Make Sure the People's Voices are Heard

The Hawthorne City Council met on May 28. Von Morris, dedicated City Manager, was under the weather, so equally dedicated Chief of Police Gary Tomatani sat in for him. Throughout the meeting, Chief Tomatani was thanked for his good work, and deservedly so.

One of the other highlights was a terrific presentation by the Boys and Girls Club. This group began one hundred and sixty years ago in Hartford, Connecticut, when three sisters observed problems with young boys on the streets and in bars, getting into fights. Today, the Boys and Girls Club wants to collaborate with Hawthorne. One of the ways to do so is through the Club's STEM program: Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. These are hands-on efforts designed to increase interest, awareness and persistence.

Bottom line, the Boys and Girls Club focuses on encouraging and enhancing academic and career success, character, leadership, and healthy lifestyles. Look for collaboration with Hawthorne.

Invariably, of course, there were some "fireworks" at this Council meeting, but probably not quite what you would expect: Seven groups were chosen to have fireworks locations in Hawthorne, including Wounded Heroes, the Chamber of Commerce, American Legion Post 314, and the Hawthorne Kiwanis Club.

Speaking of which, one of Hawthorne's own, and among Hawthorne's finest, Patricia Donaldson, spoke during the public communications portion of the meeting. As a result of a "gnarly accident," while doing

some cleaning at home, Pat was hospitalized for four months. For three of those months, she was paralyzed. She thanked so many for their support, prayers and encouragement. I can definitely say seeing her there, standing at the podium, she looked great. Pat is the longstanding, ever-energetic President of the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce. She wants you all to know that June 20 is a fun Chamber Mixer (you can win Bingo money), and September 30 is the Chamber's Tenth Annual Golf Tourney.

The public communications portion of the meeting – on the agenda, it is referred to as "Oral Communications", which is limited to three minutes – was particularly substantive. Luciano Aguilar, who runs the well-respected

Presidential K9 Dog Facility - a grooming, boarding, and training facility - has begun a program that involves high school students training dogs that did not quite make the cut for the K9 division of a police department. The high schoolers work to train the dogs to be helpful to Veterans. Luciano encouraged the Council to bring the kids in to commend them for their effort.

Another gentleman spoke eloquently about "A Safe Place for Youth," a program that promotes housing vouchers for youth in precarious living situations or who are homeless. He asked to discuss joining hands with Hawthorne. Mayor Vargas said, "This sounds like a great idea," prompting the Head

Invisible Nation: Taiwan's Battle for Self-Identity

It's fitting that Invisible Nation, a documentary about perseverance, is directed by someone who carries the surname "Hope." As if intuition led her to make this project, filmmaker Vanessa Hope crafts an empathetic and eye-opening statement that sheds light on Taiwan's struggle for self-identity and acknowledgment. Invisible Nation closely follows Tsai Ing-wen, Taiwan's first female president, as she fights for the future of Taiwan's democracy at a pivotal moment that puts her country's freedom at risk of authoritarianism.

"China does not want the world to hear the story of Taiwan," says Tsai Ing-wen as a camera intimately captures the quiet stoicism that covers her face. It's this stark, matter-of-fact sentiment that is the catalyst for Tsai Ing-wen's political motivation to preserve Taiwan's autonomy. For decades, China has considered Taiwan part of the People's Republic of China (PRC) however, Taiwan believes itself to be an independent nation and therefore considers itself the Republic of China (ROC). The film goes deeper into the history of the division by explaining the genesis of the divide and the present-day discourse it elicits within China and Taiwan.

At the heart of the film's urgency is the PRC's desire to eventually "unify" Taiwan with China, relinquishing Tsai Ing-wen's control as President and removing the nationality of over 23 million people who call Taiwan home. Throughout interviews with political leaders and notable figures, many project that a major political and geographical upheaval will take place in 2025. Looking at a similar fate in the war between Ukraine and Russia, President Tsai Ing-wen is doing everything in her power to keep what's happening in Ukraine from happening in Taiwan.

