He Can Fix Computers (and Play Hockey!)

What does hockey and computer technology have in common? There must be some connection. Come on, there must be!

Andrew Dershimer also has another passion, another environment, as it were, another tenacity and agility. He is the go-to person for many folks when something is wrong with their computer, printer, laptop, or some combination thereof.

"My dad is a retired teacher. My mom does what I do, but on quite a larger scale. She manages projects that involve IT repair for businesses. That may be where my interest in computers comes from, at least in part, but what I most remember is that my dad brought home a computer when I was about eleven. Teachers like my dad were given a computer to use at home. Well, I was just immediately interested in it and, of course, wanted to play all sorts of games there."

The determined work that Andrew handles will include, among other troubleshooting, setting up a computer, connecting it, and making sure the printer works; or transferring what is on one computer to the replacement; or, often having to investigate and figure out what to do about problems that some (probably many) are just not able to resolve; or, setting up a bank of computers for a company.

One incident: My office computer worked perfectly fine, but when printing, there were spaces between letters in various words, and the end of a sentence would be followed by a space or two before the period or other punctuation. It made reading letters and columns very difficult and was not at all professional looking. I called Andrew, who came over on his trusty motorcycle. It was very quiet for a while. It took him about 40 minutes to figure out what was causing the problem. He went through several steps to check the computer to see if that would direct him to the problem, and even watched a video online. Turns out it was related to the font that I was using. For some reason, the particular size and style of the font was causing a problem with the software program. The bottom line, he fixed it. He solved the Rubik's Cube. All good. "I am presently working with more elderly people. I think of myself as a kind of 'rent a grandkid.' One client is 95, on the computer a lot, and orders her groceries online, but her printer would not print. I was there for two hours: installed, reinstalled, ran

troubleshooters, did all the basics, and finally decided to google it. Found similar issues where someone had a printer that stopped working when Microsoft Explorer was updated. I uninstalled her version of Microsoft Explorer, and voila, all was fine. But, sometimes, to get to that point, to find the fix, to solve the issue, you have to be equally patient and determined."

Interestingly, Andrew was not so keen on school. That said, he was just starting at Hawthorne High when he applied to California State University, Los Angeles. There was a program for advanced and gifted kids. Even so, that step ultimately was not his cup of tea either. You can say he is a self-learner. He has his own wheels, as it were.

"One thing about working with computers, being a computer nerd, I guess, is you aren't likely to get physically injured. Playing hockey, on the other hand... There, I have

Film Review

Bottoms is an Edgy, Back to School Comedy That Earns an A+

As the credits rolled at the end of *Shiva Baby* back in 2021, I contemplated an immediate re-watch. I didn't want the good times to end. This progressive, cool girl comedy that filmmaker Emma Seligman so effortlessly brings to life (in her directorial debut, no less) was the type of movie that spoke to me, and I wanted more of it! Luckily, her sophomore feature, *Bottoms*, lives up to the hype and is now playing in select theaters including AMC and Alamo Drafthouse LA.

Rachel Sennott (*The Idol*, *Bodies Bodies*, *Bodies*) and Ayo Edebiri (*The Bear*) play PJ and Josie, best friends about to enter into another dreadful year of high school as the "weird girls". Both proudly queer and frustrated with the local dating scene, the girls devise an unconventional idea to start a school-sponsored fight club in an attempt to get close to Isabel (Havana Rose Liu) and Brittany (Kaia Gerber), the hot cheerleaders

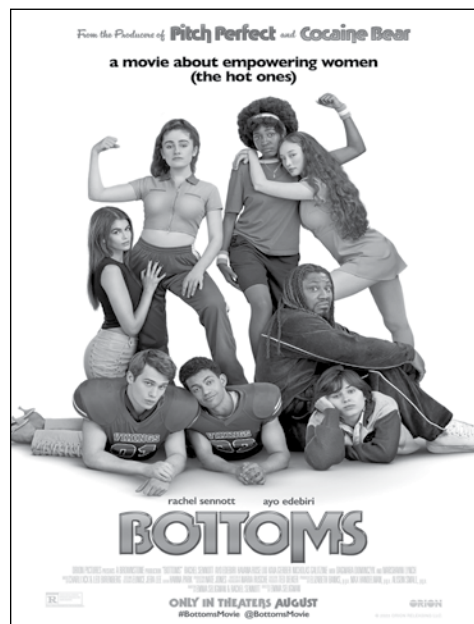
teenagers they really are.

