## Reluctant Postal Service Must Drop Mail Rates

It's rare when the price of a first-class stamp gets cheaper, but it will on Sunday when the U.S. Postal Service is forced to reduce some rates under a deal made with the federal government.

The Postal Regulatory Commission agreed the Postal Service could raise first-class, international and business postage rates until it could raise \$4.6 billion to offset losses and debt that mounted since the economy cratered in 2007. The mail service is expected to reach the target amount on April 10, so the price of a first-class stamp will fall by two cents.

A first-class stamp on Sunday will cost 47 cents, and an additional ounce for first-class falls to 21 cents. The biggest drop will be an international first-class letter, which will cost \$1.15 rather than a \$1.20. Mailed postcards will be a penny cheaper to mail at 34 cents.

No refunds will be issued for unused first-class or Forever stamps not used by Sunday's expiration date for the temporary increase in effect since 2014. A Postal Service spokeswoman advised not buying books of first-class or Forever stamps until the rates change.

The Postal Service tried to block Sunday's action in federal court, arguing that it needed the \$4.6 billion influx of revenue to overcome the decline of first-class mail volume because of business closures from the Great Recession. The mail service badly needs to modernize equipment, buy new vehicles and fund employee health care and retirement benefits, according to the postal commission that oversees it.

"We were mandated by Congress that we pre-fund future retiree health benefits to the tune of \$5.8 billion a year. Here we're mandated to do that then in 2007, boom, the Great Recession hits. We've never been able to recover from that," said postal spokeswoman Eva Jackson.

A federal appeals court denied the Postal Service's motion to force its bosses at the postal commission to extend the two-cent increase on a first-class stamp. The last hope is an act of Congress before Sunday, and that

appears to be a longshot.

"The (emergency) surcharge granted to the Postal Service last year only partially alleviated our extreme multi-year revenue declines resulting from the Great Recession, which exceeded \$7 billion in 2009 alone," said Postmaster General and CEO Megan J. Brennan.

The Postal Service warned the forced reduction on first-class, postcards and some business postage would worsen its annual operating deficit, which has been improving of late. The Postal Service added more than \$1 billion in revenues last year and in 2014, primarily from the stamp-price surcharge. Postal officials argue it's time for a permanent rate increase.

"Removing the surcharge and reducing our prices is an irrational outcome considering the Postal Service's precarious financial condition," its CEO said. The mandatory action will reduce revenue and increasing its net losses by approximately \$2 billion per year, according to her office.

Unless Congress or another federal court steps in to extend or make permanent an existing surcharge for mailing products and services — including the Forever stamp — the Postal Service will be required to reduce prices on April 10. The Postal Regulatory Commission, which oversees U.S. mail operations, estimates the Postal Service this weekend will reach the \$4.6 billion cap from the surcharge.

Despite improving revenues the past two years, the Postal Service posted a \$5.1 billion deficit in 2015 and can't pay its retirement-fund obligations. The Postal Service is \$50 billion in debt after several years of running up huge losses, and it's not making legally required payments to a retiree health-benefit

fund. Employee costs were higher last year, as sales in mailing services other than first-class postage increased and employees worked more overtime.

With Sunday's loss of the two-cent add-on for a stamp, the Postal Service will have less money this year to pay overtime, buy equipment and replace aging vehicles in its nationwide fleet, according to officials. It is looking for ways to expand mail products and services, and has no intention of stopping mail delivery on Saturdays, according to Jackson, a USPS spokeswoman for Southern California.

Postal Service prices for mailing are capped by law at the rate of inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers. However, the law permits price increases beyond the inflation rate for extraordinary or exceptional circumstances. That was the case when the Postal Service received approval for the slight 4.3 percent surcharge on postage.

The Postal Regulatory Commission capped the emergency surcharge to \$4.6 billion over the objections of postal officials who preferred it be permanent. The Postal Service has experienced rapid growth lately in package volume, yet it is "not nearly enough" to offset the decline in revenues from first-class mail, they say.

"First-class mail volume has dropped and it's not going to come back," said USPS spokeswoman Eva Jackson. We've lost that first class mailing volume."

Online bill paying also cuts into first-class postage sales as more Americans bank, make purchases and pay their bills online, according to postal officials. They emphasize that the Postal Service is looking at new, competitively delivery services in rural and hard-to-reach areas to increase revenues. The mail service has trimmed 300,000 positions since Congress ordered it to pre-pay for retiree benefits, which spokeswoman Jackson said had never been done before.

Self-service machines at local post offices will be re-programmed in time for Sunday's change in the rates, according to the spokeswoman. •

### TEST DRIVE A LINCOLN RAISE MONEY FOR PARKS

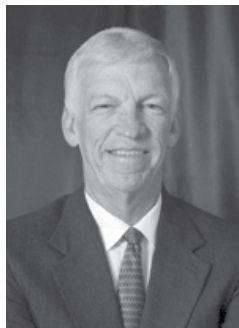

### SPRING HAS OFFICIALLY BEGUN

With the beginning of April, major league baseball has begun. I love baseball. Until the season begins, it just

