The Other Epidemic

Here in the United States, a new type of war on drugs has begun. Never before, even with the lethality of the substances already on the market, has there been something as deadly as fentanyl. According to the CDC, between 2019 and 2021, opioid overdose deaths have doubled, and fentanyl accounted for 83%. In the same study, in 2021, the most recent full year of data available, nearly 6000 Californians died from a fentanyl overdose - a tragedy each and every one of them. There is, however, a newly affected group of people whose deaths from the matter have begun to climb since 2019: children.

In a recent California State Assembly Joint information hearing meeting, Fentanyl deaths were marked at 81 tragic deaths in 2019. However, those numbers have skyrocketed to 230 adolescents and young adults ages 15-19 in just three short years. And perhaps, in a more tragic vein, they did not even know they had ingested it before they perished. These statistics are everywhere. According to the California Department of Public Health, non-fatal opioid overdoses have tripled in recent years, from 2018 to 2020, rising from 379 to 1,222. This sample group ranged from ages 10-19; in this same age range, opioid overdose fatalities rose 625%.

How is this happening? Within the last year, according to the Drug Enforcement Agency, there have been large swaths of rainbow-colored fentanyl tablets designed to attract younger Americans. Drug peddlers and manufacturers are creating new branding tactics and marketing strategies in order to develop a wider audience. DEA administrator Anne Milgram said in a 2022

interview, "Fentanyl pills and powder that come in a variety of bright colors, shapes, and sizes—is a deliberate effort by drug traffickers to drive addiction amongst kids and young adults." Predatory behavior on the most vulnerable population. With the direct marketing that has been observed, there have been instances all over the nation of things like Xanax and Marijuana vapor cartridges that have been laced with fentanyl and sold to children.

The opioid crisis is in full swing everywhere across the nation, but here in California, it has been presented as some of the worst of it. In response, the state government has implemented a new program called the Overdose Prevention Initiative, or OPI. The OPI was founded as a direct response to the problems that addicts and newcomers face daily in the dark and seedy underground of California's drug scene. Substances, all of them across the board, are being cut with this incredibly deadly drug.

With the OPI, other things have been put into place. The Campus Opioid Safety Act, which went into effect January 1st, 2023, aims to reduce opioid overdose by providing education and life-saving medication across every public college institution in California. The University of California system has been asked to respect this as well, but the law did not cover it. Through this act, every institution can receive, through federal funds, a life-saving dose of this miracle drug.


While this is a step in the right direction, the unfortunate reality is the effects of this crisis on children. According to the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Medicine, over two million children nationwide have a parent with an Opioid Use Disorder or have one themselves. If this current trend continues, there will be over four million children who have these issues by 2030. This crisis is growing at a fast rate, and policymakers are struggling to keep up with the issue. Although there is relief in many forms for people, unfortunately, this kind of help takes a very long time to trickle down to the people most affected by the crisis. Perhaps the most terrifying part is that no expressly written policy

or action has been taken to help children with this problem. There is a void of relief that exists in the public sphere to combat this issue. Unfortunately, Children across California are left in the dark now, and the problem is too complex to be solved with one piece of legislation. Never before in California have the rates of addiction to such a deadly substance been so high, and with such a risk for it to be laced into anything an adventurous youth may be interested in trying. There is no blanket of relief to pull over this blazing issue.

All we have with us are the strengths of communication, community, and education on the substance that has been ravaging families and neighborhoods since it first hit the scene just a few short years ago. There are resources if you or a loved one are struggling with addiction. Findtreatment.gov is a website designed for finding treatment centers tailored to individual needs. They can also be reached at 800-662-HELP.

Substance abuse has a tight grip on hundreds of thousands of people nationwide, many of whom are right here at home. These serious

Shiva Baby is a Cringe-Worthy Comedy **About Millenial Anxiety**

In Judaism, "sitting shiva" is the week-long mourning period that is observed following the passing of a first-degree relative. In Shiva Baby (streaming on Max and Apple TV+), a millennial undergrad feels the same sort of deep mourning, albeit over the current state of her young life. When Danielle (Rachel Sennott) returns home from NYU to attend a funeral, she knows that she's also entering the lion's den of an overbearing family. The equal parts eager and concerned "How are you?" triggers her anxieties of her uncertain future.