There are many factors that can be attributed to the success of *Bottoms*, especially the quick-witted and sharp banter between Sennott and Edebiri. Together they are magnetic, exuding this instant familiarity that draws us in and doesn't let us go. Their comedic timing is spot-on and the dialogue delivery hits every time. The script, co-written by 28-year-old Seligman and 27-year-old Sennott, is the right amount of self-aware and gut-punch funny. Subtle one-off comments said under the breath like "You don't care about feminism, your favorite show is *Entourage*", are some of the film's most hilarious moments.

Best of all, *Bottoms* evokes a sense of nostalgia for rom-coms of the past. Imagine *Superbad*, *Bring It On*, and *American Pie* told through the lens of flamboyant high school girls. Adding to the sense of female empowerment is seeing how many women contributed to the making of *Bottoms* behind the scenes and leading departments such as cinematography (Maria Rusche), editing (Hanna Park), casting (Maribeth Fox), and art direction (Michelle Jones).

Bottoms is a film for the girls, for the alt-*Barbie* crowd. A fierce soundtrack – which includes a perfectly-placed Avril Lavigne "Complicated" sync – and an original score by Leo Birenberg and Charli XCX is the perfect companion to the film's fast-paced, frenetic energy. It's definitely worth staying through the entire film so you don't miss the bloopers and outtakes that are sprinkled throughout the end credits. If you're looking for an edgy, back to school rom-com, make sure *Bottoms* is on the top of your watchlist.

