A Bicycle Built for You

Bicycles rode into Europe in the 19th century. By the early part of this century, there were more than one billion bicycles worldwide, far exceeding the number of cars. In fact, a bike is the principal means of transportation in several regions. Bicycling also is an excellent form of recreation.

There are a variety of different bicycles, including fitness, military, racing, mountain, and children's toys, among them. Here in the South Bay, e-bikes (battery-assisted bikes) are popular. As an older person (yes, that would be me), having an e-bike does indeed help me to navigate a lot of hills so that I can get to the wondrous bike path along the coast. which runs north and south from at least Santa Monica to Redondo Beach. However, some insist you can travel from Malibu to Palos Verdes and back.

The sights along the bike path are varied, but many are breathtaking. For example, the waves roll in, breaking on the shoreline, while the warm sun glistens on the water and seagulls glide through the air. The South Bay bike path reminds us of how fortunate we are to live here, in Hawthorne, Inglewood, or Lawndale, so close to the Pacific Ocean.

Bicycle, the word itself, was first used in an 1847 French publication to describe a two-wheeled vehicle (thus the use of "bi," as in bi-cycle). Today bicycles come equipped with baskets, are able to tote kids or dogs, surfboards even, and allow for securely fastening a cellphone that can then play excellent music to enhance your ride even more so.

The fine city of Hawthorne houses the storage facility for Velofix, which began in Canada and now has spread to various locations throughout America. What is Velofix?

To quote their online link: "Your local bike shop, on wheels. No more hassle. We come directly to you."

Bottom line: Velofix is indeed a bike shop in a van. I was lucky to have been able to spend time and talk with Eric Smith, the Head Mechanic for Velofix locally.

"We have seven vans now and about a dozen on the team.

On average, we handle four to five jobs each day during our busy season. On occasion, but not often, there is something we cannot fix or repair right then and there, so we come back if a part is needed or a tool, but this is done onsite. We also work on a wide variety of bikes, and it is not unusual if we are asked to assemble a bike you ordered online that is delivered to your home."

Interesting to hear Eric talk so energetically about bicycles. After all, he grew up in Turlock, California, known primarily for farming, ranching, and agriculture.

"Well, I began sweeping the floor at the local bike shop as a kid, and as time passed into high school, I learned more as an apprentice, ultimately becoming a full-fledged bicycle mechanic. I then went to U.C. Davis for college, where I majored in biology. The town of Davis is very bike friendly, I mean, very, very bike friendly. But, after college, I worked in a lab. I was, after all, a biology major. Eventually, though, I just so missed working with my hands. Also, I have such an affinity for bicycles. Now... well, here I am with Velofix, doing what I love."

The Velofix vans not only have tools for the work needed, but supplies and products. The Velofix staff is primed to explain what is wrong and what work they are doing, give suggestions on bike maintenance, and be

there to answer questions and concerns. As noted, they can assemble a bike which today is often bought online and delivered to you.

E-bikes, as one example, are new to many people. So, how do you safely ride it? How do you best charge and maintain the battery? What is the wisest lock to get?

Velofix is a very good go-to resource. This is not to say your local bike shop is not awesome as well. Bicycling is so popular there is room for both.

"There are two key problems I find with e-bikes – not keeping the battery sufficiently charged - which means charging it during a period of time when the bike is just sitting, maybe because of the weather, and making sure the tires have the right pressure. Those are very basic, I know, but basics are so important."




Check It Out


Only the Best: the Exceptional Life and Fashion of Ann Lowe by Kate Messner and Margaret E. Dowell

Only the Best: the Exceptional Life and Fashion of Ann Lowe by Kate Messner and Margaret E. Dowell, illustrated by Erin K. Robinson tells the story of the first nationally known African American fashion designer. As a girl, Ann dreamed of creating dresses as perfect and beautiful as flowers. She practiced creating flowers from leftover fabric scraps her mom and grandma, both who were seamstresses. Through hard work, vision and ambition, Ann becomes a sought after designer, overcoming prejudice, and racism to dress even Jacque Kennedy on her wedding day.

Manfish: a Story of Jacques Cousteau by Jennifer Berne illustrated by Eric Puybaret takes readers on a journey of a boy who dreamed about breathing underwater and flying among the ocean creatures in the sea. As a grownup, Jacques combines his interests of diving, filming, and tinkering to invent the aqualung, a device that brings his childhood dreams to life and an underwater camera to capture life below the waves. Later in his life, Jacques uses his passion for the ocean to bring attention to pollution that threatens the seas and planet he loves.



Film Review

Moonage Daydream is a Stunning Portrait of David Bowie, Now Streaming on HBO Max

They say never meet your heroes. Unfortunately, I'll never have the chance to meet one of mine. The world changed on January 10, 2016, when the news of David Bowie's death stunned everyone who knew and loved him. If you listened closely, you could hear the collective gasp from fans worldwide as we sat in disbelief. How could he be gone when,

just two days earlier, his 26th studio album – Blackstar – was released? It wasn't fair. Bowie was one of those rare artists who only got better with time. And now we were to be robbed of what genius he could have contributed in his golden years. *Moonage Daydream* may be the closest thing we'll get to having another Bowie experience, and that's reason enough to consider this documentary a treasure.

