## LAX CEO Justin Erbacci Discusses Airport Plans Ahead of the 2028 Olympics

Tired of LAX traffic congestion? CEO of Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) Justin Erbacci shares plans for a streamlined LAX ahead of the 2028 Olympics, as well as his experience managing an airport during a global pandemic.

Erbacci's days are long and filled with everything from Covid related upkeep to ground communication with flights to construction projects underway and in development.

"[The day] starts early and goes long," he laughs, trying to explain his day-to-day work. Erbacci was appointed interim CEO of LAWA in January of 2020, just before California went into lockdown because of the virus. Before that, he worked as the Chief Operations Officer, and he was officially appointed full-time CEO status in June of last year.

LAWA encompasses LAX, Van Nuys airport, and an aviation-related property in Palmdale. In order to operate a major airport, there are three major entities involved: the airport operator (in this case, LAWA), commercial air carriers and aviation businesses, and federal agencies like the Department of Homeland Security and the Department of Transportation.

With one of the largest metropolitan hubs in the world, including travel from around the globe, stepping into this leadership role would prove a challenge at any time for anyone. But for Erbacci, he took over leadership with all that entails in the wake of travel and airports becoming a significant point of focus associated with medical risks.

With the threat of Covid looming large, Erbacci didn't miss a beat. Taking federal guidance and safety precautions into consideration, he created a Covid task force to handle everything from implementing new touchless technologies all over the facility to implementing new cleaning standards and training to keep every employee up to date and on the same page. This includes things like new UV light sterilized handrails on escalators and buttons on elevators. Many normal airport functions moved over to a format usable on a mobile phone. Erbacci worked in his office every day of the pandemic to ensure the safety of all essential workers still required to go to the airport and begin working on a health and recovery plan for the future.

As for what's going on as we begin to exit the pandemic, some exciting new projects are underway. Erbacci explains some of the new plans he's approved and is developing with the LAWA team.

"We have a \$14.5 billion improvement program going on," he says. The project he is most excited about is the construction of a people mover train that will transport travelers to and from the airport and all terminals, effectively mitigating the need for cars to be in the center of the airport.

The new people mover train will have three stations within the airport: a west stop near the Bradley International Terminal, a Central Terminal stop, and the third stop between terminals 1 and 7. From here, the train will continue eastward to a stop at an intermodal transportation facility. This will be a remote parking lot with about 4,300



Justin Erbacci, CEO of Los Angeles World Airports. spaces that will allow for parking, as well as ride pickups and drop-offs.

Continuing east, the people mover train will intersect with the Crenshaw metro line, allowing access by metro to the airport. Finally, the last station will be at the largest consolidated rental car facility in the United States.

"It will be the second-largest cement structure in the United States, second only to the Pentagon," says Erbacci. The idea with all of this is that all rental car transactions will happen at this final station, residents will have an easier time accessing the airport sans car via the metro, and all cars and hotel shuttles can mostly use the remote parking lot, where guests can then enter the airport by train. With all of these measures, the flow of travel through LAX will be much more ergonomic for a city of this size.

## Film Review

### 'Censor' is Vintage Horror Fun For the VHS Era

Before going into the fun new horror film *Censor*, you should know what a "video nasty" is. A colloquial term coined in the United Kingdom in the 1980s "video nasties" were films distributed on video cassettes that were criticized for their violent content by the press and various religious organizations. In her directorial debut, Prano Bailey-Bond puts these graphic films at the center of the story about a film censor (Niamh Algar) who, after viewing a strangely familiar video

workplace and in danger, which Algar is as equally game for the whole time.

For a film that is so knowledgeable about video nasties and the fun that's had in staging violence in film, though, *Censor's* disturbances are aimed at the more heady paranoia of mental instability rather than blood-spurting horror sequences. There are only one or two jump scares and a few moments of grisly slasher fun, all handled rather mildly. I wonder if *Censor* had allowed itself to indulge in the genre's more bloody mayhem what further

nasty, sets out to solve the past mystery of her sister's disappearance and embarks on a quest that dissolves the line between fiction and reality.

