Still today, some are homeless and struggling.

Fortunately, there are organizations that seek to help our Hawthorne Veterans. These include the American Legion, Post 341 at 14124 Prairie Avenue, Hawthorne, phone (310) 675 1313; The VFW, Post 2075 at 4563 W. 131st Street, Hawthorne, phone (310) 679 7472); Wounded Heroes of America at 14147 Hawthorne Blvd., phone (310) 355 0266; and the Vet Center at 1045 West Redondo Beach Boulevard, Gardena; phone (310) 767 1221). Hawthorne also has a Veterans Affairs Commission, established in 2013 to provide advocacy and support for better communication, planning, coordination, and cooperation among entities (like those mentioned above) for veterans, their families, homeless veterans, and those at risk of becoming homeless. There are five members of the Veterans Affairs Commission: Faye Johnson, Chair, retired United States Air Force, and a National Affiliations Officer with Veterans Affairs Central Office. Dr. Stephen Nellman, Vice Chair, United States Army veteran and Superintendent of the Centinela Valley Union High School District. Kyle Orlemann, former Chair of the Commission, and wife of a disabled United States Army veteran, as well as a life member of Hawthorne's VFW Post 2075. Carol Steinhauer, a Hawthorne resident of 56 years, wife of a deceased Korean War Veteran, who also serves as a member and officer of Hawthorne's VFW Post 2075.

Daniel Lucero, current United States Army Captain, and recipient of the prestigious Congressional Certificate of Recognition for his distinguished service.

Recognition Program, created to recognize

designed, printed, and displayed from 120th

The cost per banner is \$300, and the honoree, or their family, must be a past or present Hawthorne resident, Hawthorne business owner, or an employee within Hawthorne. The applications will be processed in the order received, so an application outside the 2024 window will have the banner displayed in 2025.

All City Council members were in attendance, along with the City Treasurer, City Attorney, City Manager, and City Clerk. Pastor Greg Guich of the Centinela Bible Church gave a heartfelt invocation, expressing gratitude for Hawthorne and those who seek to better it, and asked

God to keep us all safe. (Amen.) To the business at hand:

Parking is challenging around City Hall, and a significant expansion program of the area is to go forward. To deal with the parking difficulties, 126th Street will be converted to angle parking. If it does not work (hopefully it will), but if not, 126th Street will revert back to two-way. Keep in mind that City Hall has 91 employees. In addition, there are 151 people working for the Police Department. The effort is to relieve the parking problem there.

Film Review

The Space Race: A Revelatory Exploration of NASA's Black Astronauts

From National Geographic Documentary Films comes The Space Race, a revelatory exploration into the historical accomplishments of Black NASA astronauts. Directed by Lisa Cortés (The Apollo, Little Richard) and Emmy-Award winner Diego Hurtado de Mendoza, The Space Race is a compelling portrait of the National heroes whose service, up until now, has been absent from mainstream history. Now streaming on Hulu and Disney+.

Space exploration wasn't encouraged in ethnic communities back in the 1960s. The mindset that was birthed from racial segregation and discrimination was especially

not welcoming to Black Americans looking to get into the scientific fields but that didn't stop Ed Dwight, Guion Bluford, Charles Bolden, and Victor Glover from pursuing their dreams of becoming astronauts. In an attempt to combat the social injustice at the time, President John F. Kennedy announced that Captain Edward Dwight would carry the title of the country's "First Negro Astronaut." This news was met with both applause and criticism and, unfortunately, those who were skeptical that the optics were just smoke and mirrors were proved right. In the

film, Captain Dwight frustratingly admits that he believes his hiring was for political and propaganda purposes, not moral progress. America needed a positive PR spin, and he was their chosen target.

Fast forward through decades and cultural strides, The Space Race uses archival footage and current-day interviews to show the side of history that wasn't written in textbooks. Special attention is dedicated to Ron Mc-Nair, the only Black astronaut aboard the Challenger Mission, who died along with six others when the spacecraft infamously exploded just seconds after takeoff. Regrettably, we will never know the full potential of his impact on future generations but despite his untimely passing, Ron is cited as an inspiration among his peers. Ron represented hope and ability for many people, specifically within the Black community.

