Inglewood City Council Approves MOU to Seek Grant Funding

With Councilman Ralph L. Franklin absent from the vote, the rest of the Inglewood City Council members approved a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Inglewood and the Los Angeles County Flood Control District. The MOU between the city and the L.A. County Flood Control District seeks grant funding from the State Department of Water Resources, in addition to Proposition 84 and Integrated Regional Water Management Program. The MOU also approved a payment by the city in the amount of \$17,440.71 to LACFCD, which represents the city's portion of the fee to be paid in preparation of the application.

The State's DWR created what is known as the Integrated Regional Water Management Program [IRWMP], which encourages the development of regional strategies that will allow for the management of water resources. In addition, the program would also provide funding for the planning and implementation of any types of projects. The funds provided are also intended to facilitate the management of water supply, water quality, environmental interests, drought protection, flood protection and the reduction of the dependence on imported water.

The MOU was proposed when city staff identified three potential projects worthy of grant funding under IRWMP: the construction of well No. 7, transfer station cover structure

and well No. 2 rehabilitation. An evaluation conducted by hydrogeology consultant Richard C. Slade and Associates concluded that these were areas the city needed to address. The consultants further concluded that in order for the city to increase its water supply with lower-priced groundwater and in order to reduce its dependency on imported water, well No. 2 was to be rehabilitated, at an

estimated cost of \$250,000, of which 25 percent will be funded by the city [\$62,500] and the remaining 75 percent [\$187,500] will be covered by the funding being requested of the state.

City Pays Outstanding Printing Service Debt to L.A. Business

The city council unanimously approved the payment of an outstanding debt in the amount of \$7,898 to L.A. Business Printing, for the services of preparing and mailing 48,000 community development brochures as part

of the Citizen Participation Plan.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development [HUD] requires that all cities receiving HUD entitlement funds through either Community Development Block Grant [CDBG] or the HOME Investment Partnership Program must develop and implement an annual citizen participation plan. The citizen participation plan is intended for the city to receive input from the community with regards to the priorities of the community in order to determine how to use the entitlement funds provided by HUD.

In particular the plan allows for low- and extremely low-income residents to actively participate and have an impact on the city's annual action plan. Through that action plan, HUD has a specific summary of the types of activities, actions and funding resources that can be used to pin point priority housing and community development needs.

Outreach efforts include public hearings, usually a minimum of six. The city also established a direct-mail brochure as a means to for the community to participate in the planning process. The brochures reach 48,000 Inglewood residents, which notifies them of available funding and upcoming meetings. L.A. Printing provided the lowest bid for the bilingual (English and Spanish) six-page and full color brochure requesting input from the community •

3. Keep trying treatments until you find one that works for you. You may be familiar with pain pills and knee replacement surgery but there are many other options. Viscosupplement injections lubricate the

joint and can provide up to six months of osteoarthritis knee pain relief. Older methods of the treatment required a series of three to five injections, but newer treatments require just one.

4. Don't wait too long to see a specialist. A doctor who specializes in knee pain can be very helpful in guiding you through all the treatment options, even in the early stages of knee osteoarthritis. The most common specialists for knee osteoarthritis are orthopedic surgeons, pain management, physical medicine and rehabilitation, and rheumatologists.

Most importantly, don't give up on finding options for managing your osteoarthritis knee pain. "After I was diagnosed with osteoarthritis of the knee and found the right doctor, we kept trying until we found a treatment that worked for me," says Mary Ann. "Now I'm able to enjoy the things I love again, like gardening. I was even able to take a trip to Europe!"

Manhattan Beach Overwhelms Lennox Seniors

Inspired with its come-from-behind 11-9 win in the finals of the District 37 All-Star Tournament on July 5, the Lennox Senior (ages 15-16) Little League Baseball team played in a more challenging Section 4 Tournament in a much larger Marine Park Field in Manhattan Beach last week. Lennox hit four home runs, including two in the bottom of the seventh, to pull off their district crown at a small Jim Thorpe Park field in Hawthorne, but was unable to hit any homers in a professional-sized field that is nearly twice the size.

