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## Valentine Selected For Hawthorne Seat, English Named Mayor Pro Tem as Council Moves Forward

After more than a month of struggling to come to a decision on who would occupy their vacated seat, the Hawthorne City Council took bold steps to avoid a special election this summer.

Former Mayor Pro Tem Olivia Valentine was chosen by a 3-1 vote to occupy the empty seat which was vacated when Alex Vargas defeated former mayor Chris Brown in November's election.

It wasn't smooth sailing in the early going though. The council convened for a special meeting last Thursday in hopes of filling the seat. Following the same eight-round format that they had implemented since the process began, the council members breezed through five rounds of nominations before Vargas paused the process to offer an alternate solution.

"It's not working and we're not focusing in on a candidate here," Vargas said after the fifth round of nominations. "My proposal is that we seriously look at our top two candidates and we'll look to see if there is a common denominator amongst the four of us."

Councilman Nilo Michelin was the only council member who expressed reservations about the change in the nomination process.

"You were the one who wanted to do it in this order and to change it midstream would be a little unorthodox," Michelin said. "Let's play out this process. I think it's a great idea and let's entertain it for Friday."

Had the Council not come to a majority decision by the end of Thursday's meeting, they would have been forced to meet again the next day to avoid a special election. Fortunately for the city, it didn't come to that.

After completing the eight rounds of futilely nominating candidates, the council moved to

Vargas' idea of each council member naming their top two candidates. The common denominator from that process was Valentine.

While Michelin objected to the idea of introducing a new process "mid-stream," he ultimately came around and participated. Michelin was the one member who did not select Valentine for the vacant seat stating that she had voted on the previous city budgets that has since caused the city much financial strain.

Meanwhile, Valentine, who finished fourth in the general election last November behind candidate Katrina Manning, said that she was grateful for the opportunity to rejoin the council.

"I want to thank my council colleagues for having faith in me," Valentine said after she had taken her seat with the rest of the council. "I want to see us work together in a unified way. I want to see us bring the council together, bring the city together and move Hawthorne forward. No more of the in-fighting, no more of the factionalism, let's move the city forward."

Vargas took a moment to address the numerous residents who had come before the council and stated that they wished for the council to honor the election results and place the third highest vote getter, Katrina Manning, into the vacant seat.

"The City Council converged about a month ago to discuss a procedure. We are in full compliance. This is a decision that has been given to the council body to fill the seat, not the residents," Vargas said. "The residents voted for two positions. If they had voted for a third position, as a contingency, people might have viewed that election different."

With the candidate selection process behind them, the council met prior to their

regularly scheduled Tuesday meeting to name Councilwoman Angie Reyes English as the new Mayor Pro Tem.

Vargas put forth the nomination which was seconded by Valentine. Michelin was not in attendance during the vote, which was unanimous.

Vargas and English took time to tout the new futsal fields that were funded by Chevrolet, the L.A. Galaxy, and Manchester United.

"Evidence of the city of Hawthorne turning in a different direction immediately after this council was seated was the futsal field. Chevrolet invested a lot of money to the project," Vargas said.

The mayor also took a moment to tout Space X and the growth of the company as they finished construction and opened up a new parking structure on Crenshaw Blvd.

"That's a big deal," Vargas said. "That just tells us how much Space X has grown and how much they have invested in our community and decided to stay here because the city of Hawthorne has been business friendly."

Speaking of being business friendly, bringing revenue into the city is going to be a key facet in turning the financial situation around and in his closing statements, Vargas touted that businesses were coming to Hawthorne. He cited a Starbucks and a Blaze Pizza that were opening up soon in the city and teased that there were many more announcements to come.

"It's not business as usual. Today's meeting is evidence of that. We came here to do business, not to bicker or go after each other, that's the old ways," Vargas said. "Pretty soon you'll see more than the Starbucks and the Blaze Pizza coming up, and that will assure you that we're going in the right direction." •

# Looking Up

## Ceres: Celebrating 215 Years of Planetary Discovery

New Year's Day, 1801, the dawn of the 19th century, was a historic moment for astronomy, and for a space mission called Dawn more than 200 years later. That night, Giuseppe Piazzi pointed his telescope at the sky and observed a distant object that we now know as dwarf planet Ceres.

Today, NASA's Dawn mission allows us to see Ceres in exquisite detail. From the images Dawn has taken over the past year, we know Ceres is a heavily cratered body with diverse features on its surface that include a tall, cone-shaped mountain and more than 130 reflective patches of material that is likely salt. But on that fateful evening in 1801, Piazzi wasn't sure what he was seeing when he noticed a small, faint light through his telescope.