The Space Race thrives when we hear the men reminisce in detail about their time spent in outer space. One describes Earth as being so small that his crew circled it every 90 minutes. Another speaks of his amazement to see the countries from that high, noting there were no lines or divides that we are accustomed to seeing on maps. If only everyone could co-exist with that mentality, that we are all equal and not bound to imaginary borders or tier systems. It's a message that extends far beyond space, and one that will hopefully resonate with audiences to infinity and beyond. •





Teen Book Review of Term Limits by Vince Flynn

Do you like spy novels? Do you like novels with intrigue and mystery? How about plots with twists and turns? If your answer was yes to any of these, the book called "Term Limits" by Vince Flynn is what you NEED to read. It is a stand-alone 612-page book published in 1997 as Vince Flynn's first book published. If his name does not ring a bell, the fact that he was a story consultant on the well-known TV series "24" should substantiate his expertise in how to construct drama and suspense. I know that 612 pages is a lot, but Vince's writing style entices the reader to not put the book down (chapter after

chapter) and continues to keep the reader interested. The novel kicks off with a shocking event - a group of assassins kidnaps and executes three high-profile U.S. politicians. The motive behind these killings is to send a powerful message to the political elite... corruption will no longer be tolerated. No one, they warn, is out of their reach, not even the U.S. president. As the authorities scramble to uncover the identities of these perpetrators, the tension escalates, and politicians start dropping like flies. In an attempt to discover who is behind these murders, the President authorizes the Central Intelligence Agency (known as the CIA) to operate on US soil and use whatever means necessary to obtain information. Only Congressman Michael O'Rourke, a former U.S. Marine, holds the clue that could stop the violence, but it has explosive implications for his country and the future of the United States. •

Smart Steps to Economic Empowerment

(BPT) - Despite today's challenging economic climate, the majority of Americans feel economically empowered and continue to strive for their professional goals, but there are generational differences, with Gen Z and millennials feeling more confident than Gen X and baby boomers.

According to a survey commissioned by Herbalife, 55% of Americans are currently taking steps to feel more economically empowered. The survey also revealed generational differences. For example, Gen Z and millennials are the most likely to currently feel economically empowered (66% and 70%, respectively) compared to 51% of Gen X and 52% of American baby boomers.

Interestingly, over half of both Gen Z and millennials have a side hustle compared to 35% of Gen X and only 7% of baby boomers.

"There are many opportunities available for people looking to achieve economic empowerment by starting their own business," said Ibi Montesino, executive vice president, chief of staff, Herbalife. 





the distinctions between a General Law City (which was Hawthorne at this time) and a Charter City. A major distinction is that the General Law City follows the State Constitution to enact ordinances, enforce zoning, and exercise the police power. On the other hand, a Charter City derives its authority from the "home rule doctrine". The Charter City can adopt and enforce its laws to an appreciable degree (including increased compensation for State Senator Bradford, which focuses on billboards for Hawthorne.

A bit later in the meeting, the Council approved the "municipal message centers development" and the lease agreement between Hawthorne and Wow Media, Inc.

Folks, these billboards are going to take time, but stay tuned.

Next was a presentation by the Hawthorne Police Department, which implemented a

are well trained (in fact must be certified). The drones are shared on different shifts and calls for service. There are specific events where the drones are particularly useful: pre-planned (e.g., a movie in the park), police patrol (observing the scene, at minimum), and first responder services. The current drones are about the size of a briefcase, cost between \$5,000 and \$15,000, and have a two to three-year lifespan. They

usefulness of the drones is proven. As a result, the Hawthorne Police Department is that much more vigilant today. Item number 19 on the Agenda was later approved by the Council, authorizing a 5-year contract between the Hawthorne Police Department and Brinc Drones for Drone First Responder and approving a purchase order.

The Council then turned to a "tear in the eye" presentation, saluting three terrific people: Deborah Johnson, who served as Custodian of Hawthorne City Hall, D. J. Cerrado, traffic safety engineer for Hawthorne, and Police Officer Ron Lewis, public safety officer. They are all "Good Neighbors"; each was heartily commended for their exemplary service and invaluable contributions to the community. Finally, some upcoming events: March 9, from 10 am to 4 pm, at the Nakaoka Community Center in Gardena, Senator Bradford's office has scheduled "Tacos and Taxes". If Hawthorne were to seek to become a Charter City, there are multiple steps to be taken and specific deadlines by which to do it. Hawthorne becoming a Charter City has been a consideration before and is not without controversy.

A representative of the company, Wow Media, came forward, and the word "wow" seems apt: Digital billboards. Wow Media has successfully worked since 2015 with the City of Inglewood. Tonight, item number 10 on the agenda is to approve a contract between the City of Hawthorne and Wow Media. Details were provided about the different kinds of billboards, where they likely will be located, how monies would be recouped by Wow Media, and how money would flow to the city. The billboards may well enhance Hawthorne's image, serve public information purposes, and bring in good money. Of interest as well, in Sacramento presently, local Assembly Member McKinnor has introduced Assembly Bill 1869, co-authored by local drone program in 2021. Today, the Department has five drones and 20 pilots. The pilots are very well maintained, and their electronic systems are rarely damaged. Above all, the


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
