## LESD Implements Programs to Ensure Student Success Through Proper aNutrition

The Lawndale Elementary School District Food Services Department is proud to contribute to student success by providing healthy meals to approximately 5600 Lawndale students daily. The Food Services team prepares students for a quality education by providing the necessary fuel for learning, and this year they plan on strengthening all existing programs and local initiatives to solidify the District's commitment to preventing hunger among students in need, fighting obesity, improving physical fitness, and educating the community at large about healthy eating. Currently, the Food Services Department operates the School Breakfast Program, National School Lunch Program, Snack Program, At-Risk After-School Meals Program, and the Seamless Summer Feeding Program. These programs are implemented to provide nutritional support to students in need before and after school, and year-round—even during the summer months when school is not in session.

These programs, however, are only a fraction of LESD's robust student and community wellness operations. "We not only aim to have an impact on our students' nutrition at school, but we also want to have an impact on the community as a whole," stated Marc Milton, LESD Food Services Director. LESD plans to have an impact on the community through their Wellness Program, which has a long history of initiating local wellness efforts—including events encouraging students to start their day actively by walking to school, hosting Family Nutrition Nights throughout the District's eight campuses, and providing Zumba classes free of charge to parents, to name a few. "We are extremely proud of our Wellness Program and we can't thank the Wellness Liaisons at each school site enough for providing support and breathing life into all our initiatives within the schools and in the community," continued Milton. LESD's Wellness Liaisons are a group of 20 individuals who receive a small stipend to represent their site in the District's Wellness Committee to advocate for their school's wellness needs, ensure school-wide compliance to the District's Wellness Policy, and contribute in promoting a district-wide culture that makes healthier nutrition and lifestyle decisions.

In addition to promoting District-wide wellness, LESD has set a goal to have an impact on the community beyond the District's students, parents, and staff. The District's Nutrition Education Obesity Prevention (NEOP) efforts have provided a large amount of outreach to educate and empower the Lawndale community to promote healthy living. "According to recent data, at least 22.9% of children residing in Lawndale are obese. In September of this year, 83% of LESD students live in households at or below the federal poverty level per Free and Reduced Price Meal rates. We've worked on innovative approaches to promote health and wellness within our community for the benefit of all," shared Camille Thorsen, NEOP Project Coordinator. One initiative that was created as a response to fighting obesity was the Corner Store Conversion Project, where students participating in the Realizing Amazing Potential (RAP) Summer Program were recruited and trained by NEOP staff to assist in local market makeovers. One of the students' success stories from that initiative was in persuading La Fiesta Meat Market, a local corner store, to make a number of changes to create a healthier food environment and promote healthy eating to the community. Changes made included reorganizing product displays to place healthy options at eye level, making water more visible in beverage refrigerators, offering fruit at the checkout, and increasing the overall amount of healthy options available. Martin and Carmen Ramirez, Owners of La Fiesta Meat Market, showed their commitment in the fight against childhood obesity and replaced a massive advertisement that promoted unhealthy beverages in front of their store with a mural showing their commitment to the health of the Lawndale community.

Another NEOP initiative that provides nutrition education along with hands-on experiences for students and parents is the School Garden Project. "By teaching students and their parents to cultivate the land, plant seeds, care for the plants, and ultimately harvest their crops—we hope to make kids excited about eating more fresh fruits and vegetables in their diets and even start their own gardens at home!" stated Kris Lauritson, LESD Master Gardener. With the support of Lauritson and

Lissette Bravo, also an LESD Master Gardener, Peer Parent Educators have completed over 53 garden lessons and trainings for parents and teachers in the past three years. LESD school gardens have also started a successful produce donation program to the Lawndale Commodities Free Food Program. To date, LESD schools have donated more than 2,268 pounds of fresh, organically grown fruits and vegetables.

