"And, what do you do, just watch the customers?"

"I don't watch. I might check email, or a call comes in, or relax for a few minutes.

The people at the store often are very interesting, nice to see all the diversity, and, you know, things going on at the store itself are of interest."

"So, let me get this straight: Costco, the store in Hawthorne, the Costco store, that's your happy place? Incredible because you are serious, aren't you?"

"It is one of my happy places. You can nosh. Sometimes they have samples, or you can get something from the food court. There are a lot of items to look at and possibly buy, and the atmosphere in the store is upbeat.

Yes, it is one of my go-to happy places. If it's been a bad day, or if I need a break, or to clear my head a bit, going there works for me. What can I say?"

"I think you should be glad they don't charge admission!"

"Hey, we pay a yearly membership, but come to think of it, we do have a Costco cash-back card, so that's another plus."

My friend quizzing me got me to ruminating. So, I looked up the definition of a "happy place," and here is what I found: A location, activity, memory, or interest that brings one happiness. Ok, that's simple enough.

The Hawthorne Costco store opened in December 2000. It has a gas station, tire service center, pharmacy, optical department, hearing aids, and a food court (not to mention all the merchandise). From birthday cakes to flowers, clothes to diapers. Vitamins to paper towels.

The very first Costco was opened back in

1976, but the name then was Price Club. In fact, it was located in a converted airplane hangar in San Diego and initially only served small businesses. Once the company began to serve non-business members as well, the growth in the warehouse club industry was on the move.

The first actual location, named Costco, was opened in Seattle, Washington, in 1983, forty years ago. Did you know Costco is the first company to go from zero to \$3 billion in sales in less than six years? As of 2022, Costco was the fifth largest retailer in the world and ranked number 11 on the Fortune 500 of United States corporations by total revenue. In fact, Costco has over 300,000 full and part-time employees worldwide. As of just this past May, Costco had at least 124 million members. And, in the midst of that 124 million folks... is little ol' me.

Happy me when I visit the Hawthorne Costco store, when I go up and around the aisles. Even when, not so infrequently, I forget where I left my shopping cart.

The staff seems actively engaged. They also seem happy. I have read that Costco employees are treated well. I don't know that I can say there is a Costco family among the personnel, but have you gone to a store and seen glum faces among those working there? I have not. Believe me; I have looked!

It is not, however, a lifelong dream for me to visit every Costco store all around the globe. For one thing, there are over 855 warehouses, spanning from the USA to China, Iceland to Sweden, Japan to Korea, and Taiwan to Australia. On second thought, that might be kind of fun! (Note to self: Propose a Costco world tour, and offer to be the leader, for a small fee, of course.)

Bottom line, there is a calm at the Hawthorne store, a comfort zone, a familiarity. It is welcoming. I have never had a tiff with anyone, been treated discourteously, or even

heard an angry word. Some vendors hock their wares and encourage me to come forward, try a taste, or consider a device, or listen to the history of their product. If I need something, I can always ask.

Kids sometimes ride in the shopping carts. On occasion, someone has a dog alongside. Foreign languages are not uncommon, as shoppers come from many places.

Speaking of which, some of my in-laws are from Asia. Last time they visited here for two weeks, we went to the Hawthorne store three times. They found a lot of items to bring home. They had smiles on their faces. We even made a mess eating slices of pizza in the food court.

Reminds me that a friend of mine loves golfing, not because he is good at it. Instead, he describes it as a buffer zone and tells me: "I forget about most everything else for a while. The world at large takes a back seat. Golf is

Film Review

Oppenheimer is a Visually Spectacular, Towering Epic

At a time when the future of movie theaters continues to grow more unstable and uncertain, every new film from Christopher Nolan—who intends for his films to be seen on the biggest screens possible—is a moment that cinephiles should celebrate. I saw *Oppenheimer* in its premiere format: at Hollywood's TCL Chinese Theater projected

on 70mm IMAX film. It is, of course, nothing short of visually spectacular. *Oppenheimer* is a towering, magnificently made epic that showcases the very best of cinema's power.

Nolan's first biopic tells the story of the father of the atomic bomb, J. Robert Oppenheimer, aka "the most important man in history" as the film quite literally states. In classic Nolan fashion, there are multiple timelines that make up the film. There's "Fission," in which we are introduced to the brilliant theoretical physicist (Cillian Murphy) and see how his expertise in atomic energy leads to him being called upon by the U.S. military to lead a secret project to weaponize the explosive power of the atom, as fascism and communism threaten the U.S. amid world war. And then there's a timeline labeled "Fusion," which takes place at a later, post-war time, in which Oppenheimer must defend his actions and character from a government that has turned on him and is eager to strip him of his celebrity, credibility, and power.