Shiva Baby is such a refreshing and enjoyable new comedy due to how totally authentic

This hilarious suffocating experience n is controlled by the entire filmmaking team: Hanna A. Park's measured and then energetic editing controls each new wave of discomfort wonderfully. Maria Rusche's cinematography captures the jam-packed nature of this house (building to a near-hallucinatory climax that reminded me of Rosemary's Baby). And of singular note, composer Ariel Marx's score is quite actually the thing that stands out that gives Shiva Baby its anxiety-inducing identity, an off-beat tension that reminded me of Jonny Greenwood's score for Punch Drunk Love. All elements swirl to make for a cringe-worthy setting, which is pretty fun to see this all-

the characters and situations all feel. It's not altogether surprising, given that the film is based on the experiences and observations from writer and director Emma Seligman's own life, here making her directorial debut. Seligman's shrewd observations of the Jewish culture along with a new millennial identity make for a wonderfully cringe-worthy but very real culture clash. From the specificity of detail in the shiva setting and the hilarious characters who attend it, down to its stark portrayal of young people owning their newfound sexualities, Shiva Baby is the type of equal-parts defiant and personal filmmaking that make for the best kind of directorial debuts.

Shiva Baby smartly uses its single setting location to bring many elements of filmmaking together to control its tone-that being a cringeworthy one every truth that Danielle skirts only raise the stakes to becoming a pressure cooker of discomfort (halfway through the film when she bursts out of the house to get air, we are desperately grateful for it as well).


Check It Out

The Best Cook in the World by Rick Bragg

Looking for a new audiobook to listen to during my commute to the library, I browsed our collection of books on CD. My eye landed on The Best Cook in the World. I had previously listened to several books by food writer Ruth Reichl ... I decided to take a chance on it. I am so glad that I did!

I listened to Rick Bragg's easy Southern drawl recalling his mother's exceptional ability to build satisfying meals despite their poor circumstances during his childhood. Subtitled 'Tales from My Momma's Table' gives the

listener an idea, but recipes are not the main event here. Author Bragg delves into his family history, intertwining Southern lore and home cooking, making the listener alternately laugh uproariously, wonder about the authenticity of those anecdotes and then, suddenly become tearful during an especially heart-tugging moment. Using colorful language that enhances mood, much of his recreations of long-ago stories are nothing less than poetic.

First conceived as a means to preserve his mother's recipes (she never read a cookbook nor did she ever write anything down herself), this project transformed into a collection of urban legends and possibly true reminiscences passed down since before the Civil War. Beginning with the legend of The Mean Old Man (Bragg's own great grandfather "Jimmy Jim"), who was on the lam when his son Charlie begged him to come home to teach his new bride Ava how to cook before he "starved to death."

Bragg details what life was like for plain folks in dire straits before, during and after the Depression in the wilds of northeastern Alabama and northwestern Georgia, in particular. People grew their own food and raised animals for slaughter. During harder times, they fished and hunted what they could find and added to their meager meals by foraging in the woods. There's a memorable account of Bragg's mother reciting her preparations for "poke salet" a wild (and toxic!) plant that proliferates in the South, especially along country roads and ditches. This "delicacy" should only be harvested at a certain time of the year, washed many times, cooked several more times... well, it's quite an undertaking.

Larger than life characters like "Aunt Sis" are memorialized, as in the tale of her chicken dressing recipe that's somehow tied to that time when she shot her husband in the teeth! There's the tale of government "commodities" (free cheese and such for the poor) being distributed that were celebratory events. On another occasion, Bragg's mother (as a child) was taken to a hobo dinner with her father and brothers. Oh, and there was the time Ava (Bragg's grandmother) actually turned a tornado away from their home!

Bragg's mother (Margaret) never paid attention to the measurements of ingredients. When he asks, she usually replies "Enough" or "a pinch" or "a smidgen ..." In the recipe for collard greens, 'what you will need' is "a mess" of greens. "How much is that?" he asks. "You'll know," she states.