"When Piazzi discovered Ceres, exploring it was beyond imagination. More than two centuries later, NASA dispatched a machine on a cosmic journey of more than 3 billion miles to reach the distant, mysterious world he glimpsed," said Marc Rayman, mission director and chief engineer for Dawn at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory, Pasadena, California.

Piazzi was the director of the Palermo Observatory in Sicily, Italy, which has collected documents and instruments from the astronomer's time, and published a booklet on the discovery of Ceres. According to the observatory, Piazzi had been working on a



catalog of star positions on January 1, 1801, when he noticed something whose "light was a little faint and colored as Jupiter." He looked for it again on subsequent nights and saw that its position changed slightly.

What was this object? Piazzi wrote to fellow astronomers Johann Elert Bode and Barnaba Oriani to tell them he had discovered a comet.

"I have presented this star as a comet, but owing to its lack of nebulosity, and to its motion

being so slow and rather uniform, I feel in the heart that it could be something better than a comet, perhaps. However, I should be very careful in passing this conjecture to the public," Piazzi wrote to Oriani.

By July 1801, Piazzi had calculating the object's orbit and made public his observations, announcing it as a planet, and naming it "Ceres"—after the Roman goddess of agriculture, was also the patron deity of

Sicily, where Piazzi then lived and worked.

The news was especially interesting to Bode because he had championed the Titius-Bode hypothesis: that the positions of planets in our solar system follow a specific pattern, which predicts each planet's distance from the Sun. The pattern demanded that there be a planet, yet undiscovered, between Mars and Jupiter—and this is exactly where Ceres orbited.

In March 1802, Heinrich Wilhelm Matthias Olbers discovered a second, similar object: Pallas. William Herschel, discoverer of Uranus, then wrote an essay proposing that both Ceres and Pallas represented an entirely new class of objects, which he named "asteroids."

The door had opened for many more asteroids to be observed. The discoveries of Juno in 1804 and Vesta in 1807 reinforced Herschel's notion that asteroids are a class of their own. Today, we know there are hundreds of thousands of asteroids in the main asteroid belt between Mars and Jupiter.

Now, as we commemorate the 215th anniversary of Ceres' discovery, Dawn is observing the dwarf planet from its lowest orbit ever: 240 miles from the surface. The many craters and other features that Piazzi could not see with his telescope are being named after agricultural deities or festivals, extending the theme that Piazzi began with the name "Ceres." •

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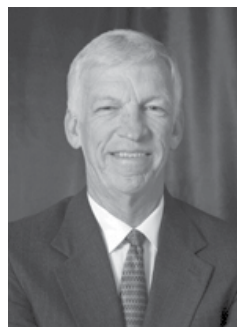

## Cardinals Fall Short of Santa Monica

Lawndale High's boys' basketball team gave highly regarded Santa Monica a scare but eventually ran out of gas in a 66-59 home loss in overtime to the Vikings on February 3. Santa Monica is the top ranked team in the CIF-Southern Section Division IA and is on the watch list for the prestigious Southern Section Open Division playoffs.

Behind the hot shooting of also football standouts Chris Murray and Bryant Perkinson, the Cardinals took a 13-6 first quarter lead. On defense, Lawndale, which is 11-13 overall and 3-5 in the Ocean League, was effective on the Vikings' standout Jonah Matthews, who will be joining former Cardinal standout center Chimeze Metu at University of Southern California in the fall, who was held to just three

first period points.

Lawndale, which lost its earlier game to host Santa Monica 76-47 on January 15, trailed 26-25 at halftime. Matthews, however, started to finally pick up as he added 10 second quarter points, including two three-point baskets. Matthews led all scorers with 25 points, including four three-pointers.

The Vikings led by three points (43-40) after three periods and were up 58-56 before Perkinson was fouled with five seconds left in regulation. Perkinson tied the game at 58 and sent it into overtime by making two free throws.

In the overtime period, though, Santa Monica stepped it up as Mikhail Brown scored all eight of its points to just one for the Cardinals. Brown finished with 18 points. Perkinson scored Lawndale's only point when he made one of two from the charity line. He led the Cardinals

with 16 points. A.J. Gipson added 13 points and Murray chipped in 12.

"I'm proud of my guys," Lawndale head coach Patrick Marks, who replaced recent head mentor Christopher Brownlee, who was dismissed by the school's administration due to an incident that occurred during a tournament it was involved in Sacramento shortly before Christmas, said. "Jonah's a great player. "When he's open, he can do anything. Our philosophy was to get him tired. He never does. Perkinson is a great athlete."