### BASEBALL'S ORIGINS - OUR NATIONAL PASTIME

Here's a little article I came across that documents baseball's beginnings. Contrary to popular lore, Abner Doubleday did not invent baseball in Cooperstown, New York. Doubleday never claimed to be the inventor, and there is no reliable record connecting him to the game. Who did invent baseball, then? Lots of people, over many years. It apparently developed from an old English game called rounders, which New Englanders played in colonial days. In rounders, players hit the ball with a bat and ran around bases. Fielders threw the ball at runners, and if it hit a runner who was off base, he was out (a custom known as "soaking" or "plugging" the runner). In the early days of the republic, Americans gradually transformed rounders into a game sometimes called "town ball" (because it was played on town greens in New England), "barn ball," "base ball," and several other names. Exactly how the game was played varied from place to place. New York City businessman Alexander Cartwright (pictured above) is often called the father of organized baseball. In 1845 he founded the Knickerbocker Base Ball Club of New York and wrote a set of rules for the game. After the Civil War the soldiers from both sides took the sport home with them, and Americans went crazy for it. Soon baseball clubs were forming all over the country, and the game quickly became the national pastime. (The American Patriot's Almanac, William J. Bennett, 2008)

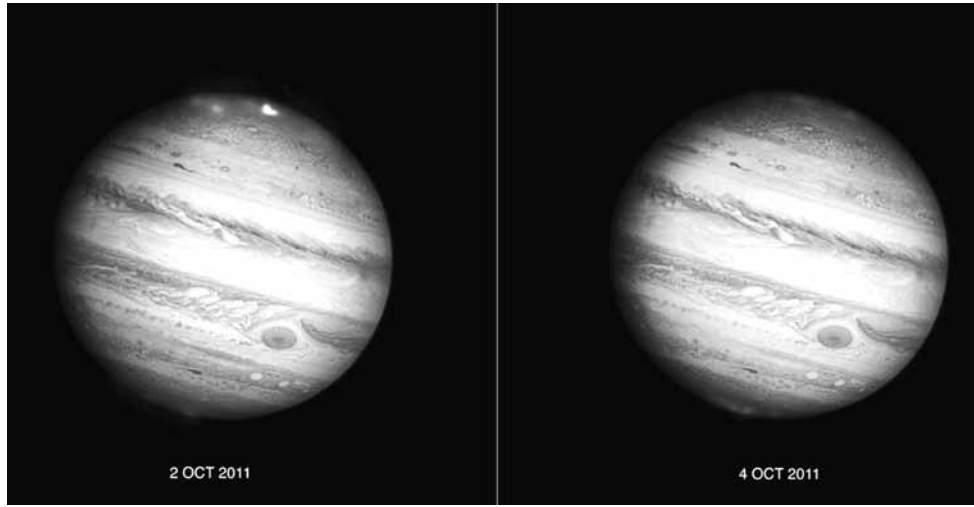
## Solar Storms Ignite X-Ray “Northern Lights” on Jupiter

Solar storms are triggering X-ray auroras on Jupiter that are about eight times brighter than normal over a large area of the planet and hundreds of times more energetic than Earth’s “northern lights,” according to a new study using data from NASA’s Chandra X-ray Observatory. This result is the first time that Jupiter’s auroras have been studied in X-ray light when a giant solar storm arrived at the planet.

The Sun constantly ejects streams of particles into space in the solar wind. Sometimes, giant storms, known as coronal mass ejections (CMEs), erupt and the solar winds become much stronger. These events compress Jupiter’s magnetosphere, the region of space controlled by Jupiter’s magnetic field, shifting its boundary with the solar wind inward by more than a million miles. This new study found that the interaction at the boundary triggers the X-rays in Jupiter’s auroras, which cover an area bigger than the surface of the Earth.

A series of composite images show Jupiter and its aurora during and after a CME’s arrival at Jupiter in October 2011. In these images, X-ray data from Chandra (purple) have been overlaid on an optical image from



the Hubble Space Telescope. The left-hand panel reveals the X-ray activity when the CME reached Jupiter, and the right-hand side is the view two days later after the CME subsided.

The impact of the CME on Jupiter’s aurora was tracked by monitoring the X-rays emitted during two 11-hour observations. The scientists used that data to pinpoint the source of the X-ray activity and identify areas to investigate further.

The dramatic findings complement NASA’s

Juno mission this summer which aims to understand the relationship between the two biggest structures in the solar system—the region of space controlled by Jupiter’s magnetic field (i.e., its magnetosphere) and the region controlled by the solar wind.

“There’s a constant power struggle between the solar wind and Jupiter’s magnetosphere,” explained William Dunn, lead author and PhD student at University College London’s Mullard Space Science Laboratory “We want to understand this interaction and what

effect it has on the planet. By studying how the aurora changes, we can discover more about the region of space controlled by Jupiter’s magnetic field, and if or how this is influenced by the Sun. Understanding this relationship is important for the countless magnetic objects across the galaxy, including exoplanets, brown dwarfs and neutron stars.”

NASA’s Juno spacecraft, launched in 2011, will investigate Jupiter’s relationship with the Sun and the solar wind by studying its magnetic field, magnetosphere and aurora. The UCL team hopes to find out how the X-rays form by collecting complementary data using the European Space Agency’s X-ray space observatory, XMM-Newton, and NASA’s Chandra X-ray observatory.

“Comparing new findings from Jupiter with what is already known for Earth will help explain how space weather is driven by the solar wind interacting with Earth’s magnetosphere,” said Professor Graziella Branduardi-Raymont, supervisor of the study at UCL. “New insights into how Jupiter’s atmosphere is influenced by the Sun will help us characterize the atmospheres of exoplanets, giving us clues about whether a planet is likely to support life as we know it.” •

There isn't anything medically we can do for this little guy because it's so aggressive but he's still very active and happy.

His adopters have been in constant communication with MSFR since they first spotted Tracey on our website. They immediately wanted Tracey and even after hearing the latest news, nothing could change their minds. These folks have huge hearts, generous spirits and a never-ending compassion for these unwanted dogs.