The leaps between timelines also come with visual format changes. Shot by longtime Nolan cinematographer Hoyte van Hoytema, we see Oppenheimer's rise and the development of the a-bomb at Los Alamos, New Mexico, presented in color, while the courtroom sequences featuring Lewis Strauss (Robert Downey Jr.)—the hopeful Presidential Cabinet Member trying to discredit Oppenheimer—is presented in black and white. The film further cuts between fullscreen and widescreen sizes, depending on IMAX-specific sequences (which may even distract audiences).

Unfortunately, the emotional toll that should be the film's most fascinating element is not something that Nolan dives into fully. Nolan's introspective storytelling has always had trouble meeting the level of his intellect. *Oppenheimer* is both an incredibly accomplished film but also short-sighted in failing to show the emotional toll that Oppenheimer felt after its use. While Nolan experiments with surrealistic flourishes that surprised me, the film doesn't fully wish to penetrate into Oppy's brilliant, tortured mind that a man who acknowledges himself as "becoming death, destroyer of worlds" would really feel.

The fact that *Oppenheimer* has opened with a massive debut is really something to celebrate, both for theaters and cinema on the whole. But although the film depicts the nail-biting development of the atomic bomb with a grand vision—one that I'll always remember where I was when I saw it—I think that after the dust settles, I'll still be left wondering what the emotional fallout was for this brilliant, lonely destroyer of worlds.

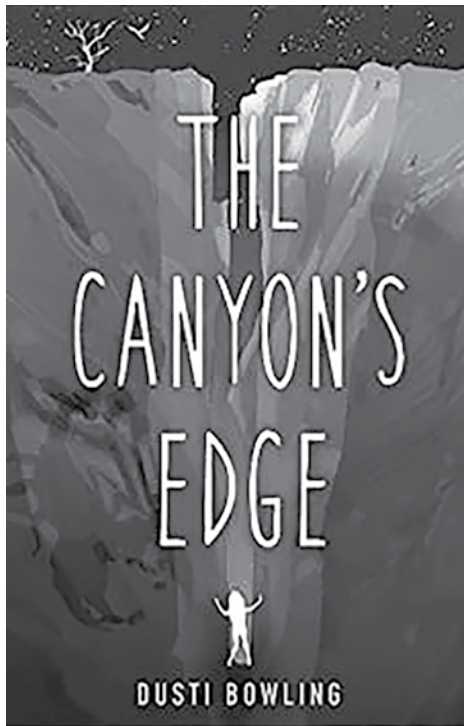
Check It Out

On the day of Nora's birthday, one year ago, her family's celebration dinner at a local restaurant suddenly turns into a horrific nightmare when a random shooting occurs.

As she wakes up on the day of her birthday a year later it is to a new normal. Another year without her mom, another birthday, another day of just her and her dad and his rules. During

the past year her father has changed. Nora is no longer in school and slowly the bright big world Nora used to know has become one filled with her father's fears. They no longer go to places that are populated which is why today, on Nora's birthday, her father has chosen to hike a canyon in Arizona. It isn't very far from where they live, and her father knows it is not populated so it will be "safe."

When they begin the hike, early in the morning, Nora is understandably processing what

happened a year ago. Asking herself "what if" questions when the day takes a turn. An unexpected flash flood hits the canyon and Nora is now alone, watching helplessly as her father washes away. No idea where her father is, if he is alive or dead. She is hungry, thirsty, suffering from exposure to heat and being chased by her worst fears. She sets out to find help and hopefully her father and along the way processes that horrible day, her present circumstances and looks closely at her inner self.

Dusti Bowling uses novel-in-verse to take the reader on a heartfelt journey through grief, resilience and courage. Taking extremely hard topics; PTSD, internal fears, grief and gun violence and handling them with grace; validating feelings and giving reassurance.

Living a Quality of Life with Parkinsons

I never know what to expect when answering a call from an unknown number. Lately, however, a surprising number of phone conversations involve the caller needing help with their loved one diagnosed with Parkinson's disease. In some cases, the diagnosis is recent. In most cases, the call is a desperate cry for help after years of caring for their loved one, and that care is becoming more challenging to provide alone.

While Parkinson's can be a devastating diagnosis, I remind families the person with the disease can and should enjoy their remaining days with respect and dignity. Unlike Alzheimer's disease, for which the average life expectancy is a handful of years post-diagnosis, a diagnosis of Parkinson's does not significantly affect a person's life expectancy. This difference is significant for families who need to plan for a lifetime of care.