Invisible Nation is equal parts educational and cinematic; the storied history and uncertain future of Taiwan are portrayed in captivating detail. Stand-out moments include the erasure that took place on the global stage. As it still stands today, Taiwan is the only member of the International Olympic Committee who is banned from using their name, singing their country's anthem, or flying their country's flag due to the People's Republic of China's communist rule. Mainland China continues to make concerted efforts to reduce the international personality and exposure of Taiwan, which further hurts Taiwan's global and social status.

President Tsai Ing-wen doesn't shy away from the fact that fighting against the People's Republic of China is an uphill battle, but she knows it's a fight worth engaging in. Invisible Nation is a battle cry and powerful act of defiance that mirrors the threat of democracy everywhere. It's an urgent and necessary viewing for all. Invisible Nation is in select theaters beginning May 31, 2024. •





The Inheritance Games by Jennifer Lynn Barnes is a great YA mystery that focuses on Avery Grambs and her adventures revolving around The Hawthorne House. It went viral on Tik Tok and became an overnight best seller. I chose it because many of the students kept checking it out and told me I need to read it. It is the first book in a series of four, and the fifth book comes out this November. The Inheritance Games takes place in Texas and is about Avery Grambs. She's just surviving high school and planning for a better future in Connecticut when she discovers that she inherited a fortune from Tobias Hawthorne worth forty-six point two billion dollars. All she has to do is live in the

house for a year and survive living with the vengeful disinherited Hawthorne heirs. Avery must learn to get along with the other occupants of the house: four half-brothers, Nash, Grayson, Jameson and Xander Hawthorne, their mother Skye Hawthorrne and their aunt Zara Hawthorne-Calligaris. The book is filled with many puzzles and mysteries, and The Hawthorne House is in the center of it all.

Hawthorne House reminds me very much of the house in the movies Knives Out and Clue, except it is on a much bigger scale. It is filled with secret passageways, many rooms and many hidden devices and gadgets. Tobias Hawthorne loved to design and solve mysteries and riddles and taught his grandsons how to do the same. Every room bears Tobias Hawthorne's love of puzzles, riddles and codes. When Avery inherits the house, she also inherits a mystery. Why did Tobias Hawthorne leave her his fortune? She's not related to him and doesn't remember ever having met him. Avery tries to solve the

Insurance Expert Offers Tips to Avoid Insurance Fraud

(BPT) - While inflation continues to drive up home and auto insurance costs, fraud is a hidden culprit contributing to the hikes. Whether you're an actual victim of insurance fraud or simply an active policyholder, the reality is that insurance fraud impacts everyone. And as the frequency and complexity of fraudulent activities increase, so does the cost of insurance for all policyholders.

What exactly is insurance fraud? It's a deliberately deceptive act with the goal of receiving a wrongful payout from an insurance process. It can be committed by applicants, policyholders, third parties or even the insurance providers themselves - and it affects virtually every type of insurance including auto and homeowners.

"The total cost of insurance fraud for non-health insurance is estimated to be more than \$40 billion per year. To put that into perspective, insurance fraud costs the average U.S. family between \$400 and \$700 per year in the form of increased premiums," said Steve Wang, Manager, Divisional Claims/Head of Special Investigations Unit at Mercury Insurance

Insurance fraud is committed in various ways, but the main offenses include fraudulent claims, application fraud and premium fraud. Of these, fraudulent claims occur most frequently, which involve offenders filing false or exaggerated claims to receive benefits they are not entitled to. For example, a policyholder may intentionally cause property damage in order to file a claim.

"There are several common schemes consumers should be aware of. Staged auto accidents, adding damage to vehicles after a loss and switching drivers on accident reports are a few of the most prevalent scams. Additionally, there are crime rings that specialize in 'slip and fall' schemes, which involve fake injuries and false claims," said Wang. "Making our job even more difficult is the fact that today's scammers are technologically savvy and have access to sophisticated equipment.

"They routinely produce fake medical records, duplicate checks, and false identifications and business licenses. To maintain an advantage, we are constantly working to stay ahead of the technological curve," continued Wang.

Given the widespread ramifications of insurance fraud, consumers may be wondering what they can do to help combat it. According to Wang, if consumers aren't looking for insurance fraud, they won't find it. "I always tell people to document suspicious activity and incidents. When it comes to cracking these cases, the devil is in the details," he added.

