## Confluence of Dreams

Some stories have no specific beginning, and with this tale, the future is still to be.

Jim Thorpe, Native American, Olympic Champion, legendary athlete, and inspiration (who passed in 1953), is joining hands with the Los Angeles Dodgers Dream Foundation. The Hawthorne Park, named in Mr. Thorpe's honor, is going to have its two baseball fields vastly improved. Some \$850,000 will be spent to refurbish the fencing, signage, backstops, infields, LED scoreboards, foul poles, home plates, dugouts, pitcher mounds, and bullpens (and then some).

On September 9, just past, dignitaries, including the revered Dodger, first-ballot hall of famer Clayton Kershaw, grabbed a shovel and made a symbolic dig into the soil at Jim Thorpe Park to commemorate this wonderful project. Kids and high schoolers will have such wonderful venues there, let alone a safe and outstanding place to gather, to make friends, to learn, and to play.

If only Jim Thorpe knew, but maybe (and hopefully) he does. Jim must have dreamt, at least occasionally, of becoming an inspirational hero. Well, it did indeed come true. He is not just an Olympic champion; he is in the National Football League Hall of Fame (inducted on a first ballot) and continues to influence for the better.

Clayton Kershaw, too, dreamt and still dreams. He has won the Cy Young (best pitcher award) several times, the Most Valuable Player award, and a World Series ring. To be clear, however, he sure wants to keep going. Given what I have witnessed over the years, Clayton will push himself.

The ball fields are the outcome of dreams that join hands, dreams that manage to come together. From Jim Thorpe (born in 1887) to Clayton Kershaw, all of 36 years young.

And, let's not forget the LA84 Foundation, which is one of the partners in this great endeavor; now 40 years since the 1984 Olympics were hosted in Los Angeles. Over that time, LA84 has made valuable investments in educational initiatives to improve this region's infrastructure. Here, LA84 merges with Mr. Thorpe's memory and spirit, along with the Dodgers Dream Foundation (and others), to build "diamonds in the rough", baseball diamonds, that is.

As such, I am thinking these ball fields are the outcome of a confluence of dreams.

These will be the sixty-fourth and sixty-fifth of the Dodgers Dreamfields-each one, and with more yet to come, a field of dreams.

When Mr. Kershaw spoke, you could feel the sense of pride and blessings: "The goal is just to be able to give kids an opportunity to do something they might not have been able to do before. So, whether that's baseball, whether that's getting outside, whether that's being a part of a team, learning how to work together, there's so many different things that can be impactful for a kid's life... and who knows, maybe we'll find the next Mookie Betts or Freddie Freeman out here on this field."

After the ceremony I walked over to the mural at the Park that includes Jim Thorpe's


## Check It Out

Many kids love non-fiction titles. Fun facts, colorful pictures and interesting info help engage curious minds and learn more about the world around them. A new kids non-fiction title to note is Deborah Freedman's Partly Cloudy. This narrative non-fiction title blends social emotional learning with weather facts, to answer the question, "What do you see when you look at the clouds??"

Two bunnies are examining the sky and have two different interpretations of what they see in the clouds. One is fanciful, "cotton candy ... Rapunzel's hair," and the other rabbit is

factual, "Cirrus ... Fog." Also included on each page are age-appropriate definitions of each cloud formation the factual rabbit names.

Readers see the tension between the rabbits' contrasting interpretations escalate as the weather also darkens. Suddenly their roles are reversed, and they realize they were both right. The pair find a way to enjoy both aspects of clouds, creative and scientific. This helpful title includes additional age-appropriate science info at the end in case readers want to learn more about weather.


## Film Review

#### Saturday Night: Pitch Perfect Casting Brings This SNL Biopic to Life

In his latest film Saturday Night, director Jason Reitman reminds us why we should all want to stay in on the weekends. Re-tracing the chaotic hour and a half before the live airing of NBC's inaugural episode of SNL, Saturday Night is a full-throttle, non-stop whiplash of hilarity and hijinks. Be prepared to laugh so hard it hurts as you relive one of TV's most historic and hectic nights. Now playing in select theaters, everywhere October 11.

Nearly 50 years ago, a young group of misfit comedians and writers changed the trajectory of television forever. Saturday Night begins at 10:00 pm, when Lorne Michaels (Gabriel LaBelle) arrives at 30 Rockefeller Center for the final dress rehearsal of his new show. Immediately, chaos envelops him. There's a llama in the loading bay,

John Belushi still hasn't signed his contract, the stagehands are stoned, scripts are being neutered by the NBC compliance officer, and the lighting director just quit. To put it mildly, it's a disaster.