Lennox, managed to advance to the championship finals but found powerful Manhattan Beach overwhelming in a six-inning mercy rule 16-4 loss last Thursday. Lennox started well, leading 3-2 after the first inning with three runs in the bottom of the inning. It started when Michael Zambrano singled. One out later, Carlos Jacobo and Ralph Garcia walked to load the bases. Robert Chavez doubled home Zambrano and Jacobo to tie the game. After two out, Jose Silva singled to give Lennox the lead. Manhattan Beach, though, scored four times in the top of the third to take a 6-3 lead but Lennox cut its deficit to one run in the bottom of the fourth when Raul Garcia singled home Kayla Hamaguchi, who was the starting and losing pitcher.

The fifth and sixth innings saw a more physical and talented Manhattan Beach squad wear down Lennox with five runs apiece. Two-run singles by Ty Conrad and Joey Hanson sparked Manhattan in the fifth and sixth, in order. Lennox was unable to muster any runs in either the fifth or sixth, which enabled Manhattan to finish it off an inning early due to the 10-run-plus mercy rule. "We made a lot of errors," Lennox manager Celso Castro said. "Manhattan Beach was the better team."

Manhattan Beach was the District 36 champion. Both its seniors and juniors enjoyed

success. Three years ago, Manhattan's seniors made it to the World Series where they finished third. They advanced to the regional finals in each of the past two seasons. Lennox started the tournament on July 7 with an 8-7 win over District 25 champion Santa Monica before losing its first game to Manhattan 7-1 a day later. On July 9, Lennox won its second game

over Santa Monica 6-4. A two-run triple by Josh Salcedo keyed Lennox in that contest. Manhattan Beach was led by Rollie Nichols who had two hits and drove in four runs. Dom Devitco had a two-run double.

Lennox Juniors Stay Alive

With a large majority of its players from its Southern California championship and Western Regional finalist 50/70 (ages 11-13) All-Star team of last year involved, the Lennox Junior (ages 13-14) Little League baseball team was seeking to go as far or, possibly, even further. Lennox was able to sweep Tri Park for the District 37 championship on July 6 and 7, but ran into a road block with an eight-inning 11-9 loss to District 27 champion North Torrance last Saturday at North Venice Little League Field.


Last Sunday, though, Lennox got another shot at North by routing District 25 champion Santa Monica 15-4 in a five-inning mercy rule game. Against North, Lennox trailed 7-0 entering the bottom of the sixth inning before exploding for nine runs to grab a 9-7 lead. With standout Cardinal Fernandezes pitching, Lennox had hopes of hanging on to top North and face powerful Manhattan Beach, the District 36 champion, on Sunday.

Fernandezes, who was an all-Del Rey League pitcher at co-league champion Gardena Serra High last spring, got stunned when he gave up a game tying two-run home run to Robert Rodriguez in the top of the seventh. After Lennox went out in order in the bottom of the seventh, North came back with two runs in the top of the eighth, then, again, held Lennox scoreless in the bottom of the inning for the win. Lennox routed Santa Monica for its rematch with North last Monday. North was crushed by Manhattan Beach 24-5 in a five-inning mercy rule game last Sunday. Lennox, though, appears that it could be without Fernandezes who has back problems. Salvador Mercado had two hits and drove in

two runs for Lennox against North. Kennedy Guillen also had two hits with one run batted in. Jesus Sanchez and Luis Garcia had run-scoring hits in the sixth. Kyle Hatu went four-for-four with two RBI's for North. Lennox captured the District 37 crown with wins of 11-1 and 6-5 in 11 innings over Tri Park on July 6 and 7, respectively. Jesus Sanchez had a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th to help Lennox clinch the crown. •

How to Shop for Dental Insurance

(BPT) - Dental health is essential to overall health, affecting everything from our hearts to our mental well-being. • Maximize your dental dollars - Most dental plans limit the amount they will pay in a given year. It's important to know what that cap is because you will need to pay full dental costs after you reach that limit in a year. Some dental PPOs let you share unused dental dollars with family members. Programs such as Family Share Max replace traditional individual maximums and allow families to pull from one shared dental coverage pool in a way that most effectively meets their specific needs and budgets.

Ultimately taking care of your teeth today keeps costs down for you and your family in the future.

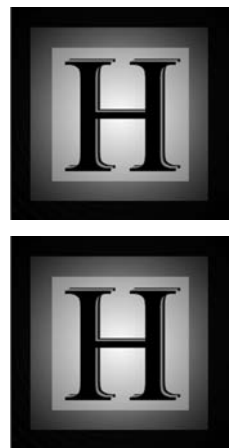