Here are some other tips that consumers should be aware of:

- When looking at policies, verify the insurance company: Only buy from authorized companies and agents. Unauthorized insurance operations are illegal and policyholders are unprotected should the company go bankrupt. In California, consumers can verify this information here: https://www.insurance.ca.gov/0150-seniors/0200beforebuy/CheckInsCo.cfm. Know that if the price quoted sounds too good to be true, it probably is. Low premiums are great, but not if the insurer is unable to cover a claim.
- Fill out the application carefully: Never sign blank forms or blank applications. Incor-

rect, incomplete or false information on an application can jeopardize insurance coverage. It is a crime to supply false information on an insurance application or claim.

- Involved in an accident? Call the police: Always call the police and document unusual circumstances or activities. Gather as much information as possible at the scene of the
- Maintain detailed records: This includes bills for collision repairs, home/property repairs and medical services. Keep copies of all insurance records, including copies of all premium payments.
- Be vigilant with billing: Watch for double billing or unexplained charges for any service received as part of an insurance claim. Avoid paying for premiums in cash and opt for checks or online payments.

When suspicious activity is observed, regardless of insurance provider, Wang urges witnesses to alert the SIU and to contact law enforcement by calling 800-835-6422 or reporting the incident online: https://www.nicb.org/how-we-help/report-fraud.



Film Review

The Jungle Book Dazzles in CGI Animation for a New Generation

It's a weird thing, to be old enough to feel nostalgia for one's own childhood. As the first wave of this millennial generation, and a child of the 90s, I am part of the last generation of people to have watched our movies on VHS cassette. One of those movies amongst a collection of other classic Disney animated films, is the 1967 version of, *The Jungle Book*. The 2015 remake of the same name, *The Jungle Book* (now streaming on Disney+), brings to the screen the same heart-warming story as the 1967 version, but in dazzling and brilliantly rendered CGI animation.

Mowgli, played by newcomer Neel Sethi, is the only human onscreen for the entirety of the movie (again, this film should technically be considered an animated film), and gives the sort of school-play performance. As Mowgli's protective panther Bagheera, who finds and watches over the young child, Ben Kingsley is strong and eloquent with his English dialect, narrating our way in to this new world. 

For another funny romp, try Corey Tabor's latest, Fox *Has a Problem*. Out of the box hero, Fox has a problem. He tries out solution







him – permanently – from the jungle. When young Mowgli decides, for the betterment of his family and the rest of the jungle, to leave his wolf family behind, including his mother Raksha (Lupita Nyong'o, Star Wars: The Force Awakens) and father Akela (Giancarlo Esposito, Breaking Bad), he meets the rest of the iconic Jungle Book characters. Credit the film for understanding and playing to all of the characters (and actors) strengths, for the movie blossoms anew in fun in the second act when a lone Mowgli meets his bear pal Baloo, the ever-hilarious Bill Murray.

Murray as Baloo is a delight, and from this point forward, it felt as though the older-aged skewing audience took equal-to-more delight in seeing the lovable bear crack so casually wise as only Murray can.

And yes, the iconic songs make the cut here, (Murray's splashy rendition of "The Bare Necessities" feels like it was performed by

Disneyland's very own New Orleans Square jazz band) but in good restraint. The movie weaves the songs naturally into the story that's in place, meaning no show-stopping musical numbers here, but that serves the feeling of being a movie all the same. This extends to the other Jungle Book hit "I Wanna Be Like You," sung by the legendary Christopher Walken, as King Louie gets a massive wide-eyed character redesign akin to a slightly more friendly King Kong – slightly.

The Jungle Book is a through and through adaptation, almost exact copy and paste of the hand-drawn version, and yet it still feels plumb new, every moment of it captivating and eliciting childlike wonder from all. Director Jon Favreau (Iron Man) whips up a new animated experience for a new generation of kids. Your kids' kids adaptation will most likely be the Virtual-Reality experience, but for now, the film impresses with its use of digital animation, along with the magic that made it so great those simple, bare necessities. •