To top it off, the cast is out of control. The combined untamed energy of Chevy Chase (Cory Michael Smith), Dan Aykroyd (Dylan O'Brien), Gilda Radner (Ella Hunt), Jane Curtin (Kim Matula), Laraine Newman (Emily Fairn), Garrett Morris (Lamorne Morris) and John Belushi (Matt Wood) is enough to make Lorne combust with anxiety. But there is not enough time to panic. With NBC executive David Tebet (Willem Dafoe) expecting perfection and rival funnyman Johnny Carson (voiced by Jeff Witzke) expecting failure, Lorne Michaels can only do one thing: trust his instincts. And right now, his instincts are telling him that this ragtag troupe of performers will somehow be able to pull it all together just before the clock strikes 11:30 pm.

He might consider also shouting "Dream big!" •



- Step 4: Drain the potatoes in a colander. Return the potatoes to the saucepan and add the soup mixture. Mash the sweet potato mixture until smooth. Stir in 4 tablespoons hot honey and the brown butter. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Serve drizzled with the remaining 1 tablespoon hot honey and sprinkled with additional fresh thyme leaves, if desired.

#### (BPT) - It's not surprising that many young people today are concerned and even uneasy about their financial futures. The era of a global pandemic, a shaky economy, inflation, high interest rates and the weight of student loan debt has been an uncertain and challenging financial period in which to come of age.

Making matters worse, numerous studies have concluded that too many Americans lack basic financial literacy, particularly young people. That's why it's important to provide a solid financial education early, while teens are still in school. Armed with information, they'll be better positioned to avoid the unwise financial choices and bad money habits that often plague young people as they enter adulthood. And it takes a village to make that happen.

One example of this was on display in Washington, D.C., in June, where the finalists of the Capitol Hill Challenge gathered in celebration. Run by the SIFMA Foundation and underwritten by the Charles Schwab Foundation, the challenge pairs members of Congress with high-needs public schools in every congressional district in the country to teach students basic money management skills. Since its inception in 2004, the Capitol Hill Challenge has made 8,000 matches of U.S. senators and members of Congress with schools, reaching nearly 175,000 youth. Public middle and high school students from all 50 states participated in this year's challenge.

Here's how it works: Groups of students at each school manage a hypothetical \$100,000

portfolio of stocks, bonds, mutual funds and cash. The 10 groups that have the highestperforming portfolios at the end of the challenge win a trip to Washington, D.C., where their financial savvy is put on display in a ceremony at the U.S. Capitol.

To help close financial literacy gaps, the Capitol Hill Challenge program teaches students to learn the skills to build wealth through smart investing strategies, and they also learn about spending wisely, saving, avoiding debt and so much more. These skills can help empower students to save more, put money away for retirement earlier, manage debt and avoid the financial pitfalls that can trip up many young people as they enter the "real world." The program is only an example of efforts being made nationally to teach basic money management skills, and experts argue more needs to be done.

"Financial literacy is critical for our youth. Currently, 35 states require high school students to take a course in personal finance to graduate. That's not enough," said Lisa Hunt, managing director and head of International Services for Charles Schwab and vice chair of the SIFMA Foundation board of directors. "Financial literacy needs to be a graduation requirement in all 50 states. It means committing the resources to have enough trained educators and provide them the necessary tools to deliver these curricula to students. The industry can't do this alone - we need government leaders, nonprofits, educators and families to work together on this critical

issue as well."

That's where Congress comes in. With bipartisan leadership from members including Reps. Young Kim (R-Calif.) and Joyce Beatty (D-Ohio), who co-chair the House Financial Literacy and Wealth Creation Caucus, financial literacy is getting more attention, including passing legislation to declare a "financial literacy month" each year for highlighting the issue, introducing bills that provide grants for funding programs, and more.

And families can make a difference, too. Cindy Scott, a Charles Schwab Certified Financial Planner based in Westlake, Texas, credits her dad with helping her learn critical financial lessons that influenced her

"One of the greatest gifts a parent can give their children is a foundation of financial wellness," she explained in her recent column. "When I was a kid asking for this and that, my dad didn't say no. He said, 'Let's sit down, and I'll show you how money works.' Kids need that."

cinematic symbiosis firing on all cylinders. This historical biopic is not a deep dive into any particular character, not even creator and showrunner Lorne Michaels. Saturday Night is a true ensemble comedy that runs like a well-oiled machine. Sure, the hyperbolic moments are exaggerated, but then again, so was the real-time activity taking place in Studio 8H of 30 Rock.

The film's biggest selling point is, without a doubt, the cast. When taking notes during the screening, there were multiple points when I hurriedly jotted down "SPOT ON" when commenting on Gilda's hairstyle, Belushi's eyebrows, and Chevy's tonal inflection. How casting director John Papsidera found these up-and-coming actors who can fully (and I mean fully) embody these comedy legends is nothing short of a perfect match.