To keep the gardening momentum alive, School Garden Committees have been created at all school sites and are given the responsibility of maintaining their school garden, governing the activities that take place, and supporting experiential learning opportunities for all in an environment focused on student growth and success. Activities at the schools range from math, science and nutrition lessons in the garden, to growing produce for taste and for donation to the community, to lunchtime and afterschool garden clubs, to hosting edible gardening workshops. Last year, teacher Kellie Duffy began offering Garden & Nutrition as an elective for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students at Jane Addams Middle School.

Recently, LESD was honored to host a visit from top level USDA Food and Nutrition Service leaders Audrey Rowe, USDA Administrator for the Food and Nutrition Service and Jesus Mendoza, Jr., Western Regional Administrator of the USDA Food and Nutrition Service. LESD Superintendent, Dr. Ellen Dougherty, along with Milton, gave Rowe and Mendoza a comprehensive tour of the Anderson Elementary School food services facilities, introduced them to students enjoying a healthy and balanced breakfast, and then invited them to participate in a lesson in the school garden facilitated by LESD's Master Gardeners and Teacher Anne Schmitt. "We are so proud of how far our Food Services Department and all their initiatives have come in supporting our students and their families with proper nutrition and in giving them the opportunity to learn, grow, and thrive in a community that puts their well-being and wellness at the forefront. Proper nutrition is an essential building block to student success—and we are delighted to provide our scholars with the necessary foundation for bright futures in our District and as they move on to higher education," concluded Dr. Dougherty. •

## LAWA Named Employer of the Year by Women in Transportation-Los Angeles

Women in Transportation-Los Angeles (WTS) named Los Angeles World Airports as "Employer of the Year." The award, presented at WTS's 30th Annual Scholarship and Awards dinner November 16, recognizes LAWA's continued efforts to support and promote a diverse and inclusive workplace, as well as outreach efforts that encourage women to pursue careers in transportation.

"Hiring and cultivating a thriving diverse workforce enables all of the great things happening throughout LAWA's airports," said LAWA Chief Executive Officer Deborah Flint.

"I am so proud of the Los Angeles World Airports staff," said Board of Airport Commissioners Vice President Valeria Velasco. "With aggressive recruitment and outreach efforts, innovative hiring practices, and a variety of education and enrichment programs, LAWA

has proven that airports can be the best place to work and can lead to a satisfying career."

Women currently serve in over 50 percent of LAWA leadership positions, from departmental managerial roles to the executive level. LAWA also provides a variety of programs that encourage women to pursue careers in transportation, including its Gender Equity Program, which strives to foster a work environment promoting equal participation of women in leadership positions at all levels, especially in historically under-represented STEM areas. Its Gateways Internship Program offers college students salaried internships while they contribute new ideas and skills to LAWA's airports. High school students also can work at LAWA through HIRE LA's Youth Program, introducing students to aviation-based careers through paid internships.

## Centinela Valley Receives UCLA California Mathematics Readiness Challenge Initiative

Centinela Valley Union High School District (CVUHSD) was one of only five districts awarded the UCLA California Mathematics Readiness Challenge Initiative grant. The \$1.28M grant will provide for in-depth professional learning opportunities in Mathematics for a collaborative composed of CVUHSD Mathematics teachers, instructional coaches, school site administrators, and faculty from UCLA to support the implementation and

evaluation of grade 12 experiences that are designed to prepare students for placement in college-level courses in Mathematics. Through this partnership with the UCLA Teacher Education Program, CVUHSD will be introducing a new Mathematics course, Introduction to Data Science (IDS) and providing extensive professional learning for their Mathematics Teachers. •

## Cardinals Keep Rolling in Playoffs

When this year's football season originally began, there were many questions about what head coach Travis Clark and his Lawndale Cardinals prospects would be. After a 28-3 win at South High in the very first game of the year, things looked good. A three-game losing streak soon followed, however, and Lawndale fans began to get nervous. An extremely young team seemingly only needed time to gel. After winning five of the last six games of the regular season, Clark has his team on a roll. A victory over West High two weeks ago in the first round of the CIF Southern Section Division 6 playoffs kept the team rolling. Now, with a 38-14 trouncing over Summit in the quarterfinals last Friday night at Lawndale, the Cardinals have a CIF championship on their minds.