When he recited the recipes at the end of each chapter, I was instantly brought back to memories of my own family. My parents were raised in Alabama and we traveled every summer to visit. Listening to his voice describing the Bundrum family's adventures and travails I realized that he and I have a shared history, which has moved me beyond words. •



with physicians, and hear music, movies and TV. Adults (18 and older) who believe they have mild to moderate hearing loss can purchase OTC hearing aids without a medical exam, a prescription or a professional fitting. You can buy OTC hearing aids directly in stores or online. They typically cost less than prescription hearing aids.

Here are some other facts about OTC hearing aids:

- Research from the National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders (NIDCD), part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), shows that OTC hearing aids can be as effective as prescription hearing aids for adults with mild to moderate hearing loss.
- You control the settings for OTC hearing aids yourself, and you may be able to adjust them in more ways than you could with prescription hearing aids.

(BPT) - As inflation continues to rise, Americans are feeling the financial pressure and weighing their present needs against their future financial health. According to The National Association of Personal Financial Advisors (NAPFA) Fall 2022 Consumer Survey, 87% of working Americans feel stressed about their finances, and nearly half are unsure of how much money they need to retire comfortably.

How a financial advisor is compensated can affect the advice you receive. Financial advisors are compensated through three ways:

- Commission-based model
- Commission and fee model
- Fee-Only model

Advisors that work in commissioned and commission and fee models are paid based on the specific financial products they sell to their clients. These models create an inherent conflict of interest. Advisors may struggle to put their client's best interests above their own. They also may recommend riskier financial investments with lower returns because they'll earn more money.

In contrast, clients pay Fee-Only advisors directly based on an hourly rate, a percentage

of assets, a flat fee or a retainer for advice, plan execution and ongoing asset management. Because financial advisors don't receive compensation from third parties, there's no incentive to sell you expensive and risky financial products. This model allows them to concentrate on financial recommendations suitable to your situation.

"When choosing a financial advisor, always ask them how they are compensated for their services," says Dattomo. "Asking this question will help you better understand the nature of the relationship and whether the advisor will be putting your best interests first. If they give you anything but a straight answer, continue your search."

2. A Fiduciary

A fiduciary is a professional that manages assets or wealth while putting the client's best interest first. Fiduciaries are required to disclose any conflicts or potential conflicts to their clients before and during the advisory engagement, adopt a code of ethics and explain their fee structure.

Not all financial professionals are fiduciaries. Non-fiduciary advisors can recommend products with higher fees that generate bonuses, commissions and prizes. That's why it's of the utmost importance to ensure your financial advisor has signed a fiduciary oath.

"As consumers of financial services, we all owe it to ourselves to remain diligent to understand our options and the standards our financial professionals are held to," says Dattomo. "Selecting a financial planner who has taken a fiduciary oath means they will always put your best interests first."

3. Experienced and Proactive

advisor is key to securing your financial future. When searching for a financial advisor, check out their educational history, including credentials and designations such as a Certified Financial Planner® (CFP®) certification.

serious problem that may require treatment from a physician.

• To help the public easily identify OTC hearing aids, the devices are required to include the words "OTC" and "hearing aid" on the outside packaging.

Hearing aids can be life-changing, but only about one in four adults in the U.S. who could benefit from them has ever used them. In fact, people diagnosed with hearing loss wait, on average, nearly 10 years before obtaining hearing aids.

What are some signs that OTC hearing aids may be right for you?

- · Speech or other sounds seem quiet or
- You have trouble hearing when you're in a group, in a noisy area, on the phone, or when you can't see who is talking.
- · You have to ask others to speak more slowly or clearly, to talk louder, or to repeat what they said.

• When you watch TV or listen to music, you need to turn the volume up higher than other people.

OTC hearing aids are not for children or for adults with severe or profound hearing loss. These individuals should work directly with a hearing health care professional or a physician to address their hearing loss.

Why are OTC hearing aids now available? Experts in science, technology and hearing health care are working with researchers, health professionals and the public to find safe and effective ways to improve access to hearing health care for adults. This issue is a public health priority, especially as the number of older adults in the U.S. continues to grow. The availability of OTC hearing aids is a major step toward hearing health care that is less expensive and easier to access.


