### <u>Film Review</u>


### The Assessment Review: Parenthood is Turned Into a Darkly Dystopian Game

What immediately piqued my interest in The Assessment wasn't the headlining cast or the Pinterest-worthy production design photos. No, it was the film's director, the French visual artist Fleur Fortuné. Having personally worked in the commercial and music video industry for over a decade, I'd recognize Fortuné's visual style anywhere. She expertly blends surreal and whimsical imagery with compelling narratives, which makes for unforgettable cinematic feats. Fortuné uses her artistic strengths in *The As*sessment, a dystopian story about a couple's struggle to have a child for reasons other than you'd expect.

Starring Alicia Vikander, Elizabeth Olsen, and Himesh Patel, The Assessment is a psychologically provocative minefield. Set in the near future where parenthood is strictly controlled, Mia (Olsen) and Aaryan (Patel) are ready to take their relationship to the next level. They want to have a baby. However, the reality of this dream coming true is far more laborious than it once was. In this dystopian landscape, resources are limited and the government has total control over reproduction rights. Despite being a successful couple in every sense of the word, Mia and Aaryan have to undergo a seven-day assessment to determine if they are "fit" enough to have a child.

It doesn't take long before their assessor, Virginia (Vikander), arrives at the couple's home. Without delay, she quickly begins the



highly confidential and borderline inhumane process. At first glance, Virginia seems like a levelheaded, unbiased judge of character. Any nerves the couple have are momentarily put at ease. However, Virginia's test quickly unravels into their worst psychological nightmare. Virginia begins acting like a child, roleplaying every worst-case scenario regardless of harmful intent. Mia and Aaryan's relationship begins to crack as they-for the first time-question the very foundations of their society and whether their relationship can survive.

Elizabeth Olsen and Himesh Patel do an excellent job grounding the film in reality while simultaneously pushing against Alicia Vikander's absurdity. Vikander has a lot to play with as Virginia, her performance reminds me of her role in the Mike Mills short film I Am Easy to Find. Vikander is theatrical, brash, and at times borders on annoying. However, her role is to push Mia and Aaryan's patience threshold. And in doing this, she successfully tests the audience's patience as well.

The retro-futuristic world of *The Assessment* is beautiful, almost museum-like. Stunning production design by Jan Houllevigue and art design by Philippe Mayanobe bring to life a cohesive blend of fantasy and reality. Further driving the mood is the original score by Emilie Levienaise-Farrouch whose previous work includes All of Us Strangers and Censor.

Filmmaker Fleur Fortuné crafts a darkly humorous and poignant thesis statement in The Assessment. At its core, it requires us to get introspective and consider what we're willing to sacrifice for our heart's desire. It's a chilling film to watch, and one that's not easy to forget. •



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

Now that Ebby is in a new environment she goes into a deep dive about the family jar, which was brought North by an enslaved ancestor, and what the jar's significance in her family's history and to their future. 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
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# In Memory of Councilmember Pablo Catano



### Teriyaki Salmon Broccoli Noodles

Provided by Campbells Soup Corp.

Spiralized carrot and broccoli 'noodles' replace traditional pasta in this Asian inspired dish. Soy, honey, and ginger flavor both the salmon and the broth that you use to cook the 'noodles'. Be sure to cook the veggie noodles until just tender so they still have nice firm texture yet soak up the delicious flavor from the broth.



### Ingredients

- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 2 teaspoons grated peeled ginger root
- 3 tablespoons rice wine vinegar
- 3 tablespoons reduced sodium soy sauce
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 2 tablespoons sesame oil
- 4 salmon fillet (about 1 pound)
- 10 ounces broccoli stems, spiralized using blade with medium holes (about 3 cups)
- 10 ounces carrot, peeled and spiralized using blade with medium holes (about 3 cups)
- 1 cup Swanson® Vegetable Broth

### **Directions**

- Step 1: Stir the garlic, ginger, vinegar, soy sauce and honey in a small bowl. Set aside 3 tablespoons soy sauce mixture in a separate bowl (for coating the fish). Reserve the remaining soy sauce mixture. Brush the fish with the 3 tablespoons soy sauce mixture and discard any left over.
- Step 2: Heat 1 tablespoon sesame oil in a 12-inch nonstick skillet over medium heat.
   Add the fish and cook for 6 minutes or until lightly browned on both sides and cooked through. Remove the fish from the skillet, cover and keep warm in the oven at 200°F.
- Step 3: Wipe the skillet clean. Add the remaining sesame oil and heat over medium heat. Add the vegetable noodles and cook for 3 minutes. Add the reserved soy sauce mixture and broth and cook for 3 minutes or until the vegetable noodles are tender. Season to taste. Serve the salmon over the vegetable noodles.

B. Many of our local nonprofit organizations. rely on the proceeds from the sale of Safe and Sane Fireworks as a significant source of their annual funding. The loss of this funding threatens critical community programs that serve Inglewood residents.

C. The use of illegal and dangerous fireworks must remain unlawful in our City, and our City must use every resource available to prosecute violators who use them in our City. The use of illegal and dangerous fireworks in our City is the real problem and not the sale of Safe and Sane Fireworks.

D. Jurisdictions that allow the sale and use of Safe and Sane Fireworks have documented declines in the use of illegal and dangerous fireworks. This decline is achieved, in part,

through residents having the option to use Safe and Sane Fireworks instead of illegal and dangerous fireworks. There are other factors that contribute to this decline, such as increased public education efforts, stronger enforcement of ordinances prohibiting the use of illegal and dangerous fireworks, and the imposition of higher administrative fines and penalties to deter the use of illegal and dangerous fireworks. These fines and penalties can help offset enforcement costs

E. The revenues generated from the sale of Safe and Sane Fireworks can provide direct financial support for public safety, public education, and enforcement efforts targeting the use of illegal and dangerous fireworks. In jurisdictions that allow their sale, revenue from administrative fines, local fees, and state sales tax contributions fund enforcement operations. Additionally, AB 1403, signed into law by Governor Newsom in 2023, allows cities that permit Safe and Sane Fireworks to impose sales fees that fund public awareness campaigns and strengthen enforcement measures

Despite these facts, the Inglewood City Council recently voted to ban the sale and use of Safe and Sane Fireworks.