In the first half, the football game between the Lawndale Cardinals and the Summit SkyHawks was like a heavyweight fight. Both teams were trading punches, attempting to get over on the other. With under a minute to go in the first quarter, it was Summit that landed a huge punch. A 35-yard touchdown pass gave the SkyHawks a 14-7 lead after a completed two-point conversion. That's when Jordan Wilmore came to the rescue for Lawndale. Wilmore tied things up just before the end of the quarter, and despite a scoreless second quarter of play was ready to explode in the second half.

Summit star running back Stephen Carr looked to continue his magnificent season and make a case for player of the game when he began the second half with a 45-yard kickoff return. After Summit eventually punted, however, it was all Wilmore. A 23-yard run in the third quarter by the Cardinals running back set up quarterback Jalen Hamler's 26-yard touchdown pass to get things going and give his team the lead. On their next possession, Wilmore broke free for a 40-yard run and later dove into the end zone to double up on Summit with a 28-14 lead just before the third quarter came to an end. "Wilmore was so motivated because of Carr," Clark explained. "He watched a lot of tape of him." Carr finished the game with 143 yards. Wilmore had 325 and four touchdowns.

"Carr is really good," Wilmore explained. "But I want to be better than him." It looks as if Wilmore proved his point. With the lead in hand in the second half, the Cardinals turned to Wilmore and the power running game. "We turned to our offensive line and put the ball in the hands of our sophomore running back," Clark explained. It paid off. Summit was never able to get back into the game and as time ticked off the clock, the SkyHawks would remain scoreless throughout the second half. Wilmore capped things off with a touchdown in the fourth quarter to seal the deal for his team.

Hamler finished the night going 11-for-17 through the air for 138 yards and a touchdown. Ahmir Wilson totaled 53 yards and a touchdown. It was Wilmore who was the star of the night, though, and helped Lawndale (8-4, 4-1) advance to the CIF Southern Section Division 6 semifinals where it will take on the Paraclete Spirits and look for a chance to advance to this year's CIF championship game.

### HAWTHORNE

The Hawthorne Cougars struggled to get much going in a down year for their football team this season. A traditionally competitive Ocean League saw three teams battling it out for first place all season long. Hawthorne would finish in fourth place and while head coach Donald Paysinger and his team saw losses come in bunches, their victories proved to be dominant and gave fans hope for the future.

Paysinger and the Cougars had trouble coming out of the gate this year. A 35-21 loss to La Canada to open the season was followed up by a 42-0 blowout win over Rivera in which starting quarterback Andrew Kalinowski threw for 110 yards and three touchdowns. Following their first victory of the season, however, Hawthorne would fall victim to a three-game losing streak that led into the beginning of league play. Coaches often say that the start of league play is like the start of a new season. Hawthorne won its first two games over Beverly Hills and Santa Monica respectively and looked like a brand new team. Unfortunately, the Cougars' hopes of turning their season around would be dashed after yet another losing streak. The wide receiver beat Adoree Jackson early in the second quarter for his second touchdown of the night to give the Bruins the lead once again at 14-7.

Unfortunately for UCLA, that was the last lead of the night that they would enjoy. It wasn't long before the Trojans would get rolling. That would happen on the wheels of their running back, Jones. Jones took the ball, busted through the seam and ran for a 60-yard touchdown that not only tied the game, but proved to be the turning point on the night. Not long after, De'Quan Hampton scored the first of his two touchdowns on the night to give his team the lead. USC never looked back. It was 23-14 at the half and by the end of the third quarter, the Trojans had pretty much put things away with a 30-14 advantage.