While operating within the familiarities of the horror genre that fans will hope for, Prano Bailey-Bond also flexes her deeper knowledge and appreciation of the genre with the plot's central connection to video nasties. The fun that Bailey-Bond brings to the screen with the video nasties' campy kills, titles, and even videocassette jackets are going to be some of the film's most memorable moments. And on a more personal level, it's clear that Bailey-Bond is expressing her voice through the central character Enid (Niamh Algar), a young and beautiful woman who is more interested in losing herself in her career of grisly fantasy than following a more traditional life path. *Censor* has a strong and empowering female perspective about being a woman both in the

fun could have been had within this set-up.

*Censor* actually ends up hitting on the softer side in terms of an all-out gorefest. However, the deeper human truth that Bailey-Bond expresses here is even more terrifying in its relatability. It's telling that after her sister goes missing during childhood, Enid grows up to become a film censor, choosing to submerge herself in such gruesome and violent content, striving to single-handedly extricate the most horrific moments from the public's (and specifically children's) consumption. But when a particular video nasty becomes the center of a national headline for an inspired real-life murder, Enid is left shaken, and the trauma of her horrific past haunts her again. Bailey-Bond shows the unconscious ways that we try to stave off events that are too hard to make sense of in a disturbing moment and what worlds we then create for ourselves to cope. In asking the audience

### Second Vaccination Site at LAX

LAX has added a second COVID-19 Vaccination Site at Terminal 1 Extension. On Tuesday, LAX officials announced the addition of a second site where guests can receive COVID-19 vaccinations free of charge. The new site is located on the Lower/Arrivals level of the new Terminal 1 extension on its far west end. Both vaccination clinics are open 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and currently offer

one-dose vaccinations from Johnson & Johnson to anyone age 18 or older. Vaccinations are administered by the Los Angeles Fire Department and are available without appointments. There is no cost for the vaccine and no proof of insurance is required. The Johnson & Johnson vaccine requires only one dose, so those who receive it will be considered fully vaccinated two weeks after receiving the shot.

### Wells Fargo awards

#### \$1.25 million grant to Together for L.A.

In addition to the train, Erbacci is working on the renovation of terminals, improvements to the airfield to alleviate congestion experienced on the ground, and adding more gates and a new concourse. A new elevated roadway system is also underway to replace the current system of how cars enter the central terminal, easing traffic on nearby streets and improving circulation in and out of the airport.

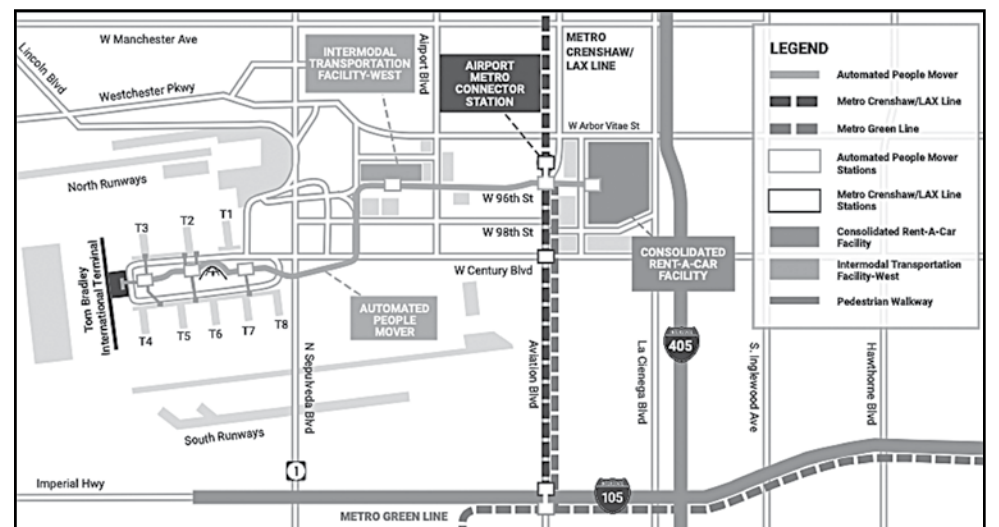
As Erbacci looks to the future, these projects are anticipated to be completed in total by 2023. Though he says these changes would have happened regardless of the upcoming Olympics, he says that he does want to make a good impression as athletes from all over the globe enter our city, which these new airport modifications will help provide. His team has set forth an ambitious sustainability plan with the goal of being carbon neutral by 2045. Through all of these goals, Erbacci makes it

clear that inclusion is a priority, making sure that diverse groups and companies have the chance to participate in these ongoing plans.