Earlier in the day, Perkinson, a wide receiver-defensive back on Lawndale's football squad that made it to the CIF-Southern Section Western Division quarterfinals before losing to eventual champion Calabasas, signed to play football at Sacramento State University. Perkinson was also Ocean League triple jump champion in track and field last spring.

The Cardinals had a very tough week having to face the top two teams in the Ocean. Lawndale traveled to Beverly Hills last Friday and was pinned with a 68-39 loss.

The Cardinals have a critical final week. After visiting El Segundo last Tuesday, Lawndale closes Ocean play at home against Hawthorne tonight at 7:30 p.m. The Cards will need to win both of those games for an automatic spot in the CIF-Southern Section Division IIA playoffs.

**Lady Cardinals Win Two:** Lawndale High's girls' basketball team remains in contention for an Ocean League title in a very close race after wins over Santa Monica and Beverly Hills last week. At Lawndale on February 3, the Cardinals downed the Vikings 41-24. At Beverly Hills last Friday, Lawndale defeated the Normans 59-40.

Rejinae Crandall led the Cardinals, who improved to 6-2 in league and 16-8 overall, with a game-high 15 points against Santa Monica. Jazzmin Odei contributed 10 points.

Lawndale visited El Segundo Tuesday. The Cardinals close league at home against Hawthorne tonight at 6 p.m. Lawndale defeated Hawthorne in an earlier league rivalry 44-23 on January 27 at Hawthorne.

"Most people don't know that chronic pain is a disease that needs to be aggressively diagnosed and treated, because left untreated the condition has devastating effects on the whole person - body, mind and spirit," says Dr. Tory L. McJunkin, an Arizona pain specialist and co-founder and medical director of Pain Doctor, Inc. "But patients don't have to live with chronic pain. These days, pain specialists have a number of impactful options that can bring their patients chronic pain relief."

Now, a new advancement - the St. Jude Medical (TM) Invisible Trial System - has made it easier than ever for patients to "test drive" one such treatment option: spinal cord stimulation (SCS), a treatment that is successful in treating many forms of chronic pain.

SCS therapy utilizes a small implanted medical device and thin wires with electrodes to deliver low levels of electrical energy to mask or interrupt pain signals as they travel



to the brain, reducing the sensation of pain. Before receiving a permanently implanted device, patients evaluate SCS therapy through a "trial period" that can range from five days to two weeks.

The new St. Jude Medical Invisible Trial System is designed to help chronic pain patients better assess spinal cord stimulation therapy during their trial period. The system relies on Bluetooth(R) wireless technology to provide patients a safe, secure and cable-free SCS trial experience. Rather than a bulky complex patient controller, the St. Jude Medical Invisible Trial System provides patients with an iPod touch(TM) mobile digital device to control their stimulation during the trial period. (Apple, iPod touch and iPad Mini are trademarks of Apple, Inc. Bluetooth is a

trademark of Bluetooth SIG, Inc.)

Dr. McJunkin recalls one particular patient who had struggled with chronic back pain for more than five years. According to McJunkin, trialing spinal cord stimulation was one key to the patient getting his life back.

"This patient felt like his life was wasting away before trying spinal cord stimulation," says McJunkin. "He didn't have the energy or strength to enjoy his grandkids, and even his wife was impacted as she watched her husband consistently deal with his pain. It wasn't until he tried spinal cord stimulation that he was able to get the relief he needed."

According to McJunkin many chronic pain patients spend years trying a number of different treatments. For some, back surgery will help for a while, but the pain may

come back. Others may try physical therapy, chiropractic care, home exercises or several different kinds of injections, but they may not alleviate the pain for very long.

McJunkin says such scenarios aren't uncommon, and that spinal cord stimulation can offer meaningful relief for some patients who are either wary of taking medication long term or who may have failed treatments earlier in the care continuum. However it's important to remember that the implantation of a neurostimulation system can involve risk, such as painful stimulation, loss of pain relief and surgical risks (e.g. paralysis). Patients are encouraged to talk to their physician to determine if spinal cord stimulation therapy is right for them.

"Patients who are eligible for SCS come from all walks of life and have usually already maxed out other pain treatment options like physical therapy or medications," McJunkin says. "By providing an easy-to-use and discreet trial system, St. Jude Medical will help patients focus more on their potential pain relief and functional improvements, and less on the burdens common to traditional trial systems."

Patients living with chronic pain should work with a doctor who is a pain treatment specialist to determine which option is best for them. Some patients may try multiple solutions before finding one that works for them and often exhaust all other possibilities before resorting to surgery.
