I was promoted to Administrative Program Specialist in the City Administrator's Office where I handled budgeting, staffing the Mobile Home Rent Control Board, and conducted public meetings. I learned a lot!"

After hearing about other opportunities in other cities, with the idea that every new job means new exposure to how cities are run and focusing on the knowledge gained, Mandoki left Carson for Yorba Linda in late 1990. That job just wasn't busy enough for a hard-working person.

"There was a major project with a Block Grant and a car dealership build-up around a business park that could have been the next 'AutoSquare,' but the times were shifting economically in the country which trickled down to the states, counties, and cities, and the deal fell apart. I learned a lot, but I needed to feel good about being there, so I began again to think about a new job.

"Then, this happened. The City Administrator I worked for in Carson called me out of the blue to let me know that he was taking a job as the City Manager for a new city in Riverside County. He was employee number 1 for Murrieta and he invited me to be employee number 2. June 1991 began an adventure that few others can say they have experienced. We built a city from a community that had previously only been a fire district.

"With the support of a newly elected city council, we were responsible for hiring all the employees needed to effectively run a city, built from the ground up, where there was no police department and no city hall. We opened a Wells Fargo Bank to house the

city's first library. There were about 24,000 residents back then in 1991 who claimed Murrieta as their home ZIP code. It was a great experience to watch the city form. A very challenging task was negotiating how to get the tax increment from Riverside County. I enjoyed that one!" Mandoki said. "A miscalculation by the county was costing the city more than \$100,000 per year."

Within those 14 years, Steve Mandoki also served as the City Manager and created the first budget in Lotus. He knows the city finances still use that same initial spreadsheet he created.

During his tenure at Murrieta, Steve used his natural artistic abilities to design and paint the mural for the Murrieta Library on the open bank vault door. Not just a city employee who is a good manager, Mandoki is a Renaissance man, of sorts.

An avid artist who specializes in portraits on canvas with ink and washed acrylic, his art is strictly a hobby. Believing that his art comes from an organic place and is tied to emotions, he doesn't draw "on command." He plays guitar and mandolin and joins a band for bluegrass gigs whenever these are booked. And, he does play his guitar every day/evening for hours, even while watching television.

"I believe the arts are so important to life. Everyone thrives on art. Kids learn better when they have arts in their curriculum. The arts got me through my childhood. I love movies and went to the movies every weekend all through my youth, still enjoying them now. And I love the theatre. Art, music, film, theatre—can't live without any of them," he stated emphatically.

Mandoki came to Lawndale after a stint in Costa Mesa that lasted about five years.

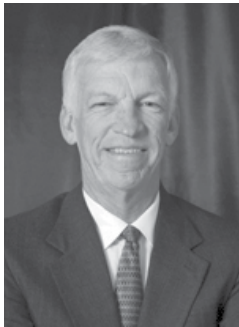

## Morningside Rallies Past Peninsula in Bay Opener

Morningside High's football team is off to one of its best starts in decades at 6-0 overall and 1-0 in the Bay League after rallying for a 24-21 win over host Peninsula High last Friday in Rolling Hills Estates.

Playing without starting quarterback Jerome Rosebrough, head coach LaFayette Fletcher, who also was celebrating his birthday, went to Travion Magee. Magee had to get adjusted as a starter as he struggled at first as the Panthers, who are 2-4 overall and 0-1 in league, took a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter.

Magee finally got things going by midway in the second quarter as he finished the game, completing 17 of 34 passes for 382 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. Wide receiver Adarras Wilson scored the Monarchs' first TD on a 15-yard pass from Magee and, later in the second quarter, Jontrell Hogan ran 51 yards for a score as the Monarchs cut Peninsula's lead to 14-12.

The Panthers brought their lead back up to 21-12 when quarterback Daniel Schubert found Jack Grimes in the clear for a 77-yard touchdown play. Morningside, though, got within three points with 48 seconds before halftime when Jaylin Wright completed a 50-yard drive on a two-yard run into the end zone.

Monarchs finally took their first lead when Magee found Wright for a 47-yard TD play. Morningside sealed the game on an interception off Schubert with 2:45 left in the game. The Monarchs had a pair of key first downs to successfully run down the clock for their sixth win, already the most since their 2003 squad went 11-3 and made it to the CIF-Southern Section Northwest Division championship game before falling at Lompoc. That squad was also head coached by Fletcher, who was with Morningside's football program since the late 1980's before stepping down after the 2011 season, then returning to replace the departed Derwin Henderson, now head mentor at Long Beach Millikan.