When I discuss Parkinson's and how to proactively engage affected loved ones, I usually point out differences from Alzheimer's disease, which is far more common. Both are degenerative diseases of the brain, including brain-related symptoms like confusion and memory problems. However, Parkinson's is usually diagnosed based on its primary symptoms involving movement: a hand, arm, or leg tremor; slowed movements; decreased facial expression; balance and coordination issues; and muscle stiffness. Parkinson's also affects more men than women. As the disease progresses, other symptoms may develop, including constipation or urinary issues, skin problems, poor sleep, and difficulty chewing, swallowing, or speaking.

No matter how Parkinson's presents, however, we must always focus on quality of life. Too often, families want to isolate their

loved ones, with devastating consequences. Depression is another common symptom of Parkinson's. We need to work to bring the family closer, not more distant. Assuring our loved ones are important to us and helping them maintain a sense of purpose can help avoid depression and withdrawal.

In short, we need to focus on our loved ones, not the disease.

Because Parkinson's primarily affects movement, especially in the early stages, our loved ones must continue active daily activities like oral hygiene, bathing, and toileting for as long as possible to help maintain their dignity and self-worth. We can help with or modify these activities as the disease progresses and abilities degrade. We need to support a person with Parkinson's by allowing them to continue to do things, not taking something away.

For those caring for a loved one with Parkinson's disease, I recommend low-stress activities that encourage movement while being sensitive to diminished ability. Boxing is one activity clinically proven to help manage some symptoms of Parkinson's, inspiring a non-contact fitness program designed specifically for people with Parkinson's disease. I also recommend any daily routine with movement to improve mobility, such as walking, sensory gardening, tossing a ball, sinking putts on a putting green, Tai Chi or yoga, dancing, marching to music, or using stationary pedal exercisers.

If you are overwhelmed caring for your loved one, find a local support group to share and learn from others facing similar challenges. 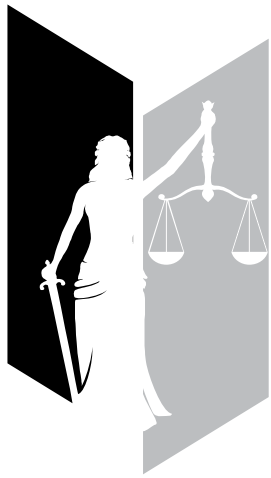

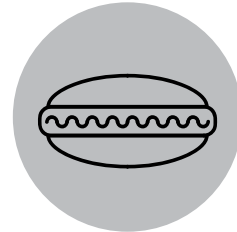

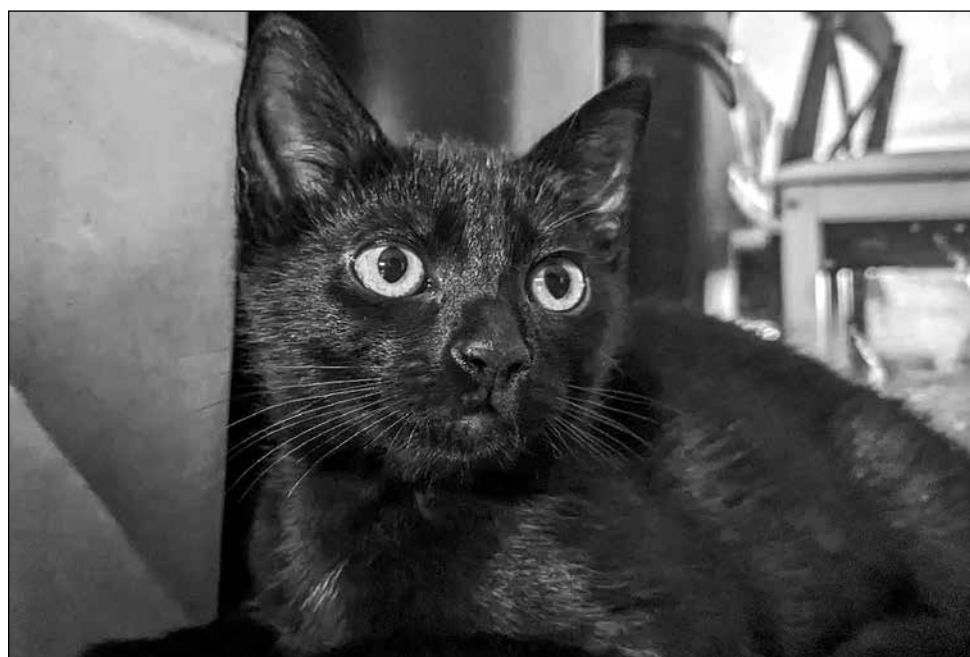