UCLA managed all of its points in the first half before being completely shut down by the USC defense. "It was just a really tough and humbling night," Bruins head coach Jim

five of their last six games.

The Trojans, on the other hand, are riding high after their victory--not only because they put a whooping on their biggest rival in history, but also because they have finally put a horrid beginning of the season behind them and remain in contention for a Pac-12 South title. "We still need a little help, but now we've set our mark at 7-2," USC head coach Clay Helton explained. The Trojans will finish the regular season off against Notre Dame this week. They'll need to win that game and have Utah beat Colorado--a team that lost at USC last month.

Trojans quarterback Sam Darnold passed for 267 yards in the 86th meeting between the two teams. Jones rushed for 121 yards and two touchdowns. USC has now won seven games in a row and has claimed the Victory Bell for the second consecutive season. The Trojans have now won 14 of their last 18 meetings with Bruins and the all-time series now stands at 46-31-7 in favor of USC.

The Bruins are headed for their final game of the regular season versus Cal and for the most part can't wait for the season to simply be over. Despite a tough defense that continues to fight in every game, UCLA simply doesn't have the firepower on offense, especially after starting quarterback Josh Rosen went down with a shoulder injury that ended his season. USC, on the other hand, simply keeps getting better under Helton. Darnold explains that with their new head coach there is "a shift in culture that you can sense now." Darnold, Jones, and Hampton highlight a powerful offense that seems to have really found itself toward the end of the season. It may be too late to win the Pac-12 South and advance far enough up the standings to have a shot at this year's playoffs, but the Trojans will try to prove their point and make an impact in their last game of the regular season this week against Notre Dame. •

## Wireless Home Phone Devices Offer Savings And Mobility

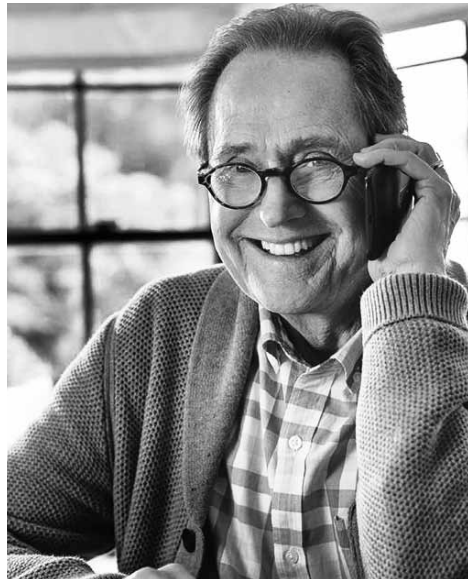

But you're no longer required to stay tethered to phone jacks - nor do you have to keep your home phone at home.

### Small Device, Simple Setup

Wireless home phone service is offered under various names - usually Wireless Home Phone or Home Phone Connect. It allows a regular wired telephone to connect to cellular networks as if it were a mobile phone.

Connections are made via a small device you can place almost anywhere in your home. It's about the size of a wireless router, and contains the necessary electronics to provide voice-only telephone service to your phone from one or two jacks on the back of the unit.



It also has a small radio antenna and a transceiver for the wireless side of the connection.

The only plug-ins required are your phone (or its charging base) into one of the rear jacks, and a power cord. Most wireless home phone devices also include LED indicator lights on the front to show signal strength and indicate waiting voicemail messages.

### Savings On Landline, Long Distance

If you already have cellphone service, you can add wireless home phone to your account for the cost of purchasing the device (expect

to pay around \$50), plus the cost of adding a secondary line for the service, which can be as little as \$10 per month.

With most carriers, you'll simply share the airtime minutes on your existing monthly cellular plan with your home phone line. Nationwide coverage is also a feature of most cellular calling plans, so in addition to your redundant landline service, you eliminate the need for a long distance carrier. There are even special rates just for seniors: for instance, Consumer Cellular, which specializes in service to users over 50 years of age, offers no-contract, post-paid plans at discounted rates to AARP members.