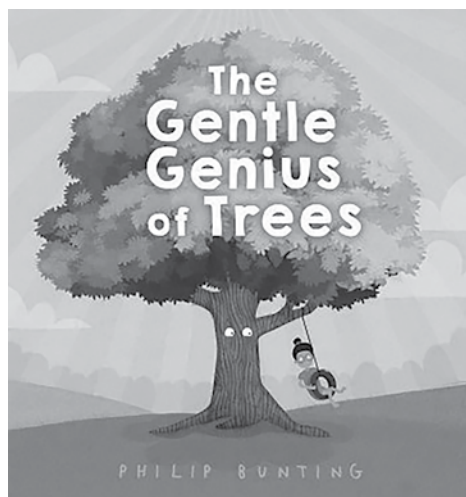

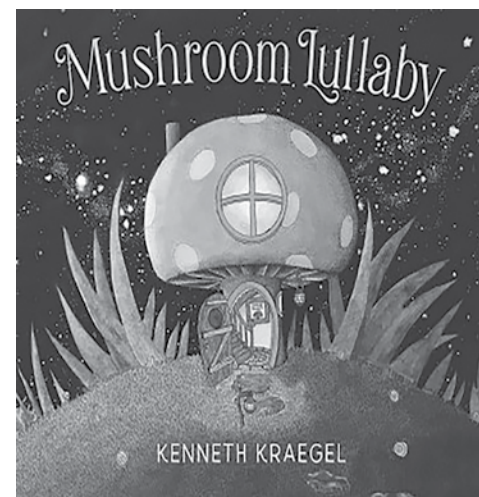
Early Reader Roundup

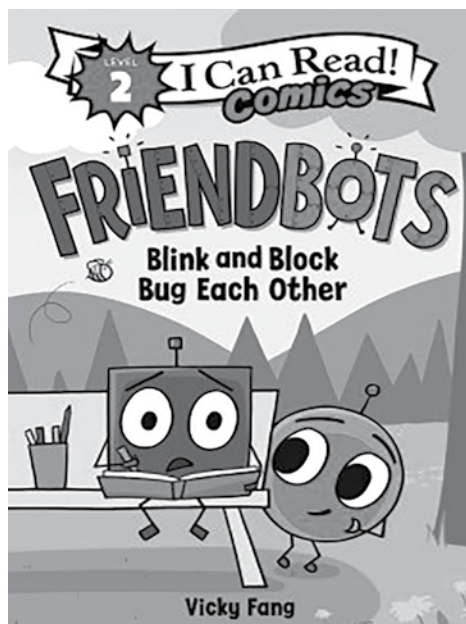

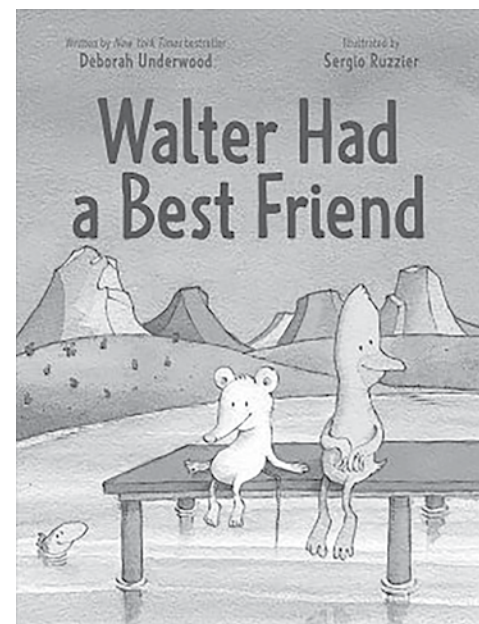

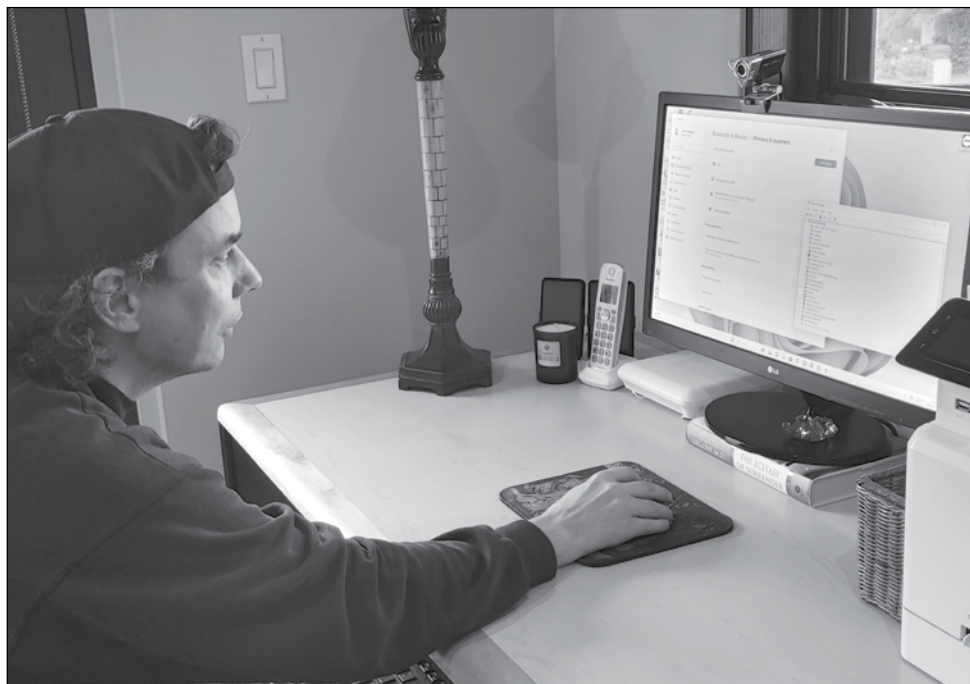
Well, I sure hope Andrew stays safe. I am not trying to convince him to stop playing ice