Director Brett Morgen's (*The Kid Stays in the Picture, Kurt Cobain: Montage of Heck, Jane*) kaleidoscopic retrospective of one of the greatest artists of our time is an amalgamation of sight, sound, and spirit. The film premiered at this year's Cannes Film Festival and more recently, crossed the pond with screenings at TIFF, before opening in theaters last Friday. Unlike a traditional biopic, which can be hard to tonally get right, *Moonage Daydream* plays

like a video collage of rare concert footage, TV talkshow appearances, and behind the scenes moments. It truly is David Bowie like you've never seen him before. Plus, this is the only officially sanctioned film from the Bowie estate (which says a lot).

Moonage Daydream is so whimsical that, for a moment, it's easy to forget Bowie himself isn't calling the shots behind the lens. Morgen channels his protagonists' energy and playfulness by breaking the "rules" of traditional documentary storytelling. There is no beginning, middle, or end here. Rather, we jump forward and back in time, onstage and off, creating intimate controlled chaos. Visually, it's stunning. And sonically, it's outstanding. Long-time collaborator, friend, and music producer Tony Visconti and Academy Award-winning sound mixer Paul Massey (Bohemian Rhapsody) remixed and translated Bowie's original stems for theaters in 12.0, 5.0, Atmos, and 7.1/5.1. That's nerd talk for: see it in an IMAX theater if possible!

Running 2 hours and 15 minutes, *Moonage Daydream* is the furthest thing from a sleepy affair. Prepare for a full-body adrenaline rush as your mind attempts to wrap around a technicolor explosion of the senses. You don't have to be a David Bowie fan to appreciate the film either; although there is a high chance you will be converted into one by the end credits. *Moonage Daydream* is a love letter to a hero who continues to inspire us, even in the afterlife.

Moonage Daydream is distributed by NEON. Now streaming on HBO Max. •



Need a Small Loan? Make Sure You're Not Adding to Your Financial Woes

(BPT) - April is Financial Literacy Month, and it's an opportunity for people to take a closer look at their finances and be smart about their money. These days, it's difficult to save money - whether it's an appliance breakdown, car repair or other unexpected bill, sometimes you just need to borrow a little cash. However, being unable to pay back your secured loan could result in losing access to the property you put up as collateral - such as your vehicle - which creates even more challenges, especially if you need your vehicle to get to work.

Unsecured loans place a greater risk on the



lender, since the borrower does not provide collateral. To account for that risk, lenders may offer unsecured personal loans in smaller amounts, charge higher annual percentage rates (APRs) and/or require the borrower to have a much higher credit score to qualify. These requirements can create barriers to accessing or building credit for anyone who is financially struggling.

To find out how much these products can really set you back, a 2022 analysis by the Financial Health Network, "The True Cost of a Loan," compares six financial products - payday loans, online-only payday loans, rent-to-own, installment loans, online-only installment loans and single-pay auto title loans - to unsecured installment loans from Oportun to estimate the total cost of these products to typical borrowers.

The study showed that even short-term, small-amount loans can end up being very expensive to borrowers in the long term, especially when compared to loans from Oportun. ORDINANCE NO. 23-11 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INGLEWOOD, CALIFORNIA INGLEWOOD TRANSIT CONNECTOR PROCUREMENTS, OF ARTICLE 5 OF CHAPTER 2 (PURCHASING) OF THE INGLEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE. WHEREAS, the Inglewood Transit Connector

("ITC") Project is a 1.6 mile, fully elevated and automated dual-lane transit system that will con-nect the LA Metro K line with three new transit stations in the City of Inglewood ("City"); and WHEREAS, the ITC Project will significa increase transit connectivity, reduce traffic congestion, and increase economic prosperity

WHEREAS, the City and the preferred proposer to be selected through the ongoing procurement process will enter into a designbuild-finance-operate-maintain agreement ("DBFOM Agreement") in connection with the ITC Project; and

WHEREAS, the DBFOMAgreement will contain the City's and developer's rights, interest and obligations in connection with the ITC Project. and some of such terms and conditions may potentially conflict with California state laws in the Public Contract Code: and

and arrange more than one subcontractor for each portion of subcontracted work.

Section 2-196.1(c)(13) is hereby added to Article 5 of Chapter 2 of the Inglewood Municipal Code to read as follows:

(13) Provisions specifying no withholdings and retainages or specifying withholding and retainages in amounts, percentages and frequency the City deems appropriate, and the terms and timing of release.

5 of Chapter 2 of the Inglewood Municipal Code to read as follows: (14) Provisions specifying the terms and timing for making payments to the contract.

Section 2-196.1(c)(15) is hereby added to Article 5 of Chapter 2 of the Inglewood Municipal

Code to read as follows: (15) Provisions specifying the rate of interest on late payment to the contractor.

Section 2-196.1(c)(16) is hereby added to Article 5 of Chapter 2 of the Inglewood Municipal Code to read as follows:

(16) Provisions allowing or precluding securities as substitution for retention or payment of

retention into an escrow. SECTION 7. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage

and adoption of this ordinance and to its approval by the City Council and shall cause the same to be published in accordance with the City Charter and thirty days from the final passage and adoption, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect.