"The Bay League is all tough," Fletcher said. "Peninsula did a real good job on us. I'm glad we pulled this game out. These kids are pretty happy to be 6-0. We had no spring football. We have no junior varsity or freshman team, so we have a lot of young players (on the varsity)."

Fletcher knows that the Bay League will be a tough road. The Monarchs will take their unbeaten record to Redondo, which is 5-1 overall and 1-0 in league after breezing past host Inglewood 37-13 last Friday at Coleman Field. Despite just a 34-player roster, the Sea Hawks

done well against a tough preseason schedule where their only loss was on September 25 against Mission Viejo (7-0 overall and 1-0 in the South Coast League), the top ranked team in the tough CIF-Southern Section West Valley Division and rated seventh in California, 35-16. Redondo is currently ranked third in the Southern Section Western Division and is led by the passing combination of quarterback Jacob Silvera and six-foot-five wide receiver Warren Jackson. #### Super Seeds

Certain seeds, like flax, chia and hemp seeds, have extensive health benefits and more boomers are incorporating them into their daily meals and snacks.

"Flaxseeds and chia seeds are high in omega-3s and fiber and contain antiviral, antifungal and antibacterial properties," says Johnson. "Hemp seeds are high in healthy omega-6s, along with being high in protein. These super seeds help balance hormones and can also

help with digestion."

Easy ways to start incorporating seeds into your daily routine is to add them to smoothies or sprinkle on yogurt or oatmeal.

#### Super Vegetables

"Vegetables provide many nutrients, including potassium, fiber, folate, vitamins A, E, C and are alkalizing, meaning they neutralize acids in the body and help your body thrive and stay mineralized," says Johnson.

Try to get a variety of super vegetables into your daily diet including leafy greens, bok choy, broccoli, mushrooms, beets, celery, carrots, onions and garlic. Leafy greens and broccoli are especially high in calcium and

vitamin C needed to keep your immune system healthy and prevent sickness. Beets and celery are extremely detoxifying. Garlic is part of the onion family and contributes to a healthy immune system while helping to lower inflammation.

#### Super Fruits

"Fruits are packed with flavor and are high in vitamins, minerals, fiber, cancer-fighting antioxidants, and are extremely alkalizing," says Johnson.

Strive to get a variety of super fruits in your daily diet including strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, lemons, limes, apples and bananas. Dried fruits like figs, dates, goji berries and raisins are high in the calming mineral magnesium which helps to relax the mind and body and aid in digestion.

#### Organic Virgin Coconut Oil

Lately there has been a lot of buzz about coconut oil and for good reason, explains Johnson. "Coconut oil is a healthy saturated fat high in lauric, capric and caprylic acids which have antiviral and antifungal properties contributing to a healthy digestion," she says. "Coconut oil also contains medium-chain fatty acids that can aid in a healthy metabolism."

Try using coconut oil in baked goods or to replace other oils when sautéing or stir-frying. It's also a fantastic butter substitute on toast and other foods. •

## Ingredients

- 1 cup chopped Fisher Walnuts, divided
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1 can (15 ounces) chickpeas, drained and rinsed
- 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon sesame seeds
- 2 cloves garlic
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon chipotle powder or ground red pepper
- 1 medium red bell pepper, ribs and seeds removed, coarsely chopped, about 3/4 cup
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley

## Preparation

1. Combine 1/2 cup walnuts and olive oil in the bowl of a food processor, pulse to coarsely chop the walnuts.
2. Add the chickpeas, lemon juice, sesame seeds, garlic, paprika, chipotle powder and salt, and process until smooth.
3. Transfer the spread from the food processor into a medium mixing bowl and stir in bell pepper, parsley and remaining 1/2 cup walnuts.
4. Serve with toasted pita triangles, if desired.

Costa Mesa elected a group on the Council who wanted to abolish all jobs and contract out for every city job. Tragedy surrounded that move, which never resulted in layoffs although everyone was noticed with pink slips, with one, perhaps, related death. Steve had already decided to leave and had interviewed with Lawndale and was just waiting his employment offer.

“Each time I moved to a new job, it always felt ‘right’ as I previously said. I did my research each time, pros/cons, good idea/bad idea, and never once regretted changing jobs, feeling confident in the experience each time.

“When Harold Hofmann called my cell

phone to offer me the job in the ‘great city of Lawndale’ I was ready to come here. To come home, to the place where my first government/Council exposure occurred. I have been here nearly five years (in April 2016), although it seems like just yesterday.