With participation in mind, Erbacci relates his desire to be a good neighbor to El Segundo. With all these plans being set forth, he is making sure the community has time to review them and reach out with any questions, concerns, or suggestions. Feedback to local elected representatives will make it on his desk, and he encourages all local residents to be informed.

Erbacci describes a sense of honor and privilege in his role and focuses on serving travelers the best experience possible.

"My personal goals are those for the airport... We want to make sure that we are providing a world-class airport for the citizens of Los Angeles and those who are coming to Los Angeles." •

## Your Neighborhood Therapist

Dear Neighborhood Therapist,

I have just graduated from college and now I'm expected to embark on a "career." I did some internships, and I did well, but I cannot seem to muster that passion for the business I was in that some of my colleagues do. It's not that I mind paying my dues or working hard. It's that I look at the people who are mid-career and I think, "I don't want to do that." I don't want to spend the next 15 years of my life dedicated to this work just so that I can get to where they are, which is a place I don't want to be. It doesn't seem worth it to me, and it's incredibly depressing.

Dear Frustrated Recent Grad,

I'm sure there is a school of thought that would say, "Hey, it's rough out there. Life isn't easy. Toughen up and get used to it." The thinking behind this is most likely something like, "Sure, it stinks, but it stinks for all of us, so don't think you are better than anyone else, or special."

I don't think that's a very helpful sentiment.

It's like saying that because kids get too much vacation, adults should be happy they don't get enough. Of course you're not better than anyone else, but you don't have to like our system, which is roughly like this:

In school, we see continual progress. All you have to do is pass and you are "promoted" to the next grade. The grade levels keep

going up, and then you have a big celebration. (And we should celebrate. School is hard. It's a big achievement to get through it.) But while everyone who passes gets to graduate, not everyone who does their job well gets to constantly move up and eventually be CEO. Of course not everyone is going to get promoted, so competition heats up. There just isn't room for everyone at the top of any organization, and so many people compete for it.

Why we protect our kids from the "real world" until we toss them head first into it is a topic for another time, but there is no question that the transition from the academic to the working world can cause real whiplash. Especially if you think you may have been condemned to years of misery in a profession you can't stand, it does truly feel like losing a lot of freedom. So how do you avoid this fate if you don't even know what you "want" yet out of your working life?

First, give yourself some more time. Just because you haven't seen a job that appeals to you doesn't mean a good life doesn't exist. You may not have been exposed to people who share your concerns, so how could you expect to have figured it out yet all on your own?

In the meantime, do something - anything - that helps provide a service that people need or enjoy. Maybe it's picking up trash. Maybe it's selling warm bread in the morning, or

Also, don't be the bad guy. Don't market cigarettes to teens. Don't convince people who are struggling to take on more debt. Don't be a patent troll. Don't help billionaires hide their money.

Your frustration that you have not seen better options or possibilities for life sounds very reasonable. If you don't want to be part of a rat race, finding those other options and possibilities means that you have some extra work cut out for you. This isn't a bad thing.

It is just a harder path, but perhaps one with better views along the way.

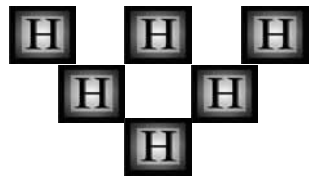

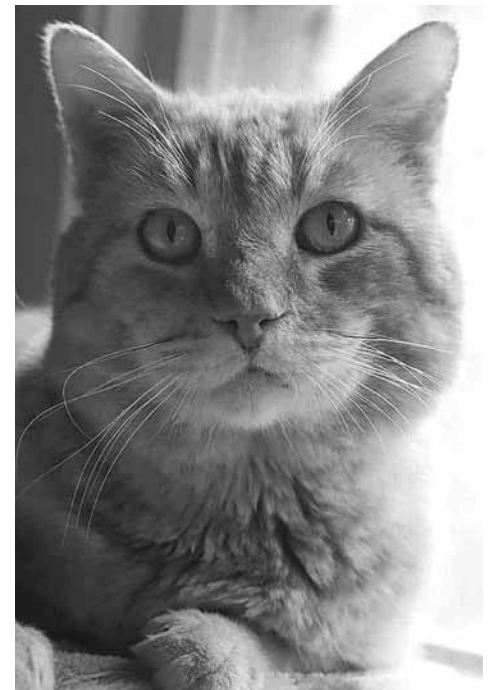