If you don't currently have cellular service, you can still convert your landline to mobile simply by ordering a wireless home phone device, then signing up for a monthly service plan that covers the number of minutes you're likely to use each month.

### Never Miss A Call - Anywhere You Go

Wireless home phone service redefines the meaning of "home." The device is completely portable, so your service is, too; you can make and receive calls anywhere you have access to a cellular signal and an electrical outlet. Set it up anywhere you want in your home - you're no longer restricted to locations near a wall jack.

Perhaps more significantly, you can take

it with you to a second home, a hotel or even a campsite and still receive calls made to your home telephone number, if cellular reception and a power source are available. It also works well with home phones that have additional handsets. By connecting the wireless home phone device to the base of your primary cordless phone, it becomes accessible to your other cordless extensions, giving you even more calling flexibility.

### Making The Cut

Like any cord cutting measure, wireless home phone service isn't necessarily for everybody. Your telephone service becomes completely dependent on a cellular signal - if, for instance, the nearest cell tower experiences an outage, you'll be unable to make anything except emergency calls. There's also no data signal on the line, so wireless home phone devices can't be used with medical monitoring devices or fax machines.

But if you've been seeking a way to cut the costs of your landline service while also keeping your longtime home telephone number, it offers a practical and affordable solution. You save on monthly service, eliminate long distance charges, and the portability offers true modern luxury, especially for "snowbirds" or retirees who travel frequently. It's a nice way to make yourself feel at home - wherever you go! •

Separate payment and performance bonds, each in an amount equal to 100% of the total Contract amount issued by a California admitted surety as defined in California Code of Civil Procedure Section 995.120, are required, and shall be provided to the Owner prior to execution of the Contract and shall be in the form set forth in the Contract Documents.

Where applicable (including projects receiving funding under the State School Facilities Program), bidders must meet the requirements set forth in Public Contract Code Section 10115 et seq., Military and Veterans Code Section 999 et seq. and California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 1896.60 et seq. regarding Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise

("DVBE") Programs. It is each bidder's sole responsibility to ensure its bid is timely delivered and received at the location designated as specified above. Any bid received at the designated location after the scheduled closing time for receipt of bids shall be returned to the bidder unopened.

Bid Security. Each Bid Proposal shall be accompanied by Bid Security in an amount FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS Failure of any Bid Proposal to be accompanied by Bid Security in the form and in the amount required shall render such Bid Proposal to be non-responsive and rejected by the District.

No Withdrawal of Bid Proposals. No Bidder shall withdraw its Bid Proposal for a period of ninety (90) days after the award of the Contract by the District's Board of Education. During this time, all Bidders shall guarantee prices quoted in their respective Bid Proposals.

Substitute Security. In accordance with the provisions of California Public Contract Code §22300, substitution of eligible and equivalent securities for any monies withheld by the District to ensure the Contractor's performance under the Contract will be permitted at the request and expense of the Contractor. The foregoing notwithstanding, the Bidder to whom the Contract is awarded shall have thirty (30) days following action by the District's Board of Education to award the Contract to such Bidder to submit its written request to the District to permit the substitution of securities for retention. The failure of the Bidder to make such written request to the District within said thirty (30) day period shall be deemed a waiver of the Bidder's rights under California Public Contract Code §22300. Waiver of Irregularities. The District reserves the right to reject any or all Bid Proposals or to waive any irregularities or informalities in any Bid Proposal or in the bidding.

Award of Contract. The Contract for the Work, if awarded, will be by action of the District's Board of Education to the responsible Bidder submitting the lowest responsive Bid Proposal. If the Bid Proposal requires Bidders to propose prices for Alternate Bid Items, the District's selection of Alternate Bid Items, if any, for determination of the lowest priced Bid Proposal and for inclusion in the scope of the Contract to be awarded shall be in accordance with this Notice and the Instructions for Bidders.