“We accomplish a lot in Lawndale. We have a solid finance structure with a balanced budget and reserves policy that funds our projects. Just as all California cities have suffered, we feel the loss every day of the Redevelopment Agency and that program that allowed for much-needed resources not available from the tax base. We have to find funding from grants and owed money from Measures, such as C and R, to continue

improvement in the street repairs project that is ongoing and will not ever really be finished.


“We just opened the new Hogan Park Expansion and will be showcasing the new Larch Park in the early part of 2016. Our Teen Center is moving forward,” Mandoki continued.

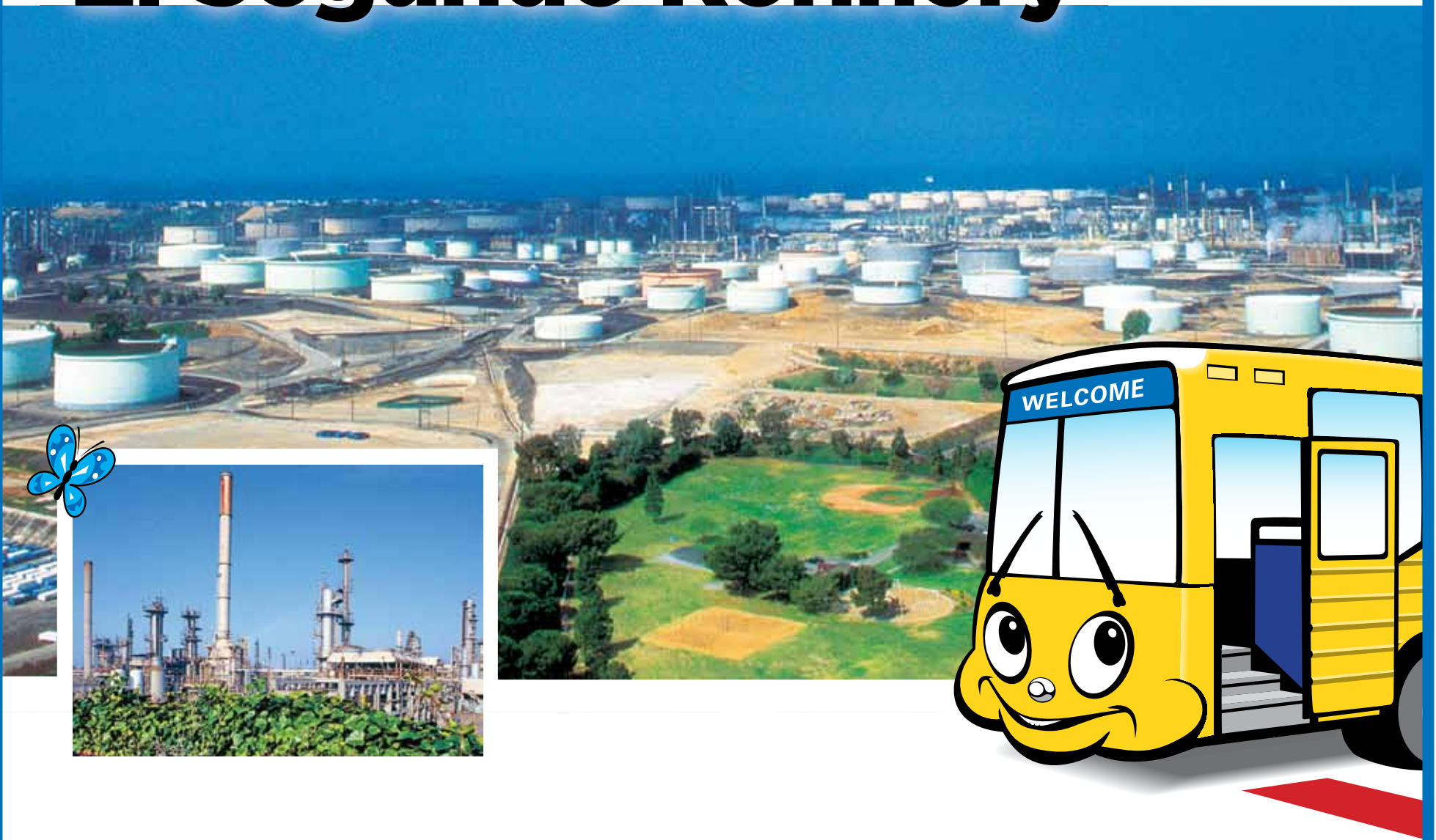