Inquiries and Clarifications. The Bidder is advised that all inquiries and clarifications about the Bid Documents, Drawings, Specifications, etc., shall be submitted to the District in writing at least fourteen (14) days before the bid opening date. The District will respond at its earliest possible opportunity. Verbal communication by either party with regard to this matter is invalid. ### RESOLUTION NO. 17-18

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGLEWOOD, CALIFORNIA DECLARING ITS INTENT TO VACATE STREET EASEMENTS ON PORTIONS OF RAILROAD PLACE, CABLE PLACE AND FLORENCE AVENUE; TO EXEMPT THE VACATIONS FROM GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 65402; AND SETTING THE TIME AND PLACE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED VACATIONS AND PROVIDING NOTICE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Division 9, Part 3, Chapter 3 of the Public Streets, Highways, and Service Easements Vacation Law, Streets and Highways Code Section 8300 et seq. ("Street Vacation Law"), the City of Inglewood ("Inglewood") is authorized to vacate street easements when the street easements are unnecessary for present or future purposes; and WHEREAS, the City has received applications from Los Angeles County Metropolitan Authority ("LACMTA") requesting that Inglewood vacate certain portions of Redondo Boulevard, Cable Place and Florence Avenue to accommodate the construction and future operation of the Crenshaw-LAX Light Rail System; and WHEREAS, prior to adopting a resolution of vacation, the Inglewood City Council is required by the Street Vacation Law to set a public hearing at least 15 days from the adoption of this Resolution of Intent at which time the City Council will receive evidence and testimony concerning whether those portions of the streets easements to be vacated are necessary for any present or future public use as streets easements and whether the vacation is in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, it appears that Inglewood may not have a present or future use for those portions of Redondo Boulevard, Cable Place and Florence Avenue that LACMTA has requested be vacated; and WHEREAS, Government Code Section 65402 requires that the Planning Agency of Inglewood make a determination that the vacation of street easements is in conformity with Inglewood's General Plan prior to vacating the street easements unless the Inglewood City Council finds that such vacations are exempt from the Planning Agency determination pursuant to Government Code section 65402 (a)(3); and

WHEREAS, Inglewood intends to vacate its street easement in that portion of Redondo Boulevard particularly described in Exhibit "A" and depicted in Exhibit "A-1", which exhibits are incorporated herein as if set forth in full; and WHEREAS, Inglewood intends to vacate its street easement in that portion of Cable Place particularly described in Exhibit "B" and depicted in Exhibit "B-1", which exhibits are incorporated herein as set forth in full; and WHEREAS, Inglewood intends to vacate its street easement in that portion of Florence Avenue particularly described in Exhibit "C" and depicted in Exhibit "C-1", which exhibits are incorporated herein as set forth in full. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Inglewood does find and determine as follows:

SECTION 1. That the hour of 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 6, 2016, in the Council Chambers of City Hall, One Manchester Boulevard, Inglewood, California, is hereby fixed as the time and place when and where all persons interested in or objecting to the proposed vacations may appear before the Inglewood City Council and offer evidence in relation thereto. However, in the event the City Council meeting of December 6, 2016, is not held, the aforementioned public hearing for interested persons to object to the proposed vacations shall be automatically rescheduled to occur at the next regularly scheduled City Council meeting at the same hour and location.

SECTION 2. That the proposed street easement vacations involve the disposition of unused right-of-ways and thus are exempt from the Planning Agency determination pursuant to Government Code section 65402 (a)(3).

SECTION 3. That the Inglewood Director of Public Works is hereby directed to cause notices of said hearing on the vacations to be posted as required by the Street Vacation Law and specifically Streets and Highways Code sections 8320(b) and 8323. SECTION 4. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to cause a notice of the hearing to be published in accordance with the Street Vacation Law and specifically Streets and Highways Code sections 8320(b) and 8322. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this resolution and the same shall be in full force and effect immediately upon adoption.
